Tax Time Info

The year is almost over, and it's time to start preparing income taxes. This month's article will address Income Tax Reporting aspects I have learned over my years of calling. However, this article should not be taken in any way as Legal or Professional advice. For that you should consult with an Accountant or Attorney. Your calling business is like any other small business. There are certain things you must do and certain things you should do.

- 1. Establish a Business Name. It can be as simple as Don Wood Square Dance Caller or a registered trademark name like Lou-Mac Records
- 2. It is always good advice but not required to establish an LLC (Limited Liability Corporation). This vehicle can protect your personal assets in the event you are sued.
- 3. Square Dance Callers file under category 711510 of the IRS Code. This section is defined for Entertainers
- 4. An ASCAP / BMI License is a must and coupled with your dues is a deductable expense. This will also provide your Business Insurance. There are three basic ways to get your license.
 - a. Callerlab
 - b. The American Callers Association
 - c. Directly from ASCAP and BMI.
- 5. It is important that you establish a separate bank account for your calling business. It simplifies the accounting portion of your business considerably.
- 6. The areas you need to be concerned with are;
 - a. Income Typically Square Dance Callers work on a Cash Basis for IRS purposes. This means all income is tracked and reported.
 This also includes the income reported on a 1099-MISC.
 All clubs, events and festivals are required to submit a 1099-MISC if they have paid you \$600.00 or more over the year.
 - b. **Expenses** These include travel, a portion of your meals, and

- supplies (such as ink for a printer, purchasing music, paper, advertising etc.)
- c. **Travel** In this category all normal expenses such as Airplane Tickets and Lodging are included.
- d. **Automobile** Automobile expenses are another category.
 When considering your mileage, there are some basic ways to track this item:
 - i. Keep a ledger that states your beginning and ending mileage to and from a dance.
 - ii. If the trip is a repeatable event such as a club dance and you know and can prove the distance is say 40 miles, it is Ok to track these in a mileage format.
 - iii. If the automobile is leased and used exclusively for your business this becomes a deductible expense.
 - iv. If you are like most of us and use the family car, you must separate your mileage from personal and business mileage.
- e. **Home Office** If you have a home office that is used exclusively this can be calculated and also becomes a write off. This includes a portion of your mortgage interest, heat and other typical expenses necessary to keep it in good repair. To claim this deduction, the home office must be exclusively used for your business.

- a. **Clothing** Clothing can be deducted but it has some requirements.
 - i. The clothing must be labeled or monogrammed.
 - ii. The clothing is considered a costume and must only be worn when conducting your business.
- b. Equipment There are two separate ways to handle equipment,
 i.e. Turn Table, Amplifier, Microphones or any other hardware or
 software you use in your business.
 - i. Depreciation You can choose to depreciate the more expensive items over a period of time. Typically 7 years.
 ii. Section 179 This section of the IRS Code allows you to take the entire depreciation in the year you purchased the
- 8. It is important that you keep all receipts. If you are audited these are your best source of record.

Once again to be clear, for Legal or Accounting advice consult a professional.

Progression: Corner Teaching Hints It is my opinion that students learn in 3 basic ways.

- A. Instruction
- B. The Written Word
- C. Demonstration

I have found that coming down off of the stage and working directly with the class is a benefit and seems to help them.

Teaching Jewel

I have noted that often when teaching Square Thru new dancers will attempt a courtesy turn on the 2nd and 4th hand of a standard square thru. It is my contention this is due to the fact that Courtesy Turn, Ladies Chain and Right and Left Thru are taught prior to Square Thru. To avoid this, you might consider teaching Wheel Around as a substitute for Courtesy Turn initially, until the dancer is proficient with Square Thru. This method has worked successfully for me for years. If you do apply this modification, I would appreciate any feedback you may have.

In closing, don't forget to register for the 2014 State Festival in Enumclaw. Hope to see you there!

Heads up for club audit

We would like to thank those clubs who are sending us their list of students. Number one, it's very encouraging to know that we have people that are interested in learning our activity and that you are willing to take your time and effort to teach them. Number two, it makes sure they're provided with insurance coverage while they are going through lessons, and it's FREE! Also, thank you for your updates and payments for new club members. It is extremely important to maintain an accurate list of members for insurance purposes. Along that line, don't forget to have each person sign in at every activity. Also remember, that when your students graduate, you have 10 days to pay their state dues and insurance to maintain their insurance coverage.

We would like to clarify federation requirements for individual membership. We need to emphasize that if a person wants to be a member of a federated club and listed on our database as a member of a specific club they MUST pay state dues and insurance. It does not matter whether they dance or whether they attend any activities, if they want to be included on the state membership rolls, they must pay state dues and insurance. If your club would like to carry a person as an honorary member on your club rolls only, that would be up to the individual club, but they would not be listed on the federation database as members if they do not pay state dues and insurance.

By now, you may have received an 'Audit' that we do to verify we have collected Membership and Insurance Dues from all members and also that no member has paid more than once. We did our best to send these audits to the club treasurers and of course only the clubs we found a problem with will receive an audit letter (you may get a refund, or you may owe money). If you have any questions concerning these, be sure to call us so that we can get the records straight.

Sewing Machine Selection

If you are thinking about a new sewing machine or serger, as a Christmas present consider your options very carefully. Please, don't think you can go to a big box store and pick up one for \$69.95 and be set for life. No one will show you how to use the machine or help if there are any problems. What they say on the box is not always accurate. One store has a machine labeled 'heavy duty'. As far as we can tell, from looking at the three we took in for repair last month, the only difference is that the outside shell is darker plastic.

