



Would like to thank Cynda for asking me to write your Caller Corner for this dance season. It is an honor. Of course, we are hoping for a dance season after COVID. At this time, it appears that will not happen before 2021. I hope you will enjoy my articles and topics we will discuss.

A little about myself, I started calling in 1965. I have attended three Caller Schools. First, 1978 at Frank Lane's Dance Ranch, Estes Park, CO. Frank, Bob Fisk and Earl Johnston instructing. I learned how to resolve squares. Second, 1981, Tacoma, WA on the way to my first National Convention, Seattle, WA. Wade Driver and Bill Davis. I started to learn music from Wade. Later, I continued to learn and would not be writing this today if it were not for Jim Hattrick. I also took voice lessons from Pauline Jensen, Portland, OR. I continue to learn today. Squares, Aloha, OR and St Helens Squares, St Helens, OR.

Positive thinking ahead to when we can have lessons, who will you ask to come to lessons. Think about people you see often, your hairdresser, your barber, the person that checks your groceries, how about someone who sits next to you in church. I remember a story a successful caller told a story of having full classes. He was asked why his classes were so successful? He said quite simply, "its my club". On the first night of lessons, he watches car after car arrive. When each car would stop, all four doors would open. Almost everyone was bringing someone. Here is the key "bringing".

Consider for a moment the club who has two squares of members brought someone to lessons pretty soon the club would double in size. Not everyone you ask will come or continue to dance. However, if you are persistent, growth will occur.

FISHTAILING FOR ROUNDS

Talking about "STYLING" this month.

We feel that styling is an individual emotional preference in movement and like personality, it belongs to you. Each couple has their own expression as to what is a natural feeling for a particular rhythm of music. No one can tell you how you feel, no publication or book can give you this thing called "Styling".

We, the separate individuals of the "Bob and Linda team", like to feel the mood of the music. Learning a dance from the cue sheet is like putting a puzzle together. Exploring the directions, trying to create what the choreographer had in mind when writing the dance. Dancing the dance, we begin transferring to the other partner, our separate feelings of both the music mood and the technique in which the dance was written—to finalize, and create our own "Bob and Linda" style of the dance. We attempt to blend every step and make every movement appear to be as smooth and comfortable as possible. We try to keep in mind that along with smoothness and continuity, attitude plays a major role in dance. If you are smiling, dancing smoothly and have the appearance of an enjoyable experience, you can make the most simple routine look interesting and pleasant. Round Dancing should not have the rigid "drill-team" look, but should appear to be a free and easy experience; one that is moving smoothly and with grace. Each couple should demonstrate their own physical and emotional characteristic of good styling.

Little things can make a big difference in your dance style. Don't "over-style" – to over-do could look tacky. Better too little, than too much. Too much arm, leg, hip, skirt, etc., action is out of place! Listen and attempt to follow suggestions made by your instructors. Watch other dancers and if you see them demonstrate something you like, try executing the same style – it may please you greatly and what a reward! Take into consideration the different body structures; such as tall or short, ect. Consider too, that just because it looks nice when someone else does a movement, does not mean it will look nice when you do it. It may not be your style at all. Keep watching, you may find another style that fits you and your "personal touch".....maybe you will discover a style that you and

your partner can express with even more gracefulness than dancers you have been observing.

Styling is not to be confused with technique! There are many steps and figures that are designed to be done with certain and precise footwork. These are constructed to make the couple turns compact and the dancers will end in the proper partner position. Styling? No! They are the manner in which the movement is to be executed to maintain the proper position and not force one of the partners to travel a greater .

There are many general rules of styling to practice. A lovely beginning is to SMILE! The entire presentation is spoiled by a "sour face". Certainly, do not stare at your partner with a "fixed – fake" grin on your face. Compliment your partner by smiling at each other occasionally during the dance. Let the other know that you enjoy dancing with them. Many couples do not have fancy styling as they dance, however they express their pleasure and enjoyment by looking happy and it is a pleasure to watch them. Dancers that are expert dancers and know all the latest routines, along with many extra styling maneuvers, yet do not look like they are enjoying themselves are really not pleasureable to observe at all. Remember to be happy and "Smile"! That alone can be contagious!

