





The following is an excerpt from the "Frequently Asked Questions" on the state web site under the M&I tab:

Question: What is the difference between club renewal and individual membership renewal?



A. Club Renewals: Club renewal is the process of renewing your club's membership in the state federation. This process is initiated by the M&I chair, but goes through your respective councils. The council is then ultimately responsible to distribute and collect these renewals along with the appropriate dues from each club in their council. The council then submits the completed forms along with the state dues to the M&I chair. This is the on-line form. Each council is also required to renew their council in the state federation each year. Club treasurers need to remember, this form is returned to your council. B. Individual Membership Dues: Individual membership dues are also initiated by the M&I chair, but are handled differently. The M&I chair emails the membership list, invoice, and instruction letter to each club treasurer. The club treasurer is required to authenticate the membership list per the instructions, fill out the invoice, and returns the completed invoice and corrected membership list along with the \$6.00 per member dues directly to the M&I chair. If a person belongs to more than one Washington Federated club, they pay their membership and insurance dues through only one club.

End of Excerpt

By the time you read this, the council treasurers should have received the club renewal instructions for the 2019-2020 dance season. We are following the same procedure as last year. We would ask each council to assist clubs that may have difficulty filling out the on-line form. Councils need to remember, they are also considered a 'club' in the annual club renewal process. Clubs remember, these are club renewals under the direction of your council and returned back to your council.

For your club renewal, the form is on the state web site under the M&I tab labeled "Club and Council Membership New Club &

Renewal Form". Click on this form to begin the renewal process.



Each line on the form contains specific instructions as to what information should be entered in that field. In order to 'see' this information, all you have to do is put your cursor in that field (do not click in the field, just put your cursor in the field) and leave it for two or three seconds. Lo and Behold!! Information magically

appears as to what belongs in that field!

We will be emailing out the individual forms, invoices and instructions for the year 2019-2020 directly to every club treasurer in March. Remember, this is the process that requires an updated membership list along with a check for \$6 per member sent directly to us, the Membership and Insurance Chair. We will talk more about this in the next issue.

As always, please feel free to contact us with any concerns.

CONCEALED POCKET


This pocket works like a fanny-pack, but it fits under the skirt or under the petticoat. It does not show or weigh down the skirt.

Materials

- 1. Seven inch zipper any color
- 2. Fabric 8 inches by 16 inches, thin and strong like nylon wind breaker
- 3. Cord or elastic for the waist tie

Instructions

- 1. Sew the open end of the zipper shut. Just zig zag across the end of the tape with a wide stitch.
- 2. Lay the zipper face down on the right side of the fabric at the 8 inch side. Stitch down the middle of the zipper tape. Move the zipper down to the other 8 inch side of the fabric and stitch down the middle of the zipper tape. You now have a tube of fabric.
- 3. Open the zipper. Position the zipper so that it is two inches down from the fold of the tube. Sew the open sides of the tube with a half inch seam. Leave a half inch space at the top of the seam near the zipper





- 4. Reach in through the open zipper and turn the pocket right side out.
- 5. Thread the elastic or cord in through one top corner of the pocket and out through the other top corner. Use the zipper foot to sew across the top of the pocket just below the cord. Tie the pocket around your waist under your skirt. Your items are safe, secure and invisible. I prefer this to a pocket in the skirt because I take it off after a day of dancing at the convention and put it on the next day with my new outfit. I never forget my stuff in the other skirt pocket.

Are you Bi-dance-ual or Ambi-dance-trous?

Many clubs have more female dancers than male dancers. In order to keep from sitting on the side lines, many gals have learned to dance the guy's part. By being flexible and willing to do something different, they keep dancing. It doesn't matter which side you are on, Belle or Beau, Gull or Buoy, the dance is the object. If you are the one who can fill out a square by dancing which ever position is needed, you keep seven other people dancing.

One night we made an all-female square. All of us in the square could dance either position. Of course, we danced right in front of the caller. He refused to look at us. We kept exchanging positions as we were dancing. Was that the reason he ignored us? Or was it the spare girl that kept cutting in? At the end of the set he referred to us as a bi-dance-ual square. Since then I have heard another term is ambi-dance-trous.

The easiest way to become bi-dance-ual is to go through lessons, from the beginning, in the other position. While you are at lessons you need to stay on the new side. Don't switch back and forth. Once you are in the mind set you will learn faster. It helps if you at least start with an experienced dancer for partner and your corner. The left allemande is one of the hardest parts to re-learn because it is one of the first things we learned.

When new dancers see the wrong sex coming at them in a right & left grand, it throws them off. Make brightly colored tabards with BOY in large letters on the front and back. Wearing one of these will help all the dancers know you are in the guy's part. A small badge can't be seen. A cap is a good idea for a girl dancing the man's part because the caller can see the top of her head and be reminded that she is on the he side. The British driving cap I wear seems to help remind me that I am a gent, maybe it's a foreign weight on my head that triggers my thinking "I'm a boy, I'm a boy, I'm a boy."

