September 21, 2019 Federation Meeting Summary of the Minutes by Judy Ottoson - Recording Secretary

September 21, 2019 Federation Meeting: Margaret Kiser called the meeting to order; Tom Rohde gave the Treasurer's report; Judy Ottoson read motions from the May State Meeting.

Reports were sent for computing/WebMaster Dick Beham, Letricia Hatch gave an informative report on the Facebook page, reminding dancers that "likes", etc. reaching over 10,000 people.

Education & Leadership Seminar is offering a complimentary fee registration for a first-time attendee/dancer from each Council. Although registration needs to be increased to \$20 per attendee (due to increased rent of the facilities/campground), the increase won't take effect until 2021.

Festivals: Rainier Rendezvous announced over 1,000 in attendance, including dancers, guests and entertainers. They were able to repay the "seed money" from the Federation, and still have some to share between Rainier Council and the Federation. Congratulations on a job well done!

2021 Mt. Baker Council (reported that their colors will be royal blue and white. Their advisors are George & Sharon Broom, and a possible venue is Eastside Four Square Church in Kirkland. Spokane Area Council reported that the venue has been selected for the 2022 Festival – Northern Quest Resort. Mike Bramlett (Texas) will be caller and John Downing (California – previously Spokane) will cue.

Heritage Center committee members are making changes/improvements (including more glass doors) to the space – to make it more interesting and display more items. Historian, Donna Rohde sent three years of her "scrapbooks" for dancers to view; she sent the 2016-17 book to Spokane for the Heritage Center.

Membership & Insurance reminded clubs to send their list of students for lessons, along with address and telephone numbers. After graduation, they can join the club (\$6.00 each membership fee). We have lost three clubs this year and gained one. Motions to accept two clubs were approved later: Sweet Heart Rounds (Peninsula Council) and A Blast Club (Mt. Baker Council).

Alert: Kay Mahan reported that a letter from "501(c)(3) Center Inc." is bogus; do NOT open it.

Cynda Clark (Footnotes On-Line) is adding a new feature "find me". The individuals who correctly tell her where they located it will be in a drawing to receive a paid registration to an upcoming Festival. The "find me" feature will change in each edition.

Roger Barnes reported that XP's signed a card for Burley Mott at the passing of her husband Pete (Federation President in 1981-82).

Bruce Ottoson offered Seminar registration forms for each Council.

Don & Cheryl Pruitt gave information on the 2020 National Square Dance Convention in Spokane, and invited all dancers to register. There will be a great variety of tours available, Fashion Show with Youth (contact kathy@4roberts.us or (503)887-6017 if your club has a youth who would like to participate. There are plenty of RV parking sites available at the Fairgrounds, and there will be an Alaska cruise following the Convention. Opening will be on the Floating Stage. The 2021 NSDC will be in Jackson, Mississippi. The Program Book editor is offering a one-line listing of names who support the 2020 Convention with \$1.00.

September's Round of the Month is Codigo, a two-step choreographed by Ron & Georgine Woolcock. The ten Councils represented at the meeting gave reports of the area's activities.

Roger Barnes gave updates to the By-Laws and Standing Rules of the Federation.

Steve Hatch proposed a Privacy Policy based on concerns of ID theft, which was discussed and voted to implement.

The current officers were re-installed for New Business.

Bob & Linda Berka's report was read; they look forward to selecting Rounds of the Month this year.

Cynda Clark requested that she only be required to print one copy of the Footnotes, since toner for the various colors are expensive. Motion approved that

she only need to print one copy for the Heritage Center archives. Since Kay Mahan is going off the committee, the signers on bank account will be updated in the near future to include Cynda, Tom Rohde and Judy Ottoson as signers.

Upon deliberation, the next two State meeting locations were determined: Spokane Area Council (at Western Dance Center) January 25, 2020 and Sou'Wester Council on May 16, 2020 (location tbd).

Feel free to contact Lonnie Graff or check the Facebook page for pictures taken at Festival and Leadership weekends, as well as Mount Baker Council.

Bruce Ottoson announced that Hunter Keller will be calling for the Wild Rose Ramblers dance on October 5, if you're in the area.

Coffee and cookies were available for a (late) celebration of Tom Tomlinson's birthday.



Buddy has been active in the square dance recording industry since 1981, with over 300 vocals released. He is producer of the largest square dance music company in the world, Blue Star Music. Buddy Weaver created the "Music For Callers" web site, which serves as the primary music search tool for callers today and contributes a monthly music review column along with an article on making square dancing better for the dancers. His articles appear in the American Square Dance magazine and elseswhere on line.

He has called numerous times in Japan, Denmark, Sweden, Holland, Germany and most United States. Buddy is the first American caller to teach and call in postcold war Poland and the first American caller brought to both Tasmania, Australia and Takagawa, Japan for a square dance festival

Welcome to the November 2019 Footnotes Square Dance page. Thanks to all that read and enjoyed our Footnotes October article. Leslie and I, wish you and all your families the very best in the upcoming Thanksgiving Holiday.

