
WHERE IS THE DECEMBER FLIPBOOK?



The topic of "RESPECT" is continued....

RESPECT is first learned at home. Children are taught to obey their parents forming the first rules. The respect of important people is earned by having good manners. It is important for young people to be shown respect if earned, which can produce a feeling of expressing themselves more easily. Good decisions can arise from having good manners and selfrespect, resulting in having great respect for others. It builds trust, safety and wellbeing.

Self-respect can create good and safe feelings to express ones self. It can mean that you accept someone for who they are when they're different from you or you don't agree with them.

RESPECT is a vital key to life and can be a good guide for all.

My articles for this topic of 'RESPECT" is our concern of the world of Square Dancing and seeing the lack of. Good square dance manners are apparently NOT being taught in lessons. It has to start somewhere, either by the instructors or the individual clubs.

What happened to the Ten Commandments that were passed out when we completed square dance lessons? Know that was in the 1970's, BUT how much change in this topic has there been? Clubs need to "get-on-this". You know, address issues like "use deodorant", don't walk out of a square (we've seen that happen lately). Couples leaving a club because they don't like someone. Guess what friends...that's third grade actions... working on good manners and learning a different direction ...all actions belonging to "growing up".

The need for "FUN" again needs to be on the rise. We need to pull together and make dancing fun...more smiles given to one another (no money involved on that move).

We see club members visiting other clubs and when they come through the door, they are exited to see one another, BUT they are loud with their greeting one another laughing and talking.....LOUDLY! THAT entrance is disrespectful to everyone. It is embarrassing to have to ask dancers to talk quietly on the sidelines so that the round dancers can hear the cuer. Leaders are dealing more with the problem of "not hearing", and people should know if they are too loud. The case of dancers shouting from the floor to a caller, "So why didn't you call (a certain figure)? Is this disrespectful to the caller? OR "We're tired of that move" (incidently, it was load – the-boat). You may think this is comical...NOT SO people! We are professionals and need to tuck these actions under our wings but from a leaders feelings...it hurts in various ways. We spend a lot of time educating ourselves in our profession and do not deserve the disrespect.

Please applaud your caller and cuer following their tips and dances. It took some planning in their presentation for your pleasure. Now, that's showing respect.

Dancers attending a dance should be made to feel they are stepping into another world....a world of fun and fellowship with friends, a feeling of love for our activity, demonstrating the knowledge learned from their teacher/ caller/leader. Our task, as leader entertainers should and need to be creating an atmosphere of stress release from everyday life to the dancer.

We want to compliment our committee on being prompt with their voting. All ROM voting has been close in points and we have had to wait for everyone to respond. Most of the dances have been good and you've had your work cut out for you. GOOD JOB!

Thank you for your time in reading our articles and our intentions are to help with improvements. We have given you synarios voiced from dancers on the floor. We have been their voices in hopes of being heard.

SMILING is what we can all give to one another. Let's do it! AND let's all show a little more respect to each other.

Pattern Layout

What is it about sewing that brings out the miser in all of us?

Most of us purchase a little more fabric than the pattern calls for '*just in case*'. Then we spend way to much time arranging the pattern pieces to '*save fabric*'. After cutting, we gather up all the little scraps of fabric and hoard them for the quilt we are going to make '*someday*'. All of this scrimping results in a scrap box that contains bits of fabric that are not big enough, or enough of one type, to make anything. Being parsimonious can result in a garment that fits poorly and looks shoddy.

Our frocks should be '*custom artistic creations*'. The first step is to invest time in making pattern alterations. Learn where you differ from the mythological '*average*' and adjust the pattern to fit you. Understanding fitting will save time and reduce frustration. Making alterations before cutting will reduce wasted fabric. Read "*Fit for Real People*" by Pati Palmer. Reading about sewing can teach new techniques, enhance creativity and increase successful garment sewing.

