# **Critical By-Law Changes**

Greetings!

PLEASE! Don't forget about the huge critical change in the by-law requirements for individual and club renewals. As always we have asked that the renewals be returned to us by May 31st to give us time to validate them. Then there was essentially a grace period that ran beyond the August 31st insurance expiration date to the Winter State Meeting at which point a club would be dropped if they had not renewed. The by-laws were changed to remove the grace period to comply with the insurance expiration date. In other words, **A CLUB WHICH HAS NOT COMPLETED THEIR ENTIRE RENEWAL PROCESS BY SEPTEMBER 1ST WILL BE DROPPED FROM THE FEDERATION AT THE FALL STATE MEETING.**

# SQUARE DANCER LICENSE PLATE OWNERS ARE YOUR PLATES LISTED AND UP TO DATE IN THE SQUARE DANCER LICENSE PLATE DIRECTORY?

We have created an electronic booklet of the Square Dancer License Plate Directory. The normal sale of vehicles along with the State of Washington mandated replacement of plates every seven years has resulted in a large number of errors and omissions in the current State License Plate Directory.

If the information about your plate is not included in the current directory, or the information is inaccurate please provide the plate number, your name, club membership and city of residence to:

If you email info to me, I will attach the latest updated publication back to you!

The License Plate Booklet is not and will not be available for sale. It will only be emailed at the individual request of a Washington Square Dancer who has a registered SD license plate, or who is a member of the Washington Square and Folk Dance Federation.

Square Dancer License Plates are available from any Licensing Agency. The cost is a one-time-fee of \$40.00 plus other issuance fees, currently totaling \$67.75. If you change cars, the plates may be kept and transferred for a small fee. After 7 years by state law you must replace your plates. In order to keep your same number it will cost an additional \$44.00 to make those plates again. There is no extra fee if you accept a new number. These fees are state mandated. You may have additional fees charged by a private licensing agency. Your new Square Dancer Plates will expire exactly on the same date as the plates being replaced. Therefore, you can make the change whenever you wish.

I suggest someone in the club survey the club members for plate information and send the results to me.

First and foremost we want to wish all Grandpas, Fathers, Uncles and Brothers, a very Happy Father's Day!



# What Does Your Club Do That Makes It Different?

As you know the major festivals and weekends are just around the corner. What makes these events seem to be better than our own club dances? Many will say "these events are larger so they are more fun". They are larger, but are they really more fun? If so you might want to ask yourself why?

Many of our Square and Round Dance Clubs have become rote (mechanical or habitual repetition). Club members attend the dance more out of a feeling of obligation than a true excitement for the dance activity itself. We all have a certain degree of culpability in creating this environment. Do you recall when you first started dancing? If you were like Marie and I, you were excited that you were going to a dance that evening. You were looking forward to seeing your friends, and wondering what choreography gems your caller and cuer would regale you with that night.

Why has that feeling changed for those of us who have danced for years? It could be that we all have some responsibility in creating this effect. Many of our Callers and Cuers continue to use the same old tired music and material. Many clubs have become complacent, repeating the same themes year after year. I am not suggesting that an annual "Special Dance" is a bad thing, only that we need to search for new ideas in how to present it. Any given club presents a theme for almost every holiday on the books. News Flash: So does every other club in your area. Just look at your local Square and Round Dance Publication. If it is Valentine's Day, how many Valentine's Day themed dances do you see?

I am of the opinion that if you want your dances to be well attended, you need to think "out of the box". One of my clubs, The Capital Singles, recently did this. Last April we held a Salmon Bake Dinner Dance. For this club it was a new theme and one of the best attended dances in several years. Food tends to bring dancers out. Special food such as Salmon brings more dancers out. This club took a risk and stepped outside of their comfort zone. The reward was a much larger dance than normal and a bolstering of their treasury. As the club caller, I had to step up as well. Most of my singing calls that evening had something to do with fish. I had to look hard but I found enough to compliment the Salmon theme.

Themes are a good way to generate interest, but keep in mind, you don't

necessarily have to stay with the old standards. Recently, another club I call for "The Prairie Steppers" held a Hobo Night as a new theme. They served Hobo Stew and I did a bunch of Train songs, wore Hobo garb etc. The evening had a packed hall and was a great success.

There are too many theme possibilities to name. I would encourage you to look at your upcoming dance season and see where there are opportunities to "think out of the box". If you are having trouble coming up with some ideas, the internet is a wonderful source. Even just going on Google and typing in "dance themes" will bring up a plethora of options. Remember, they don't have to be "square dance" themes. They can be any type of dancing (school, formal or even party themes). Keep in mind you can overdo it also. I know of a club that has two dances with the same theme in a season. They are seeing numbers dwindle, and I believe it has to do with the fact that this dance is not necessarily "special" any longer. It is "overdone".

As callers and cuers, it is our responsibility to help the club by coordinating our programs with dance themes. If the club is Mainstream and the theme is nautical, it is perfectly acceptable to, during the dance, teach them a standard Load the Boat. They only need to remember it for that evening.

