...it is as easy as "One...Two...Three!" to set up WheresTheDance.com (or "WTD" for short) on your smartphone (Android, iPhone, tablet)!

Here's how:

- 1. In the internet search bar on your smartphone's browser (Google, Yahoo, etc.), simply key-in WheresTheDance. com and "enter" to get initial Search Results displayed ... they will most likely NOT be relevant the first time you try this (they might be for New York City, for example).
- 2. Resetting the search criteria to match your specific (geographical) area of interest takes less than a minute.
 - Select the icon that looks like a small gear (or "flower bloom") near the upper right corner of the display.
 - Enter your geographic center of interest in the "Postal Code or Address" field with a full (or partial) physical address (home, city, zip code, hall location).
- 3. Hit the SUBMIT button.

That's it! You'll get a list of the next 100 dance opportunities within 100 miles* of the location you entered (provided, of course, the sponsors of the dances in your search area posted them on WTD in the first place). The list will start with the current date and will look ahead.

You can easily reset or fine-tune your search criteria any time you like. Suppose you are planning a trip to Los Angeles in October 2022. Just set the calendar date for October and enter Los Angeles in the address field and hit Submit. [Remember to reset your search results back to your "default" settings when finished.]

*You can adjust the Distance slider (100 miles is the default setting) to narrow down the search. Enter your hall location and set the slider to the minimum setting (1 mile) to see only those events scheduled at your hall, for example.

It is not necessary to download an "app" or set up a "subscription" with WTD...it's simply a website. I would encourage you to SAVE the URL to a "home screen" on your smartphone. Doing-so makes accessing WTD search results a one-click process that literally takes just a few seconds to yield results.

Try this using your smartphone (it will only take a couple of minutes) to see a rather dramatic difference in search results. Reset the search criteria (as in step 2 above) as seen in the "Tacoma" image below:

Then scroll through the search results to get the "big picture".


Next, reset the search criteria one more time as seen in the "Spokane" image below:

Again, scroll through the Spokane search results and critically compare them with the Tacoma results, then judge for yourself which would be more useful to the square dance community at large.





DAVE'S CALLER TALK Dave and Bonnie Harry

MAY

We enjoyed the Callerlab convention this year! The sessions were all good. But I would like to highlight two in particular. The session on Reconnect: Marketing was excellent! It was a detailed presentation on how to evaluate, prepare for, and execute a promotion and recruiting plan. It was one of the sessions that was videoed and is available from Callerlab in the convention recordings package. I would recommend that each council buy a convention recording then have a special meeting with all of your club's promotion chair people and present this. Digital marketing was another great section! Ray Owens was the presenter, and he talked about all of the different medias there are for promotion. What was really great about his presentation was that he has made several square dance promotional videos and they are available on his website, www.squaredancetech.com. Go check it out, he will customize them for use by clubs and councils! I think that if we took advantage of these two presentations, developed a once a month Basic 1 destination dance with either a four-week lesson cycle or a weekend Blast class we could develop a large base of dancers that would eventually move into the Basic 2 program or the Mainstream program. Speaking of Mainstream, I am a member of the Mainstream committee, and made some suggestions on rearranging some of the movements on the Basic/Mainstream lists. I felt that my suggestions were received on the positive side, but there is a process for these changes, and it will be quite some time before any changes are known. I suggested that we move alamo style, swing thru, ocean wave trades, runs, and wheel and deal from two faced lines onto the Basic 1 list. Move walk around, see saw, double pass thru, first couple go left/right, second couple go right/left, single hinge, and separate onto the Basic 2 list. Bring back the terms cast right and left and put them on the Basic 2 list along with bringing fan the top back from the plus list and restrict it to ocean waves only. Then move do paso, and split to Mainstream.

Here is my reasoning: By moving alamo style to Basic 1 I can do right and left quarter, half, three quarter, and full turns, moving the dancers through alamo styles and interconnecting ocean waves, then I can introduce trades, swing thrus, and later even fan the top. I know some of these concepts are beyond Mainstream, but I have found by dancing my dancers thru these concepts early, they become stronger dancers overall and find it easier to understand those more difficult movements in Mainstream. Swing thru, ocean wave trades, and runs, gives us ocean wave movements in the Basic 1 list, and it gives the new dancer a chance to practice these movements at a destination or plateau dance program before moving on to Basic 2. It is easier to learn wheel and deal from two-faced lines and when you combine two-faced and same-faced and teach them at the same time or even close to each other it becomes confusing to the student. So why not leave same-faced wheel and deals for Basic 2 and put two-faced wheel and deal on basic 1...besides it goes well with veer and couples circulate.

Bringing back cast right and left ³/₄ to the cast family and then moving it to the Basic 2 list gives us the opportunity to practice three quarter choreography and even to directionally dance through spin chain thru long before it's taught, so when you finally give it a name, the dancers already know the body mechanics of the movement. Moving fan the top to Basic 2 gives you a fast way to get from parallel waves to a tidal wave and a stepping stone movement to spin the top that is easier for the dancer to learn. Moving split and do paso into Mainstream just helps shorten the teaching time in Basic 1.

Think about it, if you had a group of clubs get together or the council sponsor a once-a-month dance and a blast class, or a four-week lesson for Basic 1, you could start a new class every month. Then when you have a good base to draw from, do the same thing with Basic 2. Couple this with a good advertising campaign and it seems like we could create a very strong base for the mainstream clubs to draw from, and then they would only have to teach the Mainstream list to the new dancer. Even if these movement changes don't all take place, we still have the opportunity to start a teaching sequence like this. And *so what* if the new dancer lingers for a while at each destination? --I think in the end we would end up with a lot more satisfied dancers.