The second step is to allow enough width in the side seams for alterations. Before cutting out the pattern, increase the side seams by one inch. '*Just in case*'. Side seams should be the last ones sewn on most garments. Even if this garment was made before, and it fit perfectly, add the extra inch. This will allow for changes in fit caused by changes in fabric

Fabrics fold and drape differently due to thickness, weave or type of fiber. This is called '*turn of the cloth*'. The '*hand*' or feel of the fabric also effects fit. The same pattern can be made in several different fabrics if these factors are understood. Fabrics suggested on the pattern envelope are the type the pattern was designed for. Select fabrics for the type of garment they will be made into and the care/cleaning they will receive after being worn.

Lay the fabric on the cutting board and gently align the edges. Do not tug, pull and yank to straighten. That will stretch out the fabric. As will letting one end hang over the edge of the table. The absolutely best plan is to lay out the fabric, mist it lightly with water and let it dry and relax over night before laying out the pattern.

Look over the pattern layout in the instructions. The suggested layouts are usually the easiest. The pattern envelope yardage chart allows enough fabric for the project. Examine the fabric carefully for designs that go in one direction. If the wrong layout is used the flowers will be growing up side down.

Use the with nap lay out if possible. The reason is, all fabric has a grain or a nap. Due to the way the fabric goes through the rollers in the weaving and dying process the little fibers of the threads are all pressed in on one direction. This change in the fabric is very slight and may not be visible at first but after the garment is worn and washed several times there will be a subtitle change in shading. Laying the pattern pieces with all their tops in the same direction will keep them the same color and texture.

There is also a color difference between the back and the front that may not be immediately apparent. It will show up after several washings. Put a piece of blue painters tape on the wrong side of all of the pieces after cutting. This ensures that the same side of the fabric is used as the outside throughout the garment. Either side can be used as long as it is consistent.

IMPORTANT - Measure carefully to assure the 'straight of grain' lines are exactly straight. It is tempting to twist a pattern piece a little out of line so that it fits on the layout better. Don't do it. The grain must run from the head to the floor or the garment will twist on the body and always appear puckered and wrinkly. If pants are cut off grain the legs will try to spiral. Cheap clothing is often cut off grain. It will look fine at first, but after a couple of washings the side seams will distort.

Pattern alterations, generous side seam allowances and careful layout, will enable you to create the garment that is in your vision. Sewing is an art form. *Michelangelo did not try to save paint on the Sistine Chapel.*

As we dance our way into the holiday season, I am reflecting on how much volunteer time and energy is put into making the holiday dances special. Most clubs bake extra cookies, do more decorating, and generally have a higher level of celebration.

This is a good thing, because for many of us, our square dancing friends are our second family, and it is comforting to know there is always a dance we can attend and know we are accepted, welcome, and among friends; in addition to getting a little bit of exercise and enjoying great music. For many of us, our square dancing helps us to avoid the holiday blues and feeling lonely.

For some of our square-dancing solos, the holiday meals that decorate our dances, such as turkey night or leftover night, are the only real holiday gatherings we have; otherwise our choices are baked chicken and Golden Corral.

These celebrations come at a cost. There are lots of volunteers who spend time preparing food, there are extra flyers to distribute, planning committees to put on a theme and assign duties; someone to put up decorations, more clean-up, and the list goes on.

For the past few years I have seen a downturn in the number of people actively supporting a club. The trend seems to be to become an independent so you won't be



asked to volunteer, won't be responsible for clean-up, don't have to do kitchen duty, and won't be pressured into running for an office to relieve the burnt out board members that keep your club going. Recently I was part of a discussion where the topic was even if we have fair numbers of members (30 to 40), half do not show up for the dances, and a quarter come to the dances, but don't think their participation is important because "somebody else always does it."

I was even more dismayed to overhear the comment, "We don't belong to a club anymore, but we still want to participate in our Council and be appointed to office at the Federation level. This attitude is justified because there are not enough active volunteers at the club level. Where do you fit into this picture? Are you a giver? It is a well-known phrase that you "only get out as much as you put into it."