This month we address the use of "demos" at your Lessons. Encourage your Instructor to use demos, they work.

At last year's National Convention there were 3 New Dancer Retention panels and what was amazing that surveys of those in attendance showed that only about 15% of class callers walk a call before showing it to their students.

The reason I am amazed is that it has long been recognized that 60% of people learn best visually and only 33% learn best via listening (auditory). The remaining 7% learn best by either doing the action or by reading. These percentages apply to the learning of anything have been known to educators, teachers, and psychologists for decades.

So if the survey of the 165 people at these 3 panels is correct, "The vast majority of callers are ignoring the predominant learning style of the majority of people they are trying to teach." This is incredible!

Most callers tell the dancers the name of the call they are going to learn, then walk them through it by giving directional commands. This covers the auditory learners. Now the call is danced, which takes care of the kinesthetic people. Since most learners are given a pamphlet with the written definitions, this covers the readers. What about the 60% who learn best visually?

They are ignored and are expected to try and learn the calls via a learning method which is more difficult for them. It is true that they may eventually succeed, but it probably takes them longer to fully grasp the calls, and thus their learning experience is not as enjoyable as it could be. For years the complaint has been that beginner classes take too long, and the blame has been placed on the number of calls that must be taught. Could it be that classes take a long time because the majority of people are being taught in a learning style that is not the best for them?

If everyone was taught in the learning style best for them, is it likely that everyone would grasp the calls faster, and thus the number of lessons could be reduced? Quite possibly.

The solution. Before a call is taught, have a square of angels walk it. This gives the visual people, who make up most of any learning group, an overall concept of what the call does. If you don't have angels, use checkers on top of a table. Now go ahead and put the people in a square, give verbal directions and then dance it. When the practice of the call is finished, have the angels walk the call again.

This will reinforce the visual learners and will also likely be of help to some of the other learners. Remember: A picture is worth a thousand words.

Be sure and DEMONSTRATE every call before you teach it and then again after it has been practiced. Obviously, you do not have to do this with the very beginning calls such as Circle Left and Right & Left Grand. But Left Allemande would be good to demonstrate since this gives some people problems.

If you are a club officer and your class teacher is not demonstrating calls before teaching them, consider asking the teacher to do so or at least show them this article. The bottom line is that a group will learn faster and better if calls are demonstrated before they are taught.

More success from your Students will keep them coming back each week.

ROUNDS FOR YOU

Well.....

A Question:

I am a cuer and have been for several years. My income has just been significantly reduced. I cannot continue to pay for my music license. Would the council consider paying for my license so that I may continue cueing?

Answer and suggestion...in our opinion: Yes, the council could purchase your license outright (possibly, as a loan). If you are receiving money for cueing—you could repay the advance thus allowing your continuation to cue.

Another idea---a donor (no reimbursement). However, you still must purchase music. Now, the decision: If you decide to not purchase anymore music and only use music you already have...the result will be "behind" and your program will not be beneficial to visiting clubs. The ROM will not be exposed or danced at all.

Legally, you as a cuer must be licensed to be able to play music. Please review Roundalab's information on "Performance Licensing". All clubs need to review this legal matter. If your cuer or caller, each as an individual unit, is not licensed, you may be subject to \$120,000.00 per piece of music that is played at your dance. Every cuer should have a card and every contract should ask if licensed.

Thought: In our opinion, this matter should not be a Council obligation at all—club matter only!

THE RULE:....NOT LICENSED?.....NOT LEGAL!

(incidentally....we're licensed!!)

Think about a white garment carefully before purchasing the fabric. Almost any white fabric, used in a garment, is slightly transparent. Absence of color allows light to pass. Consider underlining the bodice and leaving the sleeves unlined. Layer a piece of underlining and the fashion fabric over your hand and hold it up to the light to see how they work together. The underlining can change the color of the fashion fabric. There are many shades of white. The fiber content, processing treatment and weave pattern all affect the color. Thread spools come in different shades of white, from cream to taupe to blue white. Crystal monofilament thread can be a good choice for white fabric.

If you are planning to make a white garment or alter one, there are several steps to take before starting to sew. White fabric can pick up stains and lint from a lot of sources. It can start in the fabric store with shop soiling, lint on the cutting table and the car seat on the way home.

Before washing and drying any white fabric consider what was washed last. If it was camping clothes, run a load of towels or something before the white fabric is washed. While the washer and dryer are running, prepare the sewing space. You were planning to clean your sewing room anyhow, so now is the time.

Clean and oil the sewing machine and serger. Colored lint from the machine can be picked up in the seams of the white garment. Oil according to the instruction manual. Then take the machines outside and treat them to an air compressor blast. With white thread sew several yards of thread on scrap white fabric. Check for oil spots and lint. Spray cleaner on a rag, not the machine, and wipe the outside of the machine.

Clean the soleplate of the iron. Ceramic cooktop cleaner is great for this job. Squirt a little on a paper towel and scrub the gunk off a cold iron. Rinse completely and iron on scraps of white fabric before touching the new stuff. Put a clean ironing board cover on. This is the voice of experience speaking - I ironed a red stain on to a white shirt by ironing the shirt on the same ironing board cover used for a red project. Make several covers from second hand store sheets and change them frequently.

