Did You Know...?

...that there are now over <u>THREE HUNDRED</u> dance events in Washington state posted for the period between "now" (as of September 12th, when this article was written for the October issue of Footnotes) and December 31, 2021 on the <u>WheresTheDance.com</u> website?

That's about 100 more events than were posted a month ago (in August) through the end of the year! That's 100 more events, but with one month <u>less</u> in the period in question...that's "progress"! And the list of clubs posting has grown, if only slightly, during the past month as well (add the Wagon Wheel Squares of Central Puget Sound Council to the list posted in September's *Did You Know...?* article).

Imagine how useful and convenient it would be if <u>all</u> WA state dancers were able to spend less than one minute to see, at a glance, the 6 most-important bits of information about every dance event statewide:

- 1. When the event is scheduled (in date/time order, with the day of the week noted)
- 2. Who's dancing (which clubs, that is...by club name)
- 3. Who's calling/cueing (with their first and last names clearly noted)
- 4. Where the event is being held (by town/city name clearly noted)
- 5. What the distance is in miles (as the crow flies) from one's "home" address or any other specified city, town, or zip code.
- 6. What the dance "level" is (Basic, SSD, Mainstream, Plus, Advanced? Phase I, II, III?)

In case you were, up to now, unaware of it...the ability to have all the information above at one's fingertips already exists!

This is the time of year when our main concern is club and membership renewals. The unique thing about this year is that the Federation has agreed to cover all renewal costs due to the effect of the COVID virus on our square dance community. We still need to complete all the renewal processes minus any fees. These processes have been completed for the 2021-2022 dance season. Thank you to all the clubs and councils for your cooperation in helping us complete these processes this year.

For those clubs giving lessons, do not forget to send us a list of your students' names, addresses, and telephone numbers. Students are covered by our insurance while they are going through lessons. Upon graduation, the student is covered for 10 more days. At that time, the student must join a club to continue to be covered by insurance. If they do not join a club within the 10-day period, they will no longer be covered after lessons. A new graduate joining your club would be handled the same as any person joining the club, send us their name, address, and telephone number. A club may add new members during the dance year by simply sending us the new person's name, address and their telephone number. Remember, there are no fees required for this dance season.

We have lost three clubs in the federation this year: Stanwood Sashayers, Mt. Baker Council; Krazy 8's and Jacks & Jennys, Spokane Area Council. That leaves us with 90 clubs, and 2,197 members as of August 31, 2021, a loss of 391 members from last year.

We have emailed up-dated club membership information to each council treasurer. We are asking each council to print off the membership list of their clubs and distribute them accordingly. Also, the audit has been completed.



DAVE'S CALLER TALK Dave and Bonnie Harry

Hi! Let me start by introducing us. Bonnie is the brains in this family, and I am the dreamer. Bonnie and I started Petticoat Junction over 30 years ago and she has turned it into one of the largest dance shops in the U.S. I have been calling for 59 years, and I've been a full-time teacher/caller for over 40 years now. Normally, without a pandemic, I teach 1-to-2 week square dance class sessions in 20 Schools in 10 different school districts, and also spend my evenings teaching Mainstream for the Happy Hoppers, Skagit Squares, and the Whirlybirds. Yes that makes us Busy, and...Old!

We have two subjects this month. First a question: Is the Social Square Dance Program (SSD) right for Washington? My feeling is no. It might work for areas that have little or no Mainstream (MS) dancing, but in our state MS is strong. (I think we have 3-4 MS clubs for every Plus club here). The SSD program has 50 movements in it, so yes, it can be taught it in less time than MS, but then where are the students going to dance? The sponsoring club is either going to have to change its dance program to SSD or add another night of dancing for their new members. If your club is the only one in your council that adopts this program, then your new dancers can only dance at your club. If your whole council adopts it, the new dancer can still only dance in your area. They can't go to a MS dance or festival because they haven't been taught most of the MS movements, and they can't go to a Basic 1 or Basic 2 dance because they don't know all of the movements on these lists either. So, I would say Washington State is better off teaching the whole MS program with stop-off points at Basic 1, and Basic 2. The promoters of SSD say that this should be a destination program, meaning that dancers shouldn't be enticed into the next program until they are ready, but Basic 1, 2, MS, and even our First Friday Fun Fest (a no experience necessary dance) are destination dances, provided your area has a regularly scheduled dance for your students enrolled in these programs. Olympia area already has a successful Basic program, and before the pandemic Mount Baker Council had started one and was having some success with it.

