

Recognition has been given by both CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB to SPIKE REID: for 50 years of outstanding service to the square and round dance community, as both a square dance caller/teacher and a round dance cuer/teacher.

Raised in Illahee, now a part of Bremerton, Washington, Spike's parents were a caller/cuer team who were also very involved with many forms of traditional folk dancing. Their influence in Washington's early dance activity can be noted in the "Square and Folk Dance Federation of Washington". Spike's square dancing began in 1947, with his first calling experience on stage by 1949.

Time spent as a teen caller for the Levis and Laces teen club and a regional one-night-stand caller, changed from regularly to only occasionally when three years of active service with the Marine Corp began in 1957, ending in 1963 after his reserve service years. Spike became a roller skate competitor between 1963 and 1970, doing only occasional calling gigs. Competing in compulsory figures and dancing on roller skates culminated in 1970 at the US National Competition. 1970 also saw the end of his skate competition years and an active return to dance without skates. Round dance in its early memorized format between square dance tips had become more commonly expected during his absence and Spike included this in his activity as a caller/cuer.

Calling squares and prompting rounds between square dance tips was not a well organized or standardized activity at this time. Spike learned square dance calls for many years from other callers, including his parents, as well as publications by established callers. But learning the choreography of round dances to teach others was another matter; from 78speed records and pages of printed footprints, with dashed lines and arrows for directions.

CALLERLAB, an organization first established by a few pioneer callers, was just getting started in 1970, with membership by invitation and approval at meetings (later annual conventions). Round dance cuers/teachers followed in 1976 with ROUNDALAB, to promote teacher training and standardized dance step definitions.

By 1980, both square dancing and round dancing had begun developing some standardization, allowing a more universally accepted set of actions and instructions. Spike was recommended by three established members of CALLERLAB and applied for accreditation. On October 14, 1980, Spike received his Certificate of Accreditation as a "general caller". That accreditation acknowledged his ten years experience, starting in 1970, for calling "one night stands" and "round dancing". Spike became a member of ROUNDALAB on June 19, 1981, and his ten years or round dance experience established in his CALLERLAB accreditation was also accepted with his ROUNDALAB membership.

Membership in both CALLERLAB and ROUNDALAB provided opportunities to learn and share. Attending national conventions was a requirement for CALLERLAB. Both organizations included membership on committees to address definition standards, standardized teaching and dancing programs, as well as promotion of teaching qualifications, and were a part of his participation in these organizations.

Spike has remained a dedicated local caller/ teacher and cuer/teacher. He was the club caller for the Poulsbo Promenaders from 1975 until 1988. He became the club caller for the Rhody O's in Gardiner, WA. in 1988, and remains that club's caller today. He was the first and remains today the club caller for the 4PLUS4's plus club started in 1992 at the Gardiner Community Center. And he has been the only caller for the A-Team, a collection of Advance Program dancers in Gardiner and Bremerton (Gorst), WA. In addition to his club-caller duties, he has continued to be available as a one-night-stand caller throughout the region, and has organized a number of international square dance trips for his dancers, calling and cueing throughout those journeys.

For all of these many years, Spike has taught mainstream, plus, and advance program square dancing as well as phase II, III, IV round dancing nearly every year. He only teaches "all position" dancing because he says all dancing should be "by the definition". Anyone who has attending one of his workshops or dances knows both are always a learning experience!

Spike's efforts on behalf of the square and round dance community has also included important committee chair positions for the 1981 National Square Dance convention in Seattle, WA., the 1983 State Square Dance Festival in Bremerton, (Peninsula Council), and the 2000 State Square Dance Festival in Port Townsend (North Olympic Council). In 1983 he

received the Square and Folk Dance Federation of Washington's "Parker Award" for his outstanding teaching and promoting of square dancing. And in 2019, he received the "McNutt Award" for outstanding teaching and promoting of round dancing.

