WHEREAS, Western dancing is truly an American form of dance, originating when settlers danced squares, contras, and reels around campfires on their way to our western shores; and

WHEREAS, square dancing has been an American tradition since our earliest history, promoting the spirit of fellowship among people of all ages; and

WHEREAS, the square dance is the official dance of Washington State; and

WHEREAS, 2019 marks the 40th anniversary of the legislation that established the official state dance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Jay Inslee, Governor of the state of Washington, do hereby proclaim September 17-23, 2019, as

Square Dance Week

in Washington, and I encourage all people in our state to join me in this special observance.

President's Award



Way back when, Dave began dancing at the age of 12 in a community club next to the family home in Lynnwood. That very next New Year's Eve, Dave called a tip for the first time, and it seems that he has never put the mic down since.

Dave also participated in the PNTC, Pacific Northwest Teen Competition, winning many awards for his dancing, calling and accordion accompaniment. Dave's family helped form a pre-teen club in Seattle in 1967 where he met Bonnie at age 11 as a student in Dave's first class, whom he married 10 years later.

Through the mid 70's Dave played accordion/synthesizer in the Cross Cat Square Dance Band, which enabled him to travel throughout the Pacific Northwest. In the fall of 1975 Bonnie learned to play the drums with Dave's musical guidance and they formed "Alive-Sound". The name for their live music calling duo and recording company, newly married they began to travel, taking many long tours.

For 13 years, Dave and Bonnie owned and operated a square dance hall, Square Acres in Tacoma. Dave has been a member of Caller Lab since 1976, where he has received his 50 year calling certificate. North Shore School District awarded Dave with the Acorn Award for outstanding school service in 2006. Dave and Bonnie received the Parker award in 1996 for their continued dance promotion, and Mount Baker Council Illa Williams Award in 2009.

Most importantly he is in his 31st year of teaching square dancing in the schools throughout 11 different school districts, in the Puget Sound area as part of the physical education curriculum. His school year calendar is booked solid. Most of the schools are Junior High or middle school, but he covers grades K-9. He generally teaches for one week at each school (some 2 weeks), teaching 60 or more

kids at a time, all day long.....most often not stopping for a lunch break.

Many schools like to complete the square dance unit with a competition of sorts wherein there is a dance off between squares, all for fun, with as many as 45 squares on the floor.

No end in sight, his successful career path is endorsed by the evidence of longevity. He has taught at many of the same schools for over 25 years, and has a waiting list of schools interested in the square dance program he presents. Dave became a club caller for the Whirlybirds of Everett in 1976, and the MT. Baker Singles of Mount Vernon in 1987 and he is still with those clubs today. He continues to spread square dance fun to as many new friends as he can meet, at every opportunity.

Dave and Bonnie have dressed dancers for over 35 years. Petticoat Junction Dance Shop was founded in 1987, recognized by dancers everywhere. They can be found at many state festivals and at the National Square Dance Conventions.

Dave is very proud of his "No Experience Dances", he has called these at festivals, council dances over the last few years. Where he has dancers invite friends and family, and anyone else. He gets them up dancing the first tip. Dave is also the force behind the "First Friday Funfest", which is sponsored by the Whirlybirds, and arguably the longest ongoing dance in the area right now. We fill the Hayloft Hall to the brim, dancing shoulder to shoulder. The average attendance is about 150 dancers each month.

At last year's festival in Kennewick, Kris and I were fortunate enough to have a lengthy conversation with our beloved caller Jerry Junck. Jerry said, "He fills the Pacific Northwest maybe the last strong hold of square dancing anywhere. Dave and Bonnie have been responsible for so much of this."

Last but not least, we have grown to love their beautiful children Roxanne and Todd. Roxanne is a well-established round dance cuer who takes the family everywhere, just like her parents did. Todd is an up and coming Clogging cuer, quickly making a name for himself on the National clogging circuit. I would like to thank Roxanne especially for helping me get all this information together.

Congratulations again, Dave and Bonnie. It was an honor to present this year's Presidents Award to both of you.

