IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM THE FINANCIAL DIRECTOR

Financial Adviser's Report, by Doug Schafer, Attorney, October 21, 2023

We regularly remind clubs and councils that they should submit the very simple IRS Form 990-N annually. If they fail for three consecutive years to do so, they automatically lose their exemption from federal income tax and become a taxable business. The form should be submitted electronically by the 15th day of the 5th month after the end of the organization's fiscal year.

There is now an additional reason to stay in compliance. In 2021 Congress was concerned about illegal money laundering and other financial crimes, so it enacted the Corporate Transparency Act ("CTA") requiring almost all corporations, including nonprofit corporations, to report to the Treasury Department's Financial Crimes Enforcement Network ("FinCEN") specific personal information about the individuals owning or controlling the corporation. That could include the officers of an incorporated square dance club.

Fortunately, Congress relieved tax-exempt corporations from CTA's reporting requirements, but if a nonprofit corporation loses it's federal income tax-exemption, such a by failing to file its IRS Form 990-N, then 180 days later it loses it CTA exemption and must report the personal information about the individuals controlling it. A willful failure to report when required can result in very steep civil or criminal penalties against the corporation and its officers. While federal agency enforcement against a small club seems unlikely, the club's officers may have a nightmare dealing with computer-generated penalty notices.

An important point is that the new CTA reporting does not apply to unincorporated associations, even though federal income tax law treats them the same as incorporated entities. So if your square dance club or council has not filed as a corporation with the WA

Secretary of State, then the CTA does not apply to it. And it could be argued that if that WA state official has administratively dissolved the corporate charter of a club or council for failing to pay the annual license fee, then the club or council became an unincorporated association to which the CTA does not apply. Because we have the Federation's liability insurance coverage, the liability protections from incorporating might be considered unnecessary.

The new CTA reporting is required in 2024 for non-exempt corporations that exist at the start of that year. So if a club or council has lost it income tax exemption by failing to file the IRS Form 990-N, then it promptly should file an application with the IRS to restore its income tax exemption, probably as either a 501(c)(7) social club or a 501(c)(3) educational-cultural charity.

HOSTING AN ALZHIEIMER'S DANCE

Marty Bahr was diagnosed with young onset Alzheimer's Disease (AD) in 2000 at the age of 50. He succumbed to the disease eight years later, passing away December 30, 2008.

Marty was born and raised in Seattle, Washington and lived much of his life there. His final six years were spent in Chicago, Illinois where he received exceptional clinical treatment for AD from Rush University Medical Center's Alzheimer's Disease Center (RADC).

During his working life, Marty spent his career in the insurance industry. He rose through the ranks to become an executive with a major insurance company. He was forced to leave that position as the AD symptoms began to manifest; as he could no longer perform the duties required. At that point in time (around 1995), an AD diagnosis had not been made—the medical community at large did not yet recognize that AD could occur in a younger age group ("younger" defined as under the age of 65). It would be another five years before Marty would be delivered the diagnosis by University of Washington Alzheimer's Research Disease Center. (ARDC)

As I his brother (Joe) could see his brother starting to decline. I decided I would ask my square dance group, and the square dance community to support me in hosting a dance with all donations going to the UW study of the brain.

I told Marty what my plans were, he was overjoyed. The dances became well attended and Marty asked if I would continue, he would donate his brain to research. Maybe his life would be worth something and he could help others in doing so. I replied Marty you got a deal!

Today with the generocity of square dancers this will be the 15th fund raiser. We are approaching \$100,000.00 supporting the UW study of the brain. Dr. Thomas Grabowski head of the Study group is extremely appreciative.

How to Wash the Cat:

CIRCULATING THOUGHTS

Have you ever wondered why we have so many levels in our square dance activity? In the late 1950's when I used to go watch my parents square dance, there were no named levels, and everyone just learned to square dance. Sometime in the late 1960's early 1970's we started to see more movements added to our activity. With the formation of Callerlab, in 1974, we began the process of standardizing the movements of square dancing and creating some of the programs we still dance today. If you interested in some of the history of Callerlab and why it was created, you can read more at this link: https://callerlab.org/the-history-of-callerlab/.