Many clubs in Western Washington have gone to "finger food only," because they can't get club members to volunteer in the kitchen or to clean up. For the most part, this is not by choice, but a matter of necessity because the few that contribute are simply tired of giving more than their share. Many formerly-active dancers I've talked to, who have dropped off the square dance scene, have done so because they don't know how else to say, "No more. I've done my part, now it is someone else's turn."

I encourage and challenge you to look around and offer to lift a burden from someone else's shoulders. Become a necessary part of your club's success. You'll enjoy the holidays much more by being involved.

For the many who give more than their share, thank you for the incredible job you do, and for the good times I enjoy because of your efforts.

Most clubs have planned out their holiday dances... attend as many as you can. A lot of energy has gone into the special themes, and the reward is to have the floors full of happy dancers. We have a new crop of "boy or girl" dancers, so you can always be assured of a partner. Merry Christmas, and Happy New Year.







DID YOU KNOW?

Did You Know....?

How difficult it can be to find pictures or videos that you saw "somebody" capture at a recent dance you attended? Several people may have been taking pictures at the dance using either their cell phones or digital cameras. But there's a good chance you have no idea who to contact to see if they were ever posted anywhere (and if they were posted, where might you find them?)! You try searching Facebook, but you might spend hours scroll-searching through numerous Facebook "groups" and "pages" only to be disappointed at not finding a single photo from the dance. Frustrating, isn't it?

Well...there's "hope"! It's exciting to announce the creation of a website specifically designed to make posting and finding photos and videos taken at any square dance or round dance event anywhere within Washington state a relatively simple process. Control your excitement for a moment before jumping to explore the website...let me briefly describe what you'll find there. It's a work-in-progress, so there won't be a lot of "content" (pictures/videos) there yet.

The site, www.squaredance-wa-pics.org is built on the SmugMug.com photo-sharing site. Think of the site's architecture as being similar to the "file" structure familiar to most long-time computer users (cascading levels of detail), with the most detailed "content" at the lowest level:

- **HOMEPAGE:** You'll find a brief description of the site and instructions on how to navigate it.
 - You'll see a Council Map which is also linked directly to the WA State Federation's website.
 - You'll see a COUNCIL LIST. For now, select RAINIER COUNCIL (it's the first one with "content").
- **COUNCIL PAGES:** There's one for each council, plus a handful of others (e.g. "Circle 8 Ranch").
 - Each council page will consist of a logo box, a brief description of the council's geographic reach, and a folder for each club within the council, plus another folder just for council events (e.g Council Dances).
 - If the council has it's own website and-Facebook page, you'll find links for the as well.

• CLUB FOLDERS: Here's where you'll find any photo galleries from club dances. They will be displayed in chronological order from newest to oldest. The date of the dance will be in yyy-mm-dd format, followed by the name of theme of the dance.

How will pictures and videos be posted to the site, you ask? Each club will be allowed one or two volunteer "Gallery Creators" who will be given password access to the site. Creating a gallery prior to a dance will be a simple process taking only a few minutes and will include the creation of an upload link that can be posted at the dance. Anyone attending the dance who takes pictures of video with either a cell phone or digital camera can scan or copy the link and upload their photos or videos directly to the gallery...even during the dance in real time (being sure one has a wifi connection or an unlimited data account).

The galleries will be "public", so no copyrighted content (pictures or video) can be uploaded, although watermarking photos is allowable. You'll have the ability to download any that you like directly to your own computer...or you can order prints (and even photomerchandize like T-shirts and coffee mugs) directly from SmugMug if you like.

Would you like to volunteer to be an Authorized Gallery Creator (AGC) for you club or council? If the answer is Yes, let your President know. All club and council Presidents will receive an email request that they submit the name and email address of their two AGC's. Password access and simple instructions for creating galleries will be sent directly to the AGC's.

Before you know it, we'll have an easily searchable archive of hundreds, if not thousands, of square and round dance photos and videos pf #SquareDancers #SeenHavingFun from across the entire state.

I encourage you to take advantage of the opportunity to share your photography skills with all your dancing friends.
