## IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCIAL DIRECTOR

Financial Adviser's Report, by Doug Schafer, Attorney, October 21, 2023

We regularly remind clubs and councils that they should submit the very simple IRS Form 990-N annually. If they fail for three consecutive years to do so, they automatically lose their exemption from federal income tax and become a taxable business. The form should be submitted electronically by the 15th day of the 5th month after the end of the organization's fiscal year.

There is now an additional reason to stay in compliance. In 2021 Congress was concerned about illegal money laundering and other financial crimes, so it enacted the Corporate Transparency Act ("CTA") requiring almost all corporations, including nonprofit corporations, to report to the Treasury Department's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network ("FinCEN") specific personal information about the individuals owning or controlling the corporation. That could include the officers of an incorporated square dance club.

Fortunately, Congress relieved tax-exempt corporations from CTA's reporting requirements, but if a nonprofit corporation loses it's federal income tax-exemption, such a by failing to file its IRS Form 990-N, then 180 days later it loses it CTA exemption and must report the personal information about the individuals controlling it. A willful failure to report when required can result in very steep civil or criminal penalties against the corporation and its officers. While federal agency enforcement against a small club seems unlikely, the club's officers may have a nightmare dealing with computer-generated penalty notices.

An important point is that the new CTA reporting does not apply to unincorporated associations, even though federal income tax law treats them the same as incorporated entities. So if your square dance club or council has not filed as a corporation with the WA Secretary of State, then the CTA does not apply to it. And it could be argued that if that WA state official has administratively dissolved the corporate charter of a club or council for failing to pay the annual license fee, then the club or council became an unincorporated association to which the CTA does not apply. Because we have the Federation's liability insurance coverage, the liability protections from incorporating might be considered unnecessary.

The new CTA reporting is required in 2024 for nonexempt corporations that exist at the start of that year. So if a club or council has lost it income tax exemption by failing to file the IRS Form 990-N, then it promptly should file an application with the IRS to restore its income tax exemption, probably as either a 501(c)(7)social club or a 501(c)(3) educational-cultural charity.

#### Did You Know...?

...Don Wood ?

If you did, consider yourself fortunate to have known a legendary caller who, according to another legendary caller I spoke with to inform him of Don's passing that he could think of very few callers who have contributed as much or more to square dancing than Don Wood.

Did you ever DANCE to Don Wood's calling? Don prided himself on choreographing both patter and singing call sequences that worked with smooth body-flow dynamics. Just because a call is "legal" from formation X doesn't mean it's a good idea to include it in a dance without first considering whether using it "flows" nicely with the previous call or the one that follows. Don considered that ahead of time for every move and for every dance so that you, the dancer, would go home feeling energized rather than exhausted with sore knees and hips.

Did you ever take LESSONS from Don Wood? If you did, you learned how to perform each call properly...and in accordance with the official CallerLab Definition. Even when he felt the official definition was "lacking" in one aspect or another, he was principled and loyal to the artform. Don may have been a bit old-school, but it was for your own good as a dancer! "Learn to execute each move properly, according to its definition, and you won't have to unlearn bad habits later-on."

Did you ever go to a FESTIVAL WEEKEND where Don Wood was the Caller Coordinator? If you did, it's quite likely you had a very enjoyable experience (& and may not even be aware that Don was responsible for the program schedule). Don knew the primary objective of coordinating the program for a multi-day event was to maximize the overall enjoyment the DANCERS attending the event would experience.

Did you ever have the honor of having Don Wood as your CLUB CALLER? I did...and I can tell you, in my experience as a club President, there was never a more supportive and knowledgeable "hired gun" than Don Wood. I could bounce ideas off him (and some of them <u>did bounce</u>) and I could rely upon his honest input, pro or con. On those few occasions where he was uncertain about what advice to give, he invariably leaned toward "Let's give it a try...we can always pull back later if we have to".

<u>Don Wood passed away on December</u> 11th following heart failure on December 2nd. He was at a dance, about to do what Don loved doing most--- call for a square dance. He and his wife Marie had just arrived at the dance hall in Kirkland WA where he was scheduled to fill-in for another caller recovering from surgery. Don sat down, pre-sumably to catch his breath (he'd been experiencing some difficulty recently following back surgery a few months earlier). Moments later he collapsed...CPR attempts failed to revive him, and he was transported to the hospital ICU. He never regained consciousness.

Please hold Don's family in your thoughts and prayers...they will feel his loss most intensely. But Don's fellow callers have lost a colleague and, for many, a professional and personal "buddy". Square dancers have lost a real gem. As for me, I've lost a mentor and a friend.


Rest In Peace, Don Wood. You will be well- remembered!

Marty Bahr was diagnosed with young onset Alzheimer's Disease (AD) in 2000 at the age of 50. He succumbed to the disease eight years later, passing away December 30, 2008.

Marty was born and raised in Seattle, Washington and lived much of his life there. His final six years were spent in Chicago, Illinois where he received exceptional clinical treatment for AD from Rush University Medical Center's Alzheimer's Disease Center (RADC).

