

# NEWS RELEASE FROMYOUR PRESIDENI, KAY MAHAN

Square & Folk Dance Federation of Washington

Recommendations for Safe Return to Dancing Revised 03/30/21 by executive officers of the SFDFofWA

Following Phase 3, square dancing would qualify as a high contact sports activity and may resume following the safety guidelines as outlined below:

- Indoor activities subject to 50% capacity
- Health Monitor Participants should stay home when sick or have been in close contact with someone with COVID-19
- Face coverings required for all participants. Although the guidelines do allow that persons with certain medical conditions are not required to wear masks, with those medical conditions they probably should refrain from dancing at this time.
- Physical distance maintained when not engaged in dancing.
- Wash hands frequently if soap & water not available, use hand sanitizer with 60-90% alcohol content.
- Keep a sign-in roster of every participant in case contact tracing is necessary
- Shared food is not recommended dancers should bring their own food and beverages in their own containers.

The club/organization holding the event can and should set and enforce the requirements for that event and area. It is suggested to post those requirements.

Each dancer should be considerate & respectful of others

# MEET THE BOARD Holly gonseth coordinating secretary

**P**aul and I met at WSU in the '80's. Holly started dancing with her parents with the Palouse Promenaders of Moscow Idaho and remembers attending the Idaho State Festival "Dancin' in Hog Heaven in '77". Apparently, Moscow Idaho was named Hog Heaven in its pioneer days.

Paul attended WSU and lived down the dormitory hallway from Gordy Reed. Gordy took anyone who did not outrightly refuse to attend to Square Dance lessons that he had arranged and was teaching for the newly formed club, Wazzu Whirlers. Any existing dancers Gordy found on campus, were to attend as angels. This is where Paul & Holly met in the spring of 1982. Holly & Paul began dating in the fall of 1982.

Long story short... Married 1984, Graduated 1985, moved to Tacoma, then to Ephrata, Othello and Spokane continuing to dance some, while having 2 children. Our home club was the Krazy Eights.

In 1996, our job brought us to Yakima area with a first grader and a three yr. old. Our Square Dance shoes, badges, petticoats and dresses were packed in moving boxes and saved in our garage. They were almost untouched (except for an occasional costume) until 2011 when we re-discovered Square Dance, since our youngest had gone off to college.

We went to beginner lessons "incognito" we had agreed with each other that we were not going to tell the folks at the lessons that we had done this before. That lasted until the first break on the first night when some dancer said, "You've done this before haven't you?" to deny now would be an outright lie! We were busted. But also hooked, for us it was like an old friend, we could almost pick up where we left off. Our new dancing friends invited us to travel with them and we did. We visited a club and the guest caller was a good friend from the old days in Spokane.

The guys would tell a story (line of BS ) and Holly would believe the whole deal, being drawn in hook, line and sinker. The more I listened, the more stories they told. Until one day I finally figured them out. Now I say "You can believe every word they say... is BS" I love my dancing friends! We are Gateswingers now. We registered for the 2012 National and reached out to some of our old dancing friends and found out they had also returned to dancing. Old and new friends, the timing was perfect. It wasn't very long before Paul was encouraged to try calling. Paul attended the GSI caller school at the 2012 National and then Cascade Caller School with Daryl Clendenin at Circle 8 Ranch. Well, Daryl encourages spouses to learn to cue (unless you outrightly refuse). Thought, maybe, we should learn to round dance first. So we worked on that for a few years, joined Silhouette Dancer's club and in 2015, Holly started cueing.


We also got involved in our area council because the administration on area and state level are necessary for the continuation of our activity. Holly did not outrightly refuse and was added to the ballot for state office and was elected to Corresponding Secretary position in 2017. This position is primarily responsible for compiling and publishing the annual state directory. It turned out to be a good position for my skill set and I have served 4 years in this position with one more to go.

Paul is a civil engineer in his daily life, working for the State Department of Transportation. He is currently the South Central Region Planning Engineer. When Paul is not working, or calling, or dancing, he sleeps. That's all we have time for: work, calling, eat, sleep, dance. REPEAT!

Holly keeps busy in administration of the children's department for a Yakima Bible study group. Other activities besides Square Dance include sewing and gardening. Be sure to ask about her "migrant farm work" if you want to hear some good stories.

