...the old saying "You can lead a horse to water, but you can't make him drink!" failed to identify "which horse"? How could one possibly know ahead of time which "horse" will drink and which one will not? In order to make it relevant to square dancing, I've rephrased the statement to "You can try to lead an entire federation of square dance clubs to WheresTheDance.com, but not all of them will use it!"

I'm forced to remind myself that square dancers are more likely to stick with what they feel has "worked" for them in the past (or with what they believe is working for them currently), than to try something "different" that someone else recommends. Opinions about what is working now or what has worked in the past are always subject to interpretation.

At a macro level, the number of square dancers in our activity has trended downward for at least the past decade or two. A handful of "local" programs appear to be working in terms of attracting and retaining new dancers, but our numbers overall belie any claims to significant "dancer retention" results, let alone a statewide positive growth trend.

We all tend to soldier-on as best we can each year in hopes that some "magic bullet" will save us from having to invest considerable effort, and/or money, and/or advertising, and/or social media promotion, and/or programming modifications, and/or...etc., etc. to reverse the downward trend. [And yet we know in our heart of hearts that without some combination of these several "solutions," total membership next year will likely be lower than this year's.]

So why does WheresTheDance ("WTD") matter??...it's not a new dancer recruiting tool, you say (and you'd be correct). But in light of a shrinking "pool" to "swim" (dance) in, I see WTD as a dancer retention tool. Dancers want to go where the dancers are...duh! WTD is the only tool available at present to all square dancers that can provide that information in a heartbeat (as long as someone takes the few minutes required to post their dances on the site).

"Doesn't Facebook do that?," you ask. The answer is "No, it doesn't." Don't believe me?...try this---using only Facebook, see if you can determine which clubs in your vicinity (say, within one or two hundred miles) have dances scheduled during the next few weeks.

I'm waiting...I'm still waiting. Did you find them all? Are you sure? (Betcha didn't!) I'll even venture a guess that at least a couple dances in your vicinity that you know are scheduled are not listed anywhere on Facebook.

By now, you've spent an hour trying to prove me wrong. You've scoured Facebook "pages" and every Facebook group you're a member of to find these dances posted, but to no avail. In desperation, you may have even "cheated" in performing this challenge to go outside Facebook to check your council's webpage, only to discover it's out of date. And, even if it is up to date, very few dancers outside your area will know your website exists or how to find it (good luck getting visitors to come to your dances).

Unlike Facebook, WTD gives dancers the ability to customize search criteria in less than a minute, say for dances scheduled within 100 miles (on a smartphone) or 200 miles (on a desktop PC) from their home base (or a town they're planning to visit soon) and, more importantly, get the search results in a few seconds! It may sound complicated, but it's NOT...it is as easy as "One...Two...Three!" to set up WheresTheDance.com (or "WTD" for short) on your smartphone (Android, iPhone, tablet)!

Here's how (repeating from the May issue of Footnotes):

- In the internet search bar on your smartphone's browser (Google, Yahoo, etc.), simply key-in Wheres The Dance.com and "enter" to get initial Search Results displayed ...they will most likely NOT be relevant the first time you do this (they might be for New York City, for example).
- 2. Resetting the search criteria to match your specific (geographical) area of interest takes less than a minute.
 - Select the icon that looks like a small gear (or "flower bloom") near the upper right corner of the display.
 - Enter your geographic center of interest in the "Postal Code or Address" field with a full (or partial) physical address (home, city, zip code, hall location).
- 3 Hit the SUBMIT button.

Didn't find your club or your council's dances in the search results? The reason for this is no one has stepped forward to post the information on WTD. It's not that difficult, and it takes less time than all the other "calendaring" tools (Facebook, Council or Club websites, Google Calendar, etc) currently in use. As Neil Cavuto says, "If you don't have it, demand it!" Sooner or later, somebody will listen.

As I've said many times, I'd be happy to help any club, council or square dance event sponsor in Washington State become proficient posting on WTD (WheresTheDance). Call me...I'm in the book!



A That about considering a change for the better **V** in dance formatting, perhaps? When I started dancing 60 years ago most clubs danced twice a month. The dance format was a set of squares followed by two rounds. If you could round dance and had the energy you could dance the entire evening from beginning to end nonstop. As time went by, we added a half hour workshop prior to the beginning of the dance with one dance night featuring a square dance workshop and the other a round dance workshop. The round dance workshop was generally well attended and the round of the month was introduced. Remember, back then rounds were done by memory so if you didn't attend the workshop, you didn't learn the round and subsequently couldn't dance it at the dance. The square dance workshops were a different story...It seemed that the people that didn't need the workshop would attend, but the people that needed it always had an excuse for not attending (!), and then they screwed up the floor so bad that if you wanted to call the workshop material at the dance you had to take time and reteach the material you had just taught at the earlier workshop which frustrated the people that came to the workshop! So, for most clubs, the workshop idea was dropped and the half hour of pre rounds was adopted. At this point "Dick and Jane average Mainstream/Phase II Dancer" can chose to do the pre-rounds or not, come to the dance and still dance everything presented during the evening.

