
We had hoped to have traveled to several clubs/ councils during our tenure as President Couple, but have not wanted the risk to ourselves & others – I hope you understand.

...that publicizing slow but steady progress month after month makes it difficult, if not impossible, for some to ignore? That's the "working theory", at least, in publishing the latest statistics in each month's "Did You Know....?" article concerning WA state clubs' and councils' participation in posting their events on the <u>WheresTheDance.com</u> ("WTD") website.

It appears to be working!

As we began the new year, a total of 41 square dance organizations (clubs, councils, associations) across WA state had events posted on the site. That's up from 24 back in September and about 30 last month. After excluding a few unaffiliated organizations (non-federated), the "participation rate" among affiliated WA State Federation organizations is now at 48%.

Who (which clubs or councils) will push the participation rate over 50% (or, better yet, to 100%)? Yours perhaps?

Kudos to Penny Curtis for adding several Mt. Baker Council clubs to the ranks last month (9 out of 16 clubs are now onboard)!

Performing a WTD search across the entire state of WA identified 331 posted events (dances, classes, workshops) during the 90 day between January 6, 2022 and April 6, 2022. That's a significant number of opportunities to get out on the dance floor. But given that over half of the clubs in our state are not represented in the search results, the "real" number of opportunities to get out on the dance floor is probably between 6 and 7 hundred during any 90 day period.

To give you a more complete picture of where our state organizations currently stand in terms of actively posting their dance events on WTD, look at the table below.


The "Count" column represents the number of organizations within each council that had one or more events posted as of January 6, 2022.

The "%" column represents the percentage of clubs within the council with events posted as of January 6th. If only our dance community could see the whole "picture" with a single mouse-click. They could... if every club posted its calendar on the WTD website!

However, it is time to begin the renewal process for the year 2022-2023. This process will be returning to normal including all the dues and fees previously required. As before, we will be following the same protocol as pre-COVID relative to renewals.

We realize that each council makes out their own instructions due to the fact they all have different regulations and fees for their clubs. Therefore, we will email the renewal notification to each council treasurer with a 'cc' to the council president. We will include a generic sample that they are welcome to use in handling the renewals of their clubs. We intend to email these notifications out the first part of February. These club renewals will still be due back to us the 31st of May. Remember, all clubs, councils and associations are included in this renewal process.

The above process has nothing to do with the individual process of membership and insurance that we send out in March to each club treasurer. We will address that in the next "Footnotes" issue.





We wish to tell you about the "The First Friday Fun Fest", and other ideas for offering square dancing to the public!--

The Whirlybird Square Dance Club in Lynnwood, WA is the sponsor of the dance, and I initially suggested a once-a-month student dance which became The First Friday Fun Fest. The club is officerrun and I've called for the club for 45 years. "First Friday Fun Fest" started out as a student dance beginning in September about 9 years ago. It was to become a Half and Half dance when the new Jan. classes started that first year. Well, we had a lot more newer dancers coming versus the Sept. students, so I dedicated every third tip for the Sept. students. It wasn't long until I dedicated the whole program to the newest dancer in the hall. About the second or third year, experienced dancers would ask if it would be alright if they brought their niece, or their grandchild who was home on college break, or some nonsquare- dancing friends, etc., and so this became the beginning of the no-experience-necessary designation of the dance. Thus, our no-experience-necessary dance was dancer-created, having evolved into an entire program dedicated to the new dancer! Prior to Covid, our dance time was from 7:30-10:30 with a finger food and announcement break at 9:15. When Covid hit, all dancing, and many other activities, in Washington stopped because of a state mandate. As of the first Friday 2021, we are up and running again. Prior to Covid, we had never had a dance with less than 8 squares; the average was 13 squares!

The hall maximum is 18 squares but the parking lot is full at about 16 squares. We have actually had

people come the dance and leave because they couldn't find a parking place! When we reopened the dance program this September, we made a couple of changes: one because of Covid; no more food, and because we weren't taking a food break, we shortened the dance time—the last set of squares now starts at 9:30. That September dance was the first dance that we had less than 8 squares (we had 4), but about 1/3 of the floor were people experiencing square dancing for the first time which was amazing.