I was admiring a large, stretchy beaded bracelet on a gal at the last national and she told me it was her boy-girl bracelet. When she danced the girl side she put it on her right hand to remind her to slide-through, turn right and when she danced the boy side she wore it on the left wrist to slide-through, turn left. The Japanese dancers at Nationals wore a wide diagonal sash when they danced the male side.

Some people think that going to new dancer lessons is boring. They know how to dance so well they don't want to dance with new dancers. Well, I challenge you to go through lessons and become ambi-dance-trous. Let's see how fast and how well you learn on the other side.

When I make a mistake while dancing the boy side, I excuse it by saying, "The sex change operation didn't go very well!"

Scholarships are awarded at the Washington State Square & Folk Dance Festival held in June each year. Monies are paid directly to the winner's college or trade school.



("Tech" Tips for promoting your club using the Internet and Social Media)

.... there's probably a "solution" out there somewhere for every problem we face as square dancers? Sometimes the "solution" already exists but is obscured from view. The fact that a solution already exists for a particular problem just gets lost in the hustle bustle of everyday life...or perhaps a "not in my backyard" attitude prevents a known solution from gaining the traction and attention it deserves.

The "Snowgeddon" that occurred this past month in the Pacific Northwest, resulting in many canceled dance events, highlights the fact that successfully getting the word out to everyone who might be affected by a dance event cancellation is not guided by a well-defined, or easily achieved, policy or process.

You might reasonably conclude....that's a problem! So what's the solution?

"Oh, I know" (says *Problem Solver #1*), "let's post a cancellation notice on Facebook (or Twitter, or Instagram)." Really? Aside from the fact that many dancers (believe it or not) do not have a Facebook (or Twitter, or Instagram) account, many who do (have an account on one or more these platforms) check them infrequently. Many who check their accounts, even frequently, don't have their notifications preferences set in a way that guarantees they'll see a post about a particular dance cancellation they may have planned to attend. Even if a dancer specifically looks for a cancellation notice, there's no guarantee they'll find it quickly, it at all. Does anyone truly believe this approach, alone, is sufficient? How naïve.

Problem Solver #2 takes a different approach. "Let's send a mass email to everyone on our mailing list and ask them to help spread the word." Many of the same problems mentioned above (with Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram) are equally problematic when it comes to email communications. Not every dancer (believe it or not) has an email account. Not every dancer who has an email account checks their email often. Not to mention how annoying it is, for those who do check email often, to receive multiple forwarded emails, and be repeatedly reminded of "cancellations" for dances they did not even plan to attend. How tiresome.

Problem Solver #3 favors posting a notice on their club's website...or was that on their council's website...or maybe it was on the State Federation website...or...perhaps we should just send a notice to any/all of the several grassroots "newsletter" providers in the state. I'm confused already. My head is spinning. The club didn't post its dance in the first place on any (or certainly not all) of the websites or newsletters mentioned...or did they? So why would they bother posting a cancellation now, and on which site(s) would they post it? Could it be posted independently, or would they have to request that a webmaster or newsletter author to intervene and post a notice on their behalf? How complex.

Then, of course, there's always the fallback solution favored by *Problem Solver #4...*just post a notice on the dance hall door stating "Tonight's Dance Is Canceled Due to Inclement Weather". How thoughtful.

The result is an unhappy, chaotic, default approach to scattergun as many of the above "solutions" as one can muster, all at the same time, and hope for the best. How daunting, yet still not very effective. Anecdotal evidence confirms Solution 1, for certain, did not work...and resulted in dancers showing up at an empty parking lot and dark dance hall last week. (And there wasn't even a Solution #4 sign on the door, either). How could we do better?

Consider this Problem Solution (which already exists!) Post all dance events (including dances, workshops, and classes) on the only website currently designed with built-in functionality to deal with cancellation notices. WheresTheDance.com allows you to post events, flyers, and even CANCELLATION NOTICES, independently (that means on your own, without the need of a webmaster to post it for you). Posting a cancellation notice (including posting a reason for said cancellation) takes only seconds to achieve for any authorized representative (anyone who volunteers for a club or council, or is assigned by same, to be a WheresTheDance editor). Dancers do not need to establish an account. Dancers can access the website 24x7 from any platform (desktop PC, tablet, iPad, smartphone). Canceled events don't simply get "deleted" and disappear from the event list. They will, instead, be instantly highlighted on the website with a large, red "CANCELLED" stamp across the face of the original post (so dancers don't have to guess if someone forgot to post the dance in the first place). And dancers wouldn't have to search club or council Facebook, Twitter, Instagram accounts, or personal email account... or club Websites, council websites, or the State Federation website to see if the dance they'd planned to attend is still happening or is canceled. Dancers would only have to go to one place, WheresTheDance.com, and enter two bits of search criteria (the center point of search, e.g. Sumner WA, and a radius around that center, e.g. 50 miles) to see who's got dances scheduled, and which ones (if any) have been canceled. How refreshing.

While it may take "an act of Congress" to get anything done in this country, the author hopes club, council, and State Federation leadership in Washington will take the initiative and necessary steps to accept this solution. Failing that, hopefully the dancers themselves will hold leadership accountable.