During his working life, Marty spent his career in the insurance industry. He rose through the ranks to become an executive with a major insurance company. He was forced to leave that position as the AD symptoms began to manifest; as he could no longer perform the duties required. At that point in time (around 1995), an AD diagnosis had not been made the medical community at large did not yet recognize that AD could occur in a younger age group ("younger" defined as under the age of 65). It would be another five years before Marty would be delivered the diagnosis by University of Washington Alzheimer's Research Disease Center. (ARDC)

As I his brother (Joe) could see his brother starting to decline. I decided I would ask my square dance group, and the square dance community to support me in hosting a dance with all donations going to the UW study of the brain.

I told Marty what my plans were, he was overjoyed. The dances became well attended and Marty asked if I would continue, he would donate his brain to research. Maybe his life would be worth something and he could help others in doing so. I replied Marty you got a deal!

Today with the generocity of square dancers this will be the 15th fund raiser. We are approaching \$100,000.00 supporting the UW study of the brain. Dr. Thomas Grabowski head of the Study group is extremely appreciative.



*Jack Hardin*, who after many years of teaching and calling for dancers at all levels, from Mainstream through Challenge, decided this past year to retire and spend time dancing with his partner Thal. I always enjoy it when Jack and Thal show up at one of my dances.

**Don Wood** who this past month passed after suffering a heart attack while preparing to call a dance. In addition to teaching and calling from Basic through Challenge, Don provided his knowledge and skills to produce square dance music on his Lou Mac label.

## STEAMERS AND PETTICOATS

Iuffing up petticoats is an ongoing problem for me. How a full skirt moves and looks on the dance floor brings me joy. Keeping them fluffy is the issue.

I've tried every trick to fluff up petticoats. Spraying them with sugar water, laundry starch, diluted Elmer's glue, and Future Floor Finish are what I can think of now. Those can stiffen the petticoat to the point of cracking; they tend to powder off as you move and absolutely don't get caught in the rain.

What I use now is fishing line. It is used to make fluffy ruffles on prom dresses. The test ranges from 20# to 40# depending on the petticoat.. That solves part of the problem. Even with the fishing line, the slip still gets crumpled from sitting and being stored. Gold lamé is especially bad.

Putting the petticoat in a warm dryer for a few seconds usually works, but I always stay next to the dryer and worry. I have seen petticoats melted by a dryer.

Getting a garment steamer has been a thought for a while. How much would I use it, would it really work, what price, and where would I keep it? Have been holding me back. I purchased a handheld steamer from Walmart. This item was chosen because it has the biggest water tank. It does work well, but the amount of steam is less than I want. This will be perfect for perking up crushed lace and ruffles and is a good size for traveling.

I was talking with a stitching buddy, also a fluffy dancer, about my steam dilemma. She said, "I have a wallpaper steamer. Would that work?". The next day, I was in Goodwill, and there was - a wallpaper steamer.

It works perfectly, sending out clouds of steam! It is much lighter and smaller than the garment steamers. I am working on a way to hold the handle at the right height so I can use both hands on the petticoat. Maybe a music stand? The steam didn't burn my hands. Only word of warning - A puddle forms where you are working. Don't slip!

#### 73<sup>rd</sup> National Square Dance Convention<sup>®</sup> Parking

We have been getting questions on parking for our convention.

The downtown Milwaukee Convention area is undergoing a major growth spree with multiple developments and corporate offices springing up causing regular parking changes. We are

very much aware of the parking needs for our convention, and we are at the mercy of development and constant growth changes (none of which were going on when we bid the convention).

We are waiting for the pricing and guidelines for the new 400 space parking garage in the Baird Center, location of the 73<sup>rd</sup> National Square Dance Convention<sup>®</sup>. They have not, as of this writing, released their guidelines and pricing with ongoing construction. There are several city or privately owned parking garages around the Baird Center with height restrictions of 7 ft. These garages charge by the hour and do not provide in and out privileges.

There are a couple of open parking lots with no height restrictions at a walking distance of about 5 to 10 minutes. If you have oversize vehicles (over 7 ft. tall) please consider using mass transit to get to our convention site due to the overhead parking restrictions. The Milwaukee County Transit has Park and Ride lots with transit fees being very reasonable and the transit is very dependable and safe. More up to date 2024 information on area mass transit will be provided in the future as routes can and do change.

We have contacted area parking lots and none of them are able to work with us at this time to give us set parking rates. Rest assured, there are parking options very close to our convention site. Please watch for updates on parking locations and pricing as we gather dependable 2024 rate information to be posted on the 73nsdc.com website and the E-Magazine as we get closer to our convention.

Please consider registering at the Hilton Milwaukee City Center and receive \$5.00 daily parking with in & out privileges! (*There is a 7 ft. maximum height restriction.*) We cannot get these parking prices anywhere else in Milwaukee. The Hyatt also has parking, but it is a privately owned garage that will provide a reduced price.


