

Wayne Easton • 50 years and still calling



Easton was honored by over 200 family members, friends and square dancers at the Meridian Grange Hall in Kent, Washington to commemorate his 50 years of calling!

The following is how Wayne became involved in square dancing which eventually led to his interest in becoming a square dance caller.

"In 1960, my wife Annie wanted to square dance. We joined a class for their last eight lessons with our neighbors, Bob and Jackie George (Bob is still dancing). When lessons were over, we joined the club, Belles and Beaux in Burien. The caller was Hank Van Asselt.

We danced for approximately seven months before we discovered there was more to square dancing than the club we belonged to. We formed a close friendship with four couples and found ourselves dancing two to three

times a week. Our little group found
the dancing hours of 8:00 pm until midnight
not to be enough dancing for us, so we would
go to one of our four homes and continue
dancing. The problem was – no caller. Three
of the men would do one record each for up to
two hours. The outcome: our material had to
be expanded. Approximately six months later, I
would perform my first call for a regular square
dance. It's noted that I did not sing a note, but
talked the whole dance, scared to death!

In mid 1961, I taught a square for our church and shortly thereafter, we formed a new club called "The Tumbleweeds". We danced in Burien for about three years and later relocated to Hagen's Barn in Renton.

In the mid 1960s, Annie and I started a pre-teen club in Normandy
Park called The Buckskin Kids who are still dancing today. Shortly thereafter, we took on the Mavericks at the request of their advisors when they made a caller change. They would go on to win 13 grand championships

in International Competition over a 15-year period. Mike

DeSisto and Kevin Thomaier, two
Callers and Theresa Lusby, a Cuer went on to much success from experience gained as teenage square dancers.

In the beginning, all dance material was done in the following style: Introduction, two figures, center break, two figures, ending. The four figures would be the same with only a progression of the ladies positions. I and another caller (Jack Nichols) started what is today known as "sight calling". We later found that this system was springing up in many areas, mainly in workshops. Calling became easier for us because we did not have to memorize or read the material.

I have called for numerous clubs over the years, the longest being over forty years with Samena Squares and Wagon Wheels. I'm still calling for Wagon Wheel Squares of Kent, Washington. I also call for the Rings 'n Swings at the Kent Senior Center. I have been calling for the Exhibition Team, Dream Weavers for over eight years.
I have called in
the Canadian towns
of Prince Georae.

Chase, Lake Shuswup, Vancouver and Kelowna and both sides of the mountains in Washington State. I have also called on cruise ships in the Caribbean, Hawaii, Mexico, and Juneau, Anchorage, and Fairbanks in Alaska.

I am proud and grateful to have been able to raise my family surrounded by square dancers. The relationship with hundreds of people, who in many ways have become an extended family. The feelings, laughter, friendships and support I have found are beyond compare. I have enjoyed teaching others the joy of square dancing and working with other callers.

The fifty-three years of square dancing have flown by so very fast and I am very happy to have shared them with a special friend, Mike DeSisto.

Are you good enough?

Retention and recruiting seem to be the main topic of any square dance conversation. In past articles I've talked about methods of getting new dancers, how to teach and nurture them, and then how to keep them. We've also touched on the many reasons dancers leave the activity. This month let's focus on the ways we can retain not only the new dancer, but the experienced dancer as well.

Most people, who enjoy activities such as ours, are also willing to invest in them. I'm not speaking just monetarily, but with time and energy too. Therefore it seems to me that it is vitally important that dancers have something to do. Give them a method to contribute. New dancers could be encouraged to serve as greeters, or hosts & hostesses. Later they and more experienced club members could be asked to serve on committees (even chair one). Perhaps filling a vacant club office or writing the Footnotes article. Introduce them to the local council, they may become you next delegate or even more.

I've heard a considerable number of long term dancers complain about "burn out" regarding the many chores they perform for square dancing, however when the opportunity arises to allow others a chance to shine, they hold on tightly and say "no thanks I can do it". This fosters that non-welcoming attitude that is so destructive to our activity. You're actually telling people "You're not good enough to..." I ask you what possible harm can come from loosening up the reins and allowing new people to give an effort. You may just be encouraging the future state federation president.

I hope this gives you some ideas to try at your club. Let's truly make this "our" activity again and until next month I'll see you around the corner!

MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL DEADLINE = MAY 31ST

It's that time of the year again when we are working on membership renewals. So we take this opportunity to remind you the deadline is near, May 31st. Remember, Club Renewals are returned to your council; Individual Membership Renewals are mailed back to us. Hopefully, we will be able to collect a large number of club renewals at the state meeting in May. A few Individual Membership Renewals are trickling in to us, but we need to pick up the pace to get this completed by May 31st.

