For those clubs giving lessons, do not forget to send **F** us a list of your students' names, addresses, and telephone numbers. You do NOT need to send money for the students as long as they are taking lessons. Students are covered by our insurance while they are going through lessons. Upon graduation, the student is covered for 10 more days. At that time, the student must join a club and pay the \$6.00. If they do not join a club within the 10 day period, they will no longer be covered after lessons. A new graduate joining your club would be handled the same as any person joining the club, send us their name, address, and telephone number along with the required \$6.00 per member. A club may add new members during the dance year by simply sending us the new person's name, address and their telephone number, along with a check for \$6.00 per member.

We have lost three clubs in the federation this year: Buds & Blossoms, North Central Council; KT's, Central Puget Sound Council; Ruffs & Ruffles, Sou'Wester Council. We added one club, Sweet Heart Rounds in Peninsula Council. That leaves us with 92 clubs, and 2,588 members as of August 31, 2019, a loss of 47 members from last year.

We have emailed up-dated club membership information to each council treasurer. We are asking each council to print off the membership list of their clubs and distribute them accordingly. Also, the audit has been completed and mailed out to the clubs involved. Please take care of this information when you receive it.



Welcome to the 2019 -2020 Square Dance page. Leslie and I would like to thank Cynda, the Editor, for asking us to be part of the "Footnotes" family. It is an honor.

We are your Square Dance Editor for this season and hope you will enjoy the articles and topics we select. Some of these topics are designed for us to look at in a new light, or a new direction.

However we believe that the overall dialogue will be very positive, and these will stir the pot and allow us to have an open discussion.

The first article has to do with "terms" we use in Square Dancing and that some of our newer Students and Members of your Clubs may have never seen an explanation of these. They are used at all dancers/ lessons / workshops and may seem to be a foreign language.

We hope these will allow you to have a better understanding and definition of these.

Please enjoy.

We have a lot of newer dancers and even some experienced dancers, that might hear something and wonder what that was?

Square dancers have almost as many jargon terms as people in a technical field. Here are a few that come to mind, so you don't feel left out. This list does not include the names of the calls themselves, just vocabulary used for talking about calls, formations, or square dancing in general. I recommend you keep this list around for a rereading later.

call

1. A set of moves that you do when the caller calls its name. Most are made up of simpler calls.

2. A series of calls {1} that traditionally starts and ends with "bow to your partner, bow to your corner".

sequence

A series of calls {1} that begins and ends with the dancers at home.

patter call

A call {2} that is spoken or chanted rather than sung but is usually done to background music. Also called a hash call. You wind up with your original partner each time you promenade home.

singing call

A call {2} that consists of a song (any song with a good beat will do, and it depends mostly on the caller's taste) with some of the lyrics replaced by square dance calls. The typical singing call has 7 sequences, in the pattern ABBABBA; at the end of the B sequences, you usually wind up with your (new) corner for the promenade home.

zero

A call{1} that leaves you in the same place at the end of the call as you started. Examples: Grand Square, Teacup Chain, Eight Chain Thru.

cuing

Directions the caller sometimes gives after a call that he or she thinks some dancers may have trouble with, giving the definition of the call ("Right and Left Thru--Right Pull By, then a Courtesy Turn") or filling in who does what, given your current formation ("Flutterwheel-"Right Side goes in".

sight calling

Calling ad lib and then trying to untangle the square on the fly, rather like unscrambling a Rubik's cube.

sight square

The square a sight caller watches to see the effect of the calls. Also called pilot square.

break down

What a square has done when so few dancers know where they're supposed to be that everyone is hopelessly lost.

tip

The time you spend dancing in one square without a break. Typically this consists of a patter call and a singing call.

level or program

A list of calls, including all the levels below it. The levels are: Basic, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced (A1-A2), and

Challenge (C1-C4).

floor level

The level at which most or all the tips of your dance are called.

star tip

A tip that is at a more advanced level than the floor level. The name comes from the fact that these tips are marked with an asterisk at dances where there is a written list of tips.

hoedown

A large gathering held to square dance.

one-night stand

A party where people who are assumed to know nothing about square dancing learn just enough calls to dance for one night.

workshop

A class for people who already know one level to learn the next level, or to gain more skill at their current level.

angel

A dancer participating in a class who already knows how to dance the level being taught.

dark

Not meeting. Said of a night that a club would ordinarily meet, but this time doesn't.

book

To schedule a tip in which you are committed to dancing with a partner or particular couple(s). When you book an entire square it is sometimes called stacking. Booking many tips in advance, or stacking squares is generally frowned upon, although there are a few circumstances where it is approved, such as to help dancers brand new to the level.

checkerboard

To arrange that alternating squares (in a checkerboard pattern) dance with the head and side designations reversed, to provide more effective dancing space in a crowded hall.

couple

Two side-by-side dancers facing the same direction.

beau

The left-side dancer of a couple.

