
I HAVE MOVED SOME OF THE ADVERTISING TO A NEW LOCATION, because weekend events appeal to more than one council they are now found

- 3. Involvement in State Festivals and Leadership Seminar
- 4. National conventions, legacy, etc. if applicable (not a requirement)
- 5. Any other significant contributions to our square, round and folk dance activity
- 6. Family background

Have your nomination to us by April 1, 2023. That will allow us time to evaluate the nominees and make a final decision, and will give us time to coordinate with the families and friends to be at the presentation in June.

...there's always a choice between "staying the course" and "charting a new course"?

While we certainly all know that's true, we also know that charting a new course is frequently "easier said than done".

I encourage you to read the following. With permission, I copied it from a recent Facebook post by Stephen Cole, a WA state caller and fellow square dancer: "The idea that Kodak was caught off guard and put out of business by digital photography is a myth.

The first digital camera was invented by a Kodak engineer, Steve Sasson, in 1975. However, it was filmless photography and film (along with chemicals and paper) was what paid the bills and kept shareholders happy.

Change needed to happen at Kodak but, because it \*would not\* shift away from the way it had been doing business, it has been relegated to history.

Kodak's denial about the need to change is called the "innovator's dilemma" and was outlined by Clayton Christensen in 1997. If Kodak had moved to digital photography space early, it would cannibalize its existing business. This would have made them less profitable and angered shareholders. A switch to digital had the additional risk of angering Kodak's customer base.

Another example is Nokia. They used to \*own\* the mobile phone market and their engineers couldn't get their management to approve touch-screen devices. Today, the choices are iPhones or Android phones.

Around 20 years ago, Borders bookstores were everywhere. As a company, it seems to only exist as a footnote in the history of Amazon.com.

What does this all have to do with modern square dancing?

There are some changes needed (large and small) to help square dancing adapt to a 21st Century society.

They're needed at the club level, the regional level, the national level, and the international level. Some will be easier than others.

There are a number of responses that come up when changes are suggested. The two most popular variations seem to be:

- 1) We don't need changes... let's focus on stabilizing the existing program and getting the dancers back to confidence in their own skills.
- 2) With all the division/confusion among dancers and callers alike regarding SSD and Basic/Mainstream, we don't need any changes right now.

These kinds of responses either minimize or dismiss the issues square dancing is having. I've been dancing for 30 years and calling for about 28. I've heard these same statements the whole time.

How many square dance clubs are experiencing record growth right now? If you found out that even one club was growing beyond expectation, would you be willing to do what they're doing?

In my area, I'm seeing an increase in student-level dance attendance. People are enjoying times they can get together. That is, those people that are learning to dance seem to be using square dancing as a social outlet more than they have in recent memory.

We, as the greater square-dancing community, should be looking at ways to make it easier to learn to dance and expand our popularity. It's a complex issue and will have multiple--sometimes competing--solutions.

Changes (large and small) are needed to help modern square dancing adapt to changes in society. (Unless, of course, you want to see square dancing go the way of Kodak.)

The dance you save might be your own."

Thank you, Stephen, for restating (once again, and in clear language) what many of us know to be true about the uphill challenges we, as square dance leaders, have had (for decades) to revitalize our activity. Yet, as a collective, we have failed to overcome those challenges. The question remains: Do we have the guts it will take to "chart a new course"? I believe the answer is, "Yes, but only if our current leaders (and dancers who should become leaders) are willing to work for it. Time will tell.





# Squarely Speaking

This month we want to address gentle dancing. As new dancers start coming to our dances, we have noticed that sometimes there is redirecting of the newer dancers by experienced dancers. We know this is done with the best of intentions and just trying to help. The only problem is, there are both good ways and bad ways to help.

- Make certain you understand the definition of the call before helping the new dancer. It is never ok to say it goes something like this, then give them an improper definition.
- 2. NEVER jerk, pull, or twist trying to get them into position. This causes frustration on the part of the new dancer. Sometimes it can even cause injury.
- If the mistake continues, ask the caller to review the call. I am certain that he or she will be happy to review the call with you and the new dancer. We recently called a dance where a new dancer

complained that the more seasoned dancer jerked and pulled several times to the extent it hurt the new dancer. This is the surest way to run them off. Every time we run someone off, they tell their friends and that becomes one less dancer we can recruit. Remember, at lessons, the club members are there to fill squares. Let the caller or Cuer teach.