As usual, we are receiving inquiries as to the reason we are asking for these renewals so early. We sympathize with you as we do understand the problems involved, since we have also been club president, treasurer, etc. There are 150 clubs and councils and near 4,000 members in the Washington State Federation. All of the information we receive from you is entered into the database and cross-referenced multiple ways. Entering the information is relatively simple. Verifying the accuracy is not. Typos, mistakes, and response time

on verifying questions, are some of the reasons for the time involved. We cannot begin the verification process until we have received ALL of the renewals. Believe us, 90 days is not too long to solve these problems. Also, this information is used to construct the state directory. These folks need time to put this together.

We understand the problems you encounter collecting from your members. We suggest you send us what you have by May 31st. Obviously the people you do not collect from will not be paid up members for the coming year but they can be added as you collect from them. Another alternative to consider would be to adjust your club renewals to coincide with the state renewals. Hence, everyone will be collecting at the same time plus the information for the directory would now be current and not last year's information. Our insurance requires 100% participation of the members. We do not want to risk any problems on insurance claims due to the mistakes or inaccuracies of our membership base. We appreciate

your hard work and diligence in helping us to accomplish the above. We know it's not easy.

We've been asked the question "Do kids/teens pay the same state dues and insurance fees as adults?" The answer is "Yes", there is no discount on state dues or insurance fees for anyone. Remember, they are \$6.00 per person now. The reason for the increase is the addition of the 'door to door' coverage to our accident policy.

We need to apologize for our negligence in not maintaining the 'Frequently Asked Questions' under the M&I tab on the state web site. We have recently up-dated the FAQ's as of March 10th, and have actually dated each page which should help to give

you a better idea of their accuracy and help us to keep them up-dated. Check these questions out the next time you are in the web site and be sure to let us know if you have any issues that we can add to this document.

Remember, we're here to serve you. Don't be afraid to call us with any of your concerns or comments.

CARE AND STORAGE OF PETTICOATS

In the 1830's a linen material woven with horsehair was made. It was called crinoline and used for cloth petticoats. The word crinoline comes from the French crin meaning horsehair and line meaning linen.

Some articles say to lay the petticoat on its side in a box. Others suggest hanging the petticoat from a hook in the ceiling. People swear by each method, but no one has ever done a scientific test to see which works. The fact is, everything wears out. No petticoat will last forever. The life span will depend on the number of hours it is worn, the type of fabric, and the number of times it is washed. A few things can be done to extend the life of the petticoat.

Carry the petticoat to the hall in a bag, rather than wearing it in the car. This will reduce crushing due to sitting and seat belts. It also keeps it from getting ripped and dirty in the car door. Plastic bags should not be used because they can keep in dampness and odors. Cloth bags last longer than plastic and they can be closed at the top with a draw string. Go to SquareDanceSewing.com, click on Projects, then click on Slip Tote Bag. A bigger bag is easier to get the petticoat into than a smaller bag.

Make a bag to match each petticoat. This will make storage

and selection of the petticoat easier. When packing to go to Festival or Convention just grab the bags and stuff them in the car. If you are traveling by plane petticoats can be a problem. I put mine in a 'Space Bag' and sucked the air out. At the hotel I hung it in the bathroom while we took showers. The steam and heat fluffed it back up.

Don't wash the petticoat unless you have to; once a year should be more than enough for one that is worn frequently. The only part of the petticoat that gets 'dirty' is the waistband. At hot summer dances it may pick up some perspiration. To reduce this, always tuck the blouse into the pettipants so that the waist band of the petticoat is over the blouse, not against the skin. If needed, rinse out the waist band in the sink but don't get the entire petticoat wet. Washing the whole petticoat is a very gentle procedure

Set the washer for the gentle cycle, cold water and a very small amount of detergent. Put the waist band of the petticoat around the agitator and push the rest of it in evenly. Do NOT use fabric softener. After washing, hang the petticoat to dry. It can be fluffed up in the dryer by putting it in on low heat for a couple of minutes. Just allow it to get warm, then snatch it out and shake.

If you are having trouble with static electricity a fabric softener sheet safety pinned in the bottom of the bag should help. It has also been suggested to pin a small silver safety pin through a seam between the layers of the slip to dissipate the static. I don't know if this works, but it can't hurt.

If the petticoat is getting really limp it may be just worn out. There are several ways that have been devised to revive a dying petticoat. Sugar water, powered milk, liquid starch, white craft glue, floor wax and hair spray are just a few of the solutions that have been tried. All of those will flake off on your legs during dancing and they will become sticky in damp weather. All of them will have to be repeated if the petticoat is washed. They also make the fabric brittle so it cracks and tears easily.

