



Enjoy this month's article and try and see if this is happening at your dances. We hope not.

Please register for our National SD Festival in Spokane,
WA.

So, you go to Lessons. Maybe for 10 weeks or longer. The teacher goes through call after call and we are now done. HURRAY.

You have 51 basic calls and 17 more Mainstream calls and 30 Plus calls and 87 Advanced calls what's next?

Now you go to a dance, maybe it's your club dance and the Caller does 40 Basic calls and 12 Mainstream calls and 18 of the Plus calls and maybe 60 of the Advanced calls. Not all the calls, what the heck???

If we are going to teach them we should use them, otherwise we should not teach them. Sounds safe, but you go to a dance where this Caller does 49 Basic calls and 16 Mainstream, 28 Plus and 77 Advanced, a lot more and most of all the Calls.

Who suffers, YOU the dancer. Who gets the blame we the Callers? We need as dancers to ask the Callers to reteach/review/workshop the lesser called-calls of each program. It will make your dance more interesting without going onto the next program. In some cases, dancers are NOT ready or should not go onto the next program.

USE the list, the whole list, and nothing but the list.

The problem with this simple fact is that the truth gets in the way. Many callers say they use the whole program and, in their opinions, they do because that was how they were taught and how they were mentored and how they call....

Many others are in self-denial about using the program rather than just all the moves and self-delude and make excuses about why not doing the "extended / variant / nonstandard / sashayed / all position / positional definition "or whatever term you wish to use to hide behind these days"

We, as callers, forgot how to call using a full program, giving the dancers entertainment, fun and challenge (with the material available to us.) Says a lot...but offers no specifics to look at, to perhaps try and tackle one at a time...

From a point of view - you can appreciate the analogy that we as callers are "like husbands being asked to do the chores or being given a list of things to do".

Husbands can do almost anything. Give us a specific job and it will get done.

Honey can you put a board back on the fence – Done.

Honey, can you empty the dishwasher and put the dishes away – Done.

Honey, can you take the towels out of the washing machine and hang them on the line – Done.

HOWEVER, if you give us a list or generalize by saying things like, "Honey can you do the housework today?" There's a problem. - -

"Honey, can you clear up the dishes?

Ummm- - - Is that clear the table? Does it include loading the dishwasher?- Oh no, can't do that, there is still stuff in it,

Ummm- - - Am I supposed to wipe the table?

Ummm- - - Maybe if I just put everything in the sink, that will do.... What do you mean scrape the plates???

Honey, can you do the laundry?

Ummm- - - Is that sheets, bedding, hamper? What is dirty??? There is stuff in the washer - if I hang that out, will it do?...What about the stuff I am wearing???

Ummm- - -Does she expect me to iron stuff and put it away???...I am so confused..... Oh well, little or nothing will get done....

Callers over the last 30 years are like that...one job - see a problem - fix a single problem. - redefine this movement yes or x no... done.

Big overwhelming tasks with lots of things to do and look at and fix - we will read it, talk about it, but generally agree, it is a big problem and nothing gets done....

Sorry Guys but it is true...just ask my lady. - There are exceptions, but they are anomalies.

FISHTAILING FOR ROUNDS

The Look (or Picture Figures)

Picture figures are bodily shapes. We need to understand what to do with our bodies and then do it or make the move to accommodate the figure. Understanding what happens to our bodies during these figures performed is one of the keys to successful execution. Another key to success is good closed position.

That thought in mind, think of your partner while performing any figure. He or she must fit together with you the leader, to produce a complete figure picture. Each leader must try NOT to make their move alone and leave their partner stranded. Shape is used in most teaching demonstrations. It is a turning of the body line blending with your partner. The shape will give you the balance you will need in the figure execution taught. Body movement only without regard to your feet is a mystery to many of us and we tend to ignore it or give it little attention. Practice in maintaining a parallel shoulder line is often ignored but must be accomplished to execute and properly balance the picture frame or "THE LOOK" of the demo figure being taught.

The direction taken in preparation of a figure that gives it the comfortable completion and a proper execution for what is to follow, needs to be considered. However, too much concentration on your upper body and not keeping a good tall frame could make you off balance. Foot action is necessary for good upper position. Concentration should produce a downward feeling towards the feet. NEVER relax one leg until you are over the other and NEVER relax the foot pressure. You can relax the body but NOT the feet.

Please do NOT use a vise-like grip or hold on your partner at anytime. (a "NO-NO" and NOT APPRECIATED!") Most of the time, this action takes place with the leader through deep concentration and not meant to be a "controlled monster". Try to be a gentle leader---be an alert partner remembering you are a follower to your leader in dancing.

Body awareness needs to be considered of yourself and your partner at all times. Shoulders do not turn any further than hips. Mostly. the line is created by the hips and thighs and the body contact is met at the waist to just below the woman's bust line. It is important that the head be kept over the spine. Ladies while dancing, move their heads more than men so the need to NOT over-emphasize should be maintained. Ladies should NEVER attempt to begin the head movement in dancing. The head is only an extension of the body.