Second: At the National convention I sat in on an interesting Blast Class seminar presented by Dan Preedy from Spokane, and it gave me an idea; thanks Dan! First, to explain, a Blast class is an accelerated teach of a square dance program. Dan is teaching the MS program in a shortened period of time, hoping to entice 40- and 50-year-olds into his class. Years ago, Scott Byers and some central California callers were teaching the MS program over two or three weekends. So, here is what I just proposed to our Whirlybird Club: We are going to take the first Friday weekend in November and hold our regular First Friday Fun Fest dance where we will teach about 15 movements, then Saturday morning, hold a 2-to-2.5 hour class, take a lunch break, then hold an afternoon class, take a dinner break, then hold a progressive evening dance. Sunday afternoon hold another class, take a dinner break, then finish the weekend with another progressive dance. By the end of Sunday evening hopefully we will have completed the Basic 1 list. We will then invite these new dancers to our regular club dance the following weekend and dedicate the first half of the dance to the Basic 1 program. These new dancers now have the option to join any club's regular lessons in session, or just dance at the First Friday Fun Fest, or dance at Basic 1 dances. If this works, we may have another way to entice new prospective dancers into our dance community.

Next month I will revisit the topic of lesson plans and their importance in teaching a successful set of lessons. Until next month, "Safe and happy dancing to you!"

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM THE CAVNESS CORNER

t was 10 years ago at a club Northwest of the Twin Cities **⊥** in Minnesota where we restarted this crazy journey of dance. Other cuers and teachers can, I am sure, relate to that first moment when you are standing on a stage looking out over a group of eager dancers. It is in a word, terrifying. It had been 20 years since I had cued and that was just to kids. I had never lost my stage fright in those days. Here I was, now in 2011 not only cueing for the first time but introduced as the new Club Cuers for County Line Squares in Monticello, MN. Boy were they brave - we hadn't even tried out! There were ten couples on the floor and at least fifty other people watching. (This club typically hosted six squares). One round - we survived - and back down to the floor. I havesa a feeling no one in the hall that night understood what a momentous milestone that was for Wendy and I! In fact, we didn't even understand at that time what this meant and where this journey would take us.

Back up a few years. In 1989, my Sister and I were teaching kids to round dance. We would teach the Phase II basics, then coach them through the annual Pacific Northwest Teen Festival. A pretty young lady named Wendy soon joined the class. A few weeks into those lessons, I came to find myself dancing with her with some regularity. Eventually we married. As newlyweds, we immediately moved to Minnesota and got busy learning life and raising kids. Fast forward to 2010 I told Wendy that I would like to start dancing again. She agreed (twist her arm) and promptly found us a local Square Dance club to visit.

Fast forward two years and we found ourselves moving back to our home state of Washington. It soon became apparent that we wanted to do more with our round dancing than just dance. The Paws and Taws in Bremerton took a chance on us and hired us to be their club cuers and teachers. Believing that we needed to continue to progress with our own dancing in order to feel qualified as teachers, we started hunting for mentors and instructors. We took lessons from Debbie and Paul Taylor, Randy and Marie Preskitt and Jim and Bobbie Childers. We feel so lucky to have worked with all of these amazing people – in addition to other mentors such as Randy and Rose Wulf, and Ron and Georgine Woolcock who at times took us under their wing.

We began writing choreography – mainly to help out our own dancers and students. Boy were we surprised when the Round of The Month certificates began to arrive in our mailbox! We have been fortunate to have been recognized repeatedly by different State Round Dance organizations and Roundalab for the dances we have written.

