
ow did 2018 slip away so fast? I hope your Thanksgiving **▲** and Christmas time have been filled with fun, family, friendship, and some frolicking on the dance floor. Here's wishing you a wonderful 2019. A special wish goes out to our editor. Kathy Chase, hopefully your newly crafted and stitched feet will provide an "understanding" that allows you to walk and dance comfortably. You were very brave to have both feet done at the same time.

I love dancing and teaching Phase II-IV with a sprinkling of Phase V. However, my favorite to teach is Phase II. I'm not a trained educator. I taught a lot of in-service classes as part of my professional career. My colleagues and I used to say that half of our classes were employees who wanted to learn something to help them do their jobs. The other half were "prisoners," They were there because their supervisors had directed them to spend 2 hours with me whether they wanted to or not! A few among them were union stewards. My record working with the stewards was pretty good. If they were in the class though, they couldn't resist challenging me to be sure that I didn't cross the lines of any provisions of their union contract. That made things interesting and sometimes kept everyone awake!

Phase II classes have participants who have to learn which is their left foot and those who have had a lot of dance experience. A goal is to make sure everyone is learning something useful at every class. It is especially rewarding to see the "light bulb go on" when someone who was having difficulty with some concept or figure "gets it." Another of my goals is to be serious about teaching as much as the students can absorb, but at the same time to make it fun. None of my class members are "prisoners." They are only there if they want to be and they actually pay for it. Just like Square Dancing, Round Dancing is Fun Set to Music.

Experienced Clothing

A new name on an old concept makes it sound like a new idea. 'Recycle' is todays techie term for a process that has always been happening. With clothing, as you well know, it is called hand-me-downs. I am sure, there was a little cave girl who complained to her mother about hand-me-down bear skins from her big sister.

Today they call it 'up-cycling' but your grand mother called it 'turning'. When a garment could no longer be worn it was taken apart and the fabric was turned into something else. New fabrics were often mixed with the old pieces. When the dress is a great color but a bad fit, consider it yardage and turn it into a completely new outfit.

We are planning a council wide 'Experienced Clothing Sale' to hand down garments within our square dance family. We tell our newest dancers that experienced clothing will help them on the dance floor because it already knows the moves. That is our story and we're sticking to it.

Some of the garments need some love and care before they are ready. If they have been stored away too long and are musty wash with a splash of Pine-sol. The pine smell will go away in the dryer.

Petticoats - The most common problem is the elastic in the waist band has stretched out. This is easy to fix just pull out the old stuff and thread in a new piece. Get Ban-roll or Non-roll elastic that is at least a 3/4 inch wide. The elastic must be moderately tight to keep the slip from spinning around the body and taking the skirt with it. If the elastic is too narrow or too thin it will cut into the body and be very uncomfortable. Always leave a few inches extra on the elastic so that it can be re-adjusted. Until it is worn to a dance, you can't be sure if it is too loose or tight.

Go to my website 'Square Dance Sewing', in the menu click on petticoats and go down to C.P.R. That is Crinoline-Petticoat Re-fluff-a-tation. It is a technique to bring bounce back to old petticoats using fishing line. There are several other methods and I have tried them all. Elmer's glue, hair lacquer, Future floor finish and sugar. Fishing line is the only one that works.

Skirts - Elastic can also be a problem here. If there are rows of stitching through the elastic waist band, don't even think about taking it apart. Just cut the waist band off and make a new one. The same fabric will not be available, so go

with contrast. A wide black waist band will look like a belt. Especially if a large broach is pinned to the center front.

Shorter - If the skirt needs to be shortened the easiest way is to take off the waist band and shorten the top. The decoration is usually at the bottom edge and it is easier to work with the plain top than the fancy hem. Be careful when using this idea. Shortening the skirt several inches can make it too full and heavy for a slimmer smaller dancer.

Longer - The problem with trying to let down a hem is the crease will show. It is better to add a contrasting ruffle to the bottom. Echo that accent, such as a waist band or a ruffle on a blouse to make it a complete outfit.

Snaps - Men's snaps can be replaced. Take a small thin straight blade screw driver, insert it between the sections of the snap and pop it apart. The fabric will be held in the prongs, carefully work it free. If the cloth is damaged, a bit of interfacing behind the placket and a few stitches will pull it together. Put on a new snap and go to the dance.

Peasant style blouses - The elastic around the neck and sleeves can also suffer from aging. Some times it is easy to pull out the old and insert new. Consider using elastic cord for the replacement. It is easy to thread through the narrow tunnel using a darning needle. Clear elastic works well behind a lacy yoke. Sleeve elastic should just touch the arm and not cut into the flesh.

Pettipants - If the elastic is dead in pettipants, just toss them in the trash. There is no fix, they have come to the end.

WOW, have things changed!

I was stuck on a topic to talk about this month, so decided to read through some back issues of Footnotes for inspiration. As I wandered through the years, I was struck by the high number of solo dancers who have found life partners through square dancing; how many successful clubs have been formed for "singles" in order to satisfy the hunger for dancing, partner or not; and how the perception of solo dancers has changed in just a few years.

In past issues, credit has been given to Don Wood and Glen Raiha for preparing dancers for being able to dance the other gender when the numbers on the floor have become uneven. I want to also mention that Tom Tomlinson, Kevin Thomaier, and Steve Noseck all teach "all position dancing" in the Puget Sound Area. I encourage all dancers to look for opportunities to join workshops for "alternative dancing," "DBD dancing," and "all position dancing." Not only will you pick up some skills, but when you become proficient, you will dramatically increase the number of mainstream and plus calls that your caller can confidently call, doubling the amount of fun on the floor.


This is the season for new lessons, and it is a temptation to choose this opportunity to learn how to dance the "other side" while classes are slow, and the differences between "left side dancing" and "right side dancing" are carefully explained. However, be cautious, that unless you are highly proficient, you will end up causing confusion on the floor, and new dancers are already pretty confused. As angels, we don't want to increase their level of frustration, as too often newbies will decide it is just too difficult for them to grasp. If you find there are more angels than the floor needs, ask those dancers sitting out to help you learn the other side. Your home club dancers will be delighted to help you at your regular club dances, and you might even influence the rest of the club to join you in this new skill.

Other places to sharpen your skills are at the workshops. In my area, Steve has Thursday Night Plus at Mountlake Terrace, Kevin has KT's on Thursday night at the Maple Valley Grange, and Tom will start his workshops when his new dancers have graduated Mainstream, around the middle of January. Workshops are generally ongoing, and you can show up at any time during the year. There are many more callers

willing to coach all position, so watch for flyers. Anytime you see "workshop," it will be a good venue to try "the other side" in a safe, supportive environment.

Have a safe and joyous holiday season, and look forward to supporting the upcoming dances. In our area, Rainier Council is hosting a Pre-New Years Eve dance on the fifth Saturday (December 29) with the Hatch Brothers calling and Kyle Quande cueing. These young men bring a lot of talent to the stage, so come on out and be delighted at how much fun their calling brings. There are many New Year's Eve dances all over the state, so check out the flyers in this magazine and have a great time!

We just thought because we are primarily a youth club, we would try harder to get input from our target audience. And we can report the effort is paying off.

Even if your membership isn't attending as many meetings as you would like, or if you aren't hearing from your membership, don't get discouraged. Rather than being uninterested, perhaps "life" has gotten in the way and those members simply can't attend meetings because of it. We encourage you to think of different ways to reach out to them and to include them in conducting club business.