On April 7, 2020, "In Recognition of Outstanding Service to the Square Dance Activity", CALLERLAB certified Spike Reid as having "completed fifty years as a square dance caller" and awarded his membership in the "HALF CENTURY CLUB". On the 19th of June, 2021, The International Association of Round Dance Teachers, Inc. (ROUNDALAB) awarded a "certificate of recognition for teaching round dancing for 50 years". There are a others who can claim 50 years of teaching either squares or rounds. But it is a very special few who have taught both squares and rounds for 50 years, and counting!

Spike says he began his "serious years" as a dance entertainer and a teacher in 1970. So we will call it his additional twenty "training" years which began as a tenyear-old caller in 1949. Many hundreds of square and round dancers have benefitted from his more-than-seventy years of "training" and "serious" teaching and entertaining, and dancers continue to benefit from his gifts today. Although it is hardly enough, we wish Spike the most heart felt "THANK YOU"!

Now that the Covid-19 restriction are past, it is the time for a belated but well deserved CELEBRATION; a free, 50/50 recognition dance with squares and rounds at the Gardiner Community Center (980 Old Gardiner Road, located about half way between Sequim and Port Townsend) on October 8, 2022. Doors will open at 6:30 to visit, with dancing to Spike, and any other attending callers and/or cuers, between 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. (at the dance levels that suit those who are up on the dance floor). Doors close at 9:30. Those who know Spike, have danced to Spike, taken lessons from Spike, or just wish to stop by to thank this member of our dance community who has given so much, are all welcome to attend.



### **Squarely Speaking**

**T**t is an honor to be back writing this column for ▲ Footnotes again. It was 8 years ago that we wrote our last column and much has changed since then. Square Dancing has dramatically been modified and may never get back to "the way it was". The most significant change was COVID. This pandemic has caused dances, lessons, and festivals to be cancelled and more important than that, it caused dancers to leave the activity and some clubs to fold completely. People are asking "what can we do to bring dancing back?" We would like to take this opportunity to discuss one option that we know for certain is working. This is the story of 3 clubs and 2 callers who decided that we needed to make a change if we are to survive. This meant putting aside club politics and required clubs and callers to work together.

In the summer of 2021, with input from the club presidents for the Swingnuts, Bonney Lads 'n' Lassies and The Spinners, along with Greg Weber and myself, it was decided that we would teach the Callerlab SSD program. Don't start to panic just yet. We will eventually get to the Mainstream program, but with a little deviation along the way.

First, we agreed, that as recommended by Callerlab, we keep the positioning to standard. You may be wondering why. Let's talk about that. Dancing had been fairly stagnant for two years. Club dancers had not been to a dance since 2019. So, with that in mind, we decided that simple and slower would be better. Another reason for this course of action was that we needed to get new students involved as soon as possible. Everyone wanted to have the best opportunity for their clubs to survive, so we all recognized change was essential.

Once our proposal was developed, we (the callers and presidents) discussed the plan with the club members. They too were supportive of this program

and so off we went.

How does this combined SSD program work?

It began with open discussions among the club presidents and callers. Once the plan was formulated, it was presented to the club memberships for their input. We explained that our lessons would be held on the following days.

Sunday – The Bonney Lads 'n' Lassies at Collins Grange

Tuesday – The Spinners at the Buckley Hall

Thursday – The Swingnuts at the Valley Square Dance Center.

Students were encouraged to attend as many classes as they could. Each lesson was the same cost, so the financial burden on the club was nullified.

The Lesson Plan was the same from week to week at each club. There are multiple benefits to this. The first was that the same series of calls taught on Sunday, were taught in the Tuesday and Thursday classes. This way, if a student knew they were going to miss a class, they could attend one on a different day that week to catch up. Another benefit was if a student chose to attend the additional classes (and many did), they got more practice and became stronger dances. It also gave those that attended multiple classes the opportunity to meet additional dancers and students who could only attend at one location. Another effort that we tried hard to achieve was that every lesson was treated like a party. Fun was emphasized. Also, the clubs involved agreed that we would all refrain from recruiting until the new dancers had graduated.