The only permanent way to

bring some life back into a petticoat is with fishing line. Zig zag over fishing line along the bottom edge and on the seams between the tiers. For complete instructions go to SquareDanceSewing.com, click on Petticoats, then click on C.P.R., That stands for Crinoline Petticoat Re-fluffa-tation. This procedure takes a while but the results are permanent and worth the time.

We all want to save money, but sometimes it is best to treat yourself to a new petticoat. Petticoats are part of the fun of dancing. They are a costume and our heritage. When considering the purchase of your next petticoat don't get boring banal black or 'goes with everything' white. Get your absolutely favorite color in the brightest shade and light up the dance floor. Plan your new outfits around the special color of your new slip.

Healthy Notes

Ed note: Janolyn Keller is the caller and cuer for the Strait Wheelers in Port Angeles. She submitted this article to FOOTNOTES with the following message: "As I read the Footnotes magazine this month, I noticed the mentions of a lot of sick friends. I have loved the square dance community since 1979 and want to serve them now in a different way. We are losing so many dancers to disease and that is very sad. I am a health coach working with square dancers to reverse diabetes and other health problems so they can continue to dance until they choose to quit."

Summer is coming and with it comes longer days and longer dance events. The State Festival is 3 days and many other places put on 2 or 3 whole day dances that keep you moving all day.....but only if you can. Many of us have weight or energy problems that do not let us enjoy the full slate of events. We long to keep going, but our bodies won't let us. What would it be like for you if you could keep going and finish the weekend with full participation and enjoyment? For those who know me, I am called the "Energizer Bunny." Let me introduce you to some ideas that keep me going, and going, and going.

- 1. Sugar and caffeine are liars. They give you a short boost of energy then you crash, both physically and emotionally. Giving these up is hard, but the less you have in your diet, the more energy you really have. Stay away from the snack table at the dances. Unfortunately, they are loaded with sugar and you will quickly be drained of energy.
- 2. Drink plain water. Our bodies need the hydroelectric effects of water and it knows the difference between water and coke....it really does. And as I am dancing, I am losing enough through breathing and perspiration that I rarely have to take breaks to go to the restroom.
- 3. Sunshine and sleep. Get in the sun for at least 15 minutes each day. Soak in the Vitamin D and trigger nature's way of helping you sleep at night. I know that at Festivals, we really can't get our 8 hours, but we can be built up to handle those weekends.
- 4. Protein and complex carbohydrates. These are our best foods for energy. Eat protein at every meal, especially at breakfast and combine it with whole grains and fruit. My favorite is fresh rolled oats with honey, blueberries and eggs. I mix the eggs into the oatmeal as it finishes cooking and it is a one dish meal. Just this alone can keep me going for most of the day.
- 5. Supplements. Unfortunately our food supply is inadequate in nutrition so supplementation is necessary. Use good quality vitamin and minerals, as close to natural as you can find. And carry a whole food nutrition bar if you need a boost or just want to eat at breaktime and want to avoid the "table." Or better yet, bring protein for the snack table and help those who do not know.
- 6. Find the energy in the room. Hang around with the most energetic people and especially get plenty of "Yellow Rocks." Energy is transferrable through association. Totally get into the music, for that is truly energy out there for the taking. As a caller, I can energize the whole room by putting on certain music. I have seen it happen over and over.

This month the **MAVERICKS** and **BUCKSKIN KIDS** as well as many other teen clubs across Washington, Oregon and Canada are competing in the Pacific North West Teen Square Dance Festival. You will see what we have spent the last three months working so hard for.

But that is not what I am going to talk about this month. This month, I would like to talk about some of the differences between teen clubs and adult clubs. Like all adult clubs we love to dance, but on occasion it is hard for us to get to dances. Most adults have jobs and families they have to take care of before they can go to dances and sometimes can't even afford to go to a dance.

Well teens have school, jobs and most of us are not old enough to drive so we have to find someone to take us, and most teens dance between two and six nights a week and simply have no time to do anything, even breathe. Then we spend most of our money on things we really need and don't have much cash to spend anywhere else.

Often adult clubs, councils and the State Federation think the teens do not care to support other events in square dancing. This just isn't true. We would gladly go to more council meetings, but it is very hard for us to make meetings in the middle of the week. Especially because most of us teens dance between two and six nights a week.

Here is a list of the reasons we might not attend many adult club dances:

We dance at an intermediate or senior level and need more challenging plus opportunities. Most adult clubs don't dance at the level we need or like to dance to. Most clubs dance mainstream and for competition we need challenging plus dancing.

Many of the other adult clubs caravan; with our hectic schedules and parents schedules, our teen clubs just can't arrange that many caravans throughout the year. Often you will find us throwing together an impromptu caravan, just hours before a dance starts.

