





It's that time of year again! New classes are starting and we were wondering if you've thought about any changes from what you've done previously. Do you plan to change anything, such as teaching technique, or perhaps the list and order you are going to teach from?

In our area, several clubs have adopted the Callerlab SSD program with a 4-week continuation on to Mainstream. The entire program takes 16 weeks to complete. SSD takes 12 weeks, and the MS program takes 4 weeks. This program was developed to bring new dancers along rapidly and get them dancing as soon as possible. In doing so, those of us who are teaching and calling the SSD/MS program realize we must forgo the concept of DBD dancing. That is to say, the calls taught are basic, and the more complex formations and uses of the calls are not taught or called at dances, but reserved for workshops. The theory is, the dancers will get comfortable during the club workshops and dances where little by little we can introduce them to the more complex formations and uses of the calls.

For those of us teaching and calling this program, at least with the clubs that I, along with Greg Weber and Steve Mazel are teaching for, it seems to be working.

When teaching a multi-club program such as the one Greg, Steve and I are involved with, the biggest hazard seems to be early recruitment. We, along with our clubs, have agreed (The Code) not to recruit until after the new dancers have completed the program. Suffice it to say, too much recruitment can be a bad thing and turn the new dancers off. Remember, "Stick to the Code". We recognize this is a difficult thing to do. If you as a club member, do your due diligence to make certain that when new students / dancers show up at your club, they are made to feel welcome and at home. Then club membership will pretty much take care of itself. Don't shove a club packet in their hands as they walk thru the door the first time and say "join our club, ours is the fun club."

This program is working. Greg and I, along with Sue and Marie, called a New Year's Eve dance that we invited all our current class members to. Several of them came. They were able to meet and dance with people from the various clubs without judgement and there was no soliciting to join clubs. It was all about having fun. The dance had a modest 7 squares in attendance. This was a perfect opportunity for club members to get to know new dancers. Not all our recent graduates were able to come, due to previous commitments, but all said they wanted to.

This brings me to another thought. For many new dancers, it is difficult to transition from Class Night to Club Night. It's our belief that introducing them to Club Night as early as possible by having class level dances, is a manageable way to accomplish this. This can include special dances as well as having graduation on Club Night. We are competing for their available time. We all say we would like some of the younger people to join us. Many of them already have activities dedicated to their kids, Soccer, Baseball or School activities. Their time is limited. If we ask too much they will simply walk away. When I was growing up in a Square Dance family, Square Dancing was a "way of life". We dedicated a lot of time to our clubs, did many travels and even stole a banner or two. Today, Square and Round Dancing is more of a Hobby. We try to keep that in mind when approaching new dancers. Nothing over the top. We feel we are lucky to get them for two hours a week for lessons. Let them gradually ease into our activity that we love so much.

Progression: Corner

Teaching Hints

With the exception of a few moves, everything can be taught and called from two couple arrangements. By having two couples starting in the head positions, you can develop routines that teach the move at times even better than having a full square. If you are not already using this technique, I would encourage you to give it a try.

Teaching Jewel

At times dancers struggle with Square Thru. Consider using a number of Wrong Way Right and Left Grand before introducing Square Thru. Then put the students in the two couple teaching formation and teach a mini wrong way Right and Left Grand. Once they are comfortable with the direction and flow, introduce Square Thru. This seems to work for the standard position.

In closing, Marie and I hope you had a wonderful holiday season, and don't forget to register for the 2023 State Festival at the Suquamish Event Center. Hope to see you there!

Don't Bleed on the Fabric

There is an old Appalachian superstition that says, 'If a stitcher pricks her finger while sewing a garment, she should wipe the blood on a hidden inside seam, so her blood will protect the person who wears it.'

Rotary cutters can do a whole lot more damage than a drop of blood. I know several stitchers who have required a trip to the emergency room and several stitches to repair the damage. When nerves are cut, the feeling in the ends of the fingers may never come back. Rotary cutters are sharp as a surgeon's scalpel.

Concentrate and focus your eyes only on the blade. Trying to watch TV while cutting has caused miss cut fabric and cut fingers. Even having a conversation with someone in the same room can cause you to shift your gaze.

Always close the blade cover before putting it down. Use a spring action cutter whenever possible. These are not available in smaller sizes. Clear the space around your cutting. You could put the blade down on something you didn't want to cut.

This is not pizza - Replace the blade. If you have to roll the cutter back and forth several times, you are shredding the edge of the fabric, cutting a groove in the mat, and working too hard. Pushing down to cut with a dull blade increases the chance of slipping and warps the blade. Yes, they are expensive, but so is medical treatment.

It is easy to construct your own finger guard. At the hardware store, get a clear plastic Corner Guard by Trimaco, 1 1/8"x1 1/8". Mine was 8 feet long, so I have plenty to cut. Brand 3M Command Small Designer mounting strips. This makes the finger guard removable.

Cut the Corner Guard a bit shorter than the ruler. I used a Dremel cutting wheel and sander. It is not perfect, but it works. Wipe the ruler and the Corner Guard with alcohol to remove finger oil. This example is an 18-inch ruler, Just used two Command strips. The numbers can be seen plainly, and it feels sturdy.


Sadly, some of you may have heard that our beloved cuer Cyndi Silicki passed away on December
