



This issue of FOOTNOTES is the smallest of any issue that we can ever remember, and we've been around for quite some time. We hate to see this because it means that there is not enough participation. Consider this. Richard and Barbara Snyder, our Federation Membership and Insurance chairpersons, tell us in their report on page ten that we still have 11 councils, but only 114 clubs. If you would go through this issue and count them, as we did, you would find that less than half of our clubs sent anything for club news. Exactly 53 out of the 114. In addition, only six of the Councils included something about what was going on in their area.

To take this a step further, we took a look at our advertisers, without whom this magazine could not be printed at all. Seven of our Councils placed ads this month along with 30 clubs. Rounding out the count there are three businesses, two callers and one square dance center.

Lack of participation, especially participation that doesn't cost a single penny, seems both detrimental and foolish. We know that many clubs are small, but as long as they are dancing, FOOTNOTES would like to hear from them, every month.

There is also a noticable lack of pictures this month. Once upon a time it cost FOOTNOTES extra cash to print pictures. Not so any more. We can print all the pictures we want for not one extra cent.

Think about it folks. FOOTNOTES is your only statewide publication. We'd like to see more articles, more pictures and yes, more advertising. If your club isn't participating won't you please exert a little pressure for them to do so?

Insurance for class and new members -- Explained

For those clubs giving lessons, do not forget to send us a list of your students' names, addresses, and telephone numbers. You do NOT need to send money for the students as long as they are taking lessons. Students are covered by our insurance while they are going through lessons. Upon graduation the student is covered for 10 more days. At that time the student must join a club and pay the \$6.00. If they do not join a club within the 10 day period, they will no longer be covered after lessons. A new graduate joining your club would be handled the same as any person joining the club. Send us their name, address, and telephone number along with the required \$6.00 per member.

A club may add new members during the dance year by simply sending us the new person's name, address, and most importantly, their telephone number, along with a check for \$6.00 per member.

We have lost four clubs in the federation: Blazing Stars, Rainier Council; Checkerboard Squares, Mt. Baker Council; Contrails, CPSC; and North Central Callers and Cuers, North Central Council. These clubs have folded. That leaves us with eleven councils, 114 clubs, and 2,936 members as of this date, August 30, 2015.

We are trying something different this year. Instead of handing out paper at the fall state meeting, we will be emailing up-dated club membership information to each council treasurer. We are asking each council to print off the membership list of their clubs and distribute them accordingly.

As Membership and Insurance Chairmen, we too want to add our concern that we have lost our voice through lack of a vote. Losing the right to vote is a very serious matter. This is a principle this country was founded on. However small the organization is in the scope of things, voting is still a serious matter. We also do not think the reasoning behind this was accurate. We were deeply involved in the situation that created the descent that brought this about. Misunderstanding, misinformation, lack of direction, and personality conflicts led to this decision. Losing the right to vote will definitely affect the attendance at state meetings. This, in effect, could result in a lot of ideas not being presented. Personally, we feel like this is a slap in the face telling us we are not important enough to have our ideas and opinions matter.

It provides us with presentations that educate and help us figure some ways that anyone can practice to promote our activity. This is an Education and Leadership Seminar.

This is my first article for FOOTNOTES. I will be doing the WROM starting in October and my last one will be the September ROM. I am hoping that you enjoy the rounds that the committee chooses. My goal is to select rounds that dancers will enjoy and let the committee choose the WROM each month. The WROM is to be dances that everyone can dance with little teaching. This will insure that at festivals and special dances all Phase II dancers will be able to enjoy the program.

SEW TOGETHER

Glue and Press

This technique was learned from stitchers who were binding quilts. It works for many types of fabrics and sewing problems. You will need kids washable school glue sticks. The skinny ones that come three to a package at the dollar store. It doesn't matter what color. You can buy a 'fabric glue stick' at the store for about \$2, there isn't any difference. Extra glue sticks can be kept in a zip lock bag in the freezer to keep them from drying out.

To apply ribbon to fabric, smear a line of glue on the back of the ribbon. Position the ribbon on the fabric and iron it down. It is faster and more accurate than pinning. Take the project to the sewing machine and sew the ribbon down. Sew on the edges or down the middle. Use a 3.5 or 4.0mm stitch length. Sew fast, the ribbon is stuck and can't shift. There are no pins to stop and pull out. If the ribbon was misplaced just pull it off. Glue and press it again.