October's dance had 8 squares again and one square was made up of college students. November's dance had 9 squares, and our square of college students were back, and they stayed through the very last set of squares. They were laughing and giggling as they walked out the door. As they left the November dance, they said they had other plans for December, but they would be back in January.

December's dance had 8 squares again and there was at least a square of brand-new dancers in attendance.

At the very beginning of the dance, I ask those people that have never square danced before to raise their hand. We give them a round of applause and thank them for coming. Then I tell them they are going to experience a lot of square dancing, but the only thing I truly want them to remember, when it is over, is that they had a great time! We start the evening off with "this is your partner, corner, home position" and quickly teach Do Sa Do, Allemande left, and Promenade, and then I put the music on and start dancing through some star sequences. The square set is followed by a line dance, or easy round dance teach, and the dance progresses from there. It is fast-paced programming. The music rarely stops. There is no down-time and everything is briefly taught as-we-go, so they can dance as much or as little as they want. Nobody ever must sit out because of a star tip of upper-level squares or rounds, because

there aren't any! Just before the finger food break prior to the Covid changes (and now, it is placed second to the last tip), we have a light hearted hot hash hoedown competition, where the squares dance until they make a mistake that they can't recover from...When that happens, the square breaks it up and if there is food, they line up in the potluck line. The last square standing gets a hot hash hoedown dangle for their badge. The competition does a few things: It recover generation of the standard the s creates entertainment for those sitting out or standing in the potluck line, it is fun for our club dancers, too, and it gives a sense of accomplishment to the winning square. One night, after winning, one of our members said to me "We had the oldest couple (he and his wife are in their nineties) and the youngest couple (a middle school boy and his younger sister) in our square and we won!" Another time we had a square of 6th graders from one of the schools where I teach square dancing, and they won. I think that video is still on the

club's Facebook page. The competition is based on the material taught up to that point, and my goal is not to break the squares down, but to help them accomplish as much as they can with the skills that their square has as the competition gets faster & trickier.

This last November we used the First Friday Fun Fest to launch a Basic One Blast Class over that weekend (and we added also alamo style, swing thru, ocean wave trades, run, and wheel and deal). The club felt that it was successful enough that they are planning to do another one in March. We will start another mainstream class in February and the Blast Class will be another way to increase the attendance in the February class. I see this as a huge bonus for our area, in that it gives the current class students a chance to experience another teach of the movements that they have already been exposed to, and possibly a look at what is coming up in their regular classes, and it affords an opportunity for the newcomer to experience an intense introduction to square dancing. At the same time, they get to enjoy 3 fun dances in the same weekend. All area clubs are invited to bring people to this event.

More about the no-experience theme: Whirlybirds sponsored our council dance a few years ago. So, we rented a local middle school, and hired "The B.C. Boys" (a group of popular Canadian callers) as our attraction for the mainstream dance in the gym, and I taught and called at the no-experience dance in the cafeteria. We had between 60-70 squares in attendance! (About 50 squares in the gym, and 15-20 in the no-experience-necessary dance.) Also, our Mount Baker Council hosted the state festival a few years ago and programmed a no-experiencenecessary dance both Friday and Saturday night... we had about ten squares in attendance at those sessions both nights, about ½ of the participants were new to square dancing. Literature about classes was available, and people from the different area clubs were there to encourage the new dancers to consider looking up a class.

I strongly believe that we need dances like this at every large square dance event, including the National, other local and regional Square dance festivals, and Callerlab conventions. People are naturally curious and are willing to get out of their comfort zone to try something new if it looks interesting to them. Public advertising, of course, ahead of the event is key, and needs to be a focus of the event planning.

