Educational Opportunities Abound

The Education Committee has put together a variety of Panels and Seminars that should be of interest to everyone. These are educational opportunities that you as a dancer, club member, or club leader, do not want to miss. Some of the topics will be presented on all three days, while others will be on just one or two days. The Education Rooms are easily accessible, as they are located in the Convention Center near the Ballroom Lobby.

A Panel is an audience listening activity that is conducted in a classroom setting with a moderator, and two or more panelists. The Panel members will make specific topical presentations based on experience, research and opinions followed by discussion. All Panels allow for audience participation through a question and answer session. Audiovisual aids and handouts may be used at the presentations.

A Seminar is also an audience listening activity with one or more persons providing the presentation. There are several to choose from over the three-day period of Convention. Each topic will be presented for 45 minutes, followed by 15 minutes of audience discussion. There will be Seminars presented by

representatives from CALLERLAB, ARTS, USDA, ROUNDALAB, CONTRALAB and other leaders of the activity.

The Leadership Certification Program recognizes participation at the various Panels and Seminars. For Certification, attendance is required at no less than four Core topic sessions, and at no less than two of the Elective topics. Those of you that started the Leadership Certification Program at the 60th NSDC in Detroit may continue completing the requirements at the 61st NSDC in Spokane. Those of you



that start the Program in Spokane, but are unable to complete it, may continue to completion at the 62nd NSDC in Oklahoma City.

So, while you are at the 61st NSDC, plan to attend as many Panels and Seminars as your schedule allows. You will be a better person for it; you will gain knowledge, and attain or work toward attaining Leadership Certification. Then you can take that knowledge back home and put it to good use.



Twice the fun in '81!

If you've been around Square Dancing for a long time you may recall this slogan. If you're wondering, it was Twice the Fun! The last time the National Square Dance Convention was in Washington State was 1981. That year it was held in Seattle at the Seattle Center. I was there, were you? According to the National Square Dance Convention there were 24,379 dancers registered for this convention. I was a teenager at the time and I recall many things about the convention. First, I recall lots of dancers all over Seattle. For the days during the festival it seemed you couldn't go anywhere in Seattle without running into someone in Square Dance attire. This was my first National Convention and I had never seen so many Square Dancers together in one place. The halls and vender booths were crowded and the weather was warm.

Second, I loved dancing with people from other nations. I hadn't been Square Dancing long when I attended the Seattle convention and I had no idea

that people square danced all over the world. I thought it was really amazing to be dancing with people from Holland, Sweden and Japan while listening to a caller from Germany. I mean really, where else can you do this?

Finally, on the third day of the convention, was the Pièce de résistance. A very special dance had been coordinated that would go down in Square Dance history. On June 27th, 1981 over 18,000 dancers participated in the World's Largest Square Dance. I was part of this dance and I recall how many people were there. It was a warm day – 71 degrees – and we were packed into Memorial Stadium like sardines. Everyone was there for the same reason, to make history. Clubs lined up for blocks, club by club, each carrying its own banner. They

marched into the stadium near the Space Needle. There, Marv "K", caller for the Buck's & Does of Seattle, took Square Dancing into the Guinness Book of World Records (1984 edition). He called to the most dancers on one floor by one caller. The numbers were so large that,



in order to count the dancers, the organizers had each square make a star. This allowed a helicopter hovering overhead to photograph the squares and allow for a more accurate count. The final totals - 18,520 dancers (2,315 squares). Now that's amazing!

I look forward to the next convention in Spokane. However, for me, the idea of attending 2 national conventions in the same state - 31 years apart - is hard to digest. For many, attending a national convention is the high point event of their square dance life. It's an experience that should not be missed. The shared experiences with friends and family will leave you with life long memories. If you live in Washington State now is the time to create those memories. You don't want to have to wait another 30 years before attending a National Convention. If you were there in '81 I'd love to hear about it. See you at the 61st National Square Dance Convention in Spokane.

Hello there. After 2 years of Jill being Round Dance Coordinator, I asked her if I could write an article and she agreed. I'm Roger, a Caller and the other half of Spiese and Spouse. The subject I chose to talk about this month is Cuers. Being a Caller, I never gave much thought to Cuers. They were someone to fill in between my tips, that is until Jill became one. I now have developed a healthy respect for Cuers as I quickly came to realize that Cuers work just as hard as Callers. Putting programs together, selecting music for dances and classes, and working on choreographing new steps, Cuers deserve our appreciation which they seldom seem to get.

I have the pleasure of working with two very good Cuers on a regular basis, Jill and Debbie Taylor. When I finish a tip, there is usually some applause whether because the dances liked it or they are glad it's over. When Cuers finish two rounds, they barely get any recognition. This is just not right. They deserve our applause as well because it takes both a good Caller and a good Cuer to put on a successful dance.