I hear your questions - NO - The glue will not gum up the needle or get in the sewing machine. The iron drys the glue. Hundreds of yards of ribbon were sewn to outfits for the 2012 National using this technique. Glue and press ribbon to all of the panels of

the skirt, then sew. Having worked in a shop that repairs sewing machines I know how to check for problems. The glue and press technique doesn't hurt the machine or the fabric.

At a workshop one of the gals accidentally brought a permanent glue stick. It worked fine. I tried liquid school glue and that didn't work. It soaked into the fabric and did not form a bond. If the fabric or trim can not be ironed just let the glue dry for about 30 minutes before sewing.

Keep a glue stick near the ironing board. Wrap a rubber band around it so that it will not roll away. You will find more uses for this idea. That pesky corner that will not press down, a dab of glue and the iron will fix it. Glue can be used to hold a patch in place until it is sewn. Remember, the glue will come out in the first wash.

Steam-A-Seam can also be used to apply ribbon. This is double stick fusible web. Take a strip of Steam-A-Seam and iron it on the back of the ribbon. Peel off the release paper. Position the ribbon on the project and iron. This is a permanent bond. You can sew the edges or down the center of the ribbon or you can leave it unsewn. It will not gum up the needle or the machine.

There are many other fusible products for fabric. Heat n' Bond, Wonder Under and Stitch Witchery are just some of the trade names available. They come in different sizes and thicknesses. Some have a paper backing. Use the thinner types for fine fabrics and the thicker stuff for denim. I use a Betty Crocker© teflon oven liner when working with these products to keep the glue off the iron and the ironing board. Any glue or fuse webbing on the teflon will brush or wash off.

How to make those pre-glued denim patches stick better. - Soak the patch in warm water for about ten minutes, to soften the adhesive resin. Place the jeans on the ironing board and set the iron for cotton. Put a scrap of fabric under the hole, or the patch will be fused to the ironing board or



the other side of the leg. Spray with water and press to get the area hot and damp. Wring out the patch and position it over the hole. Press in place - really hard - push down with both hands. The glue must be forced from the patch to the jeans. Keep pressing down hard for 15 seconds. Use a watch, it takes time for the bond to form. Take the iron away and let the patch cool completely before moving or touching it. Trim the excess fabric off the back. The factors needed to make the patch stick are heat, steam, pressure and time.

Sometimes when sewing on fun fabrics with sparkles or decorations the needle will get coated with residue or glue. Wipe the needle frequently with a scrap of fabric and rubbing alcohol. Teflon coated needles are available to deal with this problem. A topstitch needle is often better for interesting fabrics. It has a deeper groove and a bigger eye. When sewing on fabric with metallic elements, be sure to vacuum the machine frequently to clean out the sparkles.

Try a new technique. Experiment with new products and don't be afraid of unusual fabrics. There is more than one way to sew anything. Accept the challenge and *Keep on Stitchin'*.

A little solo history

Imagine my delight when, a few days ago, a casual conversation with a retired square dancer backed up my first article regarding our ostracism when losing a partner. Nothing is more authentic than personal experience. When this long-time dancer lost her husband, she was "allowed to take money and keep the books", but when her work was done, while the dancers were do-si-doing, she went home. Dancing wasn't an option.

The man she eventually met and married was a bit more welcomed. He got to dance with the caller's wife, who had been sitting on the sidelines until he was widowed. Don't get me started on the plight of caller's wives and dancing, mostly in the straight-laced past.

Over the years several things brought gradual change. The aging of the dance population created widows and widowers who still felt close to this social group. Attitudes softened as more people saw that they, too, could be in the same situation someday. Also, square dancing gradually dwindled as dancers aged out, bringing more value to those of us who had no permanent partners. Better a dance which included a few solos, than no dance at all or one that didn't pay the bills.

Over the decades greater society became more accepting of single people. They were becoming a much higher percentage of the population, as more people chose careers and even single parenting, along with traditional marriage. This acceptance gradually spread to most of our clubs.

When South Sound Singles started their club in Tacoma in the 1980's, they garnered over 300 members the first year. Life was still tough for solo dancers and this new innovative club took the pressure off. Solos found a great place to meet other dancers and to find acceptance as solos.

These many years later, their club has gradually lost their large following, since many clubs now open their membership to solos. There's still a tendency to let them to do the work, then sit on the bench during the dances, rather than include them, but it's been a steep learning curve and not everyone is onboard.

Shy solo dancers have a tough time integrating when squares are forming, and that goes for either gender. Keep that in mind if you have solo club members or guests. They deserve to dance, particularly when they help with club work or are your guests.