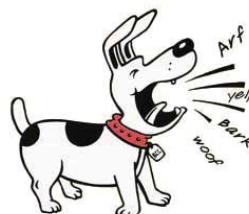

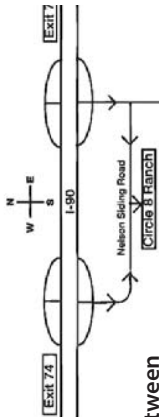

• use firm grip, gentle guide, dance smoothly	• smile and be cheerful and friendly
• applaud the caller and thank the dancers in square	• introduce yourself to visitors and share your square
• enter nearest square needing dancers	• offer your place in a square to visitors
• walk around the perimeter of the dance area	• be patient with new and senior dancers
• visit quietly when not dancing	• do unto others as you would have them do to you
• listen attentively to announcements	

NEVER:

• pass a square needing dancers	• talk or walk around during announcements
• cut through a square	• leave early unless overcome by fatigue or illness
• walk out of a square unless dire necessity	• take for granted caller/cuer/officers hard work
• tightly squeeze, pull or jerk another dancer	• cloud a fun evening with your personal woes
• just walk out of the square at the end of the tip	• talk only with club members
• cut across dance floor between squares or circle	• let guests sit and watch when they can dance
• walk between caller/announcer and dancers	• appear bored or disgusted with other dancers
• make noise and disturb those dancing

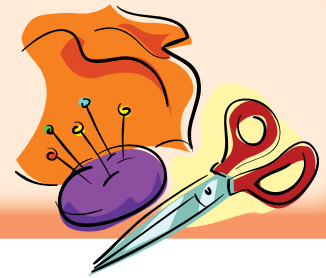

Back Stitching

Back stitching is used at the start and end of seams to make them secure. Some stitchers sew back and forth several times to make it 'extra strong'. This forms a big messy lump and the seam cannot be pressed open properly. Also, the stitching cannot be removed without ripping holes in the fabric. *Remember "As you sew, so shall you rip"*.

Back stitching is not always necessary, it depends on the stress on that area. When the end of the seam will be in a rolled hem or if the fabric is going to be manipulated a lot while fitting it to the next piece, then the end of the seam needs to be reinforced. The backstitching should be small and neat, no more than four stitches.

One way to back stitch is to sew forward. Set the presser foot so that the needle is at about half an inch from the edge of the fabric. Sew forward four stitches. Lift the presser foot and pull the fabric forward, until the needle is right above the edge of the fabric. Bring the presser foot down and sew the seam. Sewing the first three stitches locks the thread to the fabric. Then you can sew forward without having to hold on to the thread tails. When you get to the end of the seam, sew right up to the edge. Lift the presser foot, pull the fabric back about half an inch, to loosen the thread, then move the fabric forward and sew right on top of the previous stitching.

I use the knee lift on my machine to do this procedure and it is faster and easier than pushing the back up button. My hands are both on the fabric, my left foot is on the go pedal and my right knee lifts the presser foot. **Yes, you can sew with your left foot. You dance with it don't you?**

Garment factory machines don't have a reverse button. Some industrial operators hold back on the garment, for a moment, at the beginning and end of the seam to

create a shorter stitch length by pulling against the feed dogs. Starting on the edge of the fabric, sew four stitches, then hold the fabric back so that there are three really short stitches. Then release the fabric and sew the seam.

Many of the newer household machines have a thread lock feature. Just push the button and the needle will go up and down in the same place 3 or 4 times. This makes a very secure seam and is almost invisible. Don't try to lock on the very edge of the fabric. The needle will jam the fabric down into the needle plate. Make the lock about a half inch from the edge so the presser foot and feed dogs have a good grip in the fabric.

Another problem that stitchers deal with when starting a seam, is the tread pulling out of the needle on the first stitch. This is caused by the take up lever not being at the top of its rotation. When you stop stitching, grab the hand wheel and turn it counter-clockwise. That is the top toward you. Watch the take up lever and stop at the top. This prevents the thread from being pulled out of the needle, because the first movement of the take up Lever and the needle will be down. When you pull the fabric out from under the presser foot if it won't pull easily and it looks like there are three threads - that is also caused by the take up lever not being in the full up position. The top thread is still looped around the bobbin and the stitch is not completed. Turn the hand wheel, watching the take up lever, and the problem will be solved. Newer machines automatically stop with the needle in the completely up position. This is a great time saver and frustration reducer.

When moving the hand wheel always turn it counter clockwise. If the wheel is turned the wrong way the thread can make a loop in the take up lever area. This can cause an expensive trip to the repair shop to get the thread snarl out of the gears (Voice of Experience). When the machine is sewing in reverse the hand wheel is still turning counter clockwise. The sewing machine was not designed to sew backwards. Just like your car, it can go that way, but forward is always better.