Our technicians refuse to even look at some of those cheap machines. The cost for the repair would be more than the machine is worth. They cannot guarantee their work because the timing and tension will not stay in place. Poor materials and shoddy workmanship are evident in the construction. Replacement parts are not available. Some of them cannot be worked on because the plastic shells are glued together. In order to get to the machinery the shell must be cut off and then glued back on. If you want a quality machine you need to do your research. Look at the new features available and compare them to the machine you have.

Your sewing machine will not run forever. How many miles are on your machine? An average spool of thread is 300 yards, a cone is 3,000 yards. A mile is 1,760 yards. How many hours has the motor been running? Women tend to get attached to sewing machines. They are our toys and give us a sense of accomplishment. I have had women get very mad at me when I tell them their machine cannot be fixed. I have also had women pay \$300 to get an old machine fixed that could not be sold for half that amount. You may love your machine, but it doesn't love you. It is just a pile of gears. Be objective when looking at your machine and repair verses replace.

Before settling on a machine, check out several brands and compare features and price. Go to dealers and talk to your friends. When looking at a sewing machine or serger there are three things to keep in mind.

1. Sew on the machine yourself. Don't just watch the sales person. Listen to the motor and feel the vibration. You will be sitting in front of this machine for many hours. If it has a whine or is loud you will hate it. Take several different types of fabric with you and sew on them.

- **2. Guarantee or warrantee for repairs and maintenance.** What does it cover? Get it in writing. Where will the machine be serviced? How long is the average service wait?
- **3. Support services.** How many lessons do you get? When and where are they? How long after the purchase can you continue lessons? What type of lesson does the shop have?

A new sewing machine is like a new car. The buttons and knobs will not be in the same place. There is always a learning curve with a new machine. Take time to get to know how it works. Read the instruction manual, cover to cover. Take the dealer's lessons. I teach sewing lessons for a dealer and almost every week someone tells me, "I didn't know my machine could to that!" The instructions are in the manual, they never took the time to read it. There is always something new to learn. Classes will bring you together with other people who like to sew. Then you can invite them to square dance lessons.

Often I hear women say, "I don't sew enough to justify a new sewing machine." I never hear men say, "I don't fish enough to justify a new fishing boat." Sewing is not just about saving money. It is about creativity, enjoyment and a relaxing hobby. They also say, "I would never use all those fancy stitches." Yes they will, when all they have to do is push a button. Most women are sold on a new machine when I show them the automatic needle threader and how easy it is to change programs.

You would sew more if your machine was easier to use. Think about the type of sewing you do now, and more importantly, the type of sewing would you like to do. Don't choose a machine and say "I'll get by." or "I'll make do." You should enjoy sitting down to your machine. It is your artistic time. Purchase a quality machine with lots of bells and whistles that will make your sewing dance and sing.



The Kidney Kollection

It has been awhile since I have put an article in Footnotes regarding collecting aluminum tabs for kidney dialysis research. A square dancing friend has asked us to again let everyone know how the process goes.

For a good number of years, friends throughout the square dancing community—there are way too many to credit here (THANK YOU!!)--have helped us collect aluminum tabs for a charity organization we support. This



organization is the National Kidney Foundation for the prevention of kidney and urinary tract disease. The particular area we are supporting is kidney dialysis. The original plan was to collect these tabs and turn them into a local kidney center; however, after collecting a pickup truck load of them we learned that they will not take the tabs and that we would have to take them to a recycle center, get the money and then make a dollar donation. That is what we have been doing. George grumbles at times, but he is really a very willing participant. It is well worth the effort as we have lost good friends and family to failing kidneys and want to help those who are waiting for a kidney transplant so their lives can return to a relatively normal status.

One in seven adult Americans has chronic kidney disease. Most don't know it because the disease is silent until damage is severe. Diabetes and high blood pressure are the leading causes. Among current projects are: Enhancing drug safety in kidney disease by developing a human kidney-on-a-chip and clinical trials of a wearable artificial kidney.

Both George and I want to thank every one of our square dancing friends who have diligently saved these aluminum tabs for kidney research. We very much appreciate receiving any amount of tabs--from one or two to a full large box! Even those who are receiving dialysis, themselves, collect them for us. Please know all efforts are appreciated! Fifteen hundred dollars have been donated, so far, and we will be able to do that, again, in the next few weeks! George and I want to thank all the wonderful square dancing friends that have gone way out of their way to help us in this endeavor. George and Sharon Broom.

Regain

Recruit, Lets talk a little about 3/R....Recruit, Retain & Retain and Regain!

All of our clubs have a recruiting program to encourage friends, family

and total strangers to learn to dance. This is how we build our clubs.

We sometimes tend to forget about the Retaining and Regaining. Take a moment as an individual dancer and think about who belonged to your club last year and didn't rejoin this year. Many times they just need a call or a note to encourage them to remain on the roster. Many times we tend to think that dancers who do not continue on, just don't want to belong to a club anymore. Experience tells us that once they drop their membership, they eventually drop out of sight. Let' not let that happen.

Regaining the interest of the former dancer is important. Check in with former members, let them know they are missed and encourage them to come back to dancing. Remind them that angeling at classes is free for dancers, or offer them a reduced class fee to come and refresh. By offering the refresher course, they are guaranteed a place in a square for every tip at classes.
