

#### **DID YOU KNOW...?**

#### Did You Know...?

...there are usually:

- "Two sides" (at least) "to every story".
- "Two ways" (at least) "to look at things".
- Differing opinions regarding "what's the best solution" to just about any problem, challenge or issue.
- ?? (The list goes on...I'm sure you've heard them all at one time or another!)

The current "issue" (topic) that is front and center in the square dance world is that of "SSD" (Social Square Dancing). Perhaps you've heard of it...if you haven't, I encourage you to fully-familiarize yourself with what it's all about –and sooner rather than later!

To be fair, there are strong (some <u>extremely</u> strong) opinions, both "pro" and "con", being blasted all over social media (Facebook in particular). Frankly, I'm concerned that some influential individuals (callers especially) are so rigid in their viewpoints that the chasm between extremely public pro vs con positions is more harmful than helpful to those of us who are hobbyists who just love to square dance. This is not a call for restricting "free speech" against either side but social media, even with comments that are presented casually, has a way of amplifying honest, but differing, opinions to an unhealthy level.

There is not the slightest doubt in my mind that <u>everyone</u> actively involved (callers, dancers, even cuers and dance venue managers) wants to see square dancing flourish and grow. There is also not the slightest doubt in my mind that well-meaning efforts to "flip the script" over the past couple of decades (at least) have failed to reverse the declining trend in the number of dancers in our activity.

With few exceptions, by and large, what we HAVE BEEN doing HASN'T WORKED! Clearly, simply "staying the course" (repeating season after season using the same approach to recruit, train, and retain dancers) is a LOSING PROPOSITION!

In my September article, I pointed out that ONE club (the Harbor Haylofters) has become the first club in WA state to embrace the "concept" of SSD and officially adopt it as the club's "dance level". Time will tell if I will have to "eat my words" at some point in the future. I believe it's time for the naysayers among us to give SSD a chance without trying to kill it in it's infancy (like the old adage "don't throw the baby out with the bath water"). Please save the "I told you so's" for an intellectual celebration later-on (IF it ever comes to that)!

I am fairly confident that, like it (for some) or not (for others), SSD is here to stay, if not as the fully-accepted "destination" being supported by <u>some</u> of the most widely-known and respected callers in the nation, at least as a "stepping-stone" without the tripping hazard some are predicting.

In the meantime, celebrate the fact that "hybrid" SSD-to-Mainstream lesson plans have been adopted in two WA state councils (Rainier, Peninsula) and <u>at least</u> three councils---Rainier, Peninsula, and Mt. Baker (that I'm aware of...and there may be more) are coordinating across multiple clubs to start their lessons in the same week with the same lesson plan so new dancers can exercise scheduling flexibility to ensure they don't miss a lesson.

It's just MY opinion. But feel free to share your thoughts (pro or con).





Students are covered by our insurance while they are going through lessons. Upon graduation, the student is covered for 10 more days. At that time, the student must join a club to continue to be covered by insurance. If they do not join a club within the 10-day period, they will no longer be covered after lessons. A new graduate joining your club would be handled the same as any person joining the club, send us their name, address, and telephone number. A club may add new members during the dance year by simply sending us the new person's name, address and their telephone number.

Let me start my first article with a short introduction of who we are. I am Glenn Raiha and my wife is Nancy. We have lived in Lacey Washington since 1994. Nancy and I both served in the U.S. Army for twenty-two and a half years. We are both retired.

Nancy and I met in1975 and were married in the Summer of 1976. Soon after that we started our long journey in the square dance activity. Soon after graduating from Mainstream class, I was asked by our caller (who was also our military chaplain) if I would be interested in learning to call. I said no several times until our caller insisted because he was being reassigned to Korea in 6 months and someone needed to be the caller for our military club. After a one-week caller's school with Cal Golden and several one-on-one sessions with our caller I taught my first class in the Fall of 1977. Little did I know at that time that I would totally enjoy being a caller. As I continued calling, I realized that the most satisfying part of calling was teaching people how to dance. To this day teaching people how to dance is what I like the most.

After several years of military moves to such Army "garden spots" like Fort Sill OK and Fort Campbell KY, Nancy and I spent four wonderful years in Germany before moving back to Washington to finish our careers. Lac-A-Do Hall in Olympia became our new square dance home and I called for the Do-Si-Dos and Grand Squares as well as taking a few out-of-town dates from time to time. Somewhere around 2011-2012 we experienced what most clubs were experiencing, the downturn of square dancing and difficulty recruiting new students. Jim Hattrick was calling for the Do-Si-Dos and had developed a new ten-week program with new classes starting every four weeks. Jim suggested that the clubs who danced at Lac-A-Do hall do combined lessons using his program. I said it would not work but reluctantly gave it a try with the understanding that I would give it three years to succeed or fail. The program relies on major marketing and publicity efforts

and Nancy stepped forward to take over those duties. After the first three years we started to reap the benefits of all our hard work as our class attendance grew and we danced 8-10 squares on each lesson night. I am very proud of our results. Even though he is no longer with us I would like to thank Jim for his assistance in making his program work for us. If you would like to know more about this program Nancy will be the guest speaker at the combined 2024 Leadership and Square Dance Festival to be held in Yakima on July 11-13. Don't miss this great opportunity to see another alternative for growing your club.