On another topic, State Festival and Leadership are just around the corner. State Festival gives you the opportunity to meet other dancers from different areas, and Leadership provides a chance for you to see what other clubs are doing and suggestions of how to grow this activity. Many of our clubs are beginning to rebound from the Covid years and getting back into the groove of dancing. Come out and see what ideas you can glean for your club.

Both of these events can be a showcase for Callers and Cuers. If you are interested in calling or cueing out of your immediate area these two venues will give you the opportunity to put your talent on display and get future bookings. Keep in mind we are not in a competition. Our advice is to put your best product out for the dancers to hear. If you do a good job and the dancers find you enjoyable you will eventually get bookings.

A good mixture of angels, well spread out helps to minimize mistakes. Angels please remember you are there to help. Gentle guidance is one thing but be careful not to push or pull the new dancers. They get frustrated easily.

#### **Teaching Jewel**

You're never too old to learn new tricks. I have taught Grand Square for years by separating the sides and heads working them separately to learn each part. While teaching with Greg Weber, he taught "when you are close together you backup. When you are far apart you walk forward. This simple method works so well I have "researched" it and it is now one of my teaching tools. Thanks Greg

Clean Your Machine or Toss It

When was the last time you had your sewing machine professionally adjusted and cleaned? If you sew a lot, your machine should go in every two to three years.

Then again, it might not be worth it. A full service on a machine can be \$150. Is the machine worth that amount of money? If the machine is old and has been used frequently, the gears are stripped, and the cams are worn. Just like fixing an old car, parts aren't available. You love your machine; it has given you a lot of happy times. At some point, you need to retire your friend. You like your old machine because you know where all the controls are. Getting a new machine is a steep learning curve.

I was repairing machines; a gal brought in her inexpensive older model. I assessed the problem and told her the price. She refused. It was less expensive to get a cheap new machine and run it until it quit than to repair one. She didn't need the fancy embroidery stitches for what she did. An inexpensive new or reconditioned machine would be cheaper and run as long as a repair on her old one.

When people brought their machine to the shop, they said, "The tension needs adjusting." It was either the timing or a build-up of lint that was the problem. One lady told me she would not pay for a cleaning, she just wanted the tension adjusted, and her machine was clean. I took her, the machine, and the air compressor hose outside. I gave her machine one good blast, and a lint cloud flew out. Finally, she agreed to pay the shop price.

One - Quit spitting on your machine. Blowing the lint away is spiting. This makes the lint stick together. You are blowing the sticky lint deeper into the machine.

Two - Vacuum - Take the bobbin, the needle out, and the presser foot off. Take out the bobbin race and needle plate. Start on the top and follow the thread path. The light bulb area needs attention. Vacuum the bobbin area.

Check the feed dogs. I worked on a machine that had so much toe jam between the feed dogs that it raised the needle plate. Use a toothbrush to clean the dogs.

Put a tiny drop of oil on a Q-tip, don't soak it. Instead, use it to reach into the corners around the bobbin area. Oil the machine according to the manual and put everything back together.

Three - Try this out of your sewing area. Take the machine, with the pieces removed, to an air compressor. That is how they clean machines in the shop. Blast it with highpressure air until the lint stops flying. Don't use canned air because it isn't as strong and is cold. Cold has been known to cause cracks in plastic parts, and cold metal parts attract condensation. Four - Check your electrical cords. Exposed wires can start fires. Also, I have seen cords chewed by dogs and cats. Replacement cords are available in repair shops.

Five - Wipe off the outside of the machine. Do NOT spray cleaner on the machine. It gets inside and causes rust. Instead, spray a rag and wipe. Especially the deck where the fabric rubs. I stained white fabric pink because I didn't clean the deck after sewing a large red project.



#### WAYNE EASTON – FEBRUARY 3, 1937 to JANUARY 8, 2023

Caller Wayne Easton was a square dance legend having called for over 55 years and was a well-known pillar of our square dance community! He will be greatly missed by all who knew Wayne and enjoyed dancing to his wonderful calling!

The article below was written 11 years ago when Wagon Wheels celebrated Wayne's 50+ years of calling. In June of 2012, Donna Rohde from Wagon Wheels interviewed Wayne and his dance partner of 25 years, Loretta Minniear, about how Wayne was introduced to Square Dancing and later became a Caller!

On June 11, 2012, Wayne Easton was honored by over 200 family, friends and square dancers at the Meridian Grange Hall in Kent, Washington to commemorate his 50 plus years of being a Square Dance Caller! The following is how Wayne became involved in square dancing which eventually led to his interest in becoming a Square Dance Caller.