belle

The right-side dancer of a couple.

gent

A dancer who is in the beau position when squared up, even if she happens to be female. Also called man, gentleman or boy.

lady

A dancer who is in the belle position when squared up, even if he happens to be male. Also called gal or girl. Note that beau and belle designate the people in certain positions in a formation, and change from one call to the next, while the gent and lady designations are fixed for a whole tip, independent of positioning.

normal couple

A couple with a gent standing to the left of a lady.

half-sashayed couple

A couple with a lady standing to the left of a gent.

tandem

Two dancers facing the same direction, one in front of the other.

leader, trailer

In any 1x2 setup (e.g., a tandem, facing dancers, etc.), the dancers facing out of the setup are leaders, those facing in are trailers.

sex-linked call

A call that is performed differently by gents and ladies, regardless of position. There aren't nearly as many of these as some people think. Examples: Allemande Left, Star Thru, Slide Thru, Swing Your Partner.

concept

A call that doesn't by itself specify any action to take but modifies the action of another call. There are no concepts at Plus; the first one at Advanced is As Couples Call, which means to perform Call with each couple acting as one dancer.

arky older term

1. Dancing as a gent if you're female or a lady if you're male. Origin obscure.

2. A concept used at the Challenge level: all the beaus dance the specified call as if they were gents, while the belle's dance as if they were ladies.

1&3, 2&4

An Alternative designation for heads and sides, respectively. The couples in a square are numbered from 1 to 4 in promenade direction around the square (i.e., counterclockwise as viewed from above), with #1 being the couple with their backs to the caller.

styling

Anything about the way you do a call that is not mentioned in the definition. Usually, the definition tells you how to get there, while styling tells you how to do it smoothly. Some calls have a standard styling that everyone must know and is always correct, plus alternate stylings, or frills, that you can add for fun.

frill

A fancy move that is added to or substituted for the standard way of doing a call that has the same effect but is more fun. Frills that involve other dancers usually have some built-in signal so that you only do it if both dancers are ready and both know the frill. Some Callers don't teach these, and we generally refrain from doing frills during at least the early stages of a class so that you can concentrate on the calls. But if you notice amusing frills during the Plus tips of the evening that you'd like to learn, just ask someone (but please, don't use them on class members who haven't learned them).

sound effect

Something the dancers yell back, ideally in unison, in response to a call. Examples: Slide Thru--"Whoosh!" Spin the Top--"Spin the Top?" Triple Scoot--"Rooty-toot-toot!"

phantom

An imaginary dancer. They come in handy when you're desperate to dance and have fewer than 8 people, but they need a lot of help to execute the calls. At Challenge levels, callers deliberately add phantoms to the square to make things more interesting.

APD older term

All Position Dancing. In many clubs, calls are only called from certain standard positions. For example, the caller keeps the gent on the lady's left most or all of the time. So if you are a man, you will always turn to your right during Square Thru, which means you don't have to think as hard about where to go next. Other calls also have standard positions, and so most people only learn how to do half (or less) of the call. Some people think this makes it easier to learn, though to others of us it means you're only learning a lot of special cases, and you're developing bad habits that will plague you if you ever choose to dance a level higher than Plus. With APD, a couple may have the lady on the gent's left, or may consist of two gents or two ladies; any arrangement of sexes is a legal starting position for a call (except for some sex-linked calls, of course). All Advanced and Challenge dancers are required to know APD, but it is optional at Mainstream and Plus.

DBD older term


"Dancing By Definition". This requires that dancers remember how each call is defined rather than what usually works. For example, Swing Thru is defined as Half by the Right if you can be followed by Half by the Left if you can. In a non-DBD club, Swing Thru would probably be called only from a right-handed wave, and you could get away with thinking that you trade with the adjacent dancer, and then the center's trade. However, that is not the definition of the call, and it won't work from a left-handed wave. APD is a special case of DBD, but most people use the terms interchangeably.

Extended Application, is today's term for both APD and DBD.

What is microfiber? Micro-denier fiber, better known as microfiber, is an ultra fine fiber made from polyester, nylon, or rayon. Each filament of microfiber is smaller than one denier (pronounced den-e-er). A strand of natural silk is one denier. A denier, as a unit of measurement, is one gram of mass per 9,000 meters of length. Or to put it in more common terms, the weight of one raisin per 5½ miles of fiber. For comparison, yarns used in sheer nylon panty hose are 10 to 15 denier. A strand of human hair is about 20 denier.

Microfiber is not new to the world of man made textiles and the selection of microfiber fabrics is increasing. As with any other product there are various trade names and types of microfiber fabrics. Since they are manmade fibers they can be altered in many ways. Some are designed to wick moisture away, such as sports wear and towels. Others repel water as in table cloths and tents.