Nancy and I feel very blessed to be involved in the square dance activities in Washington State. We have met so many great people, some of whom are our very close friends. In the coming months I hope to share some of my thoughts about our square dance activity in Washington as well as providing some different ideas about how to make your clubs more successful. I am always open to new ideas and new things to try so feel free to reach out to me at graiha@comcast.net with your comments/questions.

I hope all your clubs have a successful start to your Fall lessons!

#### WALMART FABRIC

Walmart fabric is perfect for making test garments. Before you cut into the good stuff, make a try-it-on garment from inexpensive fabric. I know - You want to buy a pattern, cut it out of good fabric, sew it up, and wear it tomorrow. That isn't going to happen. You need to test the pattern.

A friend came into the sewing shop with a pattern for a T-shirt with some gathering details on the shoulder and the side. It looked great in the picture. There were four of us in the shop—all experienced stitchers. We could not make that pattern work. We read every word of the instructions and cut it out twice. The pattern and the fabric were trashed.

Sandra Betzina, who designs patterns for Vogue, says one in four patterns is s'dog.' Sewing is very frustrating when you do everything right and it comes out wrong. I purchased two blouse patterns from the same designer and same pattern company. One fit perfectly, and the other was a total loss.

Second-hand stores are a source of practice fabric. Sheets provide a lot of fabric for the price. Sometimes, there are great fabric finds. I made a long skirt from a shower curtain and a jacket from a window curtain.

Use the same techniques when making practice garments as you do on good stuff. Read the instructions carefully and follow each step. As an experienced stitcher, you have your shortcuts and tricks. Use the pattern instructions first to understand the sequence. Finish the test garment to ensure that all parts fit correctly. Putting the garment on may change your idea about the style.

THE SPANISH STEPS
ITALIANS CALL THIS FOUNTAIN
"THE UGLY BOAT"

Set your stitch length to 5 mm and use those halfempty bobbins and almost-gone spools. The long stitches will make the sewing faster and easier to take out. Using up the bobbins will clear them for your next actual garment.


Your body is perfect - the pattern is wrong. Once you determine where your unique body differs from the mythological average, you can make some changes before cutting the test piece. Garment sewing is a skill, like other skills, that requires practice and problemsolving. It also provides great satisfaction when you get exactly the garment you were thinking of. That fits perfectly, just your color, and is one-of-a-kind. Set your stitch length to 5 mm and use those half-empty bobbins and almost-gone spools. The long stitches will make the sewing faster and easier to take out. Using up the bobbins will clear them for your next actual garment.







Thank you for registering for the 73rd National Square Dance Convention® being held in Milwaukee, WI. June 26-29, 2024.

Our published rates for camping were based on a verbal agreement with the Wisconsin State Fairgrounds RV Park. As we proceeded towards signing a formal contract, the park unexpectedly raised the rates by a significant amount resulting in a cost to our campers of more than \$100 per night. This is about 30 percent higher than the rates already published for those same dates in 2024 on their website, and for which they are actively accepting reservations. They refused to consider any lower nightly pricing for our group.

This was incredibly disappointing to us and was a dramatic change in their position from our earlier discussions. We do not believe our campers should have to pay that marked-up price. We also do not believe you would be satisfied with such a premium over their already-premium nightly rates.

After lengthy discussions with our camping staff, our convention leaders, and the National Executive Committee, we feel it is in everyone's best interest for the 73rd National Square Dance Convention® to *not* offer a group rate for RV camping. Instead, we will provide you with a list of campgrounds in the general vicinity and ask you to select your preferred location and make your own private reservations. We will also be unable to offer bus transportation to and from the original camping site.

We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused. Any camping deposit you have already made through our convention registration process will be refunded to you within the next few weeks.

As an alternative to camping, we have two convention hotels which are connected by skywalks to the Baird Center, formerly known as the Wisconsin Center, where the convention will be held. Our host hotel, the Hilton Milwaukee City Center, offers \$5.00 per day parking with in and out privileges included. The hotel rate for both of our hotels, Hilton and Hyatt Regency Milwaukee, is \$169 per night, based on double occupancy, plus applicable taxes and fees.

For a Great Convention, in a Great City, on a Great Lake, we look forward to welcoming you to Milwaukee, WI, on June 26-29, 2024.