The State Festival is coming up in Spokane in June and we hope you are pre-registered and are planning on going. Ready to sign up? Registration forms are available at www.squaredancespokane.org/dawnofanewdance. Hope to see you there!

July 8-10 is the weekend of the Dancing, Education & Retreat created and managed by the WA State Federation Education & Leadership Committee. It is at Circle 8 Ranch, and all are invited! If you have never been to a weekend of this nature, then let's make a date for it this year. You don't have to be an officer in your club or council to attend. There is a lot of good information presented in the morning sessions, fun afternoon dance sessions, and evening dances to attend. So, register and come join the <u>Fun and Friendship</u>. Information elsewhere in this issue.

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM THE CAVNESS CORNER Shawn & Wendy Cavness

here are several Latin rhythms in round dancing: Jive, Bolero, Cha Cha, West Coast Swing, Single Swing and Rumba. This month we will focus on Rumba. When Wendy and I started taking lessons from our current teachers, they asked us what we wanted out of our lessons. We told them we wanted our Waltz to look like Waltz, our Foxtrot to look like Foxtrot and our Rumba to look like Rumba. For the purpose of this article, we will assume that the reader already knows the figures/steps and simply wants their Rumba to look like Rumba.

The first thing to remember is the attitude of Rumba. Rumba is called the dance of love - but what it is really is the dance of flirtation. Our teachers tell us that gentlemen dance Waltz, Men dance Rumba. The first thing to make Rumba look more authentic and fun is to stand tall. This goes for both partners - but especially the man. Stretch the body upward, press the chest out and spread the shoulders to fill the space. Lean slightly forward on the toes. The man is in control of the dance and knows it. But really, the woman is in control. She also stands tall and leans slightly forward on her toes. There is a tension between both partners that is expressed in body language and a certain tension in the arms and hands. The man does not push or pull on the lady, but the tension within the hands and arms provides direction as the lady flirts with her man - rejecting him, turning away from him and then facing him again.

Rumba is danced on the balls of the feet. The toe should never leave the floor. This is very different than Waltz with its signature heel lead. With the toes pointed slightly outward, step forward onto the toe then roll onto the foot as weight is taken on the foot. When stepping backward, step back onto the toe then roll onto the foot. Rolling onto the foot helps provide the hip movements emblematic of Rumba as well. As rolls onto the foot the hip will naturally come down. Make sure full weight is taken on each step. Round dancers have a tendency, especially on the forward step to put the foot out there but not go fully onto the foot. (I am certainly guilty of that). Keeping a forward posture as the dancer rolls onto the foot will

make that easier. Each dancer is asserting their dominance as they step forward toward their partner.

In Rumba the leg which has weight should always be straight. Not bent as in Waltz or Foxtrot. There is a certain feel to the dance as the weighted leg is straight and the dancer is standing tall with the weight forward and the chest up and out. Both dancers are proud and strong. The knee will be bent for the leg which is moving, but then straighten as the foot is placed and weight is taken. It feels silly and overexaggerated at first, but trust me - it looks great!

Rumba is delineated as well by quick sharp movements. A turn step, for instance in a chase, would start with a quick step followed by the 180 Degree body turn. The step and turn are not combined, but rather the turn happens an instant after the step. This is very subtle - but combined with the other concepts, will provide a crispness to the Rumba which is very attractive.

When Round dancers think of Rumba, they think of hip movements and how difficult that is to develop. Most have literally given up on doing hip movements



and just step through the figures. Hip movement which eventually is accentuated by body part separation - takes time to develop but here are some ideas to start. Think of yourself leaning against a lamppost at a bus stop or actually lean against a wall. With the Left leg straight and the Right knee bent – resting the Right leg – push your Left hip toward the right. Think of holding a child on that hip. Then roll your weight to the other side, straightening that leg and bending the other knee until that hip is completely on the other side. That is the hip movement you are looking for in Rumba. Practice standing in place with your feet slightly apart, rolling your hip from one side to the other - then start incorporating that feeling into basic Rumba figures.

Rumba is a fun rhythm and is easily learned - but very difficult to master. For those who haven't taken Rumba lessons we highly recommend Rumba as a rhythm to expand your dancing repertoire. For those who are current Rumba dancers, we hope at least one of the tips above may provide some ideas for moving forward with this beautiful rhythm which is one of our favorites. The Washington Round of the month for May 2022 is Beautiful Day for Goodbye which is a waltz written by Diana and Jake Ring from Vancouver Island Canada.

We started our dancing "enjoyment" in 1980 with classes in square dancing, graduating in 1981, and just continuing from there. Jake started calling in 1982, and away we go! We are just restarting the square dancing here this month (from our shut down due to COVID). Diana started cueing in 1997 after our cuer retired, and Jake said he was not going to cue. She enjoys the cueing and teaching new dancers. She has been writing dances for about 12 years and most of her dances come from her teaching new dancers, and needing certain moves in dances. So it is the dancers that cause some of the writing!

Thank you to Washington for looking at a "Beautiful Day for Goodbye". George Strait does such a beautiful job of his music, and it fits so well to all rhythms of round dancing.
