Recommendations for Safe Return to Dancing

Revised 03/30/21

by executive officers of the SFDfWA

Following Phase 3, square dancing would qualify as a high contact sports activity and may resume following the safety guidelines as outlined below:

- Indoor activities subject to 50% capacity
- Health Monitor Participants should stay home when sick or have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19
- Face coverings required for all participants. Although the guidelines do allow that persons with certain medical conditions are not required to wear masks, with those medical conditions they probably should refrain from dancing at this time.
- Physical distance maintained when not engaged in dancing.
- Wash hands frequently if soap & water not available, use hand sanitizer with 60-90% alcohol content.
- Keep a sign-in roster of every participant in case contact tracing is necessary
- Shared food is not recommended - dancers should bring their own food and beverages in their own containers.

The club/organization holding the event can and should set and enforce the requirements for that event and area. It is suggested to post those requirements.

Each dancer should be considerate & respectful of others

Each group should keep in communication with membership with up to date recommendations & ask for their input to determine what is best for their organization

Did You Know...?

...that your opinion matters?...at least it's supposed to! That's why I'm going to take advantage of the opportunity this forum presents to express mine!

[Full disclosure: this is my opinion and is not intended to suggest an approval, recommendation, or endorsement by the WA State Square Dance Federation leadership.]

If you took the time to read Don Wood's open letter in last month's issue of Footnotes regarding Social Square Dancing ("SSD"), you already have a "hint" regarding where I stand...I'm "all-in" for SSD! That would not have been the case a year ago. At the risk of repeating something I have said before, I was not strongly against the SSD concept, but I wasn't for it either. I figured it would take a decade or more for SSD to "catch on" (and waiting a decade for anything less than a dramatic, rapid improvement and reversal of our declining membership trends seemed problematic and not worth the effort. In an ironic twist of fate, the Covid-19 pandemic changes the calculus substantially. It is clear to me there is no better time or opportunity to implement a wholesale, dramatic contribution to square dancing than right now!

I'm aware of anecdotal evidence that similar programs (B51, Club 50, Basic, and some individual/independent efforts without the benefit of a catchy "name") have had success in attracting new dancers, and there's even anecdotal evidence that new dancer retention is "up" in some cases where those programs have been implemented. That's fine, and to be commended. But success on a local or a regional basis does little to enhance or contribute to the success of the activity overall.

In my opinion, a system-wide "solution" is what is needed. Look at it this way: in any team sport, "success" (winning) depends on every individual member of the team knowing his/her individual role/responsibility for all the plays in "the playbook". When a quarterback calls a play, if even one member of the team doesn't know what he's supposed to do, the chances of a successful outcome

are compromised. That should be pretty obvious to anyone. When a square dance caller calls several "plays" in the middle of a patter tip that some dancers aren't familiar with, the odds of having squares break down goes up dramatically (also pretty obvious). Virtually any "50-ish" call program works as long as long as everyone who shows up at the door knows all 50 of the calls in the playbook. And there is the rub...if successful local or regional 50-call program advocates insist on being stubborn about their 50-call program being "best" versus selecting a single system-wide program, we'll still be having this discussion a decade from now and will still be suffering from declining membership in our activity. Dancers who travel (what retiree doesn't?) who find they can't dance while traveling are more likely to drop out of the activity altogether than those who can dance anywhere, anytime they choose. If every dancer in the country knows the same 50 calls, problem solved.

That, in part, is why I'm in favor of the SSD "solution" over any of the others that, for whatever reason, have not gained broad-based support. It's not that they're necessarily inferior to SSD. But SSD has garnered broad-based attention recently, while others have not. SSD has captured the attention of Caller Lab as well and has a verifiable track record. If any of the other "successful" 50-ish call programs had managed to lobby more effectively for their 50-call version, perhaps we would be settling on theirs rather than SSD as the system-wide solution. We have a narrow window of opportunity right now to hit the "reset button" for square dancing. I sincerely hope we make the right choice...and soon!

Club Renewals and Individual Membership Renewals were due on May 31st.

If your club has not completed these processes, they need to be done immediately. We will be contacting the delinquent clubs to assist with any problems you may have. The deadlines for membership and insurance renewals are set in the bylaws. The deadline of May 31st is to allow our committee the time to create an accurate Membership and Insurance database to take effect on September 1st. Although it is set in the bylaws, there is no consequence if you don't meet it.

We are asking the clubs and councils to do the best they can under these trying circumstances. This means, use alternate means of communication such as email, telephone, social media, and so forth instead of your usual club meetings. Gather as much information as you can and get it to us as soon as you can. We can always add members later. We say this because our square dance year expires on August 31, 2021. Remember, this year there are no state fees due for the renewals for 2021-2022. Therefore, all renewal processes can be done by email if you like.

