Did You Know...?

...that dear old "AUNTIE SOCIAL" died?

Sadly, the task of writing her eulogy fell to me (and I'm sad because nobody else would offer to write it). There's much to be said about her but, unfortunately, a lot of it is a bit uncomfortable to talk about.

Auntie Social's life was...well, truly anti-social in many ways. She was a long-time square dancer. She must have loved it (how else can one explain her decades-long participation in the activity), but you'd never know it by being in her company at a dance. And you can forget ever seeing her as an "angel" during lessons or workshops--- "Waste of time and energy!" she'd say. "Too many beginners and retreads---who needs them!"

She was the founding member and the only club president the "Auntie Social Squares" dance club ever had. There were 2 squares to begin with, but the club (if you can call it that) has really been the Auntie Social "Square" (singular) for as long as anyone can remember. Under Auntie Social's leadership the club seemed to intentionally discourage dancers from attending their dances. For example, they steadfastly refused to post the club's dances on <a href="WheresTheDance.com">WheresTheDance.com</a> which made it difficult for vacationing or traveling square dancers to find them. Auntie Social even opined that advertising the club's upcoming dances in Footnotes or elsewhere on social media sites like Facebook made the club look "desperate".

Before you get the idea that the club might actually be a "traveling club"...think again! You'd be hard-pressed to recognize more than a handful of their members since they seldom caravanned as a group to dance with other clubs. Yes, led by their matriarch, the Auntie Social Squares were in a class all by themselves.

One could always count on Auntie Social to keep things a bit gloomy at a dance---she never welcomed or greeted, never encouraged, never thanked anyone (not the dancers or the volunteers, not even the caller or the cuer). Any momentary lapse of memory by another dancer would be met with a disapproving scowl or pursed lips, or a head-shake...sometimes all of the above at once. (Except, of

course, when it was Auntie Social who messed-up---which occurred with regularity).

It was rumored that Auntie Social was looking forward to dancing again after this past year's "hiatus" due to the pandemic. She'd even had a change of heart and felt that that the "SSD" (Social Square Dancing) approach is just what her club needed to thrive. Alas, it was all a bit too much for her, though. We may never know what finally "did her in"...but the medical examiner, a fellow square dancer, said she died smiling!

Dear Auntie Social, may you Rest In Peace.

**D** y the time you read this, all the club treasurers should have received the INDIVIDUAL membership renewals through email from us for the 2021-2022 dance season. If you are a club treasurer and you have not received this individual membership renewal from us by the time you read this article, please let us know. This email includes your club membership list and instructions and is sent to the club treasurers we have on file. If you receive this email and you are not the current club treasurer, please pass it on to the club treasurer. We are emphasizing that we want you to print your club membership list as emailed to you, make the necessary corrections on that list, and return it to us. By now, you may have heard that the state voted to give all clubs/members a "free" year (2021-2022). This means there is NO \$6 per member charge. This includes any new members you would like to add, but we need to know their information. Therefore, this process can be completed by email since there is no check involved. Remember the deadline for returning this information is May 31st.

Even though there is no money involved, it is still extremely important to maintain an accurate membership list for insurance purposes. Only members that we have in our database, as reported to us by you, will be covered by our insurance. We will still have insurance as usual because the state is picking up all the fees. This will cost the state around \$16,000. We hope this will encourage clubs to hang on for another year, things should get better.

Do not look now but we might be through the snowfilled winter and on our way to spring. Just when we are thought maybe we were going to escape those cold snowy winters February came and with it our old friend an artic front from the north that so far, we had escaped it for this winter. As you see in one of the pictures, we experienced on the west side of the state an unusual one foot of snow.

This is where it gets interesting and lucky because of square dancing. As Judy and I started shoveling out with her at the top of our driveway with a small electric snowblower that we had brought from Eastern Oregon years ago and I took one of our snow shovels and went to the bottom of our drive. Just as I was starting, one of our St Helens Square dancers came around the corner that lives one block from us stopped and asked me if I wanted to borrow his snowblower (see another picture)? I could not believe what he had for a snowblower living in Western Oregon. Dave said, "I always wanted one". This REALLY made our job easier!

You may say, what does this have to do with square dancing? With us being involved with square dancing and Dave belonging to one of our clubs, he allowed us to borrow his snowblower.

Being a square dancer is just not about just the dancing but, the social and new friends you meet, helping each other in our square dance family. That brings me to thinking about new possible dancers.



Think about this for a moment. If everyone would bring one new person to your next class, potentially you could double the size of your club in one session.

I know "you have asked everyone you know". I would ask this: Did you ask the mechanic who worked on your car, the person who checked you out at the store, the person who cut your hair? You do not have to be good friends to invite them to lessons. Chances are if they come you will be come good friends just like Dave.

#### FISHTAILING FOR ROUNDS

#### HEY.....LET'S TALK A LITTLE ABOUT "FRAME"

A scenario.....You've been asked to dance and you're both a little nervous. Settle down...try to remember your basic rules in moving close to each other to create a good frame. You're thinking...humm, good frame? Oh yes, now what was I suppose to do???

Let's start by "breathing" and easing the tension.