As a Caller, I think that it is important to remember that I am not the only person working over the course of the evening. While I might want to remain on stage after my tips, so that I can prepare for the next round of square dancing, I must remember that the Cuers need the stage too. Cuers are not up on the stage fiddling around or distracting me while I am trying to call, so they deserve the same respect from me while they are trying to cue. While this might mean that I have to spend a few more minutes preparing my program for the evening before I get to the dance, it is well worth it to show the Cuer I am working with the respect deserved. That is the reason I always vacate the stage to allow the Cuer the opportunity to work without interruption and I encourage all Callers to do the same.

Cuers are few and far between and we should take the time and energy to show them just how much they are appreciated. Dancers, I challenge you to make your feelings known to your Cuer about the dancing through applause. Whether you are celebrating because the dance went well or are just happy the darn thing is over with, let your Cuer know with a hearty round of applause. Callers, I challenge you to show your respect for your Cuer by arriving a few minutes early to set up your equipment and to take your conversations to the floor, allowing the Cuer command of the stage. Remember, that Cuers work just as hard as Callers and deserve the same amount of respect. Let's make this month, Cuer Appreciation Month. The Round of the month for June 2012 is:

Pressing is a Priority

"One third of your time fitting, one third of your time sewing and one third of your time pressing." The instructors repeat that, over and over, in classes on fine couture sewing. Pressing during construction is required for a professional look. Proper pressing requires technique and equipment.

How old is your iron? After many years of use the thermostat may be burned out. An iron that keeps even temperature at all settings is essential. Is the bottom clean and smooth? Is it spitting and sputtering? That brown gunk isn't rust, it is burnt mineral deposits from the water. To clean it out, fill the iron with white vinegar and let it sit over night. Then heat it up to 'cotton' and holding it over a folded up old towel, hold down the steam button. This really stinks but it is only vinegar and the smell fades rapidly. Unplug the iron and rinse well. Refill with water and iron over another towel with full steam to get all of the gunk out. If this doesn't work, get a new iron.

When selecting an iron look for one that is heavier. Light weight irons require you to push down more to set a crease. Do not get an automatic shut off iron. They are always shutting off just when you need them. Plug the iron and a lamp into a serge protector. Get in the habit of turning your iron on with the serge protector. If the iron is on, the lamp is on. That will remind you to turn off the serge protector when leaving the room.

Look at the ironing board. If it is old and wobbly with T-bar legs replace it. This is a matter of safety. The iron could slid off and hurt someone. Get a wide board with an iron rest on the end. The extra width will reduce the number of times you have to move the fabric, the iron rest will give you a safe place to set the iron and more of the board will be available for use. Look for a board with 4 separate legs. Make sure that it is heavy and sturdy. Before you buy, set it up in the store and put some pressure on it. A good board will cost more but it is not something you will buy again.

Set up the ironing board on the other side of the room from the sewing machine. This will require you to get up and walk to press. Frequently getting up and down will reduce cramps and swelling from sitting too long. When you get to the ironing board stretch you hands up to the ceiling. Your shoulders will appreciate a little range of motion exercise.

Make several covers for your ironing board. Take the old cover off and use

it for a pattern. Make the new covers about an inch bigger all the way around for a better fit. Fabric should be something like heavy muslin. Any white or light colored cotton fabric that can take the heat. After cutting out the new cover lay it over the board and pin in a couple of pleats at the back corners and the front. Don't make the pleats too deep or you will not be able to get the cover on and off. Sew the pleats and cut off the excess fabric.

Serge or zig zag around the bottom. Find some very strong thin string and a big needle. Starting at the front stitch around the cover about half an inch from the edge. Take big stitches, about an inch. When you get all the way around, over lap the hand stitching about an inch. Place the cover on the board and pull the string. Tie it off leaving long tails, so you can remove it again. Buy a pair of boys suspenders at the second hand store. Clip them to the cover under the board to pull the cover smooth. This is not very fancy or pretty, but it is fast and effective. I would rather spend my time making a new square dance dress than a new cover. When the cover gets dirty toss it in the wash and slip on a new one.

The best pad for the board is an old Army type wool blanket. Cut it a little smaller than the cover. It should come down over the sides of the board but it does not need to go under. Two layers should do the job. The wool can take the heat and it will absorb moisture from the steam.

Good pressing equipment will make the task easier. Stopping to press while sewing may seem to slow down the process, but this extra step will be evident in the extra compliments you receive on your creation.




very much as friends and hope to see them frequently on or off the dance floor. Jim and Dona we wish you the very best on your new adventure.






