

This will be the 14th year we have presented this great scholarship to a deserving young square dancer. OUR FUTURE! I 'm sure a lot of you don't know how this all got started.

At the January 2,000 State meeting, Bill and Linda Lundin made a motion to give out a \$500.00 Scholarship to a well deserving youth in our state. It was discussed and passed. At the May meeting we decided to call the first one the Kenn Trimble/Arland Pilot Memorial Youth Scholarship in memory of both my father and Arland who had recently passed and were very much involved with our square dancing youth. At that time the original monies was to come out of the federation funds, but there were so many donations given in Dad's and Arland's name that we didn't need a single dime from the treasury. It has been the same ever since. It has been wonderful how generous our family of square dancers have been with all the donations. In the past 14 years we have given out 20 scholarships. In 2006 the name changed to the, now known, Timothy Dale Boggs Memorial Scholarship in memory of Vern and Kathy Boggs son Tim.

This summer we are happy to announce that we raised the amount of the scholarship from \$500.00 to \$750.00. If you have a student in your club or know of one in a different council, please let them know about this. Tell them to go on line and print out the application and send it to Erin Harth, who happens to have been awarded the scholarship in 2007. She has been the chairman of this committee since 2010 and is doing a wonderful job. Thanks Erin. And thanks to the others who have been Youth Chairman since this all started.



Many of us personally, and all of Square Dancing in Washington, lost a



Renewal time now more important than ever



By the time you read this, the council treasurers should have received the club renewal instructions for the 2014-2015 season. We are following the same procedure as last year hopefully to make the renewal process a little easier. Instead of handing out packets at the winter state meeting, which would then be passed on to the councils, and then passed on to the clubs, we are going to email the renewal instructions directly to each council treasurer. Our reasoning is that we realize each council is different in their requirements for renewing their clubs so the instructions we send out are subsequently modified by each council. We would ask each council to assist clubs that may have difficulty filling out the on-line form. Councils need to remember, they are also considered a 'club' in the annual club renewal process.

Clubs remember, these are club renewals under the direction of your councils and returned back to your councils. We, Membership and Insurance Chair, will be mailing out the individual forms, invoices

and instructions for the year 2014-2015 directly to every club treasurer in March. Remember, this is the process that requires an updated membership list along with a check for \$6 per member sent directly to us, the Membership and Insurance Chair. We will talk more about this in the next issue.

The membership and renewal process must go through a structured procedure dictated by the bylaws and standing rules. We make every attempt through ingenuity, suggestions, direction, etc. to make this process as clear, concise and understandable as possible. This procedure requires deadlines that MUST be met. We send out the requests in February and March and ask that they be returned to us by May 31st so we can complete a variety of actions necessary for the coming year.

Our insurance fiscal year ends August 31st. Our bylaws now state any club not completing their renewal process by September 1st will be dropped from the federation rolls. If you are dropped, you will have to start

over again as a new club. Folks, we don't want to lose clubs. We CAN'T afford to lose clubs but, #1 we can't jeopardize our insurance, #2 it's not fair to those who do comply, and #3 it makes our job exceedingly more difficult.

We would like to remind you again that when the old four part paper form was converted to the electronic on-line format each line on the form contained specific instructions as to what information should be entered in that field. In order to 'see' this information, all you have to do is put your cursor in that field (do not click in the field, just put your cursor in the field) and leave it for two or three seconds. Lo and Behold!! Information magically appears as to what belongs in that field!

Also, there are some fields that were changed last year. The following are the fields that were changed:

'Secretary 1' has been changed to read 'Recording Secretary'. 'Secretary 2' has been changed to read 'Corresponding Secretary'. The old 'Delegate #1' field now has a drop-down window where you may choose either 'Council

Delegate #1' or 'State Area Delegate' depending on whether you are filling this out as a club or council.

The old 'Delegate #2' field now has a drop-down window where you may choose either 'Council Delegate #2' or 'State Nominating Delegate' depending on whether you are filling this out as a club or council.

The old 'Caravan Chair' field now has a drop-down window where you may choose either 'Club Caravan Chair' or 'Council Publicity and Promotion' depending on whether you are filling this out as a club or council.

This should facilitate the completion of this form.


