It is with deep regret that we officially announce the cancellation of the 69th National Square Dance Convention® in Spokane, Washington, June 17-20, 2020.

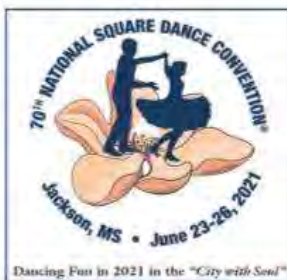

...that “social distancing” doesn’t have to mean social isolation?

The Coronavirus (aka Covid-19) crisis has affected every square dancer in WA in one way or another. Without the benefit of some research and a database to collect the data, we’ll probably never know precisely how many of our dancers contracted the disease. Regrettably, we do know that it took the lives of several members of our community.

Fortunately, most of us didn’t “catch” it. The most obvious effect has been the significant disruption to, and curtailment of, many of our dance activities. Short-term financial impact cannot be ignored...while dance revenues quickly went to zero, hall rent must still be paid for some clubs (whether or not they dance), flyer and ad-placement expenses are sunk costs (unless you had the Footnotes staff watching your back), etc.

Perhaps the biggest impact overall is on the “social side”. We’re not spending time in-person with our friends. Some have been expressing concerns on social media about the long-term impact the virus might have on the future of square dancing, some even postulating that the activity will never recover. Giving-in to such “doomsday” predictions is the surest way to create an environment of inevitability. Let’s not do that. Americans, especially square dancers, are adaptable. If we must make “adjustments” to make our activity more socially acceptable and virus free and still keep it fun and vibrant, then so-be-it...we’ll figure out a way to make that happen!

Without getting too far “down in the weeds” from a technical standpoint, Zoom Meetings have quickly become a new arrow in our quiver. Anecdotally, two councils (and probably more) have held their most recent Council Meetings using the app. The consensus among participants was positive. When face-to-face get-togethers are not practical, the Zoom approach is a good alternative.

Ground-floor participation is free to everyone...invited guests and even the meeting host. “Free”, of course, means there are limitations...e.g. 40 minute meetings (this restriction has been waived by Zoom during the Coronavirus outbreak), but you can get 10, 20, 30 (up to 100) participants online in socially-distant and distinct video boxes all at the same time. And after you drag a few luddites into the 21st century with “click on that little thingy in the lower left corner”, “turn on your microphone”, “turn off your radio”, etc., even the very first experience is surprisingly effective.

Hopefully, by the time you see this, you’ll already be dancing again. If not, all the more reason to look for an opportunity to look into adding Zoom to your toolbox. Look for it at <https://zoom.us/> .

Every club and council in WA state has its own page on the site. Every club and council president was asked to identify a couple of volunteers to act as "Assistant Administrators" on behalf of their club or council. These individuals do not have to be either photography or website "gurus" to be an effective administrator...after about 30 minutes of training, it takes only about 5 minutes to create a photo gallery for one's club or council.

Each gallery, when created, will generate a "guest upload link", thus enabling anyone attending a dance to easily upload photos from a smartphone or digital camera (even during the dance where wifi is available).

Let your club or council president know if YOU would like to volunteer to be an Assistant Administrator. As of this posting, approximately a dozen individuals have already signed up!

So go ahead....**EXPLORE** the site! The amount of "content" you can explore now is somewhat limited, of course. For a sneak peek, check out the Swingnuts Club's content under the Rainier Council link to get a general impression of what every club or council page could look like by this time next year.

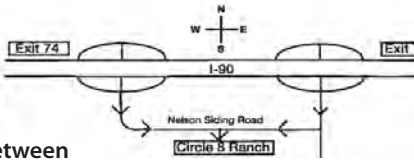

But sometimes we as Callers must force ourselves to get ready and going. Why is there not the same drive as has been in the past? Why should you feel this way? It is BURNOUT.

This is an overwhelming exhaustion, sometimes physical sometimes mental.

The physical is day after day night after night of driving to and from the Hall to get the Hall ready or set up equipment. To teach or re-teach. To tear down the kitchen and clean up and out we go, until tomorrow or next week. No matter how much you love teaching and/or dancing,

no matter how much you love the people that attend, sometimes you just want a change

The mental side well????

