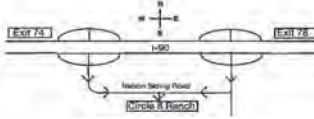

It's Festival Time!

On June 15 and 16, 2018, you should really be in beautiful Kennewick, Washington for the 66th Washington State Square Dance Festival "Dancing in the Blues", being held at the Three Rivers Convention Center. For that matter, being there a few days early will give you even more Dancing opportunities. There is a Trails-In Plus Dance on Wednesday, June 13, at the Shuffler Shanty in Kennewick, called by Steve Noseck and Kevin Thomaier, and cued by Bill Holm. Then Thursday night, there is a Trails-In Mainstream Dance at the Three Rivers Convention Center, with Dan Nordbye calling and Neva Reid cueing. Both Trails-In Dances start at 7 p.m. with Pre-Rounds, then Squares from 7:30 to 10 p.m.

The featured caller for the Festival is 'super caller and extremely nice guy', Jerry Junck, and the featured cuer couple is the dynamic duo of Sharon and Casey Parker. Our Washington State callers and cuers will provide excellent calling and cueing. The calling will have duets, trios, some high energy tips, and some extended application tips.

At the Festival, there will be halls for Mainstream, Plus, Advanced, Youth, and Round Dancing. There will be times for the public to participate in both Square and Contra Dancing, and a Badge Dance at The Reach Museum that is open to the public. Also, Clogging will be available in its own hall for all you Cloggers. We have 30 callers and 20 cuers from Washington state that have accepted invitations to call and/or cue. On the Square Dance side, we have more callers than slots available to call for Mainstream and Plus. Then for Advanced, Youth and "No Experience Necessary", we have more slots than callers that indicated they could or would call for those groups. Every caller and cuer that timely signed up gets to call and/or cue. It might be just once, but 'what the heck'.

Additional activities at the Festival include a talk on the Future of Our Activity, led by Jerry Junck; two After-Parties, one hosted by the 2020 National Square Dance Convention committee, and the second by the 2019 Washington State Festival Committee; a Youth BBQ; Pageant; Grand March; and an appreciation luncheon for Festival callers and cuers.

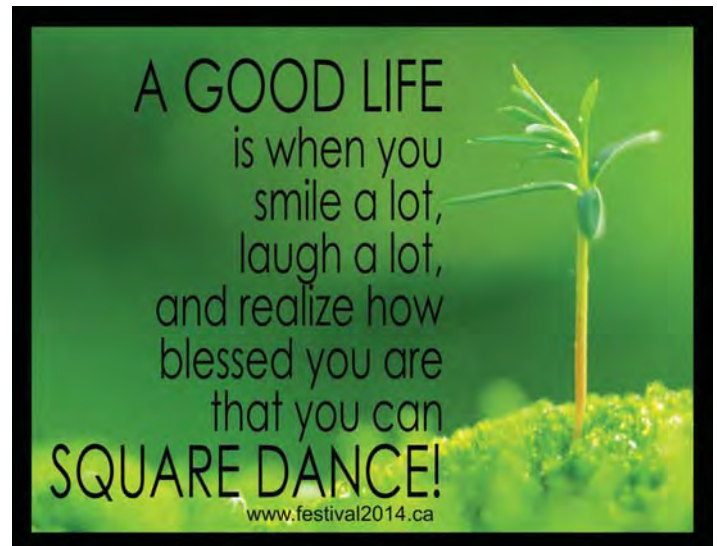
Handing Off the Baton

Sewing Machines vs Fishing Boats

Sewing is like fishing. It is a hobby that brings pleasure. Guys don't bring home enough fish to pay for their equipment. Stitchers should not be expected to save enough money to justify the sewing machine. Sewing is a relaxing hobby, it should be done for the creative enjoyment. The hum of the sewing machine is as calming to the stitcher as the rocking of the fishing boat is to the sportsman.

I sold sewing machines and it was interesting to watch how women selected a new machine. We had machines from very simple to ones that ran close to \$20,000 and could do amazing things. Women would come in and look at the fancy machines and wistfully watch me demonstrate them. Then they would select a machine that cost less saying, "I can get by with this one."