Seminar to be weekend of fun and info



The separation is in the preparation

In that light, I want to quote Russell Wilson, "The Separation is in the Preparation". You might ask how that statement is relevant to our Calling and/ or Cueing activity. Do you ever wonder why some Callers and/or Cuers are in higher demand than others? You know the ones I am talking about. They always seem to get booked for the special dances, regional and national festival.

I would suggest that it is completely relevant in that preparation is important in all aspects of life especially a professional caller or cuer. Initially as we launch our calling or cueing career, we prepare. We purchase sound equipment, computers, music, and various other physical aspects of the business. These days we purchase an ASCAP / BMI license thru ACA, Callerlab or Round A Lab. All of this is done in the preparation to participate as a caller or a cuer. As a new caller or cuer we prepare by organizing our dance, then practicing for the presentation.

At one point I found myself slipping on my preparation. While I planned the music, I had fallen back on the other aspects of the event. What was my goal for that evening's dance? Was there a choreographic theme I wanted to present? Was there a creative aspect I wanted to develop? I could go on. Suffice it to say, I found myself a bit complacent and comfortable in my role as the caller. Fortunately for me, I have a partner who, when she saw this characteristic evolving, had the confidence to "enlighten me".

When contemplating what to write about in this article I asked myself how many of you might be in the same boat. Someone mentioned that they recently danced to a caller who was using the same music and choreography month after month. I do hope this dancer was not referring to me, and I hope you feel the same.

Preparation is much more than those items I mentioned above. I know a National Caller who reviews every aspect of his dance before he presents it. This includes music and choreo, but it also extends to what clothes he wore, and jokes he told, etc. You might think this is a bit over the top, but rest assured this caller does not present a carbon copy of a dance he did for the same club five years before.

On the other side of the coin, I was dancing to a National Caller who after a particularly difficult sequence stated "I guess that didn't work so well". A lady on

the floor loudly exclaimed "It didn't work when you called it last month in New York either"! While it might not have been courteous on her part to express her frustration in that manner, never the less it was clear this caller had not prepared in advance of the event and was calling the same material repeatedly.

Keep in mind, dancers travel. As I call for three clubs locally and travel to a degree, it is extremely important I keep this in mind. I may have to entertain the same dancers at my tiree home clubs only to see them show up at one of my out of town gigs. Do you ever ask yourself "how prepared am I"? If you are well prepared, I believe it will resonate as you present your dance.

Preparation also enters into aspects of your business. Yes, taking money for calling or cueing makes you a professional. Calling and Cueing is a business and should be treated as such. Most of the business we do is a cash transactional business as defined by the IRS. I have discussed taxes with you in a previous article, so I will not bore you with more of that. I will, however, state that in my opinion, regardless of the amount of money we make (some make more than others), we owe it to the dancers and our colleagues to purport ourselves as professionals. Keep copious records, report your income, and make certain you are licensed. Continue to go beyond just planning your dance; practice and be fully prepared. In short, remember you are a Professional Caller or Round Dance Cuer. That title is something to be proud of.

Choreo Gems

Here is a singing call break I found recently. The dancers seem to enjoy it.

Heads Promenade 3/4 Sides Right and Left Thru Sides Flutterwheel Double Pass Thru Leaders Trade 8 Chain 2 Touch ¹/₄ Scootback Swing Promenade Progression: Corner Teaching Hints

Remember to ask the students if they are struggling with any particular call. They will tell you and you can work it into your evening lessons.

Teaching Jewel

I have recently incorporated Veer to the Left / Right much earlier into my teaching routine, substituting it in various ways for Right and Left Thru, Pass Thru, Pass thru and Wheel Around. This is working successfully for me. I have found it gets the new dancers to touch hands with the dancer beside them more automatically. You may want to give it a try.

Example;

The original sequence for a one night stand or first lesson:

Heads Circle Left 3/4, Pass Thru. With the Sides Circle Left 3/4, Pass thru Face your partner Pass Thru – Allemande Left.

Same result using Veer Left and Right.

Heads Promenade Half Way, Then Veer Left and Bend the Line. Veer to the Left then Veer to the right. Veer to the Right and Bend the line. Pass thru face your partner. Everyone Veer Left and Veer Right, Corner Allemande Left.

Yo Baby!

Oh! I am so ready for spring. It's been so cold in much of the United States that I really don't like saying that out loud. We that live in the Pacific Northwest really can't complain about bad weather. Sure, we've had a few low temperatures but not much snow, and yes, a little rain, but we are very lucky to live where we do. So, I guess I will leave that subject alone and get to the "classics".

