DID YOU KNOW?

...that convincing all leaders of the state's roughly 90 square and round dance clubs to post their dance events on the WheresTheDance ("WTD") website (<https://wheresthedance.com>) is a challenge akin to herding cats? It seems like it sometimes. Recalling that "Rome wasn't built in a day" gives this author hope, though...especially in light of some recent good news. Here are the latest "statistics". While the number of clubs in the state posting their events on the site still stands at about 30 (approximately 1/3 of the clubs in the state federation), nearly 300 events are currently posted statewide over the next 90 days. There's more good news...Mt. Baker Council's Penny Curtis has taken up the challenge to post events on behalf of MBC clubs in order to achieve a goal of 100% participation in the near future! Dan Saikkonen made a similar commitment on behalf of Peninsula Council and achieved the goal in record time.

If clubs in your council haven't stepped up and post on their own, who among you would be willing to follow Dan and Penny's lead to post on behalf of all the clubs in your council? With very little "training" (or self-study), one can post an entire dance season's calendar for a number of clubs in less than an hour. If you would like to volunteer, contact me directly, please!

Check out the screen shot in the next column [Full disclosure, the author's club is highlighted, but that wasn't intentional...honest!] The date displayed was chosen because it's a good example of what a "typical" screen would look like if clubs all across the state posted their dances on WTD. Not only does it show which clubs in a given geographical area have events posted for a particular date, it even shows if there are previously scheduled events that had to be cancelled for any reason (especially important cases where the cancellation occurs at the very last minute...e.g. "snow-mageddon").

In December the WheresTheDance development team implemented a requested enhancement to the WTD mobile app. Note the colored icons with the reversed-out capital letters. The "C" stands for "Class", the "D" for "Dance", and the "W" for "Workshop". Now, when searching WTD for events using a smartphone, dancers can tell at a glance what type of event is displayed without having to open the Event Detail screen.

Let's become the first state in the country to have 100% club/council participation on WTD!

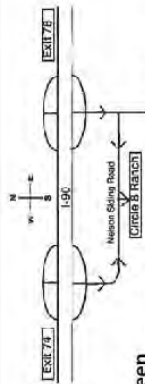

DAVE'S CALLER TALK

This month is a summary and critique of our Nov. Blast Class. As far as advertising goes, we had too little advertising, and we were too late with it! In spite of that we still had enough students and angels for a class, so it was a moderate success. We used Whirlybird's First Friday Fun Fest as the spring board for the event. In addition to several attendees already planning to go through the weekend Blast Class, 2 brand new students, a few current class students & a couple that wanted a quick refresher signed up on the spot for the Blast Class. On Saturday, we also had 2 more new students and another couple join us for a refresher. We used the Hayloft for the First Friday Fun Fest, and the Sunday program. Tri-way Grange was our location for the Saturday program as the Hayloft wasn't available that day. Our first class Saturday, ran from 12PM to 2:30. We took a 30-minute break, and our second class went from 3 to 4:45. We took a 2 hour 15-minute dinner break and came back to finish the evening with a 2 hour dance, featuring all of the material taught both Friday night and Saturday afternoon. Sunday afternoon we had another 2-hour class (where we gained another brand-new student), and another 2-hour evening dance.

The registration fee was \$25 which included all of the classes & dances, and they also had a per-class fee for those that couldn't commit to the whole program. Angels were encouraged to come and participate, and weren't charged for the afternoon classes, although a

donation can was available for those who wanted to donate to the cause. As I wrote earlier, we had nine squares Friday night, and if I remember right at the 1st class Saturday we had 4 squares, the 2nd class 3 squares, 4 squares for the Saturday night dance, 2 squares for the Sunday class, and 3 squares for the Sunday night dance. By the time the weekend was over we had completed all of Basic one and alamo style, swing thru, ocean wave trades, run, wheel and deal, and single hinge. As always, I ended up modifying my lesson plan as we progressed. I approach teaching a little different in that each of my class sections are like a progressive dance which also includes line dances and easy rounds that I can quickly teach. This keeps it upbeat and not so much like "school".

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM THE CAVNESS CORNER

Four years ago, Wendy and I started working with new instructors. We were preparing a showcase – a Foxtrot. We got into Hold, started the music. First figure – Dip Back. Our new instructors: “Stop!!” We spent the rest of the lesson re-learning how to do a Dip Back. “That was not the way we learned it.”

That’s not the way I learned it. How many times have you taken a dance class or clinic and uttered that phrase? If you are a dance instructor, how many times have you heard this from your students? There is certainly a frustration in having learned a figure and finding out that the way you have danced the figure for months, years or perhaps decades now appears to be wrong. Believe me - it’s a shared experience for all dancers. Wendy and I have relearned how to do multiple figures over and over. Just recently working with our instructors on Natural Hover Cross, I mentally uttered those words as I realized that the way we have been dancing that figure for ten years is different than the way it was being demonstrated. That’s not the way we learned it. So why does this keep happening, and is there any way to prevent it?