During the past fifty years the original calls my parents danced to have grown through the creativity of several callers and dancers, and new moves have been created and added to our activity. To better manage this growth in movements, Callerlab created several levels or programs to help organize all the moves that were created. The result is that we now have multiple levels, each with its own set of movements, requiring additional class attendance to master those moves.

So why have I just given you a short history of how my parents' square dancing became what we have today? Because I would like to discuss the pros and cons of our various levels of dance, and why we all need to remember why we enjoy this activity. Every square dancer has their own reasons why they enjoy our activity. For some it is the enjoyment of meeting people from all walks of life who come together to socialize and dance to great music with friends. For others it is an opportunity to come together with their friends and enjoy the satisfaction of what I call "puzzle solving." In our current activity we have dancers of both persuasions. Neither of those dancers are better than the other because, remember, square dancing is a non-competitive activity. Yet I continue to see the perception that some dancers are better than others because they dance at levels well above Basic and Mainstream. This attitude only creates an environment that will eventually destroy square dancing.

I remind everyone who dances at levels above Basic and Mainstream to remember their roots and continually seek opportunities to dance at those levels. One of the best ways you can do this is by supporting Basic and Mainstream lessons in your area. If you only dance Plus, Advanced, or Challenge you are not helping to grow our activity. Without Basic and Mainstream lessons and dances there wouldn't be anyone to dance Plus, Advanced and Challenge. Support your Mainstream clubs and show up to their dances and lessons. The new dancers need your dance expertise to learn and be successful.

I appreciate the folks who are supportive of the Basic and Mainstream programs. I have a couple who dance at the Challenge level who regularly attend the Basic dance that I call once a month for my club. I have an individual who I taught to dance, who now dances at the upper levels of Challenge. He still faithfully attends my basic and Mainstream dances as well as regularly showing up at lessons to be an angel. I have another couple who I taught to dance, who dance at the C2 level but still return to dance Mainstream and help with Basic lessons whenever they can.

I'll close this by saying that I would like each and everyone who reads this to think about why you enjoy square dancing and remember where and when you started enjoying this wonderful activity. If you dance at levels above Mainstream remember to support the Basic and Mainstream lessons and dances in your area. Go and dance and have fun and quit worrying about what level you dance. If you are a Mainstream caller, make your dances interesting and fun so dancers from all levels have a great experience. In the world of square dancing what dance level you have achieved is important only to you. Be sure you make the other dancers feel welcome and accepted regardless of the skills you have acquired.

Have fun and dance whenever you can!



Hanging by a Thread

Stitchers choose the strangest places to go cheap. They spend good money on fabric, spend hours planning and cutting, and then buy the cheapest thread they can find. Your clothes are hanging on you by a thread.

There are many different types of thread, just as there are fabrics. Match the type of thread to the fabric, the project, and what works for you.

Cone thread is designed for sergers. This is the 'average' setting on your serger. It is 2-ply (made of two smaller threads) and lightly twisted 100% polyester. Three threads working together on the serger give the seam strength. Cones can be used on the sewing machine if you remember that a standard seam made with this thread is not as strong. I use it all of the time, where stress is not an issue. My dance outfits are usually serger thread. For sewing slacks, I use regular spool thread; these seams get stressed.

Spool thread is stronger than serger thread. It is cotton twisted around a polyester core. This tread will take care of most of your home sewing needs. Coats & Clark, Guttermann, and Mettler are the most common. The last two are a little more expensive. They are made of longer staple cotton and have a smoother finish. When working on expensive fabric, use one of these brands. Some stitchers say their machine prefers one brand over another. Use what works for you.

Rayon thread is for decoration, not sewing seams. It is weak, shiny and may bleed; looks great in machine embroidery.


There are many myths and 'rules' about threads.

(1) If you are sewing on 100% cotton, you MUST use 100% cotton thread. A polyester thread will 'saw' through the cotton fabric. Nope - Poly-cotton works fine unless you work on a special project, like microwave bowls. Sawing is an action; the thread is just lying there. (2) If you are sewing on polyester fabric, you must use polyester thread. Nope - I use Dual Duty on everything from polyester slacks to nylon undergarments.