Whenever a husband came along with his wife I was very careful to include him in the demonstration. More than once, a husband overruled his wife's selection of machine and bought her an up grade model. I never had a husband select a less expensive machine than the one his wife wanted. The husband would usually spring for a few accessories to go with the new machine. He understood the enjoyment a new machine would bring her.

There was a lady who came into the shop several times and had her heart set on a specific model. A friend of hers was a regular at our classes and the lady really wanted the same model as her friend. One day she came in and I could see that she was in a bad mood when she stormed in the door. She walked up to the machine she had been test driving and said, "I want that one, now." I replied that I didn't have a new one, just the floor model. She said, "I want that one, now." I sold it to her, fast. When her friend came in a few days later I asked why the lady had been so upset. The friend said the lady had been talking to her husband about the sewing machine and he couldn't find space in the budget to get it. The next day she came home and there was a brand new Harley sitting in the driveway.

I have seen women spend \$300 to get a machine repaired that was not worth \$50. Sewing machines are women's play toys. They remember all the fun they had using the machine and all of the great things they created. They were so attached to the machine they could not think of getting another one. You may be attached to your machine but that pile of gears isn't attached to you. It won't miss you a bit when you trade it

in on a new model. Boats and sewing machines wear out and have to be replaced.

Have you ever seen a guy regret selling his old boat? No, he is too busy backing the new one into the garage. Guys understand that the memory is in their heads not in the equipment. They don't keep sinking money into a sinking boat.

One very distinguished looking lady, who appeared to be about eighty, came in with an old Singer she wanted repaired. The tech looked at it and said that everything was so worn there was nothing to repair. It fell to me to tell the lady her machine was dead. She went into a tirade, "How dare we call ourselves a repair shop when we couldn't repair a simple machine?" She would tell all of her friends how incompetent we were. In the blast of words that followed I learned that the machine had been her mother's. How long was she expecting a machine to last?

You do not have to have the most expensive machine to enjoy sewing, just one that works smoothly and is well tuned. Figure out where sewing fits into your life and how much you are willing to spend. Not just in money, but in time and effort. What type of sewing brings a smile to your face?

Always remember that you can say, "NO". Sometimes owning a sewing machine means people ask you to repair clothing or other items. If you really don't mind and it won't take too long, that is up to you. If it is not something you want to tackle, just tell them you don't want to. They didn't ask Michelangelo to paint the garage.

Hi, would you like some information on where to go to square dance? I was asked as I passed by a vendor booth at Salmon Days in 1988. I was with my boyfriend of the moment, who I enjoyed dancing with, but who was not a particularly accomplished dancer.

My first thought was, "If we went square dancing, it wouldn't matter if he isn't a very good dancer. They would teach us how to dance with other dancers." I picked up the information, and determined to use my feminine charm to convince my boyfriend that this would be a good activity for us, and we should enroll in a class. Unfortunately, he did not have my vision, and although he agreed to take ballroom lessons, he wasn't too keen on square dancing. Still, the thought lingered that there was a type of dancing "out there" that all of the partners would know all of the steps, and I would merrily whirl around the floor, which is the dream of all would-be Cinderellas.

Through the next 17 years, I had many ballroom dance partners, and attended a great many dances. It was my default for meeting new friends, and hopefully meeting a future "Mr. Right." It was at a singles' ballroom dance that one of my regular dance partners told me square dance lessons would be starting soon, and I should consider signing up. Walt had been square dancing for most of his adult life, and said he much preferred it to the nightclub scene. I was quite willing to take lessons, but a detail I had not been told was that "taking lessons" meant a three-or-four-month commitment to learn 68 different calls. I had another friend from the same singles' club who told me he was a square dancer, and if I would take lessons, he would like to be my future dance partner. Now I had two great reasons to enroll in the program, plus my lingering desire to be in a room full of people who all knew the correct dance steps.