So here we are again starting a new adventure as your Washington State Round Dance Coordinators. In that role we stand on the shoulders, or maybe in the shadow of those coming before us. Giants who we feel unworthy to compare ourselves with. People who have been dancing, teaching and cueing successfully for many, many years and have made such a difference in our community of dancers. One of the greatest time savers of all is the rolled hem foot or narrow hemmer. It forms and stitches a perfectly turned hem without basting or pressing. With this foot, many yards of ruffle can be finished very quickly. A metal scroll forms two fine folds of the raw edge and stitches the hem with only a gentle control of the fabric as it enters the scroll. As with any other technique or new tool some practice is required.



Originally, when a very narrow rolled hem was wanted the instructions were to fold the hem up one-eighth inch and stitch down the middle of the fold. Then fold the edge up again and stitch again. This took a lot of time and very careful control of the fabric. The rolled hem foot is the household version of a foot that is used constantly in industrial stitching. They are available in a variety of widths and are available for all machines.

For the cottons, poly-cottons and broadcloths used in square dance dresses, I suggest the 4 mm or 5 mm foot. Smaller feet are for finer fabrics like chiffon. The picture of the top of the feet shows the size of the scroll. The bottom view shows the groves in the bottom and the width of the final fold.

The set of four Greist

feet was standard with sewing machines years ago and will still work on my newest machine. Sizes are one-quarter, one-half, three-quarters and one inch.





To start the rolled hem on a corner, you will need a needle with about twelve inches of thread. Make a quarter inch double fold in the end of the fabric and finger press it very hard. Take a small stitch through the end of the fold. This is the handle to control the start of the roll.

Work the edge of the cloth into the scroll and pull it forward until the end of the fabric is under the needle. Holding the handle threads and the machine threads, start stitching.

If you want to start in the middle of an edge, make a quarter inch double fold and pin it. Put the pinned section behind the foot, work the fabric into the scroll and pull forward until the pin is just under the back of the foot.





Keeping the right hand just

in front of the foot, guide the fabric into the scroll. Keep the edge all the way to the left side of the scroll and the fold of the fabric wide enough to fill the scroll on the right. If a raw edge appears the material has been fed into the hemmer too sparingly. If a bulky misshapen edge results, there is too much fabric in the roll.

To give the edge some extra bounce and flare insert some fishing line. Include it in the folds when the roll is first started and guide it in the back of the fold with your thumb. Use 15 or 20 # line, get the inexpensive stuff, it is bouncier than the pricey kind.

To cross a seam - Make sure the end of the seam has been back stitched to the very edge. Cut the seam allowances to a sharp (45 degree) point. Press the seam open. A small tug may be required to help the seam feet through the scroll. To hem a bias edge - Straight stitch about a quarter inch from the edge. Being very careful not to stretch it. Trim close to the stitching before hemming.


Lengthen the stitch to 3.5 or 4 mm. There is no stress on this seam. A longer stitch will sew faster and be less likely to shrink and pucker. If the foot has wide needle opening, as shown in the new feet, a zig zag or decorative stitch can be used. If the foot has a single needle opening, like the Greist feet, only a straight stitch can be used. Decreasing the thread tension by one number will also reduce puckering.

Learning to use all of the different feet allows the stitcher to accomplish interesting effects in less time and most importantly, with less stress. Stitching should be your happy, relaxing and creative time.

Last month I attended the 50th Annual Dancerama put on by Single Square Dancers USA. The dance was a huge success, with an impressive number of dancers arriving, mostly from the East Coast and Mid- Eastern states. Although there were less than 200 registered dancers, many waited until the last minute and joined me and Grandson Caleb in registering after we arrived in Des Moines, Iowa. The reason for our delay was simply that with so many venues cancelling, and the recent mandates in place, we didn't want to have to take a chance on not being able to attend because we might test positive for Covid, or take a chance the event would be cancelled at the last minute.