Have you ever thought you could combine calls and develop a "special call" for the evening? A few years back a colleague of mine was doing an aeronautical themed dance. He used songs like "I'll Fly Away, Snoopy and The Red Baron, and Time For Me to Fly". Preparing for this dance he took a call out of the encyclopedia "Linear Weave to a Wave". "The basics of the call are Single Hinge, out facers Fold (the beginning of Linear Cycle) and the lead dancer then weaves by left shoulders then weave by right shoulders with the other dancers, facing to the right setting up a Right Hand Ocean Wave. Trailing dancers would follow facing to the left at the end to blend into to the right hand ocean wave".

You might ask what this as to do with a Plane theme dance? Nothing until he changed the name to "Fly That Plane". Dancers would spread their arms as if they were wings of a plane making the sound of an airplane and do the call. If done successfully they earned their 'Pilots License'. Yes it is corny, but the dancers had a ball. Isn't that what we all want? This is an example of a caller thinking "out of the box".

You can make your average club dance a great deal of fun. Keep it lively and make certain everyone is made to feel welcome. As callers and cuers, remember you are an Entertainer! Don't be afraid to step out of your comfort zone. It is much like the Army slogan "Be All You Can Be".

# **Choreo Gems**

Heads Right and Left Thru, Send her Dixie Style to a Wave, Boys Trade, Extend (Careful, a Left Handed Wave with the Boys in the middle) Swing thru (rights first), Chain Down The Line, Slide Thru, Left Allemande (or Swing).

# **Teaching Hints**

From time to time it is necessary to correct a dancer's position while teaching. As a teacher, you must be aware of those you can call out by name and those you can't. Some folks are really uncomfortable hearing their name called out. You must always keep your corrections in a positive manner. It is not our position to chastise a dancer, only to help them succeed. If you have a particularly difficult student, try addressing your comments to a nearby square or another couple in the square having trouble. I would also encourage to speak with those dancers you feel you can call out. (My wife calls them my "pick-onables". I talk to them ahead of time and tell them that from time to time I may call out their names even though they are correct. My goal is not to intimidate anyone but hopefully to gain the attention of the nearby dancer who is having trouble.

# **Teaching Jewel**

Mini Squares (Two Couples)

Mini Squares is a great way to teach a large number of calls. Using Mini Squares in Sicilian Circles, is a great way to teach Pass The Ocean, Swing Thru and Extend. This works well as a pre-cursor to full squares. You can have them Pass the Ocean then Extend to the next couple around the circle. This concept will work from any parallel wave formation, Left or Right handed.



# Fabric Width

Fabric seems to be getting narrower. Many bolts say 44/45 inches on the end, but are really about 40 inches wide. Always carry a tape measure to check the width of the fabric before buying. The chart on the back of the pattern envelope is usually for 45 and 60 inch wide fabric.

The length given on the pattern envelope is a generous amount. When laying out the pattern pieces in the diagrams they do not scrunch them together to try to save a couple of inches. Using the pattern yardage amount, and layout diagrams, you will be able to make the garment. When calculating yardage for fabrics with nap, one way designs or plaids at least an additional quarter yard in length will be needed. Most stitchers purchase an extra quarter yard of fabric just in case. This is not a bad idea, because mistakes can be fixed. It also fills up the scrap bin with chunks of fabric that are too big to toss and too small to make anything. When buying expensive material you don't want to buy any more than is needed, but you don't want to come up short.

Many of the beautiful silks and brocades from the Far East are only 32 to 36 inches wide. Before buying expensive textiles, do a practice layout and make a practice garment. Use inexpensive cloth that is cut to the width of the better fabric. Always choose fabric that you like. Life is too short to sew on something ugly. The practice cloth should have about the same feel and weight of the expensive textile you plan to use. The garment may have to be cut in a single layer, remember to flip the pattern. Backs may need a seam down the middle to make them out of narrow fabric. Always use the 'with nap' layout for expensive textiles. Any changes made in the practice garment will affect the yardage for the final garment.

Remember, some length and width will be lost in preshrinking the yardage. Due to the way cloth is made it will shrink more in length than in width. Some knits will actually gain in width as they shrink in length, look at T-shirts. Nice wools, fine silks and brocades will shrink at the dry cleaner. Take finer fabrics to the cleaners and have them steamed before cutting. For cottons wash in hot water, dry hot and steam press before starting. I know, you only plan to use cold water and hang it up to dry. This will only cause the fabric to shrink more slowly - it will still shrink over time.

Layout all of the pattern pieces of the garment before you make your first

cut. Relax and quit trying to squeeze the pieces tightly together so there are more scraps to stuff in that already overflowing bin. Add a half inch to the side seam allowances and an inch to the length. Then, if alterations are needed, there will be plenty to work with. It is better to have the extra fabric in the garment than in the scrap bin.

This chart is a guide and will give you an approximate yardage conversion. Always remember - This is sewing - NOT brain surgery. If a mistake is made, and the project does not come out exactly as planned, just hide the evidence. Give it away or throw it away. Don't let it clutter up your sewing space or your mind.


# Ed note: In response for a more complete explanation of the above chart Karen wrote the following:

If the back of the pattern envelope says that you need 1 yard of 60 inch wide fabric, but the fabric you want to use is only 40 inches wide then you have to buy 1 ½ yards.

On the back of a pattern envelope there is is grid that shows yardage. i.e. If you are going to make a size eight you need 1 yard. If you are going to make a size 12 you need 1 ¾ yards. Anyone who buys yardage is familiar with this system. The envelope only gives yardage for 45 and 60 inches. If the fabric is 32 inches you need to use this additional grid.
