...That some clubs post their dance events on Facebook?

- It's true!..."some" do, but many don't.
- Furthermore, did you know that many dancers don't even have a Facebook account in the first place?
 - It's true!
 - Some dancers (quite a few I'd surmise) absolutely refuse to join Facebook.
 - Many who do have an account (I'm guessing) don't "join" or "follow" square-dance related groups or pages.

...That some clubs post their dance events on Wheres-TheDance.com?

- It's true!...more than half of the clubs on the "west" side do, but only a handful of clubs on the "east" side do.

...That some clubs post their dance events on their very own website?

- It's true!...a few clubs do, but most clubs don't.

...That some clubs place ads in Footnotes magazine to promote their dances?

- It's true!...a few clubs do, but most don't.

...That some dancers read Footnotes every month?

- It's true!...some dancers do, but most don't.

...That some councils have a dedicated website in addition to a Facebook group or page?

- It's true!...some councils do, but most don't.

...That some clubs rely exclusively on email to promote their dances (primarily to "static" distribution lists of club

members and others in their "local" area).

- I'm only guessing this is true!...relying upon that tried and true argument, "We've always done it this way, and our dancers like it!" (But what about the rest of the square dance community?...how will they find out about your dances?).

...That some clubs post their dance activities on Twitter and/or Instagram?

- It's true!...a handful do, but most haven't even considered it or made any effort to investigate it.

My point in this article is to remind square dance leaders, whether on behalf of a club or council, that relying on just one or two of the many places where one can promote a dance is a recipe for low turnout.

But there's also an inherent risk associated with posting your events in multiple locations. Suppose you post a flyer, along with the "details" about an upcoming dance, in a half dozen or more places (websites, social media platforms, emails, newsletters, even Footnotes)... THEN an unforeseen situation arises necessitating an update. Do you even remember to which sites you posted the event in the first place, and are you able to update the information in each of those locations? (If you are unable to update every post, you run the risk of having some unhappy dancers contact you at some point!)

I'd ask you, once again, to go back and read my June 2022 "Did You Know....?" article in Footnotes for some more "food for thought".

Ask yourself how “effective” your current dance promotion approach is at attracting new dancers, or out-of-area dancers. If your dance floor is bursting at the seams, feel free to ignore my encouragement to critically review your club or council’s situation. Then act “accordingly”...surely there’s an answer out there somewhere.

My recommendation has been (still is, and will continue to be) to:

- Make WheresTheDance.com your “primary” calendaring tool for square dance activities.
 - no subscription required
 - fast, instant results on a smartphone
 - consistent format
 - free
 - updates are easy to post and available to EVERYONE!
- Make Footnotes “required reading” each month.
 - No subscription required.
 - Covers all of WA state and is entirely about square dancing in our state.

Sure...feel free to continue posting on Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, your Council website, your Club website, etc. (are you tired yet?) The more the merrier (until you’re forced to change a date, a time, a caller, a cuer, a dance location...and can’t remember to which Facebook groups you posted flyers that were perhaps “shared” outside of your control and are suddenly out-of-date).

If you have a contrarian point of view, send me an email. Or, better yet, write a “letter to the editor” for Footnotes and share your feedback. It’s all good.

May your dances be fun, fulfilling, and well-attended!

What does our insurance do for us?

Our accidental insurance plan is a supplemental plan covering us while participating in any square dance activities sponsored by a Washington State federated club and while traveling to and from such activities. Our plan pays only after all of the individual’s insurance plans have paid. Incidents should be reported immediately by completing the “Incident Report Form” that dancers are required to fill out. Submit this completed form to the M&I chair. This form is available on the state web site under the Membership & Insurance (M&I) tab. Some dance locations have printed this form out and made it available in their dance hall for convenience. There is also a \$10,000.00 death benefit payable under this plan regardless of any other insurance the individual may have. Another aspect of our insurance is the liability portion of the policy. We are all covered by liability insurance in case of any legal actions brought against an individual or a club with respect to incidents that may have occurred during square dance activities.

When are Washington square dancers covered?

Square dancers belonging to a Washington State federated club are covered by the Washington State square dance insurance policy while participating in dance club activities sponsored by a Washington State federated club and when traveling to and from such activities as a structured group, or as an individual.

Are Washington State square dancers covered outside the state of Washington?

Square dancers belonging to a Washington State federated club are covered while participating in dance club activities sponsored by and under the direct supervision of a Washington State federated club.

Ho ho ho and welcome to the season of yuletide cheer and dancing parties!

My experience is that the holidays are harder for solo dancers than for couples. Why? Because everyone wants to be with their special person on a special night. My own inclination, as a single woman, is to dodge the event rather than show up and end up watching everyone else have a good time on the dance floor while I spend my time hoping that someone is willing to sit out and encourage their partner to dance with one of the single dancers. When I do show up with a partner, as I look around the room, other people may feel the way I do, because during a special holiday dance, there are seldom single dancers that are waiting for another single dancer to show up.

The solution to this conundrum is to plan ahead. Chances are you have been to enough dances to get a feel for the singles who regularly show up and don't have a dance partner. You may be reluctant to invite them to go with you to a special dance, not wanting to send the message that you find them special, and you want to become more than a dance partner. There is nothing wrong in saying, "I would like to go to the New Year's Eve dance, but I'm afraid if I go without a partner, I won't have anyone to dance with. Were you planning on going?" The answer could be yes or no; either answer is okay. If it is yes, simply ask if they will save you a few dances and see where it goes from there. If no, go on to the next single dancer on your list. The point is, if you decide to stay home, other single dancers may be staying home for the same reason, and all of you will not be able to enjoy the big dance of the season with the group of dancers that have become an important part of your network of friends (or your entire social life, as in my case).

If you decide to go by yourself and take your chances, then you will need to be **VERY BOLD**. **Take a deep breath and as soon as the music starts, get yourself into a square and hold up your hand for a partner. Someone will join you before the caller begins his tip. I've never seen an instance where the square had to sit out for lack of an 8th dancer** (assuming there were more than eight people to start with).

A Last Saturday I went to the Roamin' Tacomans first Saturday dance with Andy Garboden and Charles Morehead. There were two squares of dancers, and we were very pleased to welcome three visiting single dancers from other clubs and councils. Fortunately, we had three single dancers show up from our own club, so everyone was able to dance just about every tip. Once of the visiting dancers had not danced in ten years, but one would never know it... like getting on a bicycle. It was a very fun evening, mostly because everyone wanted to dance with "the new guys." Keep that in mind if you are undecided about wandering outside of your own council.

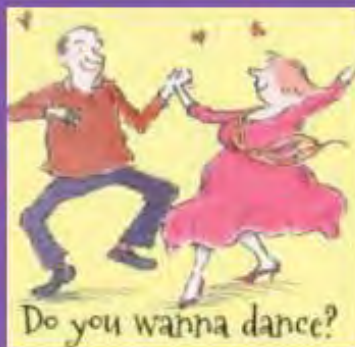

Throughout the day, we will identify varying dance halls on the Program with RED to indicate that this is where Solos can gather during these times and hopefully find partners.

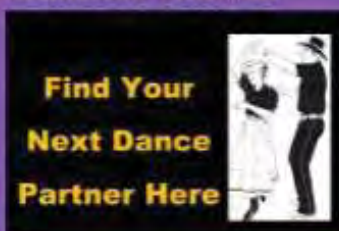