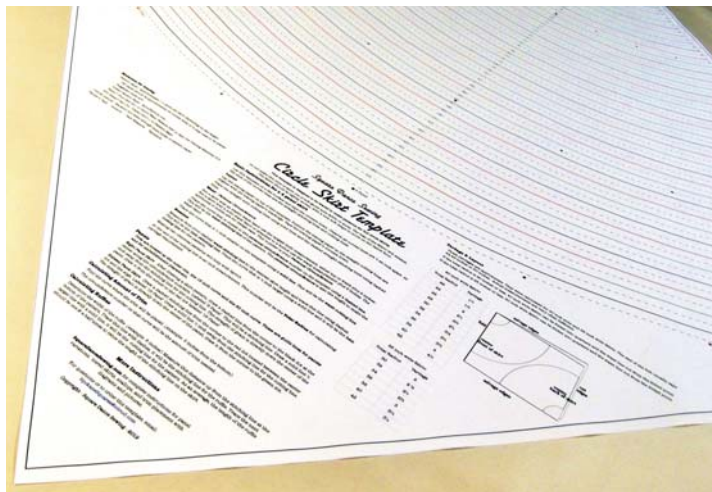
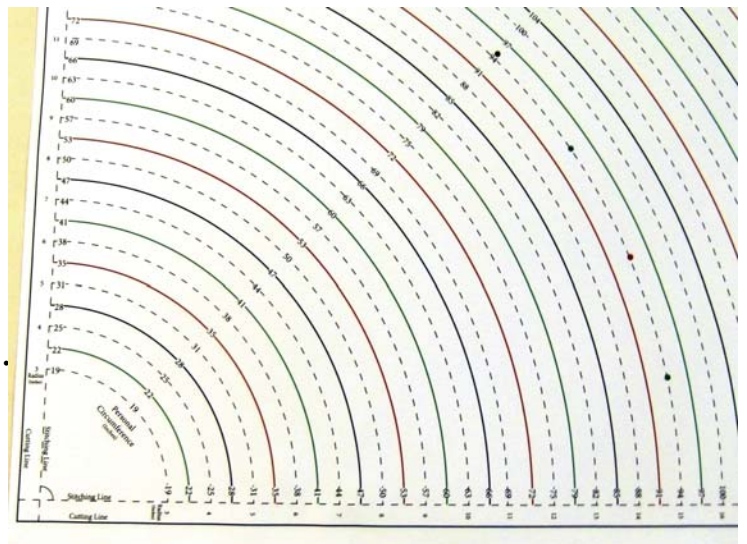

What a fantastic State Festival!! I have heard nothing but good things about the dancing, the music, the decorations, the halls, the sound, and the amazing details that went into the 2019 Rainier Rendezvous.

The 2019 festival team did a lot of ground-breaking: introducing on-line registration, ability to take credit cards, instant notifications of changes to the schedule, and the decision to not have a separate seating area for solo dancers. This was also the first time that Washington State has had a live band, The Ghost Riders, that played every evening, beginning with the Trails End dance on Thursday, and ending with the last dance on Saturday night. Our local callers got quite the experience in being able to join this popular band on stage.

Although I had announced it in this article, and repeating it may be singing to the choir, but not having solo ribbons or a seating area caught many of our solo dancers unprepared and more-than-a-little skittish about being able to dance often. As I walked around the dance floor and looked to the seating areas, I was relieved that there were fewer dancers sitting and waiting to be asked to dance than at previous festivals I have attended.

Possibly one of the reasons is that we have so many more dancers who can dance as either a belle or a beau. In looking at the registration forms, approximately one-third of the dancers registered as a solo. Many of these registrations, I am sure, were dancers who had a partner who registered separately, but most of the regular “coupled” solos used the same form and paid together. They were not included in the one-third count. This is a huge number, and one that all clubs and councils should take into consideration when doing their planning.

I also heard several concerns about not having information on the solo lunch and dinner announced in time to get the word out to everyone. This is a legitimate

concern, but I would like to add some insight. The registration committee had been trying to find a solo coordinator for many months. Fact is, they were not successful in finding someone willing to head a committee. If you were one of the disappointed solos that didn't get the message in time to attend, consider offering your services to the planning committee at our future festivals. 2021 (Mount Baker) is being planned now, and they have put the call out for volunteers. Contact Judy and Tom Corning to discuss your willingness to help.

On that note, remember to thank the many volunteers that brought you three days of non-stop fun. As Chairman of the Registration Committee, I was particularly proud of the team, and the excellent job they did in getting dancers on the floor quickly. If you were one of the 80 dancers who did not pick up your 2019 Puyallup bar, to be added to your festival badge, let me know. I will be happy to send one to you.

Happy dancing. See you on a floor soon.