This was the last Dancerama. The executive board decided three years ago that with the inability to recruit volunteers, the aging of the worker bees, and the dwindling of dancers, it was time to say goodbye to an era. Because of last year's Covid restrictions, the event was cancelled and rescheduled to this past Labor Day

Although the focus of the advertising was aimed at solo dancers, I observed that an equal number of married and partnered couples showed, which seemed to outnumber the solos. Like most festivals over the summer months, dancers quickly paired, leaving too many dancers without a partner as the weekend progressed. Had I not been blessed with my grandson's company, I fear I would have been side-lined for most of the Advanced dancing. There were a few that could dance either part, but this was not the place to be training. Dancing was challenging, fast-paced, and a whole lot of fun. The ones that could easily switch positions also tended to pair off for the weekend.

Most of the attendees came because of the lineup of exceptionally gifted callers. There were four callers: Jack Pladdys (OH), Tim Tyl (TX), Tom Davis (OH) Travis Cook (KY); and Bonnie Lawrence (IN), Carolyn Ahart (MO) cuing. While these talented entertainers are not well-known on the West Coast, they are among the best of the best, and well worth the long drive to enjoy three days of solid dancing.

Although Winthrop has been cancelled for this year, we can look forward to the next Mid-Winter Festival January 28-30 in Albany, Oregon. Featured callers and cuers include Ray Gallagher, Brent Mawsdley, Andy Howard, and Randy and Marie Prescitt. Pre-registration prices for three days are \$45 for adults and \$25 for youth.

For those who like to plan ahead, I am told the WASCA (Washington Area Square Dancers Cooperative Association) will be the place to be March 17 – 19, 2022. Washington as in Washington D.C., not our fair State of Washington. Scheduled for three days of heavy dancing (Mainstream to Challenge and Phases II to IV) in Alexandria, Virginia; there is an impressive lineup of eight national callers and five national cuers, including our own Marie and Randy Prescitt. Pre-registration price is \$50, and youth is \$20. Hilton Hotel rooms are only \$119.

Most clubs in my area have scaled back from their usual calendar of events, waiting to see when the current uptick in Covid cases has dwindled to a "safe" level. In the meantime, help your club and council by coming to the new dancer classes and volunteering as an angel. Most of us will benefit from a reminder of basic skills and square dance protocol.



EVANSVILLE — If you need a break from dancing at the 71st National Square Dance Convention® but want to stay in the air- conditioned indoors, the city of Evansville has plenty of places to spend afew hours.

Evansville has plenty of museums if you find yourself in the mood to learn. The Evansville Museum of Arts, History & Science has more than 30,000 artifacts from all periods of history. The Koch Immersive Theater has a 360-degree digital projection featuring astronomy and science programming. The Evansville Museum Transportation Center concentrates on transportation from the 19th through the mid-20th centuries, including a three-car train and a model train diorama of the city. Evansville's Wartime Museum has airplanes, ships, tanks, and ammunitionmanufactured in Evansville during World War II, including a P-47.

Two historic homes may also be worth a visit. The Peters Margedant House was built by William Wesley Peters, first apprentice of Frank Lloyd Wright, and made USA Today's list of Top 25 buildings to see in Indiana. It's tiny, at 552 feet, but very influential in design. The Reitz Home Museum is a Victorian mansion with all the hallmarks of thatera. Lush furniture, silk walls, and hand-painted ceilings can be seen throughout.

The Eastland Mall is a 10-minute drive away with chain and unique shopsif you're in a shopping mood. More information about the convention is available at 71nsdc.org.



Sugar Cream Pie Filling

1 cup sugar ¼ cup flour or cornstarch

1/2 tsp. salt 2 cups whole milk or half & half

1 stick butter 1tsp. vanilla

Sprinkle top with nutmeg after baking

Melt the butter in a saucepan over medium heat. Whisk in the flour or cornstarch. Continue whisking for 2 minutes, letting the butter and flour form a paste. Then whisk in the milk or half & half, sugar, salt, and vanilla. Bring to a boil and cook for 7 minutes, whisking frequently as the mixture thickens. Strain the filling into the pie crust. Bake at 350° for 25 minutes. The top of the pie filling should be very lightly browned. Lightly sprinkle with nutmeg and bake for another 10 minutes.