Wipe all surfaces with a damp cloth. The cutting board, the sewing machine table and any other flat surface that collects dust and lint. While cleaning put away all colored projects in clear bags. Keep a clean bag handy and put all white fabric pieces in it when they are not actually being sewn. Have a garment bag or clean piece of fabric to drape over the garment when it is on a hanger. Make sure the hanger is clean.

Vacuum the floor and spread a large old sheet under the ironing board. If your fabric should touch the floor it will stay clean. This seems like a lot of work to prepare the sewing space, but it will reduce the chance of spoiling the project and a good cleaning never hurts. Before taking the white fabric out of the dryer, wash your hands and don't use had lotion. Do not let any cosmetics touch the white fabric.

Mark white fabric with white chalk or other white markers. The marks will be hard to see but they will not stain the fabric. Some of the disappearing inks can be removed from white fabric depending on the

type of fiber and the finishing process. Always test on scraps before using a marker on any fabric. Little bits of painter's tape can be used and they will lift right off the fabric.

Washing by hand is the best way to treat white garments. This prevents them from picking up dye and lint from other items. Use chlorine bleach sparingly, because it can weaken fibers. Before putting a white garment away for the winter be sure to wash it throughly. Even if stains are not apparent they may develop over time while in storage. Do not store in air tight bags for long periods. Garments should be on padded hangers with space between them to prevent permanent wrinkles.

Very few people can wear true white. Most complexions look better with cream or beige white. Consider adding a bright scarf or other accent to reduce the glare of pure white. All garments will wear out and white ones show their age faster than most others.

Your regular host of Solo Corner has asked me to share some of the things that are happening to promote the growth of square dancing.

I've been dancing for six years, and I've loved every minute of it! As fun and exciting as dancing is, it can be a major challenge at times to find reliable and updated information (not to offend, many clubs do an excellent job of keeping information current... others, not so much). This has been particularly evident in our state's biggest event, the Washington State Square and Folk-Dance Festival.

Every year, competent and dedicated committees are formed. The new committee starts with the prior year's festival committee report (or "lessons learned" report), and begin the process of creating their version of a great festival. Each team member contributes 110% of their skills and expertise as they visualize, design, and build from the groaund up, as they forge ahead into the world of large-scale event planning. At times, committee members may become overwhelmed and take a step back to consider why they signed up for this. The bottom line is that they do it because they love to dance.

What happens in the event marketing world is that not everyone has the resources (skilled webmasters or administrators) that they can tap into, to create a website or manage a Facebook page. In recent years, some committees have forgone social media, figuring that they survived before the internet, and would continue without it. The local clubs and Footnotes magazine were the primary source of advertisements and information. Since Footnotes went digital, the message has had less and less of a reach.

Most festival committees have recognized the need for a website and Facebook presence. Here are the website addresses in recent years:

As you can see, the domain names are not consistent. Each committee has had the freedom to be as creative. Having new blood and new ideas is a very good thing! However, having different websites to go to each year is not

The same is true of Facebook. Each year, the current committee starts a new page, starting with zero subscribers.

The 2016 festival Facebook page had a total of 150 subscribers, or people who "Liked" their page. In 2018 there were about 30; 2015, 2017 and 2018 have since closed their Facebook pages; and the 2019 festival currently has 246 subscribers.

THE IDEA – CONTINUITY

It made sense to my husband, Steve, and I that the website and the Facebook page for the festival should not change from one year to the next. We recommended to the Square and Folk Dance Federation of Washington that we have ONE festival Facebook page and ONE festival website. They supported the idea, and we began working.

THE SOLUTION; Facebook:

I asked the Rainier Rendezvous 2019 committee if I could become an administrator on their Facebook page and change the name to Washington State Square Dance Festival. They agreed, giving the next committee a 246 person/subscriber head start. Each year, the hosting council can appoint someone to be that festival's co-administrator, so the subscriber base can grow without starting over from zero. You can "Like" the "new" page at https://www.facebook.com/WAsdfestival/ if you haven't already done so.

THE WEBSITE:

I happen to be married to a talented techy, (Steve Hatch), who has a lot of experience in web technologies. With the goahead from the state federation, he purchased a domain, and will build out a permanent website. The administration can be transferred from year to year, while the overall administration of the root website will not change. The website will have online registration built in, which is by far the biggest challenge. Text and email services will also be available to any committee that wants to utilize them. Each committee will have full control over the look, feel and content of their festival.

WHAT NOW?

As you probably know by now, there will be no Washington State Square Dance Festival in 2020. Rather, the 69th National Square Dance Convention is coming to Spokane this June! At this very moment, Steve and I are working with the 69th National Convention, helping them to get online registration up and running, as well as helping with their Facebook page. As soon as online registration is working smoothly, I will be posting and sharing to raise awareness that it will be possible to register for Nationals wherever you are, just by reaching into your wallet and grabbing your credit card. I know this will bring a smile to many people's faces, including mine.