Here is where we have gone astray. Many groups have injected a star tip of Plus somewhere in the middle of the dance and sprinkled rounds classified above Phase II (I'm not talking about Phase II + 1, I'm talking Phase III or higher). Now "Dick and Jane" can no longer dance the entire dance because they don't dance Plus or rounds above Phase II. Here is another scenario: "IoŠ and Sue" are newer Mainstream dancers that haven't learned Round Dancing yet: They go to a club to dance, and this club does 2 plus tips and mixed level Rounds. If you figure it out, at a two- hour dance, round dancing takes up about 1/3 ¹⁵ FOOTNOTES

of the dance evening; if you do one plus tip that is 1/6 of the evening, and if you do 2 Plus tips that is 1/3 of the evening. So, JoŠ and Sue came to the dance, paid the same price at the door, and got to dance 1/3 of the dance. I'm not saying that we should change the two rounds between squares format, but we should really think hard about what we do about Plus at a Mainstream dance. How 'bout level dances? "Bob and Alice" are three weeks into class, and they go to their first level dance. The dance is standard square and rounds and it has a star tip in it. "Bob and Alice" have to sit out 3/6 of the evening! Think of it this way; You and your spouse (or a date) go to dinner with another couple. All four of you order the house special. The food arrives and the other couples' plates are piled high from rim to rim. Yours come and the food barely covers the logo in the center of the plates. You leave still hungry! Would you go back to that restaurant?... How are "Dick and Jane", "JoŠ and Sue", and "Bob and Alice" feeling about going to the dances?

Possible solution: (and I heard this success story at Callerlab this year). Add another half hour to your pre-dance. The first half hour is dedicated to Plus, the second half hour to upper-level rounds, and the main dance is dedicated to Mainstream and Phase II rounds. If you are going to have rounds higher than Phase II in the main dance, then put it in your



ads just like we advertise the squares in our clubs as Mainstream or Plus, etc. The club mentioned at Callerlab doing the hour pre-dance format was skeptical when it was presented to them but after they tried it, they were sold on it and their dances are thriving because of it!

This is my thought for a student dance: You could consider pre-dance program ahead of the dance, using that same format as above, but when the student dance starts, put one teachable round or line dance in-between the squares so those new students get to dance the whole evening non-stop. If you plan on having Phase II rounds in the dance, allocated at least half of the rounds/line dance program to the new dancer. Remember we are trying to sell our activity to those new-comers....Sitting on the sideline is not the same as participating.

The state festival and leadership are coming up! Have you registered?

Until next time, happy dancing and thanks for your time. See you on the dance floor this summer!

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM THE CAVNESS CORNER Shawn & Wendy Cavness shawn@rounddancing.org

The weather is getting warmer and we are excited for summer. For many clubs the dance season is coming to a close. This was a challenging year for dancing starting with mask mandates and a surge in the pandemic during the winter which caused cancellations and absences. Wendy and I spent the year teaching beginning Bolero and Two-Step. The lessons ended in May. We are so proud of our students for sticking with us and with their dancing. They all finished their lessons and did amazing. We know many other teachers and students had the same experience.

So, what's next? With Summer comes festivals and weekend events and a chance to try out those newfound dance skills. It's exciting and scary at the same time to be on a dance floor with no teacher to provide encouragement and guidance. Don't worry, you have been well trained and have learned the things you need to succeed. Here are some thoughts as you try out your new dancing legs at local dances and summer festivals.

The first and most important rule of thumb is DON'T STOP. Take every opportunity to dance so you don't forget what you have learned. Practice, practice, practice. In dancing, repetition is everything, it's all about muscle memory and the way you develop muscle memory is to keep practicing. No matter how easy or hard the dance is, the repetition of continuing to dance will make you a better dancer. That said, be prepared for frustration. Especially at festivals you will encounter difficult dances and unfamiliar figures. It will take at least a year before you will really feel competent at your new level or rhythm. That sounds like a long time but if you just keep dancing you will notice improvement over time and soon things that once seemed hard will become second nature.