Often we don't come to adult dances because we don't want the adult clubs to think the ONLY reason we are there is to sell badges. We know that we are there from September-May and most of the time it is to sell badges. We actually feel quite guilty always selling the badges or asking for money.

We don't always care to wear square dance attire and appreciate being able to dress casual on occasion, and most clubs are square dance attire clubs.

There are some clubs that don't offer decreased or FREE dancing for the youth and we simply can't afford the door price. Neither can our parents.

The next time you find yourself questioning why you don't see more teens; please consider all of the above mentioned. Heck, most of us can't even plan a night to hang out with friends because our schedules change from week to week and we never know what is going to happen. But you can bet that if we had the time, money and way to get there and back we would be going to every dance we possibly could, and there are a lot of clubs that hold dances in our area that we would be more than willing to attend, but as stated above most times we just simply can't manage it. Between Square practice for competition, school, work and our home lives, there are not enough hours in a day to attend all the dances we would like.

There is a great feeling of hope for our type of dancing, as dancing numbers in general are rising, so what is happening with us? The top discovered way to attract and keep dancers was... better dancing! Who would have thunk it? The clubs that changed their format began to teach a thorough grasp of mainstream moves from all positions (1 year

classes) and then increased the dancing speed, have had the greatest success, and their clubs are still growing. What seems to be happening fairly universally is as dancers we become comfortable with the speed & accomplishment we currently dance at. Once that happens we tend to spend more time on the sidelines and less on the floor. New dancers come, they think maybe this isn't so fun long term, and slowly fade away. The clubs who have taken this dance better approach report that challenging the regulars to learning moves by position, and stretching to varied start points for those moves has been almost like sprinkling fairy dust, no one wants to be left out, and the new inductees catch the excitement and stay. As I listened to some of the discussions, I thought of the dance's that advertise 'hot hash' or high energy dances. Always packed! Often like sardines. So yeah, I can understand why this would work. (I wonder too: we used to add calls, new calls invented, could that be what drew the crowds back then? Hmmm)

The second and most often encountered obstacle that has to be overcome first is our willingness to save Square Dancing. What does that mean? We all do this to some degree or another, "but I like the way this is," "We have always done it this way," "We are happy just the way things are," "Why should we be the ones to change?" Do we REALLY want to promote dancing? Do we want people to love it like we do? Are we willing to challenge the 'status quo'? This was not flipping dancing on its ear, but the staid things. We need to not only be flexible to dance, but flexible in our minds too. Clubs tried many things, but this seemed to draw them closer together as they experimented because they all wanted to bring in the dancers. What would it take? Dancing different hours, changing dance nights, changing dance places. Fewer dances in the area, so more concentration of dancers at each dance, and more local demo's. There was so much diversity in effort. The point was, the successful, growing clubs were not afraid, but were willing to try new things. An attitude of "what if?" rather than "it won't work" is what's needed.

We are so spoiled! We have great people, have a super fun activity open to all ages, and we sometimes forget that there are a lot of folks out there that would love to do what we are doing in the atmosphere we are doing it.

People in this world need healthy touching; it has SO many health benefits alone. Boy have we got that! Who else has a special name for friendship hugs? Today's world isolates people. We like to be inclusive. I think sometimes, if we could really grasp how we could truly help others by getting them involved, our numbers problem would dissolve pretty quickly. Don't you?

Memories from Theresa Lusby (Nilsen), Original Buckskin Kids dancer at age nine in 1960. Theresa is a Square Dance Caller and Round Dance Cuer in Kasilof, Alaska.

I am one of the original Buckskin Kids, a Pre-Teen Club started by Wayne Easton, my father, Art Nilsen and Bob George in 1960.

Wayne and my dad took calling classes together. The first time Wayne called in public was in our basement when I was around eight years old. There were After-Parties back then after Square Dances. Everyone would come back to our house for more dancing, visiting and eating, of course! I can remember getting out of bed in my PJ's and watching everyone square dance in our basement. I loved listening to Wayne call even then!

I remember telling him that I wanted to learn to dance and he said if I'd get enough kids together, he would teach us. I recruited enough kids to make several squares! We started out at the Old Log Hall in Burien and then went on to Wayne and Annie's house off of 8th Avenue in Normandy Park. They had a great basement and it was full of kids every week!

When Wayne called for the Tumbleweeds in Burien, we would go to Baby Island in Whidbey Island every year. After Buckskins, I followed Wayne and Annie and danced with the Mavericks. Eventually, I became a Cuer and cued with Wagon Wheel Squares in Kent for a couple of years before I moved to Kasilof, Alaska in 2008. I really did have a great childhood with wonderful memories

of square dancing with lots of wonderful people!