A side benefit was that the clubs began working closer together and we all recognized this was better for Square Dancing in general.

The lesson period took 15 weeks from start to finish on the first series. Once this was done, the 2nd series of lessons began. The only change to the program, was to shorten the initial 2 hours of SSD

teach by 30 minutes. This was done so we could use that time to teach the remaining calls on the Callerlab Mainstream Program to the first group. Once again, we did not focus on anything other than standard positioning.

The end results were that each club got new members and some of the new dancers joined multiple clubs. Even if they didn't join a particular club, they still came out and supported them at the dances.

We have begun the same program for the 2022-2023 dance season and as it has been so successful, we are being joined by The Young Bunch, the local teen and pre-teen club.

This kind of effort requires callers and clubs alike to think outside the box and fosters cooperation. It will take all of us to save our beloved activity. If we don't make changes appropriate to the times, there is a risk of becoming extinct, like some of the other activities affected by COVID.

We suggest you take the opportunity to discuss this approach to lessons with your local clubs and see if it might be an option for you.

### Teaching Jewel

When teaching Scootback it is a good idea to review turn thru and left turn thru first. It has been our experience that doing so will make the Scootback teach easier.

### POINT TO PERFECTION

### Point to Perfection

Pins - Those are the most basic of sewing items. A point on one end and a knob on the other. Nothing to worry about - right?

The first part that can go wrong is the point. Is it dull or hooked? How old is that pin, and was it well made in the first place? That pin has been rattling around in your sewing stuff for how long? It has been used and dropped, how many times? Due to new technology, today's pins are much sharper and stronger than those hand-me-downs from your grandmother. A pin that snags the fabric instead of piercing cleanly can leave a permanent flaw in the garment if the pin doesn't slide in and out smoothly - trash it.

Consider the head of the pin. Metal and glass-headed pins can be ironed over. Glass ones are easier to find and grasp than those with regular heads. Large plastic heads in different colors can be used to mark special areas. There are even pins with numbers and letters to help quilters keep track of the rows.

The shaft of the pin is equally important. I purchased a box of red glass pins, because I liked the color. They felt rough when passing through the fabric. The shafts had not been properly polished into the crafting stuff with them. The size of the shaft is also important. Use finer pins on finer fabrics.

I tried to make a chart of pin sizes and types, but it quickly become confusing. Even in one brand, pins with the same length and diameter have several names. Different manufacturers use different standards.

The pins I use are blue glass Dritz Ultra Fine and white glass Dritz Extra Fine. They both have size 22 on the package, but the blues are finer than the whites. The blues are used on finely woven fabrics, laces, and microfibers. The whites are for basic cotton and wool.

I also have, Quilters pins (size 24) with big yellow plastic heads. They are for working with knits or heavier fabric. The big heads keep them

from sliding into the loosely woven fabric, and high visibility makes them great for serging.

Ball point pins are for working with knits. The rounded tip slips between the yarns and doesn't snag and pull. These types of the fabric also need a ballpoint machine needle. Appliqué pins are only half an inch long. They just need to hold the edge of the project until sewn. Fork pins are 'U' shaped, so it is as if you were using two pins simultaneously. They can tame the slinkiest fabrics. Finer sizes for fine fabric and thicker ones for upholstery.

Keep different pins separate. Colored heads make separating easier. Mechanic's parts trays work well for this. They have much stronger magnets on the back than the pin dishes in the sewing store. Just toss the pin at the dish. Trays will magnet to the ironing board and not slide off. Run the bottom of the tray across the carpet and pick up all the dropped pins. Trays come in a variety of sizes, shapes, and colors.

Take all of your old pins and put them in your craft supplies. Purchase a variety of clean new pins. Select different styles for the types of sewing you prefer. The fabric and your hands will thank you. With all of the money, you put into the pattern and fabric, with all of the time you put into the planning and layout. This is not the time to use cheap, old, rough, dull pins. Quality is evident, even in the smallest part of the creative process.