There are many reasons that you may find yourself uttering this phrase. When first learning to dance you may find that your teacher only teaches you the very basics of a figure. We tell our students that there is a simple way of dancing a figure and then a more advanced way. Then a more advanced way after that and so on. Even professional Ballroom dancers are always relearning the figures as their dancing becomes more sophisticated. When we first learned how to dance an Open Telemark, we were not ready to learn the more advanced nuances of the figure and our instructors were smart enough not to try to teach at that level. As our own dancing continued to improve, our knowledge aptitude also continued to increase and that meant basically starting over. There is almost no figure that we haven’t relearned at least once. Many figures we have relearned multiple times.

Things change over time. Ballroom dancing which translates eventually to round dancing is ever evolving. Better ways of executing a figure are being introduced - sometimes this is for safety, and sometimes for making the figures easier to perform. Sometimes these changes are simply because styles change.

When we were first taught Waltz we were taught closed position as toe to toe, lead hands out and Man’s Right fingers pointing down on the lady’s shoulder blade. All that has changed now as closed position is much softer and the bodies offset - that’s not the way we learned it.

Figures are nuanced. Many dance figures have so many fine details that trying to learn every subtlety would be impossible when first learning. Weave is a great example where Wendy and I have learned it at least four times. The first time we learned it we were happy to simply enter and exit in the correct position and stay off each other’s feet. Later we learned that the figure moves in an “L” direction on the floor – towards Diagonal Line/Center then to Diagonal Line/Wall at the end. We then learned that the fourth step is a cross behind (front for the lady) with no rotation. Even Left Turning Box is nuanced. We basically relearned that figured about four years ago after dancing together for twenty plus years. We would never have imagined how much goes into a Left Turning Box - from body position to swing to correct rise and fall to where and when you place your feet. We usually start every lesson with ten minutes of Left Turning Box.

There is no one right way to dance any particular figure. Dance instructors - especially great dance instructors understand figures in different ways. Sometimes the difference is in emphasis of what’s important. Sometimes the difference is in the mechanics. Just because it is different doesn’t make it wrong. Often when attending clinics you will see slightly different ways of executing a figure demonstrated. This is especially great for a figure you

are struggling with. That difference in teaching style or teaching focus may be just the thing to get you over the hump in perfecting a figure. Our advice – try it out. If it works for you, use it. If not - leave it at the clinic.

We have learned to take any figure – even ones we think we know well – to our instructors to ensure that we are doing it correctly. Almost always there is something they find for us to work on or to help us improve. In doing this throughout the years, we have learned to turn the frustration of “we didn’t learn it that way” into the excitement of “how can we make our dancing look even more beautiful?” Continuous learning in dancing doesn’t always mean learning a new level or phase - but can also be taking what you already know and relearning it, to look even more amazing on the dance floor.

Round dancing not unlike many other athletic sports continues to evolve, so with it your knowledge and ability to dance well and easily, and to enjoy doing so with your partner.

The Washington Round of the Month for January is Sunshine, Lollipops and Rainbows. This is a phase 2 Two Step written by TJ and Bruce Chadd. TJ and Bruce reside in Boise Idaho. TJ learned to round dance in 1980 and began cueing and teaching in 1984. Over the years, TJ and Bruce have choreographed over 70 round dances.

