There are still no bids for State Festival 2014.

New slate of officers was given – 93% of ballots were returned.

Education presentations at the 61st National Convention will be on the WA State website for 1 year after the Convention. Our promotion trifold is also on that web site & can be downloaded.

Historian/Librarian pleads for pictures and flyers for the scrap books. Publicity & Promotion Margaret Kiser has Washington pins to pass out at Convention and the Showcase of Ideas trifold is ready also.

Leadership Seminar officers for 2013 are Chairman Darlene Jolly, Vice Chairman/Secretary Joyce Sebree, Treasurer/Registration Oren &Lew Gaskill, Facilities, Terry & Mike Grater, Publicity & Promotion Cathy & Cliff Bruhn.

Don & Lynda Congrove were reappointed to the Heritage Center for another 4 year term as XP's & Bonnie Burnett for a 4 year term as a Dancer at Large.

Joyce Sebree was appointed for a 2 year term to the Leadership Seminar.

Heritage Center officers for 2012-13 are Chairman Don Congrove, Vice Chairman Marguerite Villars, Secretary Judy Ottoson & Treasurer Sharon Broom. Their treasury is \$9,869.12

The 61st National Convention reports there are 1/3 of Washingtons dancers registered.



President Tom Tomlinson reported that the By-Law review committee will be completed on or before the winter meeting of 2014. He will not be dissolving the clogging committee yet.

If you have purchased a new square dance license plate, be sure to let Gailyn Ploeg know the number & your name & club.

Since we have no editor for Footnotes, President Tom appointed a special committee to review the situation. There are 14 people on it headed up by Kathy Chase,

These ideas I will be sharing with you are not Mainstream they are not going to be embraced by all, accepted by all, thought to be the best and certainly not the only way. Today's discussion will involve Recruitment.

Lessons & Clubs.

Councils

Callers and Cuers

Leadership: The position or function of a leader: an act or instance of leading, guidance, direction.

This is leadership taking on tough issues and problems. Caller/Cuers and Dance Leaders we share more common ground than uncommon. We are all on the same team with the same color jersey, let's focus on these points.

Are we leaders going to lead like MacArthur or Custer?

Here are some of my thoughts, please remember these are not the best ideas to come around, nor the only ideas, but they are what I feel.

#### RECRUITMENT

Invite the public to our dances/functions and advertise in non-square dance formats to have the public come watch. "Free coffee and Food".

When was the last time we had visitors or even asked friends to watch us at a

dance... very rarely? Picnics, Christmas parties, anniversary dances these are opportunities.

Use Facebook turn off the radio it works!!!

Perfect NO,

Issues /concerns sure but right now nothing is better

If you use Facebook put that you are a Square Dancer, don't hide it... be proud of it.

Use Groupon or other sites like that to recruit for lessons.

Get a web site for you Club

#### **CLUB LESSONS**

All club members must recruit.

I believe the Councils need to subsidize with financial support those clubs within their Council that have beginning lessons. If your Council has funds spend some of it, NOT having lessons and clubs folding (for me) is unacceptable... this must stop now!

If you have 20 couples in your club they each need to bring at least 1 person... just 1... that would mean your members brought 2 ½ squares alone. We need to grow 1 square at a time, time re build, please make that commitment.

All students should be made members of the club after X number of weeks, get them a badge, make them feel welcome and wanted. People miss that feeling of welcome and being included right from the start.

Go back after former dancers, people who dropped out or didn't finish. They may have had a job or status change. Go back after them. If you used email addresses you can find them quickly.

#### **CLUB DANCES**

There should be NO Greeters ALL should be Greeters.

Make your members and guest welcome and wanted.

Keep the announcements at dances SHORT & CONCEISE. Many a good dance ends at the break when announcements are made. Door prize; draw the tickets and staple the winning ticket on the gift ahead of time. Place them in the area where they paid and signed in and let the dancers know where the prizes with winning tickets are and let them pick them up.

With new Dancer or Student dances limit Rounds as these people don't do rounds. Introduce a mixer or line dance limited also, these students are here to Square Dance, let them do so. A small concession is needed on these 1 or 2 dances a year.

Star tips should be at the end of the dance afterwards.

Councils

Support each other's dances Mt Baker, Rainer, Central Puget Sound, Peninsula and others.

Clubs don't compete with your Council Dance.

Find out about live music for a Council Dance, Ghost Riders example, with maybe a local band or group live music draws people.

Callers/Cuers

What is your Brand? How is it viewed? Is it the same by you as with

#### dancers?

Get excited about your work.

Don't be boring.

Change your music and material.

Study your craft.

Go out and dance.

Be assessable.

Be a better listener.

Be a Callerlab or ACA member, be a Roundalab member.

Be a member of your local Teachers and Callers Organization.

Teach, it is our future and yours.

Share your talents with other callers.

Fees need to represent a base fee + Travel, and maybe a bonus.

The National event showed us a lot of great thing happening and was a charge to our spirits as leaders. Keep in touch with panel members, other leaders and share your ideas and our events with them, prove to them we are striving to be "Best in Class" keep those friendships going.