Washington has been doing monthly Round Dance selection and recognition since September of 1961. According to the information that I have, Classic Round Dances were recognized in June of each year beginning in 1968, and that was changed to March of each year in 1981. What exactly is a Classic Round Dance? A Classic is a dance that has withstood the test of time. It's a dance that has been danced, danced, and used by many of the cuers/ instructors. The members, of the international group called Roundalab, vote on the dances they believe should be designated as Classics. The criteria they use is that the dance is known and danced by many, many dancers and can be requested at a dance in many areas.

Green Door, Roses For Elizabeth, Miss Frenchy Brown, and King Of The Road are just a few of the Classics that have been danced for many years. Some of the newer ones are My Song, All Shook Up, Except For Monday, and Fishin' In The Dark. To keep these dances active, and alive and well, it was decided to annually have a Classic Round of the Month. There seems to be something in a lot of these dances that takes a quick "peek at" and it's always fun to learn a past Classic dance.

Oregon also has a Classic of the Month during March and the two dances are usually different ones. It's nice for those of us that live on the border of the two states to have two Classics to use.

The dance chosen by the committee for March is "Midnight In Moscow". This dance has not been a Washington Round of the Month. The song for the dance was created by a composer and a lyricist both from Russia, and the song has had several names. Leningrad Nights, Evenings in Moscow, Moscow Nights, and then the name as we know it, "Midnight in Moscow". The song began as a vocal and has been recorded as an instrumental. A gymnast used the instrumental in the 2008 Olympics, and her performance just happened to win her gold.

Move to the Beat of the Music

I began learning Square dance five years ago, after Scottish dancing for the previous twelve years. The club caller and dance teacher Jim Hattrick explains his main goal for Square dance lessons is to get dancers to "move to the beat of the music". Jim's popular teaching methods regularly attract 70 club members and new dancers to his weekly lessons in a friendly social setting. Moving to the beat of the music, while having fun with friends, sends a message of positive feelings to the limbic brain.

This year I expanded my interest to explore Irish Ceili dance, English Country dance, Contra dance, and International Folk dance. I had an opportunity to observe how all these folk dance forms approach teaching dancers to move to the beat of the music.

Teachers of all dance forms guide dancers among the actions:

1. Dance while moving to the beat of the music

2. Move to learn the pattern to the music or leader's count


3. Stand and observe others move to learn the pattern to the music or leader's count

4. Stand and listen to the leader talking

An effective dance teacher strikes a balance among the necessary actions, with the goal to spend as much time as possible on action number one.

I originally observed that Square dance has more continuous motion compared with Scottish dance. The caller announces the next move just in time for dancers to flow through the dance figures. On the other hand, Scottish dance motion with the skipchange step is twice as fast as walking, and the pas-de-basque setting step is more aerobic, so we need resting time between bursts of energy.

Since I practice several folk dance forms, I designed an experiment to measure the percentage of time I am moving during various dance activities. I have a goal to keep moving, and I have been wearing a pedometer for three years to measure my progress. In addition to measuring steps, my current pedometer measures



"Activity Time". The timer runs while I am moving and pauses when I am inactive. I use a stopwatch to record the elapsed time during a dance or a dance class and I also record the activity time. I reset the activity timer and start the stopwatch after sets have formed and the dance leader begins teaching or briefing a dance, and stop the stopwatch after the final chord of the dance. I pause the stopwatch when some unavoidable technical delay or unrelated reason occurs. The ratio of activity time to elapsed time gives the percentage of time I was moving:

Activity Time Percentage =

Activity Time ÷ Elapsed Time x 100

I gathered activity data for 72 dancing events over 16 weeks. Most of the data was for Scottish dance (52 hours) and Square dance (35 hours), and I made an effort to get a sense of activity for other folk dance forms. We can view my Average Activity Time Percentage results in the chart. The Square dance "Dance" activity led with 86%, and the "Class" activity averaged 60% when the caller taught the moves. The Scottish dance "Dance" activity averaged 51%, and the "Class" activity averaged 38% for teaching dances. English Country dance averaged 52%. Other folk dance forms averaged in the 61-73% range.