Rounds For You...what an art this dance recreation is of ours.

We would like to pass on to you a paragraph found in a very old book written by Lloyd Shaw....it really "moved" both of us....it reads as follows:

I love to see a young couple who love to dance – lithe, eager, erect; the give and take of their light and delicate hold; the exquisite teamwork in the dip and sway and whirl of their bodies! With their weight properly forward they move as lightly, as gossamer. Oh, the bewitching line from erect body through curving thigh as she reaches lightly to a backward step, the graceful whirling of her skirt; the light touch of his protective strength as he whirls her about him. It is beauty at its best. Beauty to behold, but even more beauty to be partner to.

Thank you for reading this article originally written by us years ago in Footnotes Magazine. We will continue this article suggesting some factors we feel necessary to help you blend to better styling.



Rolled Hem Feet

One of the greatest time savers of all is the rolled hem foot or narrow hemmer. It forms and stitches a perfectly turned hem without basting or pressing. With this foot, many yards of ruffle can be finished very quickly. A metal scroll forms two fine folds of the raw edge and stitches the hem with only a gentle control of the fabric as it enters the scroll. As with any other technique or new tool some practice is required.




Originally, when a very narrow rolled hem was wanted the instructions were to fold the hem up one-eighth inch and stitch down the middle of the fold. Then fold the edge up again and stitch again. This took a lot of time and very careful control of the fabric. The rolled hem foot is the household version of a foot that is used constantly in industrial stitching. They are available in a variety of widths and are available for all machines.

For the cottons, poly-cottons and broadcloths used in square dance dresses, I suggest the 4 mm or 5 mm foot. Smaller feet are for finer fabrics like chiffon. The picture of the top of the feet shows the size of the scroll. The bottom view shows the groves in the bottom and the width of the final fold.

The set of four Greist feet was standard with sewing machines years ago and will still work on my newest machine. Sizes are one-quarter, one-half, three-quarters and one inch.

To start the rolled hem on a corner, you will need a needle with about twelve inches of thread. Make a quarter inch double fold in the end of the fabric and finger press it very hard. Take a small stitch through the end of the fold. This is the handle to control the start of the roll.





Work the edge of the cloth into the scroll and pull it forward until the end of the fabric is under the needle. Holding the handle threads and the machine threads, start stitching.

If you want to start in the middle of an edge, make a quarter inch double fold and pin it. Put the pinned section behind the foot, work the fabric into the scroll and pull forward until the pin is just under the back of the foot.



Keeping the right hand just in front of the foot, guide the fabric into the scroll. Keep

the edge all the way to the left side of the scroll and the fold of the fabric wide enough to fill the scroll on the right. If a raw edge appears the material has been fed into the hemmer too sparingly. If a bulky misshapen edge results, there is too much fabric in the roll.



To give the edge some extra bounce and flare insert some fishing line. Include it in the folds

when the roll is first started and guide it in the back of the fold

with your thumb. Use 15 or 20 # line, get the inexpensive stuff, it is bouncier than the pricey kind.



To cross a seam - Make sure the end of the seam has been back stitched to the very edge. Cut the seam allowances to a sharp (45 degree) point. Press the seam open. A small tug may be required to help the seam feet through the scroll. To hem a bias edge - Straight stitch about a quarter inch from the edge. Being very careful not to stretch it. Trim close to the stitching before hemming.

Lengthen the stitch to 3.5 or 4 mm. There is no stress on this seam. A longer stitch will sew faster and be less likely to shrink and pucker. If the foot has wide needle opening, as shown in the new feet, a zig zag or decorative stitch can be used. If the foot has a single needle opening, like the Greist feet, only a straight stitch can be used. Decreasing the thread tension by one number will also reduce puckering.

Learning to use all of the different feet allows the stitcher to accomplish interesting effects in less time and most importantly, with less stress. Stitching should be your happy, relaxing and creative time.
