



We would like to thank those clubs who are sending us their list of students. Number one, it's very encouraging to know that we have people that are interested in learning our activity and that you are willing to take your time and effort to teach them. Number two, it makes sure they're provided with insurance coverage while they are going through lessons, and it's FREE! Also, thank you for your updates and payments for new club members. It is extremely important to maintain an accurate list of members for insurance purposes. Along that line, don't forget to have each person sign in at every activity. Also remember, that when your students graduate, you have 10 days to pay their state dues and insurance to maintain their insurance coverage. If you're aware of any problems, or have any concerns let us know.

We have had several discussions lately about exactly who needs to pay the dues and insurance. We would like to clarify and emphasize that if a person wants to be a member of a federated club and listed on our database as a member of a specific club they MUST pay dues and insurance. It does not matter whether they dance or whether they attend any activities, if they want to be included on the state membership rolls, they must pay dues and insurance. If your club would like to carry a person as an honorary member on your club rolls only, that would be up to the individual club, but they would not be listed on the federation database as members if they do not pay dues and insurance to the state.

We wish you and yours a very merry Christmas, and a fantastic 2012!



Specialty Fabrics

This holiday season look for beautiful and inspiring fabrics. Silkies and satins can be used on the dance floor if selected carefully. Choose washable fabrics of polyester or nylon. Activity on the dance floor can cause us to perspire and pot luck spills are always a hazard. If the dress must be dry cleaned after each dance, the cost will increase dramatically. Check for care labels on the end of the bolts. Pre wash all fabrics and trims.

Larger prints are more effective, the skirt is a large area. Tiny candy canes look cute at arm's length, but when seen across the dance floor they are a pinkish blur. The narrow aisle of the fabric store is not the wide area of the dance hall. Most people will be looking at the skirt from a distance of 10 or more feet. When considering at a piece of fabric, drape it over the shelf and walk about 20 feet. Turn around quickly and get a first image of the fabric. This is especially important when combining two pieces of fabric. Drape large sections together over a shelf then walk away. Focus your eyes on the ceiling for a minute to clear the mind, and then turn around. Fabrics that look good together close up, may clash when viewed from a distance.

Before starting on special fabric make a practice garment in a similar weight, but inexpensive, fabric. This will allow the pattern to be checked for fit. Choose inexpensive fabric that you like, and if it comes out right, you will have two new outfits. If it needs adjustment, you won't have ruined the good stuff. The best designers make mock-up designs in muslin before they start on the expensive fabric.

Slinky fabrics require special handling. Before laying out the fabric, cover the cutting area with a layer of tissue paper or newsprint. Put the fabric on top and line up the salvage edge of the fabric with the edge of the paper. Pin the salvage to the paper. This will reduce shifting and sliding. Arrange all pattern pieces before any pinning. Do not pin the 'straight of grain' lines, use weights. Repeated pinning can leave holes in the fabric. Pin only in the seam allowances. Purchase new fine silk pins. Old dull pins will snag and mar the fabric. Sandwiching the fabric between the pattern and the base paper will keep it steady making cutting easier. Insert a new rotary cutter blade. Skips in the cutting will cause pulls and runs in the fabric. Time energy and money have already been invested in this project. Don't waste it by trying to use old pins and a chipped rotary blade. After

the pieces are cut leave them pinned between the papers until ready to work with that piece. This will reduce distortion from stretching.

Underline the bodice of a dress with thin woven silk fabric. Only about a yard is needed. It doesn't have to match the fashion fabric, just look for something in the same color range that won't show through the fashion fabric. To underline just cut the main bodice pattern pieces out of the silk. Lay them on the wrong side of the fashion fabric and treat them like one piece. Underlining reduces wrinkling, makes the fabric look richer and hides construction details. It only takes a few minutes to add underlining and the results are well worth it. This will also keep the bodice looking new longer.

There are many sewing websites where you can learn the tricks to handling specialty fabrics. Try www.fashion-era.com for lots of interesting information and tips. Sandra Betzina and Claire Schaffer are authors who have expertise in working with many fabric types. Their books have sections on lace, chiffon, lame, velvet and any other unusual yardage.

Enjoy the feel and the color of exotic fabrics. Treat yourself to something special and interesting to sew. Take your time creating a unique ensemble that you will wear with pride for many holiday seasons.