No matter where any credit may go we all share in the wins and loses. Share the workload and the love of our activity will grow.

Thank you so very much for your time and attention. It has been my honor to with you today. You all make a difference and I thank each one of you for your hard dedicated work and for the care you give to Square Dancing.

There are so many wine and grape related prints available and they don't all have to be purple. Use any color any style. Once you get your outfit made, wear it to lots of dances. Let everyone know that you are going to State Festival.

# Listen While You Work

There is a big difference between being alone and being lonely. At times being alone without any noise or distraction allows you to concentrate completely on a project. You can think about what you are doing and focus on the details. Other times, when working on a less demanding project, it is nice to have a bit of noise to keep you company. It is also handy to be able to turn the noise off when you need to concentrate on a particularly tricky spot or to answer the phone.

TV can be too distracting to the eyes and without watching you don't get the whole story. Trying to sew while watching TV is very dangerous! When the needle is moving, you should have your eyes on your hands and their position near that needle. A sewing machine needle will go right through your finger. It has enough force to pierce the finger nail and the bone. This has happened to many distracted stitchers.

The radio is a safer option for a little ear enjoyment while you work. The

problems with radio stations are they do not always play the music that you want to hear and they have a lot of commercials. Set up your computer in the same room as your sewing machine and log on to Pandora Radio. You can design your own station. If it plays a song you don't like you can delete it and it will not be played again. Give a thumbs up to the songs you like and they will go into your file. Then it will search for similar songs that you might like. You can even set up more than one station and play blues one day and classical the next.

Also on the computer you can listen to audio books. Listening to a book is great fun. Having someone read you a story while you stitch really makes the time pass quickly. It is better than TV because you can pick they type of story you like, you can pause it when you leave the room and you can rewind it if you miss a clue. (I listen to a lot of murder mysteries.) There are inspirational, motivational, educational and biographical audio books as well as fiction. Libravox is one free audio book site. There are thousands of books to choose from in many different categories. This site only has books whose copyright date has expired. That is not always a drawback. All of the Sherlock Holmes books are there. This volunteer site is part of Project Gutenberg which is trying to put all books on the internet. This is an interesting project and you can get involved for free.

For more current books I log on to my local library web site. Using my library card number I can down load newer books without charge. After listening to them, I return them so that they are not cluttering up my computer. If you do not return them they will just go away on their due date. They can also be down loaded to a portable device, like an iPod or an MP3 so you can take the story with you.

Audio books on CD or cassette, from the local library, are another way to enjoy a story while stitching. There are thousands of them and they are free with your library card. Set up a boom box near your sewing machine and play them as you sew. Once you get started on audio books you will really enjoy the ability to select just the story you want to hear.

The main drawback to listening while you sew is the noise of the machine. You will need to turn up the volume to be able hear while you are stitching. To increase your listening enjoyment get a pair of those big puffy over the whole ear head phones. They will keep out the noise of the sewing machine and allow you to clearly hear the narrator. (This is of vital importance when listening to murder mysteries.) They are also more comfortable than the small things you are suppose to stuff in your ears.

The best way to enjoy sewing and company is to attend classes on sewing. Check with sewing machine dealers or fabric stores near you for classe; Learning new techniques that will make your sewing easier and faster. You will find new friends who share your interest in material things. Then you can invite them to square dance lessons.

## Dear Square Dancing Friends,

Over recent years, we have collected aluminum tabs for kidney dialysis research. We strongly believe that research is the answer to help those with kidney disease to be able to live normal lives. We originally collected the tabs to turn them into Northwest Kidney Centers. We soon learned that they do not receive the tabs themselves so we began the process of collecting the tabs, hauling them to the recycle center (that pays the most per pound) and saving the dollars. To these dollars we have added our contribution. We have been blessed by the tab donations from square dancers everywhere. We thank you all from those that give us small and large bags to those that have asked others to help collect and give us huge bags and boxes! Every tab counts. This has finally resulted in a donation of \$1,500.00.



We recently contacted NW Kidney Centers and asked for a meeting to present this donation and they arranged for us to be on the agenda for the Board of Directors meeting on April 10 of this year. At this meeting, we presented the check to the Chairman of the Board and assured them that square dancers would continue

to work toward another donation in the near future. They expressed their appreciation and sent a thank you letter for all those involved in making this donation possible. Thank you, all!!

Wonderful news! As a result of many years of research, UW Health Sciences/UW Medicine and NW Kidney Centers recently announced that a wearable artificial kidney, designed as a new treatment for kidney failure, will be tested in Seattle! This is a battery-powered wearable artificial kidney and in its current form weighs about 10 pounds and is worn in a belt around the waist. The goal is to free end-stage kidney disease patients from being tethered for several hours for three or more days a week to a dialysis machine. The goal is to, if necessary, operate around the clock, seven days a week like normal kidneys.

Again, we want to express our thanks to our square dancing friends for past and continued efforts. Without you, we wouldn't be able to do this.


