#### Did You Know...?

...there is a new "sheriff" in town? His/her/its initials (don't you just "love" all the controversy over pronouns these days) are "SSD" and the Harbor Haylofters Square Dance Club (Hoquiam/Aberdeen, WA) is the first WA State square dance club to "hire" SSD!!

OK...SSD is not really a sheriff (but you already knew that). What I am alluding to, however, is the fact that SSD will have some influence, if not direct impact (just as a new sheriff would), in the coming years within our square dance community. Today's square dancers should be familiar with SSD even if they consider themselves (another pronoun) Mainstream, Plus, Advanced or Challenge dancers. Why?...because SSD, while some dancers and callers are against it, is likely to grow as a "destination" level rather than a "stepping stone" or the first "rung" on the square dance "step ladder" to higher levels.

I am not going to debate the pros and cons of SSD In this article. It is likely you have already formed an opinion one way or another about SSD, and there is little chance that I can say something profound enough in a short article to alter your position.

Congratulations to the club (leadership, caller and members) for taking the bold step to become the first club in Washington state to adopt the SSD program! I am sure new clubs that form in the coming years will likely follow in the Harbor Haylofters' footsteps and, eventually, even some existing/struggling Mainstream clubs may develop the courage to adopt the format now that the Harbor Haylofters have paved the way.

The Harbor Haylofters will follow the12 lesson SSD program for their upcoming lessons beginning in September/October 2023. The club expects to complete two full SSD lesson cycles in the current dance season.

Jerry Story, the visionary caller and primary architect of the SSD program before his passing, would be pleased and proud.



## Squarely Speaking

Hi all,

Another new season is right around the corner. I want to tell everyone what a pleasure it has been to be your Square Dance Columnist for the last year. I truly enjoyed the opportunity to speak with and correspond with many of you. I especially enjoyed the Dancing Education and Retreat (D.E.A.R.) seminar in Yakima this past summer. A great big thanks to the Footnotes Staff as well as Dave and Sharon Boggs for putting this on. I really love your hall and what great dancers.

There was a significant amount of interest in all the presentations that were given. For those that were unable to attend, you missed some really good topics. Lane Johnston, the State VP and I gave the seminar on Social Square Dancing (SSD) presenting it as more of a concept than "just another list". I have received several phone calls and emails requesting a copy of the presentation and more details on the subject. Here are the highlights.

- SSD is not, at least for Washington, the destination. We have been and continue to be a strong Mainstream State.
- 2. The lesson plan clearly spells out a way to teach Square Dancing in Standard Positions and the emphasis is on fun.
- 3. The program takes 16 weeks. 12 to teach the SSD moves and 4 to teach the remaining Mainstream moves.
- 4. The biggest advantages are.
  - a. Clubs working together as a team
  - b. Callers working together as a team
  - c. Students hear different voices and approaches to teaching.
  - d. Students can attend the same lesson multiple times in a week if they wish. If they miss a lesson or simply want more floor time they can go to the club that is having the same calls that were taught at their class earlier in the week.

I could go on but you get the gist.

The result of this program, at least in our areas are that CLUBS ARE GROWING. Who doesn't want that?

The SSD program that is operating in Sumner is a variant of the very successful B51 /MS program operating in Olympia. The calls and order are a little different but Olympia has an advantage. That being Lac A Do Hall. There is no central dance location. In the Rainer Council ' Sumner area we have 3 different locations.

It is good to note that the clubs in the area, The Bonnie Lads 'N' Lassies, The Spinners, The Swingnuts and the Young Bunch are all onboard with the program and we are beginning to see the fruits of our labor.

I also want to commend Dan Preedy for a great speech. Dan touched on a good portion of the salient points that need addressing to bring Square Dancing back to what it once was. Great job, Dan.

My last subject for this article is the 2023 Washington State Square and Round Dance Festival.

Here are 3 modules you can employ for the "Invert and Rotate" concept as taught at GSI Callers School. Once in the Corner Box

- 1. Star Thru, Pass Thru, Bend The Line, Slide Thru (Standard Invert and Rotate Module)
- 2. Touch ¼, Scoot Back, Boys Run, Pass Thru, Bend the Line, Slide Thru
- 3. Right and Left Thru, Star Thru, Square Thru 3, Bend the Line, Slide Thru


By working out several methods for this, as well has having return to CB modules and using Magic Modules, a caller can call an entire dance. It is up to you how much work you want to put into it.

Many of these can be developed using Taminations.

## CUER'S THOUGHTS FROM DAN BAILLY




H i everyone, I don't know about you, but it's been a busy summer going to various functions meeting new People and reuniting with old friends. Learning new techniques to apply to our dancing and share with others has been rewarding, with lessons starting up again this will be helpful I hope we have gotten refreshed and ready to start anew.

Something we worked on was a telemark this summer witch is defined as forward left turning left face forward right continue the turn then forward and side to banjo or side and forward to semi for the depending on the figure cued (ladies foot work back right, heel turn back and side right or forward right ) for the 3rd step it generally is a <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> rotation move used mainly in waltz and foxtrot. For me there has been an issue with the 3rd step as it was originally explained to me as a side step that turns into a forward step for the man (side that turns into a forward or back step for the lady depending on the desired end position for the lady such as semi or banjo). This summer it was suggested to think about stepping off a curb for this step, as I watched this person demonstrate and copied then things moved on. Later as I was rehashing it, I thought that's not how I step off a curb, mentioned it to a friend and she responded you must translate from Venetian to Martian or vice versa cause the person telling me was female and thinking high heels whereas I was thinking flats so maybe the better thought is down a stair so as a guy, I don't stride out.