The activity time measurement excludes the intensity of physical activity and interest level, so we need to interpret the results. After each dancing event, I subjectively noted whether the event gave me a positive, neutral, or negative interest level. I observed a strong correlation between Activity Time Percentage and interest level. Scottish dance classes with a value greater than 40% were generally positive interest, while less than 40% gave me a neutral or negative interest level. All Scottish dance "Dances" were positive. Irish Ceili dance and Contra dance have the quality of being both aerobic and high Activity Time Percentage. Square dancers move to the beat of the music with walking steps, and I am able to increase the walking energy with more spring in my steps and travel the moves with a slightly longer path.

Square dance caller Jim Hattrick teaches weekly Plus, Basic, and Mainstream lessons for three hours. The Plus and Basic lessons are divided into two or three periods with social breaks. I observed a pattern of less activity while teaching new dance moves for the first period, followed by greater activity while practicing the moves for the second period, with a focus on moving to the beat of the music.

This article finally explains to fellow dancers and dance teachers who have been curious about the numbers I have been writing on Post-it notes while dancing. Interested readers can contact me to view the spreadsheet file with the activity time data. I would like to thank my dance teacher friends for your skilled and entertaining teaching efforts.

Hoedown Sweater

I am so proud of myself. I finished this sweater. It is a vintage picture knit that was originally published in 1957. The knitting is not difficult. All of it is straight knit and purl. The hard part was keeping track of all the color changes. I took the pattern to the copier and enlarged it double. Then as I completed each row I marked it off with a highlighter. The pattern was free with the purchase of varn. The pattern includes raglan and set-in sleeves; I did the set in style. The instructions include Fair Isle and Colored Pattern techniques which are used in this sweater. There are also changes for making this a button front sweater.

This pattern only comes in man's sizes. The original back length would have been about 28 inches. I shortened mine down to 23 inches. The sleeves were also way too long. If you are interested in more information about the changes I made please contact me at the email address in the header.

This copy righted pattern is from Mary Maxim Inc. (www.marymaxim. com) I called the company (1-800-962-9504) because this pattern is not in their current catalog. The name is Hoedown #447. They were very nice and

helpful. This is TITAN bulky weight yarn and the gauge has to be correct or the dancers could end up looking very odd. You can see the different colors of TITAN available on their website.

You can't see it in these pictures but the man's pants are brown and the lady's skirt is green. The background is cream colored. The notes

on the bottom are brown with green lines. The selection of colors is

up to you. You will need to get eleven skeins for the background, one skein for his pants & her hair, one skein for face & legs and one skein for her dress & his shirt. The original pattern has treble clef signs on the sleeves. I omitted them.

Do you have a **Square Dance** License Plate?

by Gailyn Ploeg Washington State Federation License plate coordinator

Have you sent your most recent number to me and also told me which plate (s) you had that are no longer registered?

DO YOU WANT A COPY OF THE LICENSE PLATE LIST? **THE 2014 EDITION IS READY** TO SEND OUT!

Square Dance License Plates are available from any Licensing Agency. All you have to do is take your vehicle registration or license "Renewal Notice" to your local friendly Department of Vehicle Licensing Agency.

To purchase a Square Dancer plate will cost \$67.75 for a vehicle requiring two plates, plus the subagent fee and any required registration fees. The \$67.75 contains the \$40 fee for the Square Dancer background, a \$10 per plate original issuance fee, \$2 per plate reflectivity fee, a \$3.75 filing fee.

Unlike most special plates there is no extra charge to renew a vehicle with a Square Dancer plate. If you change cars, the plates may be kept and transferred for a small fee.

After 7 years, by state law, you must replace your plates. When a plate needs replaced at 7 years the renewal fee will be \$24 more than usual (\$10 per plate original issuance

fee & \$2 per plate reflectivity fee) and if the customer wants to keep the same license plate number they can pay an extra \$20. There is no extra fee if vou accept a new number. These fees are state mandated. You may have additional fees charged by a private licensing agency.

Your new square Dancer Plate will expire exactly on the same date as the plates being replaced. Therefor you can make the change whenever you wish.

These are better than Vanity Plates because it does not cost you anything additional each year to keep them. It is a one-time only fee as described above every 7 years.

To the best of our knowledge there are currently about 900 registered Square Dance Plates on vehicles. It is our goal to keep the Washington State License Plate information as up to date as possible.

Please send me your latest license plate numbers by email, noting any new numbers and indicating the deletion of any old numbers. Please state your registered name, all Square