As we have just explained, there is no serious consequence to missing the May 31st deadline, but the August 31st deadline is set in stone as that is the end of our insurance year.

Clubs must also remember to renew their club within their council. This is where the club turns in their club officers' information to make up the state directory. This process has to go through the council before it comes to us. We are urging council leaders to communicate with your clubs to gather this information so we can receive it no later than August 31st.

Please keep us informed of your situations and problems so that we may help in any way that we can and alleviate problems before August 31st.

“SOCIAL SUPPORT”.....we all need it!

We must tell you....we had the most relaxing week of fishing, visiting with friends, no masks, eating with the company of friends.....outside, sitting next to each other, communicating face-to-face and enjoying life and the unrestricted “emotional break”. Each couple had their own boat, we helped one another when necessary and life was good. Thanking GOD for all of HIS gifts and the air we breathe.

Brings to mind the title of.....“ SOCIAL SUPPORT”. We all need it you know. Social support means having friends and other people including family to turn to in times of need or crisis, to give you a broader focus and positive self-image. Social support enhances the quality of life and provides a buffer against adverse life events. We need to tap “this tool” to beat stress. Being in tune with your emotions serves a social purpose connecting you to whatever in life.

Presently, with the coronavirus pandemic and troubled economy, many people are living in crisis. The need for each other can be helpful. Square dancers have a special family-styled support system. It’s an amazing act of belonging, the need to be helpful, to celebrate and enjoy a family recreation.

As leaders of our activity, we need to be strong in our leadership. Dancing will return and flourish with patience once again. Strong social skills are essential for success in life. We, as teachers need to lead with welcoming positive attitudes. Some backing up may be required in our calling and cueing. Classes may have to be placed on hold until club members feel confident again at dancing, but WE CAN DO IT! Together we can accomplish and bring back our recreation. We need to be gentle and provide easy routines building from there at a slow repetitive speed gradually producing confidence and the ability to expand further. Let the dancers determine how fast we progress in teaching. Most of us have not danced for over a year and some are very skeptical in getting together due to the virus. Be aware that some of the callers and cuers haven’t called or cued for over a year either so, experienced dancers, be gentle with these leaders as well.

We recommend these 2 ideas: (1) SMILE, it truly creates a good feeling and is a great beginning to every dance....(2)Teachers.....teach as if you have 2 special people in the class, one, being deaf and the other blind. To the deaf person you must show each step accurately and more than once. To the blind person you must explain in detail as you demonstrate. You are encouraged to repeat the process more than once, each step and/or figure. Classes we took in learning to teach round dancing, this particular method was strongly stressed. We teach all classes remembering to keep this idea in mind always.

Thank you for reading our articles for the last two years. We hope that we have brought to you both, the dancer and teacher/instructors, helpful information.

71st NSDC to have Dueling Pianos as opening act

EVANSVILLE – Get ready for some fun and fancy music playing as Felix and Fingers Dueling Pianos will be the opening show for the 71st National Square Dance Convention in Evansville. Dinner will begin at 5:30 p.m. Central Time at the Tropicana Hotel and Casino and the show will begin at 7 p.m. The cost is \$50 for the dinner and show, or \$25 for show only.

Dueling Pianos is a high-energy show that thrives on audience participation. Performers go into a show having little to no idea what songs they will play, and the audience requests songs for them to perform. Their musicians can play in all genres, from country to classical to hip hop to jazz to rock, so there are many songs they can play. Performers also work comedy into the act. The goal of Dueling Pianos is to entertain as many people as possible.

According to Felix and Fingers' website, dueling piano shows started in the late 19th century with two pianists on stage taking requests and seeing which one could play the song better and faster.

The format has evolved since then. Now, many of the shows include humor and even more improvisation, but that core purpose remains.