#### **D**id You Know...?

...that consulting with an expert before making an important decision is good advice? Of course, you already knew that...and so did I! That is why I recently asked a caller-friend of mine (and undeniable square dance expert) to comment on the "social square dancing" (SSD) initiative that has rapidly growing support in some circles and yet still faces entrenched resistance in others. Apparently, I'm not the only one who asked for this caller for his opinion... so he sat down and penned the "open letter" you will find below this paragraph. I hope you will take the time to read and fully absorb what this influential expert has to say.

"To:Square Dancers at largeSubject:Social Square Dancing ("SSD")

I have been asked for some time now to express my views on SSD Square Dancing. *This will be my attempt to express my personal impressions on the subject.* 

#### History

SSD (Social Square Dancing) has taken many forms over the past few years. It started out with an attempt by Jerry Story (and others such as me) who recognized and became seriously concerned about the problem of declining numbers of square dancers over time. To realize this, one needs to look only as far as the attendance at the Nationals over the past 20 or more years. At the last convention held in Seattle in 1981, the attendance was 24,379.

These numbers have been on a steady decline since then. The last convention held in 2019 in Atlanta had 4068 in attendance. These numbers can be validated by going to http://www.azsquaredance.com/documents/PAST%20 NSDC%20CONVENTIONS.pdf. As you can see, the numbers of people attending has dropped significantly from year to year. At the Spokane convention, the issue of the decline began to get more visibility. Jerry Story and several of us began to discuss possible solutions for this. This is how SSD was born. We realized that:

- Square Dancing has changed from a way of life for many, into a hobby.
  - At one point in time Square Dancers lived and breathed the activity. They would attend many weekends over the course of a year. They would also strive to achieve the various levels beyond Mainstream. This has changed. Over the past 10 to 15 years it has moved into more of a hobby. Only a few of all the dancers that exist are interested in APD (All Position Dancing) or DBD (Dance By Definition) dancing. Most just want the recreation, socializing, and exercise.
- People have been for some time objecting to the length of time it took to learn and begin dancing.
- The various lists made it seem like a caste system. If you didn't dance at least plus you were less than a "Real Square Dancer".
- Something needed to be done. —

With that Jerry took on the role of a leader in the movement and "Sustainable Square Dancing' was born. We began working on a list that could be taught in 12 to 15 weeks. We understood that it would be nearly impossible to teach all the Mainstream moves in that period, let alone "All Position or DBD" Dancing.

Recently the name change came about and it was renamed Social Square Dancing. There are 50 moves on this list taken from the Basic and Mainstream programs. Approximately 17 of the difficult moves are proposed to being moved to Plus, thus paring the moves down to 50. We, the committee, agreed that we would only teach Standard Positioning.

For some, change is not something that is undergone easily. They resist because they don't see anything wrong. They fail to see the clubs diminishing or folding all together. Now, coming out of the Covid Pandemic I believe it is the perfect time to introduce change. SSD makes perfect sense in that we will all (Callers and Dancers alike) need to refresh our skill sets. For some it will be easy, for others not so much.

The key (again all of this is my opinion) will be for all of us to embrace this change. Callers will need to work harder to make the dance enjoyable, and Dancers will need to adjust and adapt for the sake of the activity as a whole (meaning all dancers from all clubs, not just one's personal dance-level preference or one's own club format). That is not to say there will no longer be a Plus program, I doubt that will go away.

Just ask yourself! Would you rather dance in a hall full of dancers or struggle month after month with 1 to 3 squares? It is time for us to rebuild the activity we love so much.

I ask you to open your minds to change and adopt SSD for the upcoming season(s). Nothing is lost by trying something different.

THANK YOU, DON WOOD! It needed to be said. If square dancing is to have a chance of reversing the trend in the number of dancers participating in our activity, our current "population" will need to face the reality that the recruitment strategies and, more importantly, the retention strategies of the past several decades are woefully lacking. Count me among those who believe, as you obviously do, that square dancing needs a shot in the arm. The Social Square Dancing (SSD) concept appears to be our best hope.