I began my first lesson at South Sound Singles, with Stephen Cole instructing. Because I was a traveling sales representative, I was often out of town for the Wednesday night lessons, but Stephen was very patient, and with the help of Al Tokin, I was honorarily graduated and became a wannabe Mainstream dancer. I was delighted that I was in a new world where all of my dance partners knew what they were doing, and the entire dance square and team led me through the moves so that I was soon twirling around the floor in a way I had previously only dreamed.

For the next few years, I divided my time between the nightclub scene, and my new square dance friends. If I showed up alone, I felt very comfortable that the other members of the club would see to it that I was able to dance most of the tips. Soon I was learning more about the different levels of dancing, and was campaigning for my nightclub friends to take square dance lessons along with our weekly ballroom sessions.

As a member of **JACKS AND JILLS**, more and more, I am finding myself in conversations with other square dance advocates discussing potential means of growing the square dance activity and extending the current gust of growth currently blowing through the Youth Square Dance Community in our area. It got me thinking about what I am doing to help the square dancing activity grow and how each of us in our own small way can grow our individual dance communities.

From my point of view, "square dance" is made up of two things: the dance itself and the people. The community is what brings life to the dance. To build one up is to build the other and that is the approach I have taken to helping square dancing grow. For some time after I started square dancing, I struggled to feel if I had any particular belonging to the square dancing world I was participating with I mistakenly assumed that since I had a very unique upbringing that I would always stand apart from any crowd that didn't know my culture and family. Quickly, I found that these "square dancing people" who were not as different as I would have assumed, were interested in getting to know me. It may seem like a funny thing, but one of the biggest impacts that square dance has had on my life was to afford me the opportunity to find that I could let people know who I was as a person, through my

actions and interactions, without previous introduction to the way I saw the world. I had found a safe place to grow.

I am sharing this example from my own experience to illustrate the key role that the relationships square dancers play in the making of a tentative newbie into an invested and happy member of the square dance community. At the 2017 Washington State Square Dance Festival in Spokane, I fell into a conversation with an older Caller and one story he recalled to me exemplified something very important about square dancers. He recalled a conversation he had with some security guards at a big square dance convention. They had said to him, "I wish you would have told us that you all were going to be "very little trouble" at the beginning of the weekend. We could have all gone home." The guards went on to tell him that thousand dollar cameras and hundreds of backpacks and bags had been left unattended all over the facility for the whole weekend and not one thing was stolen. They were blown away. Even church events always have thefts and disturbances of the peace.

I wasn't surprised, but why? I can guarantee you that out of the hundreds of people at that convention, not all of them were honest, but then why was it that there were no thefts when it would be so easy? This blessed sanity, I believe, we can attribute to the dancers. We touch each other physically while dancing which is proven to build rapport. Every right and left grand is like a handshake and no one is nameless or faceless on the dance floor. Everyone gets a chance to be seen and known and in our current world, that is uniquely powerful. I believe that square dancing has become a safe place for many people of all walks of life just like it did for me. I want to help square dance grow so that many more people can be blessed like I have been and I am doing so by building up the people. We are the community who will extend the joy of friendship and the freedom of dance to all future square dancers.

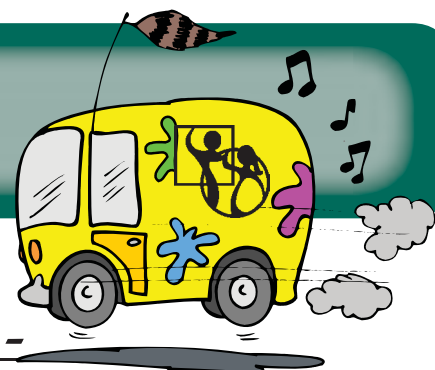

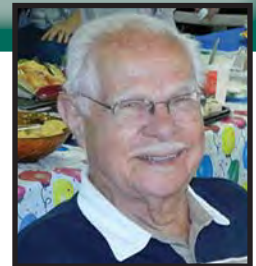

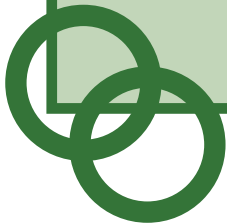
