

The Twin City Twirlers and Spokane Area Council did a great job hosting the dance with Steve and Alayne Swanson, President couple of the Twin City Twirlers, leading the charge. The entertaining calling of Dan Preedy and wonderful cueing of Neva Reid provided enjoyment for all the dancers. A bus load of dancers from the Spokane and Coeur d'Alene area helped fill the hall to the brim, and Dick and Charlene beamed the whole night through at being honored by friends, old and new. If you missed it, shame, shame, you missed a good one.

B-51 (Excerpts of a Daryl Clendenin article)

"When square dancing ceased being a "social recreation" and became a "hobby", our problems began. The difference between recreation and hobby is the difference between just going bowling or being part of a tournament league. The first requires little, the second requires a lot. The idea of B-51 is to recreate a social program of dancing."

"It has been said, "Most of us callers call material that is far too difficult for the recreational dancer." Today's dancers are survivors. It is evident that the recreational dancer has not been intrigued with the challenge and has left the activity. Movements 1-51 on the list make up the Basic 1 and 2 Programs of square dancing. Notice that B-51 is only 17 movements fewer than the 68 that make up Mainstream. How can the clubs and callers help? My opinion (along with many other caller leaders) is: we need to get a quicker, easier entry level established and accepted."


"I'm not suggesting that we change the dance level at our clubs to B-51, but our area could benefit from local dances at an easier level of difficulty. Keep the club level at Mainstream and when the students reach the 51 Basic level, have some real dances for them to attend while they finish their Mainstream lessons and hopefully join the club."

"For the dancers whom we are losing, those who are slower to learn, the ones who need to angel the next two sets of lessons, the ones who make it through ten lessons and never get any further and mainly those that we are losing because it's too much too quick, it creates a program where they can survive..."

My thoughts: B-51 attempts to address the problem of attracting dancers. Perhaps the Square & Folk Dance Federation of Washington could find 'attraction of dancers' relevant enough to include as an item on the agenda for future meetings. The Federation's stated purpose is "to promote Square & Folk Dancing in Washington as a means of recreation and pleasure for all persons". Sounds to me like 'attraction of dancers' would be much more relevant than deciding for the upteenth time who should be able to vote at meetings. Come on Federation leaders, let's focus on what's important – dancers and the future of our wonderful activity.

Sewing Machines are Like Cars

There are three major factors that cause them to break down. Lack of maintenance, number of miles and mistreatment.

Lack of maintenance - Many women think a machine is clean because they run the brush around the bobbin area and blow on the lint. Blowing is one of the wrong things to do to a machine. It drives the lint deeper into the gears and breath is wet. That is spitting on the lint so it to sticks better inside the machine. Canned air is worse. It is very cold and when metal gets cold it sweats and then lint sticks even better. Cold blasts can crack plastic parts and can't be any good for the computer.

Techs clean machines with an air compressor, room air. Take the machine out side. Remove the presser foot, stitch plate and bobbin parts. Stick the end of the compressor hose in the bobbin area and blast. Move the hose to the tension disks, the light bulb, and any other openings. Keep blowing until no more lint is flying. After sewing with fuzzy stuff like fleece or flannel, blow out the machine. It only takes a few minutes and can save you a repair bill. If you have a bobbin sensor it can fail because it gets covered with lint.

Oil the machine - Get out the book and follow the directions. Each machine is different. Most of the newer machines require very little home oiling. Put your machine on a schedule, make a note on your phone calendar. Oil the machine even if it has not been used.

Machines should be taken to a technician on a regular basis for deep cleaning, oiling and timing adjustment. Depending on how much it is used, a machine should go into the shop every 1 to 3 years. This can't be done at home. Special tools, training and techniques are needed. Computerized machines need to be updated and reset. Just removing the shell from a computerized machine can blow the mother board.

Number of miles - My previous machine just plain wore out. A small spool of thread is 250 yards and a mile is 1,760 yards. That works out to seven spools to the mile. How many spool miles have you sewn? That is a long distance for a small motor and gears. Age is also a factor. It is just as hard to get parts for old machine as it is for an old car.

Mistreatment - When people brought machines into the shop, they almost always said,"The tension is off." It wasn't the tension, it was the timing. There is a very precise alignment

necessary for the hook to be in the right place to catch the needle thread and pull it around the bobbin. This timing can be disrupted by many factors.

One factor is jamming the needle up into the head. When the needle hits a pin, it is just like a car hitting the curb with the front tires. Sewing with an old used dull needle has the same effect. The machine has to work harder to force the needle through the fabric. Like driving on rough pot

holed roads. A sewing machine needle is good for 8 to 10 hours of sewing, then it is dull and need to be replaced.. If I hear one more persons say,"It ain't broke yet." I am going to scream. After spending \$\$\$ on fabric, and all their time, they won't spend \$ on a new needle.

The action that many women do to mistreat a machine is to get their left hand behind the needle and pull the fabric. They say they are 'guiding'. Then why do they have a tight fisted grip on the cloth? They are pulling to make the machine sew faster. That is like towing a car faster than the wheels are turning. It causes the needle to hit the plate and get jammed or broken. Hands should be in front of or beside the needle to guide. If you want to sew faster, step on the gas and lengthen the stitch.

Pulling on the fabric is also bad for body alignment. The spine is twisted to the left, the head is bent down and the shoulders are raised. Why do you have a headache after sewing for a couple of hours? The stitcher should be sitting up straight, just like driving car. Head up, shoulders down, spine straight and eyes on the road.

Take care of your machine and it will last for a long time but it won't last forever. Just like your car, sometimes it needs to go to the junk yard.

Scholarships are awarded at the Washington State Square & Folk Dance Festival held in June each year. Monies are paid directly to the winner's college or trade school.



In 1958 negotiations with Spokane County Parks Department, enable the dancers to lease the beautiful site at Sullivan Park in the Spokane Valley.


By 1960 they had enough money to purchase a dismantled steel building, complete with metal roofing, maple flooring, several thousand board feet of lumber, and two gas heating units. It had been a Roller Skating Rink in St. John, WA. The square dancers transported it to Spokane and stored it until they could start building. More money was raised by offering interest bearing bonds for sale.

When construction began it was done completely with volunteer labor. Equipment and tools were donated and salvage yards were scrounged for usable material and fixtures. The hall was completed in the fall of 1961. The Grand Opening Dance was held September 30th. The Western Dance Association, which is in charge of the operation of the hall officially became an Association with the Washington State Square Dance Federation in 1963. Dancers enjoy dancing at the Western Dance Center! And we look forward to many more years of enjoyment at the dance center.