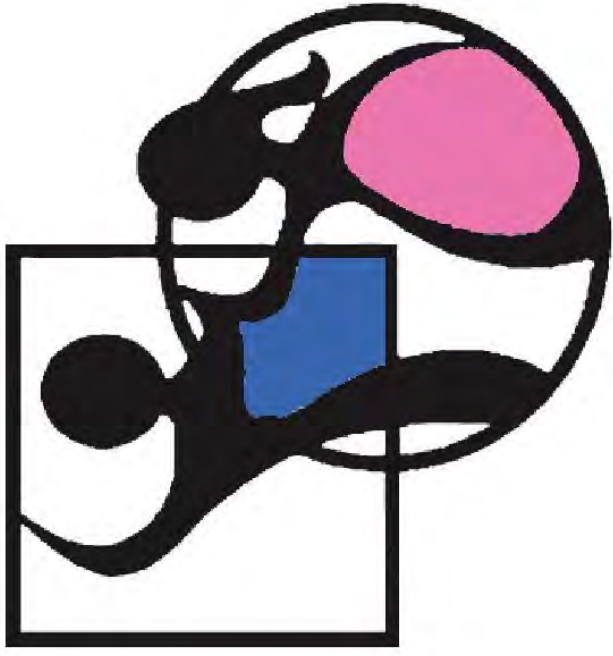

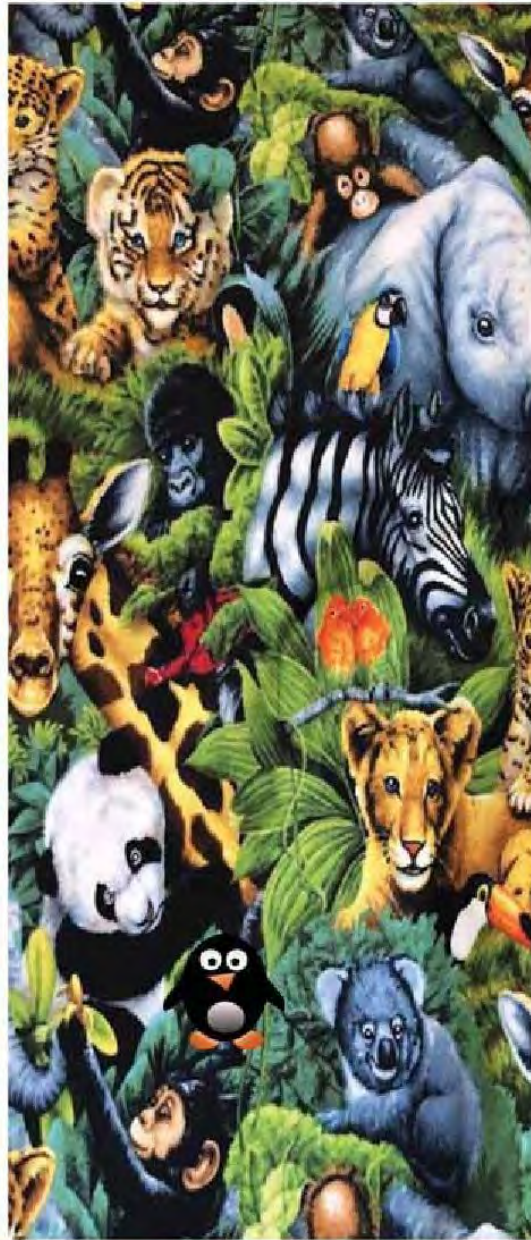

Getting to and around Evansville

Getting to Evansville for the 71st National Square Dance Convention® is as easy as putting in your rowboat and paddling the Ohio River until you see the Evansville courthouse tower peeking out from the town's skyline.

If you don't want to take the transportation our River Rats did, there are plenty of other options. Two interstates, I-64 going east-west and I-69 going north-south, run through the city, as well as U.S. 41, another north-south road. I-64 passes through Louisville and St. Louis as well.

For those looking for aerial transport, four airlines, Allegiant, American, Delta, and United, fly into Evansville Regional Airport, though you will probably have to take a connecting flight.

Once you're in the city, there are a few transport options, even if you don't have a car. Several major car rental services are available at the airport. The city also has the Metropolitan Evansville Transit Service (METS), with 22 fixed routes, and operates from 6 a.m. to midnight. Lyft and Uber also operate throughout the city.

The clubs and dancers of **MT. BAKER COUNCIL** wish all the other Councils a Happy New Year and a full year of dancing in 2022. When 14 of our 16 clubs send me reports for the January issue of Footnotes, I know we're back to fulltime dancing in Washington State. So here they are in the order in which I received them.

Hello from the **SKAGIT SQUARES**. The worries about Covid19 have diminished. Our 16 students are coming to the end of their mainstream lessons. We will be starting another mainstream lesson set the end of this month. Our current-lessons dancers have much appreciation for having the chance to join a new social group that is made up of people who practice kindness, smiles, laughter, dance skills and enthusiasm to others. These positive attributes are appreciated by "angel" square dancers who want to get out of pandemic mode and into dancer mode. The dancers know that while you are square dancing you cannot think of negative things all night long. We have made our lesson people aware of the level dances in our area and the opportunity to practice square dancing with other callers and students.

It has been an observation for several years that the number of singles is increasing in square dancing. Almost no clubs cater to singles. From my past experience there are more women than men singles dancers. This year we have more men than women who are taking lessons and "angeling." We also have twice as many angels, looking for positive people, compared to previous years.

We asked our club if we could cater to singles for the next 6 months. We created a 3 foot by 5 foot white board with thin plastic tape lines into a grid where singles could sign in to be right or left hand dancers for the evening. The white board organizer would then match up couples from the board for the next tip. By

doing this, singles would have a different partner each tip and dance for most tips. 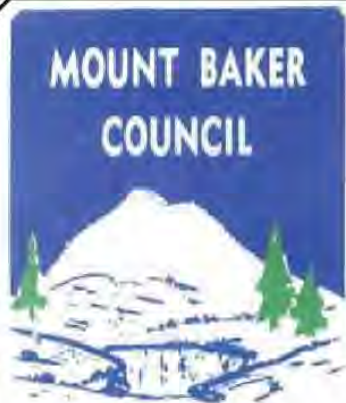

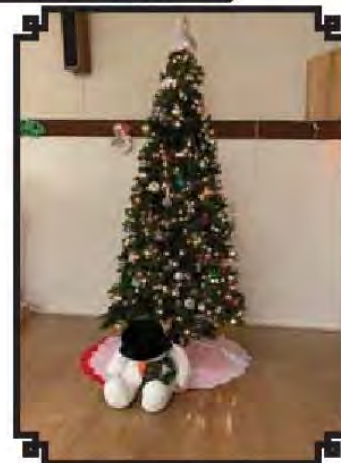