DO NOT use cheap or old thread. The stuff that comes in sewing kits is weak, fuzzy, and useless. If it is on small black spools, toss it. In the picture, the red thread is from a sewing kit. The blue thread is a regular spool thread.

Thread ages just like most other things. All home sewing thread on wooden spools is over 60 years old; toss it. 100% cotton gets weak and brittle over time. Poly-cotton also deteriorates as it ages. An article I read said - old threads could be rejuvenated by putting them in a freezer for a few days. Also, you could leave them on a covered porch overnight so the morning dew could fall on them and make them young again. If that really worked, all of us would be sleeping on the patio table.

On your next trip to the store, take a few minutes to look at all of the different types of thread available and what they are designed for. Our great-grandmothers only had one type of thread for their treadle sewing machine - Cotton. They only had one type of fabric - woven. It could be cotton, linen, or wool. but it was a basic flat weave. We have so much more. Grab some thread, go to your happy place, and create something.





RECIPE OF THE MONTH



This recipe comes from the kitchen of Blenda Wienen, Wanda Kruse's mother. Wanda and her sister, Denise, were playing with dolls when Mom had them try these cookies. Instant hit! The sisters declared them "Mush-Mush"; the real name of the cookies has been lost. Please enjoy these cookies as much as the Wienens. Warning: very addictive, we suggest cutting it into small squares.

Mush-Mush Cookies (Cookies and Candy)

1/3 c. butter

1 – 6-oz. package Semi-Sweet Chocolate Morsels

½ c. sugar

½ t. salt

1 t. vanilla extract

2 eggs

3/4 c. all-purpose flour

½ c. chopped walnuts

1 to 1 ½ c. miniature marshmallows

Melt butter with morsels in saucepan over low heat, stirring occasionally. Blend in sugar, salt, and vanilla. Add eggs, beating well after each egg is added. Stir in flour and walnuts. Spread in buttered 8- or 9-inch square pan.

Bake at 350 for 20 to 25 minutes. While baking, make Chocolate Glaze.

1 ½ c. semi-sweet chocolate morsels

2 T. butter

½ c. light corn syrup

Melt semi-sweet chocolate morsels and butter with light corn syrup in top of double-boiler over hot water. Remove from heat but keep glaze over the water.

Remove pan from oven. Sprinkle immediately with marshmallows. Drizzle with glaze. Cool. Cut into squares.



73rd National Square Dance Convention® Parking

We have been getting questions on parking for our convention.

The downtown Milwaukee Convention area is undergoing a major growth spree with multiple developments and corporate offices springing up causing regular parking changes. We are

very much aware of the parking needs for our convention, and we are at the mercy of development and constant growth changes (none of which were going on when we bid the convention).

We are waiting for the pricing and guidelines for the new 400 space parking garage in the Baird Center, location of the 73rd National Square Dance Convention[®]. They have not, as of this writing, released their guidelines and pricing with ongoing construction. There are several city or privately owned parking garages around the Baird Center with height restrictions of 7 ft. These garages charge by the hour and do not provide in and out privileges.

There are a couple of open parking lots with no height restrictions at a walking distance of about 5 to 10 minutes. If you have oversize vehicles (over 7 ft. tall) please consider using mass transit to get to our convention site due to the overhead parking restrictions. The Milwaukee County Transit has Park and Ride lots with transit fees being very reasonable and the transit is very dependable and safe. More up to date 2024 information on area mass transit will be provided in the future as routes can and do change.

We have contacted area parking lots and none of them are able to work with us at this time to give us set parking rates. Rest assured, there are parking options very close to our convention site. Please watch for updates on parking locations and pricing as we gather dependable 2024 rate information to be posted on the 73nsdc.com website and the E-Magazine as we get closer to our convention.

Please consider registering at the Hilton Milwaukee City Center and receive \$5.00 daily parking with in & out privileges! (*There is a 7 ft. maximum height restriction.*) We cannot get these parking prices anywhere else in Milwaukee. The Hyatt also has parking, but it is a privately owned garage that will provide a reduced price.







Our club will also begin planning our Fall 2025 Council Dance early next year.