Ladies, we generally wait a few seconds letting our gentleman "show us the way". He begins his good posture standing tall, welcoming his partner's response to his good frame creation. The gentleman should have remembered when he stands tall, he also is stretching his entire body including his neck muscles, upward giving the "good frame look". At the same time, ladies are moving forward, blending to that "good frame" and he is adjusting his arm to create a comfortable level for his partner's height.

Ladies should move your whole body toward the man's right side for a good "closed" position. It is so important to remain in this good posture connection throughout a dance. Do remember that suggestion.

It is a very common reaction to tense up if the dance music is fast. Ladies, please.... try not to "pressure grab" onto your partners arm and put the "squeeze" on his hand. This reaction can be so irritating to him. Actually, that same action can apply to both of you. Once again..."breathe" and try to relax yet keeping in mind of where your body is located. Your body stance should remain to the MANS RIGHT SIDE of his body. Hard to understand....read carefully! LADIES, YOU SHOULD STAY TO HIS RIGHT SIDE OF THE FRONT OF HIS BODY, (that is OUR female LEFT) stay in that position. It is so easy to allow yourself to slide in front of your partner especially after "turning figure". Ladies want to always try to stay to OUR LEFT on the mans front body core. Without going into a real depth explanation....that completes the "FRAME" work. Hope to help produce a good habit ...and we recommend keep practicing to make a more relaxful beginning to every one of your dances.

THE HAND HOLD...another very important part of dancing.

The lady places her right hand in the mans left hand, thumb to thumb and both closing their fingers. There should be no gap between palms. This should be a gentle action.

So once the lady is in the frame, the man steps to his left starting the preparation step, (keeping his hips pressing forward and shoulders down), then stepping to his right to begin the dance.

#### There are 5 points of contact to consider:

- 1 Mans left hand to ladies right hand
- 2 Body contact with lady on mans right side. Hips forward. If hips go back, connection moves up to ribs and shrinks the topline.
- 3 Mans right hand on ladies shoulder blade, fingers pointing down ward, this raises his arm
- 4 Ladies left upper arm rests on mans forearm.
- 5 Ladies left hand on mans upper arm.

A few thoughts that have been "springing up" recently about exercise and square dancing.

### Did you know?

- 1. A person, on average, walks between 3 and 5 miles in a typical evening (or anytime of day) of square dancing. So for every square dance you miss take a walk to keep from missing out on the healthy benefits of dancing. With spring weather at hand and covid on the decline perhaps you can consider walking with a friend (following the health guidance from local health authorities)
- **2.** A rule of thumb is that about 100 calories per mile are burned for a 180-pound person and 65 calories per mine are burned for a 120-poung person. You can do the math for yourself for a typical evening of dancing
  - **3.** Calorie count for favorite snacks at square dances:

1 chocolate chip cookie - 80

1 slice of apple pie - 296

1 brownie - 162

1 cupcake - 131

1 deviled egg - 62

1 whole carrot - 25

1 whole cucumber 66

- 1 cup of brewed black coffee 5 Add sugar 16 Add non dairy creamer - 20
- **4.** Now you can add up the miles you walk, either dancing or walking, calculate the snacks you enjoy at a dance and come up with a net zero calorie intake! Or better yet, a calorie decrease

So until we can safely gather to dance again, keep walking and enjoying your favorite after dance refreshments.

The **APPLELAND PROMENADERS** have not made any decisions about resuming dancing. Every month Jackie Chase asks me for a Footnotes article and then I am stumped as to what to write about. Well, this month I will cook. I bought a Lodge 12inch cast iron skillet as I kept seeing recipes using one – everything from pizza to cornbread.

### APPLE PANCAKE

34 cup unbleached flour

5 tablespoon granulated sugar

¼ teaspoon salt

¾ cup milk

1/4 cup sour cream

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

3 large eggs

¼ teaspoon ground cinnamon

Pinch of nutmeg

4 tablespoons unsalted butter

4 medium tart apples, peeled, quarter, and sliced about ¼ inch thick. (about 1 ½ pounds)

Preheat oven to 450 with rack in the middle.

In a medium size bowl, whisk together the flour, 1 tablespoon of the sugar, and the salt. Add, the milk, sour cream. Eggs, and Vanilla. Stir util combined. A few lumps are okay.

In a small bowl combine, ¼ teaspoon of cinnamon, nutmeg, and 4 tablespoons of sugar.

Preheat the skillet over medium heat for 2 minutes. Melt the butter and then add the apples. Sprinkle with the cinnamon mixture. Cook for 5 to 10 minutes.

Remove the skillet from the heat and spread the batter evenly over the apples. Place in the oven and cook for about 25 minutes. It will be puffed and golden brown.

Pancake will deflate when removed from oven. Wait about 10 minutes and then serve with dusting of confectioner's sugar. Leftovers can be refrigerated for up to 2 days. Submitted by

**AINIER COUNCIL** is anxious to get back on the dance floor! Now that the state has moved to "Phase 3" of the re-opening plan, it appears we are finally turning the corner on the viral beast that has kept us cooped up for an entire year. There are compelling pros (and cons) to consider for making such a sweeping shift in focus. There's much more to discuss in order to avoid making rash judgements in favor of (or against) any current or proposed dance format. Dancers will hopefully make an "informed" decision about what is best for square dancing writ large.


