DRIVE SAFELY, BE CAREFUL CHECK YOUR EXPIRATION DATE

It sure is getting cold out there, and being raised in Spokane where I can remember it getting 30 below, now anything below 40 degrees is cold.

One thing us Square Dancers have to watch out for this time of year are the road conditions. Many of us are traveling twenty to thirty mile or more just to enjoy our activity. Not only do we have to watch out for the road conditions, we have to be especially aware of what the other drivers are doing. Trying to avoid danger on these icey roads can be an hair raising experience.

I remember leaving Puyallup to call a dance in Moses Lake in my 4-wheel drive ¾ ton pickup with studded tires. A light snow was falling in Auburn and the roads were covered as I was heading to I-90 up the hill on HWY 18. All the wise drivers were doing 20 – 30 miles an hour. Of course that was to slow for me, so I boosted it up to 35-40 mph as I passed all those other slow pokes. After I had passed everyone, and was turning back in. There I was, out of control spinning around 2 or 3 360 degree turns and finally smacked into a concrete barrier which saved us from going down a steep ravine. We made it to Moses Lake, and drove a little bit safer. SO PLEASE DRIVE CAREFULLY, call ahead to see if the dance has been canceled. We want you around to dance again.

The other item I would like to discuss regarding Expiration dates of your subscriptions. We need as many subscribers as we can get. That is why we put your subscriptions expiration date on the mailing label. We have been mailing issues 2 or 3 months after the expiration date, just to give you a chance to catch up. If your subscription expires and you send in \$15, then we restart it when it expired, not when we receive it. Example; Expiration date 10/2010 the \$15 will keep the expiration date as 10/2011. New Years Resolution -

"Organize the Closet"

If it is something you just can't part with - your old high school sweater - put in in Elsewhere. It should be in your memory box not in your everyday closet. If it is something you think someone else would like put it in the Friend box.

The Second Question is - Will you wear it? There are many reasons that we have clothing in our closet that we don't like. May be it was given to us, or we had to have it for a special event or it was purchased in a moment of insanity. If you have such an item decide which box it belongs in. Don't let anything take up space in your closet that you don't like. Wearing something that you don't like, will make you feel frumpy. That feeling will be reflected in the way you move and hold yourself.

While doing this you are thinking - "I won't have anything left to wear." - Well, you can't wear these items any way so you won't miss them in your closet. Don't confuse quantity with quality. 