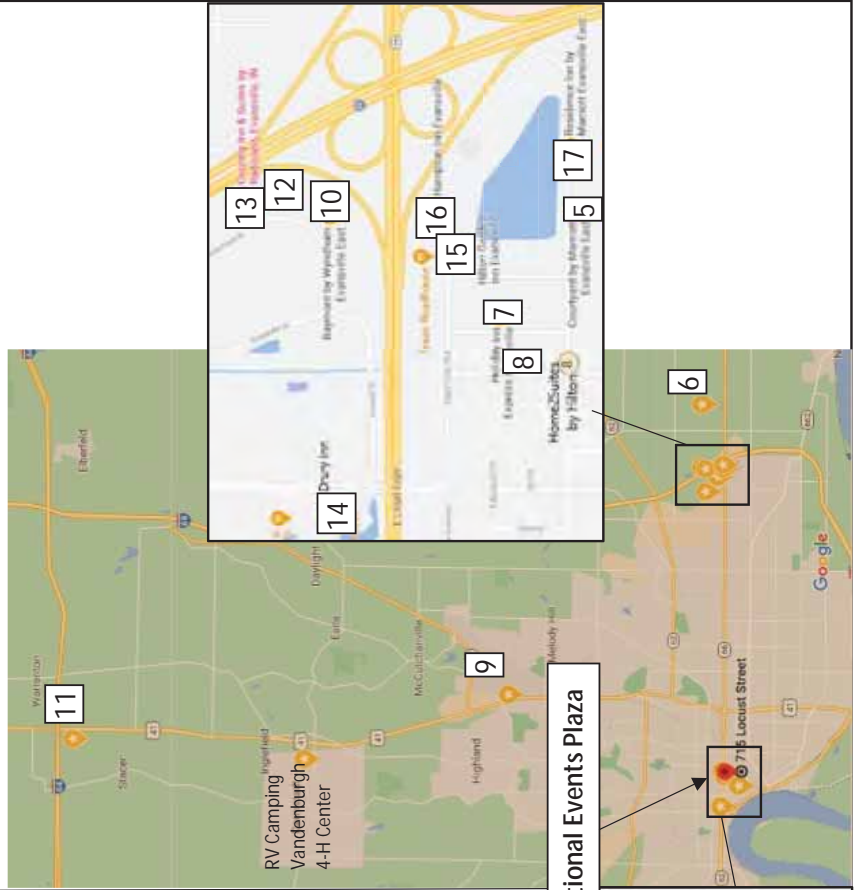

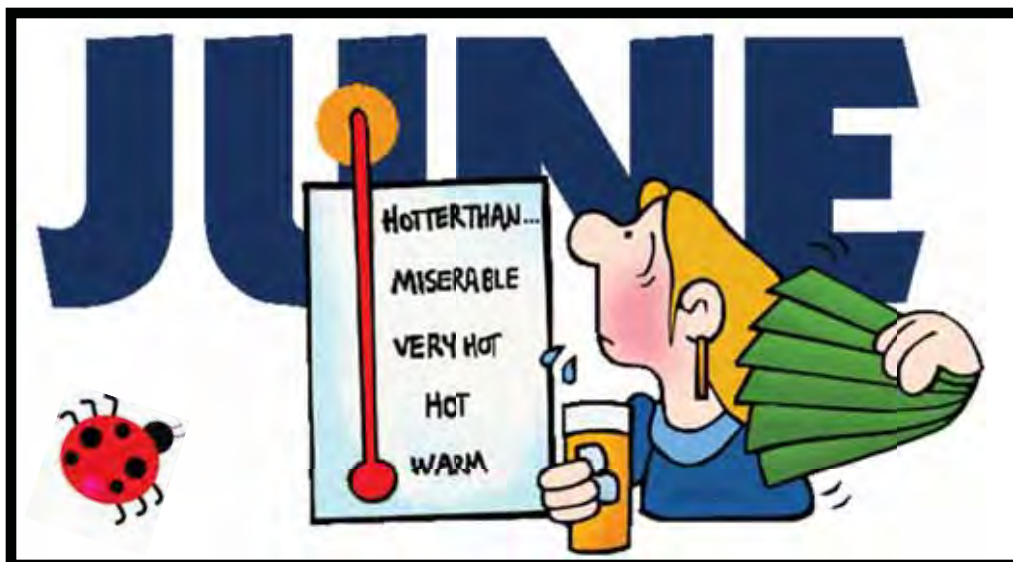


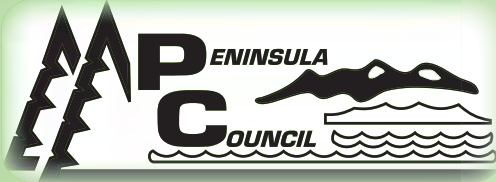

RAINIER COUNCIL

Will implementing an SSD-style (“Social Square Dancing”) model become a reality in our region at the Club level, at the Council level...and State Federation level?

This is a question that should be at the top of the list of important decisions dancers need to make. While there are compelling reasons for making SSD “standard” (versus Mainstream), there’s also entrenched resistance within the Mainstream population. It is up to each of us to become fully-informed about the alternatives and avoid making rash judgements in favor of (or against) any current or proposed dance format.

Square dancing’s future in our state will depend upon the strength of the commitment offered to support the decision(s) we make. [Please see my “*Did You Know...?*” article in this issue of *Footnotes* for an “opinion” editorial on the topic.]