I remember several years ago; our shop was in the Plus hall at USA West in Boise. It was Thursday afternoon and I needed a bathroom break. As I walked out the main entrance headed for the rest room, I noticed a group of teenagers standing in the doorway watching the dancers. When I came back from the restroom, they were still there, so I asked them if they would like to learn a little bit about square dancing. They said yes, so we set up a square in front of our booth. I told them to listen to the music but to ignore the caller and just listen to me. (I had no mic or sound system, just the plus dance music). I taught and we danced for about 30 minutes and then they had to leave. I told them if they wanted to come back that evening, I would help them through some more dancing. They came back with an entire square! Friday night they were back with a square again. (Some of the originals couldn't make it so they recruited new teens to take their place) Saturday night I thought I had lost them. The dance was almost over and the afterparty was about to begin, and here they came dressed in their version of what a square dancer should look like! The after party was a much smaller dance and it was an all singing call dance; I took the square out into the middle of the floor and again told them to listen to me and we danced the night away. Again, they had a new boy in the square. I didn't want to start from the very beginning, so I left it up to the square to help him through. I've taught enough teens over the years that I know if they want to learn it, they will make it happen. I wasn't sure if the new boy was enjoying himself, until I noticed while he was dancing, he was singing the lyrics to the song along with the caller on stage!

There are opportunities to recruit new people into our activity all the time. When opportunity knocks, don't let it pass you by. It might lead to your next big class, or the beginning of your new big club. Programs like The First Friday Fun Fest can be a destination dance too, and we are proving that every month!

Callers may enjoy seeing this -- Below is the dance layout and lesson plan for the November First Friday Fun Fest and kick off dance for the blast class.

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM THE CAVNESS CORNER Shawn & Wendy Cavness shawn@rounddancing.org

his may not be news to many but there is a pandemic raging. (The former is of course a tongue in cheek comment.) Even if you are currently attending live dances - the pandemic has no doubt impacted your dancing to some extent. Many clubs are still inactive. Those that are dancing are seeing greatly reduced attendance - including the ones Wendy and I are hosting. Dancers, just like everyone else, each have their own thoughts and feelings about the amount of risk they are willing to take on as the pandemic continues to impact society. There were several months when practically all dancing was shut down. Some dancers have literally not round danced in 20 months. And not to be pessimistic but there is every possibility in the new year that things will get worse before they get better. We all miss dancing the way it used to be but one of the silver linings to the pandemic is that it has opened up a plethora of creativity around our activity. We truly believe that many of these ideas are here to stay even after the pandemic becomes a distant memory.

Prior to March of 2020, Wendy and I had been dancing, cueing and teaching at least 4 days per week consistently. March 13th was our very last Sweetheart Rounds dance that Spring – then, society changed. Literally every dance was cancelled. We immediately set to put together a dancing space in our garage. Four weeks later it was such a relief and a release to dance again - even though at that time it was just the two of us alone in our garage. Dancing is so important to us and we know it's important to everyone reading this article as well.

When society changed, some dance leaders (who are more enterprising than us) immediately switched to Zoom dancing. Our heroes in this arena are Bruce and Mary Nelson from Edmonton, Alberta. They didn't even skip a beat as they moved all of their dancing to Zoom and began hosting Zoom dances three days per week. Another cuer who is hosting Zoom dances from Phase II to Phase VI is Amy Shotting. We have not danced to her, but see her information all the time. Zoom dancing not only gives you a chance to dance to great cuers but also provides a sense of community that many of us had been missing ever since the early days of the pandemic. Many of you may still be missing that community. Even if you aren't ready to dance to Zoom cueing - it's worthwhile to join the Zoom dance just to feel like you are involved in dancing, and watch others dance. Wendy and I believe that Zoom dancing is here to stay. As the technology continues to evolve and as the cuers who are taking advantage of the technology continue to gain confidence with the venue, there are many opportunities for Zoom to supplement our dancing. For instance, wouldn't it be great if a guest cuer could join a dance without having to travel? Many clubs simply don't have the finances to bring in a world class cuer and pay for their airplane and lodging expenses. If that cuer/ instructor could interact with the dancers without having to actually be there, it would be a win/win all around. Another idea - with the number of cuers/ instructors continuing to diminish there are many locations where there are dancers but no cuers at all. A club in that location could hire an experienced cuer from another location to regularly Zoom-cue dances at a dance hall, keeping alive Round Dancing in that location. It's really very exciting to think about the opportunities this technology can bring to expanding our activity!

