

AWARDS TOM TOMLINSON



50th ANNIVERSARY OF CALLING.

HARLES J. TOMLINSON...whether you call him Charles, Uncle Chuck, Chuckie, Sparky, CJ or Tom, he is still a Rainier Council caller of great renown. Over the course of his 80 years he has lived and called all over the world. He started the square dancing at the age of 15 in Kingston, Idaho. He joined the Navy and became a ship's signal man. He danced whenever he could find a dance. Early 1970 found him dancing in Syracuse New York. A group of "friends" talked him into doing an Amateur Night. The rest is history. The group sent him to caller's school in Troy New Hampshire where upon graduating he joined CallerLab.

Now that he could call, what was he to do? His "Friends" wanted a club. First came the *Barge Thru's* (in honor of the Erie Canal). But the Teens wanted their own club so then came the *Smileys*. Did I mention he was also a clogger? Well you guessed it, the *Penguins* were born. Round dancers wanted a part of the action, too...so the *Ribit Rounds* were born (with the teens being *Little Riblets*). All of these families danced, camped, socialized, and yes, worked together. There was dancing every night of the week!

A friend arranged for Tom to call overseas involving a trip to Switzerland. Once there several additional cities were added to Tom's itinerary. Then, back home he came. He was calling so much that his "regular job" kept getting in the way. So Tom became a full-time caller, all up and down the east coast, plus Europe. Being a family man, however, he found himself growing increasingly tired of not having his family close-by, so he eventually "retired" from full-time calling and returned to New York to be a "family man" again.


In 1985 Tom relocated to the West Coast as a civilian working for Uncle Sam at Fort Lewis. He found a house in Steilacoom, and it wasn't long before he was actively engaged in square dancing again. He's called for the *Phil's & Phillies* in Poulsbo, clubs in Olympia, the *T-Squares*, the *Evergreen Rounds*, the *Swingin' Squares* in Sumner. Tom learned American Sign Language in the mid-90's, becoming a licensed interpreter/translator/educator for the school district. For over 15 years Tom has volunteered his time to teach kids with special needs how to square dance. Tom has also played an active role in helping coach teen square dancers for the PNTSDF competitions.

Now (and for the past 25+ years) Tom is the Caller & Cuer for the *Roamin' Tacomans*.

Tom has been an integral part of square dancing in Rainier Council and the WA State Federation of Square and Round Dancing for decades, having held too many positions to list here! He is deserving of the attention and admiration of square dancers statewide and beyond.

Please help us congratulate Tom, Charles, Uncle Chuckie, Sparkie, CJ or whatever you know him as for sharing his many talents for the last 50 years.





Built in the nineteenth century government architectural style it is constructed of native Indiana limestone with pink marble wainscots and at 216 feet to the bell tower is the focal point of downtown Evansville.

The members of the MT. BAKER TEACHERS, CALLERS, & CUERS ASSOCIATION (MBTCCA) are looking forward to dancing again and plan to start meeting in person starting in September.

Some questions have come our way about Callerlab's newly approved Social Square Dance Program, SSD. For the record: *Not all of the members of the Mt. Baker Teachers, Callers, & Cuers support SSD.*

This article was written to provide a high-level overview of what SSD is and how it works. It is **not** a silver/magic bullet that will instantly make square dancing problems go away. Instead, think of it as a new tool for square dancing's toolbox.

There are two ways to look at SSD. The first way is about **promoting club growth**.

SSD promises this to new dancers: "Dancing in **90** *days*." Where, using the more traditional combined Basic and Mainstream programs, the promise is "Dancing in **9** *months*."

In practice, in Illinois, the Glenview Squares grew their club from 20ish members to 90+ in three years. The North Shore Squares--a spinoff of Glenview--went from 0 to 60 members in two years. Both used SSD.

The second way to look at SSD is by examining the list of calls. The list was curated by examining their applications in singing calls. About 12 calls were removed from the Basic and Mainstream lists because they could not be effectively used (and reinforced) in the singing call figures. Some calls just don't fit well into singing call figures and are rarely--if ever--used. If the singing call is the "test" for what dancers learn, the goal of SSD is to ensure that dancers "pass" this test and that their time learning is focused. There's nothing wrong with the calls that were removed, per

se. The goal was to maximize each call's usefulness to focus on the overall dance experience.

Because the SSD material can be learned in 90 days, clubs can have three sets of lessons--if they wish--to provide multiple access points for club membership. Clubs that start SSD lessons in September will be done before the end of the year holidays. (Historically, this is a dangerous time for classes. People drop out and never return.) Then, a second set of SSD lessons can be taught starting in January. This can take advantage of so-called New Year's Resolutions. (What's your resolution? To be more active? Meet new people? Learn a new activity?) If the second set of lessons starts in January it will be complete in March. The third set of SSD lessons could start in April and be done in June.

Each subsequent set of lessons allows recently graduated dancers to bring their friends into square dancing quickly without sacrificing the quality of the dance experience.

Essentially, SSD is a repackaging of the square dance activity we know and love that was designed to be effective for a 21st century audience.



Maintaining an open dialogue between our club leaders, our callers, and our dancers is key if we are to successfully giving square dancing a chance to flourish once again.

The **SPINNERS**, a mainstream club that dances in Buckley, WA is celebrating its 40th anniversary this month!

The club was founded by Lloyd Shaw (also the club's first caller) as the Enumclaw Spinners on September 6, 1981. Lloyd, by the way, was the grandson of Pappy Shaw - founder of square dancing as we know

it. Pappy taught square dancing to Henry Ford and his workers, which ignited its popularity. Two of the original charter members of the club include Charlotte Hargrave and Ray Bollie.

The club danced in the Senior Center in Enumclaw for the first few years, however in 1984 a severe storm tore the roof off the Senior Center and the club moved to the Osceola Grange for two years. The club then moved to the Marion Grange where they danced for about 4 years. Then in 1990 there was an opportunity to dance in the Buckley Community Hall. However, there was no dance floor, the pipes all had to be replaced, the bare walls needed new sheet rock and paint, the restrooms needed to be replaced, and new windows were required. Suffice it to say, the dance hall was nowhere near ready for dancing in. With a lot of sweat and many volunteers, the hall became dance-worthy under the guidance and hard work of Dave and Nina Pearcy.

Lloyd Shaw, 1981 Ernie Buss, 1982

Vince Hargrave, 1983

Dave Pearcy, 1984 and for "most" of the next 34 years (until 2018)

Other presidents between then and now included:

Neil Andrews, 2019 - 2020

Patsy Harris, 2021

One of the most popular dances the Spinners hosted was their annual badge dance, where dancers danced in goofy ways to earn a badge. Our dance hall would be bursting at the seams with the over 10 square that couldn't wait to see what strange thing was next. At one dance we sold over \$300 worth of badges – 75 cents at a time!

Our first dance, since Covid began, is scheduled for Friday, September 10th at the newly renovated Buckley Hall in Buckley WA. It will be our 40th anniversary dance. Please join us to celebrate our 40 years as a club, our new renovated hall, and to help us continue our journey!