Today's microfibers can be used to make breathable woven fabrics, weft knits such as jersey, and warp knits like tricot. Some have silky finishes, others have fine suede like naps or metallic finishes. Microfiber fabrics require special handling during manufacturing, so they are more expensive to produce than other synthetics. Microfibers are now used to create fabrics which are as luxurious and comfortable to wear as natural fiber fabrics, and as easy to clean as synthetics.

Since micro-denier fabrics are densely woven, they require special handling when sewing. Choose your pattern carefully considering the 'hand', weight, drape and feel of the fabric. Consider a light, silky microfiber for your next dance outfit. They can be packed for travel and when removed from the suitcase look perfect with a good shake.

Microfiber fabrics are frequently used in outdoor recreation clothing and gear. When they are very low denier they are very light, such as the lining of a sleeping bag. This means less weight to pack. When the fabrics are higher denier they are more abrasion resistant than natural fibers. Good for pants and jackets.

During construction, use fine pins, placed within the seam allowances to avoid permanent pinholes. Dritz Ultra-Fine Glass Head Pins are my favorites. The tight weave makes sliding pins in more difficult. Consider working with hair clips or quilter's clips instead of pins. Cutting some microfibers, with a rotary cutter, can be challenging. The fine fibers easily hide in any cracks on the mat. When you go to lift the piece away the bottom layer is still attached by tiny threads. The easiest way to overcome this is to cover the cutting mat with paper. Any type will do. Dollar store wrapping paper works well. Lay the fabric and pattern on top. Pin through all layers and cut. The blade cuts through both fabric layers and into the paper. No, this won't hurt your blade. The wrapping paper is so fine your blade won't notice it. How old is that blade anyhow? When starting a new microfiber garment it may be time to get a new blade.

Microtex (Sharp) machine needles, by Schmetz, penetrate micro-denier fabrics best. The type of needle really does make a difference. Use this needle for micro fibers, polyester, silk, foils, artificial leather, coated materials. This very thin acute point creates beautiful topstitching and perfectly straight stitches when precision is paramount. Start a new garment with a new Microtex needle and quality thread. Guttermann Sew-All and Mettler Metrosene brand threads are more expensive because they are worth it. With the time and effort you are spending on this project, don't skimp on the needles and thread.

Microfiber fabrics are tricky to press, and once pressed, unwanted creases are difficult to remove. If the iron is too hot, the fabric will glaze or melt; if it isn't hot enough, it won't press well. Test press on some fabric scraps at various temperatures with steam or a damp press cloth until you get a good result.

Most microfibers are washable. As with anything else, read the end of the bolt before purchasing. Prewash and dry the fabric as recommended on the label. Some of these fabrics shrink with heat of the dryer. If the fabric should be line dried, add a care label of your own while sewing. Something like a small piece of red ribbon in the neck line to remind you not to toss it in the dryer.

Are you Bi-dance-ual or Ambi-dance-trous?

Many clubs have more female dancers than male dancers. In order to keep from sitting on the side lines, many gals have learned to dance the guy's part. By being flexible and willing to do something different, they keep dancing. It doesn't matter which side you are on, Belle or Beau, Gull or Buoy, the dance is the object. If you are the one who can fill out a square by dancing which ever position is needed, you keep seven other people dancing.

One night we made an all-female square. All of us in the square could dance either position. Of course, we danced right in front of the caller. He refused to look at us. We kept exchanging positions as we were dancing. Was that the reason he ignored us? Or was it the spare girl that kept cutting in? At the end of the set he referred to us as a bi-dance-ual square. Since then I have heard another term is ambi-dance-trous.

The easiest way to become bi-dance-ual is to go through lessons, from the beginning, in the other position. While you are at lessons you need to stay on the new side. Don't switch back and forth. Once you are in the mind set you will learn faster. It helps if you at least start with an experienced dancer for partner and your corner. The left allemande is one of the hardest parts to re-learn because it is one of the first things we learned.

When new dancers see the wrong sex coming at them in a right & left grand, it throws them off. Make brightly colored tabards with BOY in large letters on the front and back. Wearing one of these will help all the dancers know you are in the guy's part. A small badge can't be seen. A cap is a good idea for a girl dancing the man's part because the caller can see the top of her head and be reminded that she is on the he side. The British driving cap I wear seems to help remind me that I am a gent, maybe it's a foreign weight on my head that triggers my thinking "I'm a boy, I'm a boy, I'm a boy."

I was admiring a large, stretchy beaded bracelet on a gal at the last national and she told me it was her boygirl bracelet. When she danced the girl side she put it on her right hand to remind her to slide-through, turn right and when she danced the boy side she wore it on the left wrist to slide-through, turn left. The Japanese dancers at Nationals wore a wide diagonal sash when they danced the male side.

Some people think that going to new dancer lessons is boring. They know how to dance so well they don't want to dance with new dancers. Well, I challenge you to go through lessons and become ambi-dance-trous. Let's see how fast and how well you learn on the other side.

When I make a mistake while dancing the boy side, I excuse it by saying, "The sex change operation didn't go very well!"