As we began to explore opportunities to continue to stay in touch with our own dancers, we also looked at YouTube and Facebook. Those forums are not interactive like Zoom dancing, but they do provide the opportunity to provide cued dancing. There was a misunderstanding that we could not provide music on the internet without paying a hefty extra fee to the copyright companies – ASCAP, BMI and SESAC. That is true if you want to present on Zoom or want to publish to a private website. But it is not true for publishing on YouTube or Facebook. Both social media sites have private agreements with the copyright companies which work on our behalf. That means we can publish cued music to either site without paying an extra fee. This is a fantastic opportunity for individuals who would like to dance to cued music in their own home! Dance Demos -YouTube which had been relatively stagnant up until recently has lately published several new dances. Though they tend to focus on Phase III and above, there are still a few Phase II dances on their dance list. One of the great upsides to Dance Demos on YouTube is that you can watch the dances being performed by professional dance instructors and learn from them. Bruce and Mary Nelson have also published all their Zoom dances on You Tube. Their site is Bruce Nelson - YouTube. They cue Phase II through IV so there are a lot of Phase II dances on their channel that you can dance from home. We think that YouTube is a great opportunity - just like Zoom - that should continue to be utilized even after this pandemic someday ends. One thing that Wendy and I continue to work on is supplementing our live classes with YouTube content. In doing so, we provide simple cued loops that our students practice at home - of the figures we taught that week in class. In addition, dances that we have already taught can be demonstrated virtually on YouTube. Truthfully, we haven't had the time to put this content together as well as we would like to have, but what we have done so far can be seen on our YouTube channel: Shawn and Wendy Cavness -YouTube. We really think the possibilities for utilizing YouTube, Facebook and other social media channels to supplement teaching and dancing are amazingly exciting!

So now we hope you are eager to dance in your own home. Find a location with a little bit of room. We have seen people dance in their Kitchens, Garages, Living Rooms, even their Hallways. Push your furniture out of the way and dance. For Latins you only need a small amount of room. For Smooths you probably need a bit more, as they move around a bit. If you have a Smart TV, YouTube is probably already there. Otherwise use your laptop or smart phone or smart tablet. Just log into whatever channel you want to use and play the dances. If you want to Zoom dance, you will need to reach out to the hosts. We don't feel comfortable publishing their E-Mail addresses here, but send us an E-Mail at shawn@ rounddancing.org and we can send you either Bruce and Mary's or Amy Shotting's E-Mail address so you can reach out to them to get the Zoom meeting IDs. They are very open to new attendees.

The pandemic has been devastating to our activity in multiple ways, but at the same time there are opportunities that would probably never have been explored if it wasn't for the pandemic creating those needs. We hope that those will be the ultimate legacy of the last two years. Whatever it takes, just keep dancing!

The February Washington Round of the Month is "If It Ain't One Thing" by Janet Cook. This is a Waltz.

Janet Cook was born in the UK and grew up on old time dancing passing her bronze medal just 1 day after her 5th birthday. She moved to Australia with her family in 1971 and continued with the old-time dancing and added both modern ballroom and Latin as well. She competed locally and then turned professional achieving her teaching qualification at 18 years old. She got into square dancing whilst attending Adelaide University and upon graduation moved to Melbourne in Victoria. She starting calling in 1982 and opened her first square dance club "Mountain Squares" in June 1983. This was soon followed by a round dance club "Forest Rounds" and later a line dance club as well. She now calls, cues and teaches at a non-metro club called Rosedale Squares and Rounds.

Janet wrote her first dance in 1999 after being asked to do so for a local competition. The dance was written in under 2 weeks and Janet was surprised when it came 2nd. Since that time, she has written numerous dances and in 2021 won round of the quarter from Roundalab for her Two Step dance "Under this old hat".

Janet loves to travel combining dance weekends with sightseeing the world. She has attended and called and cued at dances in the USA, Europe and New Zealand and is looking forward to getting back to travelling again once.