We would all agree that almost all involved in Square or Round dancing are just the BEST.

Kind, nice, thoughtful, we share common goals.

But there are a few who have a different purpose. Perhaps recognition or power. Maybe they don't realize that an unhappy person affects those around them.

For me it is depressing to deal with these folks. I must remain calm and positive instead of telling them what I really feel. It does take willpower.

Why do I do that? Because I love this activity. Responding would cause Clubs or Festivals to not hire me. I might feel better for a few moments and then regret having them "got to me" and my descent into Burn Out would be complete.

If you are nearing this, here are some suggestions:

- + Rediscover your joy of dancing
- + Spend time with newer or Youth dancers.
- + Search for photos of a special event, rejuvenation
- + Attend a workshop to advance your own education
- + Share with other Callers/Dancers
- + Take a short vacation or take a break.

Burn Out is something almost all of us experience. But it is also something we can overcome. Because, in the end, we love this activity.

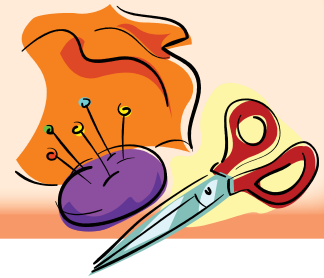

Point to Perfection

Pins - Those most basic of sewing items. A point on one end and a knob on the other. Nothing to worry about - right?

The first part that can go wrong is the point. Is it dull or hooked. How old is that pin and was it well made in the first place? That pin has been rattling around in your sewing stuff for how long? It has been used and dropped, how many times? Due to new technology today's pins are much sharper and stronger than those hand-me-downs from your grandmother. A pin that snags the fabric instead of piercing cleanly can leave a permanent flaw in the garment. If the pin doesn't slide in and out smoothly - trash it.

Consider the head of the pin. Metal and glass headed pins can be ironed over. Glass ones are easier to find and to grasp, than those with regular heads. Large plastic heads in different colors can be used to mark special areas. There are even pins with numbers and letters to help quilters keep track of the rows.

The shaft of the pin is equally important. I purchased a box of red glass pins, because I liked the color. They felt rough when passing through the fabric. The shafts had not been properly polished. Into the crafting stuff with them. The size of the shaft is also important. Use finer pins on finer fabrics.

I tried to make a chart of pin sizes and types but it quickly became confusing. Even in one brand, pins that appear to be the same length and diameter have several names. Different manufacturers use different standards.

The pins I use are blue glass Dritz Ultra Fine and white glass Dritz Extra Fine. They both have size 22 on the package but the blues are finer than the whites. The blues are used on finely woven fabrics, laces and microfibers. The whites are for basic cottons and wools.

I also have, Quilters pins (size 24) with the big yellow plastic heads. They are for working with knits or heavier fabric. The big heads keep them from sliding into loosely woven fabric and high visibility makes them great for serging.

Ball point pins are for working with knits. The rounded tip slips between the yarns and doesn't snag and pull. These types of fabric also need a ball point machine needle. Appliqué pins are only half an inch long. They just need to hold the edge of the project until sewn. Fork pins are 'U' shaped so it is as if you were using two pins at once. They can tame the slinkiest fabrics. Finer sizes for fine fabric and thicker ones for upholstery.

Keep different pins separate. Colored heads make separating easier. Mechanic's parts trays work well for this. They have much stronger magnets on the back than the pin dishes in the sewing store. Just toss the pin at the dish. Trays will magnet to the ironing board and not slide off. Run the bottom of the tray across the carpet and pick up all the dropped pins. Trays come in a variety of sizes, shapes and colors.

Take all of your old pins and put them in your craft supplies. Purchase a variety of clean new pins. Select different styles for the types of sewing you prefer. The fabric and your hands will thank you. With all of the money you put into the pattern and fabric. With all of the time you put into the planning and layout. This is not the time to use cheap, old, rough, dull pins. Quality is evident, even in the smallest part of the creative process.