Using some of these suggestions can and will produce smooth dance skills. We, as round dance instructors can help dancers achieve smooth dancing by teaching them the "show and tell" method and explaining the how and why ways of these skills.

The general "rule-of-thumb" idea:

Where the lady takes all picture lines to the right and the man to the left

Centralize the weight over the feet /or foot

Parallel your shoulders

Counter balance each others line

Do NOT cross over into your partners space with; your body

Stay on your side of the "fence"

Do NOT lean over the top of your partner

Take a deep breath and stand tall to strengthen the spine

Pull the stomach in, developing body tone

Think about improving your dancing, your teaching methods and executing smooth dancing with ease and grace. PRACTICE BE RESPECTFUL SMILE BE HAPPY

- **7. Never Serve on a Committee -** And if you are put on one "nuts" to them.
- 8. Deride the Caller You know more about dancing than he does.
- **9. Never Invite Guests -** It's too much trouble; but if you do be sure they are below the level of your club.
- **10. Don't Learn Anything New** you know enough to get by; how can you be sure something new will be fun.
- 11. Jabber and Talk While a Dance is Going On You're not interested in what the caller is saying, so why should anyone else be.
- 12. If Anyone Has To Sit Out A Dance, Be Sure It's A Guest It's you'r club, isn't it?
- **13. Don't Smile -** Show everyone you aren't having a good time.
- **14. Belittle Your Dance -** Tell everyone how good the other dances are.
- 15. You're Always Right Everyone else makes mistakes, not you.

And if this doesn't kill your club, you may find that some of your fellow members are ready and willing to eliminate you.

DID YOU KNOW?

Did You Know....?

How difficult it can be to find pictures or videos that you saw "somebody" capture at a recent dance you attended? Several people may have been taking pictures at the dance using either their cell phones or digital cameras. But there's a good chance you have no idea who to contact to see if they were ever posted anywhere (and if they were posted, where might you find them?)! You try searching Facebook, but you might spend hours scroll-searching through numerous Facebook "groups" and "pages" only to be disappointed at not finding a single photo from the dance. Frustrating, isn't it?

Well...there's "hope"! It's exciting to announce the creation of a website specifically designed to make posting and finding photos and videos taken at any square dance or round dance event anywhere within Washington state a relatively simple process. Control your excitement for a moment before jumping to explore the website...let me briefly describe what you'll find there. It's a work-in-progress, so there won't be a lot of "content" (pictures/videos) there yet.

The site, www.squaredance-wa-pics.org is built on the SmugMug.com photo-sharing site. Think of the site's architecture as being similar to the "file" structure familiar to most long-time computer users (cascading levels of detail), with the most detailed "content" at the lowest level:

- **HOMEPAGE:** You'll find a brief description of the site and instructions on how to navigate it.
 - You'll see a Council Map which is also linked directly to the WA State Federation's website.
 - You'll see a COUNCIL LIST. For now, select RAINIER COUNCIL (it's the first one with "content").
- **COUNCIL PAGES:** There's one for each council, plus a handful of others (e.g. "Circle 8 Ranch").
 - Each council page will consist of a logo box, a brief description of the council's geographic reach, and a folder for each club within the council, plus another folder just for council events (e.g Council Dances).
 - O If the council has it's own website and-Facebook page, you'll find links for the as well.

CLUB FOLDERS: Here's where you'll find any
photo galleries from club dances. They will be
displayed in chronological order from newest to
oldest. The date of the dance will be in yyy-mmdd format, followed by the name of theme of the
dance.

How will pictures and videos be posted to the site, you ask? Each club will be allowed one or two volunteer "Gallery Creators" who will be given password access to the site. Creating a gallery prior to a dance will be a simple process taking only a few minutes and will include the creation of an upload link that can be posted at the dance. Anyone attending the dance who takes pictures of video with either a cell phone or digital camera can scan or copy the link and upload their photos or videos directly to the gallery...even during the dance in real time (being sure one has a wifi connection or an unlimited data account).

The galleries will be "public", so no copyrighted content (pictures or video) can be uploaded, although watermarking photos is allowable. You'll have the ability to download any that you like directly to your own computer...or you can order prints (and even photomerchandize like T-shirts and coffee mugs) directly from SmugMug if you like.

Would you like to volunteer to be an Authorized Gallery Creator (AGC) for you club or council? If the answer is Yes, let your President know. All club and council Presidents will receive an email request that they submit the name and email address of their two AGC's. Password access and simple instructions for creating galleries will be sent directly to the AGC's.

Before you know it, we'll have an easily searchable archive of hundreds, if not thousands, of square and round dance photos and videos pf #SquareDancers #SeenHavingFun from across the entire state.

I encourage you to take advantage of the opportunity to share your photography skills with all your dancing friends.