We suggest taking one or two ideas you may have seen and liked, try them...but remember you should be using good posture and practice good body mechanics....ones that you have learned from your dance instructors in class. Most are helpful. I might say, there are some dancers that practice some "not-so-cute dip and dive" moves, please sort those out and accept only the smoother moves that flow.

First of all, let's begin with a **SMILE**. That smile may be just the thing in creating a good attitude. Having a nice expression on your face, looking and acting, giving the feeling like you are ready and happy to be dancing with your partner. Showing each other and creating an atmosphere of attitude is a wonderful beginning.

**GOOD POSTURE**....is the basic factor to good dancing! It is the key to body balance and control to which good styling is based. Do try to keep your body standing straight and dancing tall, getting rid of the stooped shoulders, caved-in chests and pooched-out tummies. Whew, that's a lot to ask for! Head to foot, your entire body should be in vertical alignment. It not only looks good, but you will find that you will not tire as easily and will have the balance, poise and confidence so essential for good styling.

HEAD POSITION....is important in the fact that if you are looking in one direction and turning your body in another....humm...NOT GOOD! It is very poor "body mechanics". An examble is a term called "Lookitus" (watching someone else) only to find you have placed yourself in a poor position for the next move. Take the time to look where you are going and try never to watch your feet. Doing so, creates such a bad habit and watching really doesn't help you execute the figure properly.

SMALL STEPS....Attempt to transfer your weight evenly and smoothly, one foot to the other. Try to take small steps and pretend you are moving on a narrow base. Men, as well as women should avoid dancing flat-footed or dancing too far on your toes, but attempt to dance on the ball part of your feet. Men often take steps too long for a lady. Please remember that most often she is on the outside of the dance circle having a farther distance to travel. Try to take steps according to the music...for instance, the faster the tempo, the shorter the steps; also different routines require different size steps. Remember the rule: "SMALL STEPS MAKE SMALL MISTAKES". Another suggestion: when performing a "step swing figure".....it should be made with the toe pointed toward the floor-the raised foot should never be more then a few inches from the floor. We should never see the bottom of the sole of your shoe.

**ARMS AND HANDS**....what to do with them! A good rule to follow is: Do NOT let your free hand fall below the waist. Never allow the arms to just dangle. If the free hand will be free for a period, to be followed by another hand hold, place it in an upward position, but in the position for the next hand contact. Ladies, please DON'T "flap" your skirts with your free hand. We aren't flag poles displaying a flag "flapping" in the breeze. We are dancers, not perfect in every way, but dancing with a little smoothness and gracefulness certainly won't look bad. Men, if your hands will be free for any length of time, we suggest for you to keep your free arm at waist level, fingers flat and your elbow out of the way. Another suggestion for the same situation is you might place your free hand—palm out—on your back pocket. **NOT IN IT!** (thank you)

A couple of helpful hints for the Butterfly Position is to place your arms out to a comfortable "wing-style" position—trying to avoid the look of a "poodle dog" image with the elbows in close to your body.

In a **SOLO WALTZ TURN**, gauge hand positions and height before you drop hand contact with one another. Attempt to keep the same hand level and hopefully your hands will meet at precisely the same level after your turn has been completed. It could help in the prevention of a "great collision". **BLENDING** is also an important factor to the art of styling. This action could very well be defined as "anticipation". Webster's definition of anticipation is: to realize beforehand—to foresee and act in advance of. Actually, in round dancing, if you don't prepare in advance you may be in trouble for the next movement. Yet, in square dancing. It is absolutely taboo and understandably so. To summarize...Blending into a good styling is vital and means to make an adjustment in your action/ movement so as to be prepared for the next figure.

You must keep time with the music and take the required number of steps to the routine...dance to the music. Take care to only get a head start on the next position—**BUT DO NOT** get ahead of the steps and dance pattern.

We could add pages and pages of ideas and suggestions of the hints of styling. However, there is a fine line that separates styling from technique and in this article, we may have reached that point. Here, we would repeat ourselves—**STYING is NOT** to be confused with **TECHNIQUE!** There are many steps and figures that are designed to be done with certain and precise footwork. They are constructed to make the couple-turns compact and to end in the proper partner positions. This has to be defined as technique. Styling, however is the individual manner of executing and blending the steps and figures in the smoothest and most graceful way possible, to the rhythm of the music.