Another suggestion offered me was to wait just a little on count 2 for the lady ,for those who have been told a little about waltz technique this may sound familiar as it is suggested to stretch count 2 by barrowing time from count 3 of coarse I also like to think about staying in closed position as long as possible as the transition happens at the end of the move i.e. semi or banjo to prepare for your next move. Well hope this gives you something to think about and possibly try, until next time.

### Cutting on the Edge

Precise cutting is as essential as accurate sewing to construct a garment. If the scissors are chewing instead of slicing, sewing an exact distance from the edge will be impossible. Don't waste time and talent on a project due to poor-quality tools.

Different scissors are needed for different parts of a sewing project. An 8 - 9 inch pair of benthandled shears are best for cutting a pattern layout. The large finger loop should slide along the tabletop while the scissors are used. Picking the shears off the table while cutting will cause the layers of fabric and the pattern to shift. Take long deep bites with the shears, slide them forward, and take another deep bite. The next pair of scissors is a small pair of thread nips. These six-inch scissors are spring-loaded in the open position. Keep them right next to the sewing machine. To use them, all you do is grab and squeeze. Do not use them for anything except threads. The last pair of scissors is a 5 - 6 inch pair of tailor points. These are for clipping curves and doing other close work. Much easier to work with in tight areas.

Spend some money on scissors. Buy quality. Keep them in good shape by cleaning the fabric lint off them after each use and occasionally putting a tiny drop of oil on the pivot point. After oiling, wipe them down carefully and cut up some scraps to remove excess oil. Quality scissors that are well cared for can last a lifetime. Rotary cutters can replace scissors for some jobs.

Rotary cutters are wonderful for cutting fabric but are much like computers. Mistakes can be made twice as fast. They are rolling razor blades and can easily cut fingers or anything else that gets in their way. If a pin is rolled over while cutting, the blade is ruined. It will skip a thread ----skip a thread at that spot because of the damage to the blade. There are blade sharpeners, but I have never heard good things about them. Blades must be replaced, and they can be expensive. Blades are brand specific and will only fit one type of handle. Be sure to dispose of old blades carefully. Put them in a sharps container, not in a trash bag. Someone reaching into the trash could get a nasty cut.

There are several sizes of rotary cutters. The ones that are used most often are 45 mm and 28 mm. The smaller one is perfect for tight corners, curves, and circles. For your first purchase, get the 45 mm for general sewing. Keep the package as a reference for changing blades. Quality cutting tools and techniques reduce frustration, increase accuracy, and improve projects. Many sewers cut several garments at once when in a cutting mood. Then they can sit down and sew whenever they have a few minutes.



In the Spring of 2022, four solo ladies from Spokane decided to pool their resources and travel together to the Spring Sashay in Yakima. By sharing gas and lodging, they not only saved money, but since all four were able to dance either beau or belle, they were able to partner with each other or ask someone else to dance. They were determined not to be old hens by going to a dance and not dancing.

The ladies had so much fun, that they decided they would continue to travel together, and would bring chickens as their mascots. They called themselves the Free Range Chickens of Spokane. Each of the solos would bring a fluffy, stuffed chicken and line them up on the floor in front of the caller, so everyone would know they were there. They began collecting silly chicken items and they put chicken stickers on their cars so they would be easily visible. Some have squeaky chickens that they use for sound effects while dancing. Many wear chicken earrings or t-shirts. The chicks in Spokane have aprons made with chicken wire fabric and the roosters get a necktie of rooster fabric.

The Free Range Chickens are not a formal club; they are a loosely held group of women who like to



travel. Each brings their own ideas to their group. They post what they are doing and where they want to go, hoping others will respond and want to join them. When at a dance, they also watch out for new dancers, and make sure they are included and dancing. Because they bring fun, whimsy, and inclusive, they are welcome at all dances and clubs.

The Free Range Chickens idea has now spread to Montana and Oregon. Their only web site is through Facebook, and to join, you simply ask the host to add you to the group. Chickens are encouraged to contact other solo dancers in their area. There are no rules. Anyone who dances as a single and likes to travel is welcome.

Since new classes are starting this month and next, if you don't already dance as a beau or a belle, think of enrolling in a beginner class as your opposite (beau if you are a girl, belle if you are a guy). After a season of lessons, you will be confident of your ability to fill any spare spot.

He began dancing in 1963 and calling in 1968. He taught beginner classes every opportunity he could. He firmly believed that square dancing was truly fun and fellowship set to music. He said it allowed us to laugh at ourselves and have a great time doing it. He joined CALLERLAB in 1975.

George joined the San Francisco County Sheriff's Department and became a Sheriff's Deputy in 1976. He worked in the jails, and

court rooms. He was promoted to Rangemaster in about 1985. He was responsible for the training of all members of the San Francisco County Sheriff's Department. He loved the job and loved the teaching. He loved to shoot, and he was good at it, and participated in many shooting competitions. He was Rangemaster until he retired in 2008.

In 2000, at a square dance, he met his wife Martha, and they married in 2005. They were partners on the dance floor, and in life. He was very active in the Bay Area calling and was Club Caller to the Keeway Swingers and the Ranchero Squares. In 2018, they moved to the Tri-Cities in Washington State and loved visiting the Prairie Shufflers. Soon he was able to call for them and was calling until the cancer made it impossible to continue.

George was a very special man with a heart of gold and the patience of a saint. He will be sorely missed by his loving wife Martha, and all his family and friends. Martha was by his side when he left this earth and he left knowing that he was loved.