Pay attention to the Cuer when he/she announces the dances. They should let you know the rhythm, Phase and pluses. In Round Dancing a dance doesn't raise a Phase unless there are at least three figures from the next Phase up. Most dances have pluses. Most likely your teacher taught you the most common pluses from the next Phase - but it is not unusual that the dance may have an unexpected plus in it – a figure that is added to the dance that you may not know. If possible, have someone demo it quickly for you. If that is not possible you can, depending on your courage level, choose to dance and fake that figure or simply sit out the dance. Our belief is that there are are some plusses that are simply inappropriate at every level - but that is a different topic for a different month.

Do not get discouraged if you can't get through a particular dance or if you feel like you are going backward. Just believe us that as long as you are dancing, you are always improving and learning. As you are dancing, identify figures or sequences that you struggled with. Don't be afraid to ask a teacher or another strong dancer to demo those for you. Dancers love to help and will take it as a compliment that you asked them for guidance. If you know the Cuer or if the Cuer seems to be open to it, request a familiar dance that you are comfortable with and enjoy. Repetition with dances and figures you know well are just as beneficial as learning new sequences.

Many festivals and weekends will feature a clinic or teach - take advantage of these, they're great opportunities to learn from different teachers. Often times, relearning even a familiar figure or sequence from a different teacher will provide an insight or sometimes even a breakthrough. When taking a clinic don't try to remember everything. Take home just one or two items to practice later. If you really enjoyed



the dance, pick up a cue sheet and give it to your local Cuer to put together. Don't be afraid to ask the clinic teacher questions or clarifications, or ask them to reteach one of the figures or sequences. If they are on the floor at a weekend teaching, they are doing what they love and will be open to providing some extra help to a motivated couple.

Most importantly! Seriously most importantly! HAVE FUN!! That sounds so simple - but we have known many couples who treat every dance as a lesson. They concentrate so hard on being perfect and on improving their dancing, that they forget the whole reason they took lessons in the first place. Dancing is supposed to be fun - it is totally ok to smile, to enjoy each other and to simply let loose, enjoying the rhythm and the flow of the dance.

Wendy and I will be attending the Washington State Square Dance Festival in Spokane. We will be Cueing and teaching at the Dancing, Education and Retreat weekend at Circle 8 in July. We will also be teaching and Cueing at the Firecracker Plus weekend in Bremerton and the Skagit Valley Hoedown in Sedro Woolley – both in July. In August we will be teaching and Cueing at the USA West Square Dance Festival in San Diego. If you are attending any of these events, come say hi. We would love to talk to you about your Round Dance experience and journey.

The Round of the Month for June 2022 is "Little Miss Rosa" written by Peter and Stella Tennant. This is a Phase II Two-Step with an interesting twist. It has a cucaracha. MEET SHASTA

As I am writing this, I am listening to the rain and the wind; eager to get into June and enjoy all of the spectacular dancing this summer.

I will miss the Montana State Festival this year, but will make up for it with the State Federation meeting in mid-May, the Idaho State Festival in Sandpoint, and Memorial Day Weekend at Lac a Do.


June will bring us the Idaho State Festival in Sandpoint, Washington State Festival in Spokane, and National's in Indiana.

Why do I spend so much time talking about the festivals and urging that you sign up for them? If you are a beginning dancer, dancing three or four days in a row to the best-of-the-best callers will give you a quantum leap toward becoming an outstanding dancer. By dancing with more experienced dancers, you will have a better opportunity to develop muscle memory so your steps become automatic, without thinking about the definition.

Dancing with your club is great, but sometimes we become so accustomed to our instructor's voice and favorite calls that when we hear an unknown voice calling steps that we don't hear very often, we can be thrown off balance and become intimidated by the unknown. At the festivals, callers are switched out at regular intervals; sometimes in half-hour increments and sometimes in 20-minute intervals. We don't have to worry about anyone discovering we don't know all of the steps, because the tip will quickly be over and nobody is going to remember.

If you go as a solo dancer, there are usually a number of dancers available who can dance both beau and belle so you can get in a square, secure that someone will step in to fill the empty spot next to you.

Usually the festival committee will have arranged some type of meet and greet for solo dancers early on. Be sure not to miss these the first day or



two. My experience is that quite a few people show up to find out who the other solos are. By the third day, most solos have partnered with someone they met on the first or second day, and it becomes more difficult to spot someone roaming around looking for a partner. Often the festival committee will have a designated seating area for solos, but my experience is that couples will often sit in that area because they don't notice the sign or banner, and that just confuses everybody. It is much more effective to be standing or walking near the dance floor, ready to make eye contact with someone wearing a solo ribbon or badge, and be ready to get in the square. It is much more effective than sitting and waiting to be asked, only to find that by the time you get on the floor, the open spots are taken.

Congratulations to Kathleen Rogacki and John Peterson on their marriage on May 17. They began to be interested in each other last September while angelling, and soon began showing up at dances as partners. We wish them the very best as they begin their lives together.