"In 1960, my wife Annie wanted to square dance. *We joined a class for their last eight lessons with our* neighbors, Bob & Jackie George (Bob is still dancing). When lessons were over, we joined the club, Belles &

Beaux in Burien. The Caller was Hank Van Asselt. *We danced for approximately seven months before we discovered there was more to square dancing than at the* club we belonged to. We formed a close friendship with four couples and found ourselves dancing two to three times a week. Our little group found the dancing hours of 8:00 pm until midnight not to be enough dancing for us, so we would go to one of our four homes and continue dancing. The problem was – no Caller. Three of the men would do one record each for up to two hours. The outcome: our material had to be expanded. Approximately six months later, I would perform my first Call for a regular square dance. It's noted that I did not sing a note, but talked the whole dance, scared to death!

*In mid-1961, I taught a square for our Church and* shortly thereafter, we formed a new club called "The *Tumbleweeds.*" *We danced in Burien for about 3 years* and later relocated to Hagen's Barn in Renton.

*In the mid-1960s, Annie and I started a pre*teen club in Normandy Park called "The Buckskin Kids." Shortly thereafter, we took on the "Mavericks" at the request of their advisors when they made a caller change. They would go on to win 13 grand championships in International Competition over a 15year period. Teens Mike DeSisto and Kevin Thomaier

became Callers and Theresa Lusby became a Cuer. They all went on to much success from experience gained as teenage square dancers.

*In the beginning, all dance material was done in the following style: Introduction, two figures, center* break, two figures, ending. The four figures would be the same with only a progression of the ladies' positions. Another caller (Jack Nichols) and I started what is today known as "Sight Calling." We later found that this system was springing up in many areas, mainly in workshops. Calling became easier for us because we did not have to memorize or read the material. *I have called for numerous clubs over the years, the* longest being over forty years with Samena Squares and Wagon Wheels. I'm still calling for Wagon Wheel *Squares of Kent, Washington. I also call for the Rings* 'n Swings at the Kent Senior Center. I have been calling for the Exhibition Team, "Dream Weavers", for the past eight years. Dream Weavers is comprised of 16 dancers who interweave from two squares into one large square *with intricate moves. They have performed at the* annual Washington State Festivals, Parades, Retirement Homes, and ended their final performance at the 2012 National Square Dance Convention in Spokane.

I have called in the Canadian towns of Prince George, Chase, Lake Shuswup, Vancouver, and Kelowna and both sides of the mountains in Washington State. I have also called on cruise ships in the Caribbean, Hawaii, Mexico, and the cities of Juneau, Anchorage, and Fairbanks in Alaska.

I am proud and grateful to have been able to raise my family surrounded by square dancers. The relationship with hundreds of people, who in many ways, have become an extended family. The feelings, laughter, friendships and support I have found are beyond compare. I have enjoyed teaching others the joy of square dancing and working with other callers.

*The fifty-two years of square dancing have flown by so very fast, and I am very happy to have shared* 

them with a special friend, Mike DeSisto, along with my dance partner of 25 years, Loretta Minniear!" Keep Smiling and Keep Dancing! Wayne Easton June 2012

Memories from Theresa Lusby (Nilsen) Original Buckskin Kids dancer at age 9 in 1960 Theresa Lusby is a Square Dance Caller and Round Dance Cuer in Kasilof, Alaska

Yes, I am one of the original Buckskin Kids, a Pre-Teen Club started by Wayne Easton, my father Art Nilsen, and Bob George in 1960. Wayne and my dad took Calling classes together. The first time Wayne called in public was in our basement when I was around 8 years old. There were After-Parties back then after Square Dances. Everyone would come back to our house for more dancing, visiting and eating, of course! I can remember getting out of bed *in my PJ's and watching everyone square dance in our* basement. I loved listening to Wayne call even then! *I remember telling him that I wanted to learn to* dance, and he said if I'd get enough kids together, he would teach us. I recruited enough kids to make several squares! We started out at the Old Log Hall in Burien and then went on to Wavne and Annie's house off of 8<sup>th</sup> *Avenue in Normandy Park. They had a great basement* and it was full of kids every week! When Wayne called for the Tumbleweeds in Burien, we would go to Baby Island in Whidbey Island every year. After Buckskins, I followed Wayne and Annie and danced with the Mavericks. Eventually, I became a Cuer and cued with Wagon Wheel Squares in Kent for a couple of years before I moved to Kasilof, Alaska *in 2008. I really did have a great childhood with* wonderful memories of square dancing with lots of wonderful people! Theresa Lusby *June 2012*


Dance attire is suggested, but everyone is welcome, so don't let clothing keep you from attending.