Trying to be helpful can sometimes be confusing when one reads explanations. It is always easier to "show while telling" for people to understand.

Hope you have enjoyed the articles we have written for the past two years and they have been helpful. Dancing for fifty years and for most of those years, we have cued and instructed classes. Love it! Dancers are wonderful.

  <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> lb. lean ground beef
  <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup green peppers, chopped
  1 clove garlic, minced
  3 (8oz.) cans tomato sauce
  1 tbsp. sugar
- 1 cup cottage cheese, softened
   1 (8oz.) pkg. cream cheese, softened
   <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> cup dairy sour cream
   3 to 4 green onions, chopped
   1 cup cheddar cheese, shredded
   <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> tsp. pepper

Cook noodles according to package directions. Cook ground beef, green pepper and garlic until beef is browned. Drain the fat. Add tomato sauce, sugar, salt and pepper. Stir in noodles and set aside. Combine cottage cheese and cream cheese, then add sour cream and green onion. Layer half of noodle mixture into



a greased 13x9x2" baking dish. Top the layer with cottage cheese mixture and remaining noodle mixture. Sprinkle with cheddar cheese. Bake uncovered in a 350 oven for 30 minutes or until heated through. Serves 8.

1 head iceberg lettuce 1/3 head romaine lettuce	2/3 cup olive oil
1 cup canned artichoke hearts	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> cup red wine vinegar 1 tsp. salt
Packed in brine (not marinated),	<sup>1</sup> / <sub>4</sub> tsp. ground black pepper
Drained well	2/3 cup Parmesan cheese, grated
1 cup red onions, sliced	1 cup pimientos, diced, drained well

Wash iceberg and romaine lettuce; let drain completely. Refrigerate until cold. Split head of iceberg lettuce in half, pulling the heart of the lettuce out of both halves and breaking it into small pieces. Do not use a knife. Separate the rest of the iceberg; it will break up when salad is tossed. Tear each romaine leaf into 3 pieces. Place iceberg and romaine in a large bowl. Add artichoke hearts, onions, and pimentos. Combine oil, vinegar, salt, pepper, and cheese; add to lettuce in bowl. Toss until mixed completely, then serve.



If you're looking for history, the question isn't where to find it, but what era. Angel Mounds State Historic Site is recognized as one of the best preserved Native American sites in the United States. It has 12 earthen mounds built for ceremonial and residential purposes scattered around its 100 acres.

Evansville was also an armory for the United States during WWII, and that heritage is celebrated at the Evansville Wartime Museum. It houses an authentic P-47 airplane, Tarheel Ha, among other artifacts.

Learn about one of the nation's first housing projects, built under Franklin Delano Roosevelt's New Deal, at the Evansville African American Museum.

Movie history was made at Bosse Field, where the film "A League of Their Own," was made. The field offers tours of its facility.

If animals are more your speed, try the Mesker Park Zoo and Botanic Garden. The zoo extends over 45 acres and includes more than 700 animals. Be sure to check out Amazonia, a walk through a South American rainforest.

If you're feeling lucky, check out Tropicana's Riverfront Event Center. It has a 24-hour casino, as well as some of the best views of







Whether or not the trend for implementing an SSDstyle ("Social Square Dancing") model will become a reality in our region (at the Club level, at the Council level...and State Federation level) remains at the top of the list of important decisions dancers need to make. There are compelling reasons for making SSD "standard" (versus Mainstream). Not surprisingly, there's entrenched resistance within the Mainstream population to consider before deciding whether to alter course to SSD or leave things as they are. It is up to each of us to become fully informed about the alternatives and avoid making rash judgements in favor of (or against) any current or proposed dance format. Square dancing's future in our state will depend upon the strength of the commitment offered to support the decision(s) we make.

German-American square dance club. They danced with the club until 1986 when they returned to the States. They held offices of President, Treasurer, and Secretary for three of their four years in Stuttgart.

There never seemed to be time for square dancing when assigned in the United States with raising two active young boys. They retired from the Army in 1993 and settled in Lacey, near Olympia. Gary began working in Tacoma, and a co-worker was a square dancer with the South Sound Singles club. 
