



- 1) Never physically pick them up off the floor unless you are a close personal friend or family member.
 - We think it is a lot of fun to pick up the smaller, younger dancers, however, it can be distracting and unsafe. Also, these days, we all need to respect how people may react. Even if it is just in fun.
- 2) Please do not use styling with them, as many of them are getting ready for "Comp".
 - A lot of our young dancers compete and when they are getting ready for competition, they want to be able to improve "their" styling that they need. And get extra dance time.
- 3) Do not push or pull on a youth in the square.

 Pretty much the same answer as #1. Also, most of
 these kids know how to dance better than some of us
 adults. They will ask if they need help.
- 4) Please don't get angry with them if the square breaks down. Remember we are there to have fun.

 All squares break down now and then. It's not necessarily the fault of the youth.
- 5) If you are having issues with a youth dancer, please talk to the adult club leadership.

Their adults need to know if a youth is causing issues in a square and/or the dance in general. Let their advisor's or parents handle it.

We would like to thank all of the clubs for their efforts in renewing their club and memberships for this dance season. We have now received all renewals for the 2016-2017 dance year except for the following clubs who have folded: Columbia River Squares of Blue Mountain Council, Legion Squares of Rainier Council, Solo Squares, Phils & Philies and Timberlane Cloggers of Central Puget Sound Council and Spokane Tapeworms of Spokane Area Council. As of this date, we have 2,745 members which is 232 members less than last year.

We will soon be sending out each club's up-dated membership list in electronic form to their respective council treasurer. It will be up to each council to print and distribute this up-dated membership list to each of its clubs. This is the information that used to be handed out to each council delegate at the fall State Meeting for distribution to the clubs. Since we receive quite a few requests for this information electronically, we decided this would be a good way to handle it.

Don't forget to send us a list of your students! Please remember, if a student should join multiple clubs, they need only pay the state dues and insurance of six dollars through one club. This would hold true for anyone belonging to multiple clubs, they need to pay their state membership and insurance through only one club. The students are covered by our accident policy for free while they are taking lessons. Upon graduation, they have 10 days to join a club or they will no longer be covered. Now, that being said, we feel that a person should be allowed to be counted as a student in your club for only one year. The whole idea of free insurance for students is to help them get started, not to provide them with free insurance for the rest of their dancing career. We are responsible to make sure our insurance requirements are met and not abused and create a situation that could adversely affect our insurance coverage.

GIVE ROUND DANCERS A BREAK

In our area Square Dance lessons have produced a large number of new graduate dancers that have not seen much Round Dancing and think we are there just to fill in the gaps while they take a break. Square dancing and Round dancing go hand in hand.

Originally the round dances where memorized Waltz or Two Step and the Caller just put on a record for the Round Dancing and took a break. It began to change in the 70's when the dances became more complicated and we discovered we had more dancers participating when the Caller cued the dances we could not remember. This meant the Caller lost his break so Cuers were born and began to read the steps to the dancers while the caller got his break. At first they just read the words on the sheets, not always in time to the music. They usually had about 20 or 30 records to choose from for a dance that the dancers had been taught so they were just reminding the dancers how the dance went.

As Cuers became more interested in their job and started writing even more complicated dances the dance count grew. It became more difficult to memorize everything so good cueing became more important. Some people began to like Round Dancing as much if not more than Square Dancing. This made it necessary to learn to cue better to get the message out to the dancers in a timely way so we could dance smoothly.

Roundalab was born in 1976 to teach the Cuers better cueing technique and teaching principles. They also discovered that we could apply the same technique to other rhythms besides Waltz and Two Step, such as Rumba and Cha Cha and eventually Cuers were as important to a dance as the caller.

Today a Cuer must know how to cue multiple rhythms at multiple levels which probably requires as much skill as the Callers. With modern technology we now have thousands of dances to choose from.

Unfortunately Cuers are not as respected as Callers. Round dancing is part of the program not break time for the square dancers. This means the Cuer and round dancers on the floor need to have the respect that is due during their time on the floor. If round dancers were to make as much noise as those sitting out during round dances the caller would not be pleased. Please clear the floor if you are not dancing and move to the seating area or break room. Better yet learn to Round Dance and join us as we dance.

ne thing I learned while working in a sewing machine repair shop was that many stitchers sew with one hand behind the needle and pull on the fabric. They claim to be 'guiding the fabric' but they have a tight grip on it and are leaning forward. They are pulling to help the machine sew faster. This is a very bad technique for several reasons.

First - It damages the timing of the machine. When the needle is down in the fabric and is pulled back, the machine must work harder to get the needle up from where it is pinched against the needle plate. We could always spot the 'pullers' machines by the needle scars around the hole in the needle plate. When the needle hits the plate because it is being pulled by the fabric it jams the needle up into the machine. This is just like ramming your care tires into the curb when you park. It ruins the alinement and the timing. This also causes the needle to break sending the needle parts into the gears to jam them up. It can also send those needle parts flying at your face.

Second - If you have one hand behind the machine your back is in a very bad position. You are twisting forward and your neck is bent trying to see what you are sewing. With your eyes way too close to those flying needle parts. Sit very straight in the chair with you shoulders down and your hands resting on the bed of the machine just in front of the needle. That is where they should be gently guiding the fabric.

Third - It causes uneven stitching and skipped stitches. The length of the stitches varies depending on how hard you are pulling at that moment. It also stretches the fabric. This is especially bad on curves and bias cut areas. The fit of the garment will be ruined by areas that have been stretched. Decorative stitches will be distorted because many of them have backward as well as forward elements.

If the machine is not sewing fast enough, step down harder on the speed control pedal. Some people have told me that they only sew at medium speed because they are afraid of 'burning out' their machine. Sewing machines and sergers are designed to go at top speed. If they are in good running condition they will hum along with your foot pedal to the metal. You are doing a lot more damage by pulling on the fabric than you could by increasing speed. Some machines have speed controls to slow down the machine for new stitchers. Check your manual for these over rides and set the machine for the fastest speed.

If you want to get to the end of the seam faster - increase the stitch length. Many people sew with a very short stitch length with the mistaken idea that they are making the seam stronger. It is actually the reverse, they are making the seam weaker. Each time the needle goes through the fabric it punches a hole breaking some of the fibers of the fabric. Just like the perforations on your toilet paper. The cheap toilet paper with only a few holes that are

widely spaced, does not tear very easily. Expensive toilet paper with many holes tears easily. I sew all of my square dance

clothes and my husbands shirts with a stitch length of 3.5 or 4.0 mm (about 7 to 9 stitches per inch). We dance frequently and those outfits go through the regular wash and dryer. I have never had a seam come apart.

Why are you in such a hurry? People who sew pulling on the fabric tell me about neck, back and shoulder pains. They complain of headaches if they sew more than a few minutes at a time. This is due to the stress of poor posture and the stress of deadlines. Sewing should be your creative

outlet and relaxing get a way from chores. If you don't enjoy sewing - give it up. Sewing does not save money in most cases. Calculate the cost of the fabric, thread, notions and pattern. If you get satisfaction from a perfect seam, if you enjoy the creative challenge, if you can see in your mind a perfect unique outfit, if you find sewing relaxing then sew (with both hands in front of the needle).
