DYK...that 35 of WA state's ~90 square dance clubs and councils are now posting events on the WheresTheDance.com website (aka "WTD")? Is your club or council among them? In other words, are your club's dances, workshops and classes posted on the site for the world to see?

With 35 active participants, the WA state club/council participation rate on the WTD website is now over 33% across the state (up from about 25% just a couple of months ago)! Collectively, approximately 285 events are posted over the 3-month period from November through January.

Once organizations finally begin to recognize the convenience* and benefits** posting on WTD offers to dancers (locally, statewide, regionally, and even nationally) there will be no turning back! [Author's note: the experience is similar to that of installing and using an automatic garage-door opener. After installing one for the first time, I began to wonder how I ever managed to get along without one. And, going forward, I cannot imagine ever again living in a home without one!]

*Convenience: less than a minute to quickly perform a simple search using one's smartphone to find all relevant dance events in a defined area. (Remember that garage-door opener story?...same idea!)

**Benefits = 6 vital bits of information:

- WHEN... the date, time, day of week for each event (the default starts with "today's date" and only looks to the future...but the user can optionally select any future start date)
- 2. WHO...the name of the club or council sponsoring the event.
- 3. WHO...who's calling, who's cueing (with both first and last names listed).
 - 4. WHERE...the exact location for the event venue (plus a link for its map).
- 5. WHAT...the distance in miles ("as the crow

flies") from a "home" address or specified search center.


 WHAT...the dance "level" (Basic, SSD, Mainstream, Advanced? Phase I, II, III, IV?) displayed as colored icons.

Not convinced yet? Try this using your smartphone:

- Open a browser window and enter <u>Wher-</u> <u>esTheDance.com</u> in the address bar and hit search.
- Then click the gear/flower-shaped icon near the upper right corner. For demonstration purposes, just enter 98390 (it's a zip code) in the Postal Code field and hit Submit.
- Within seconds you'll see the search results displaying the 6 bits of information listed above for each event. Clicking directly on an individual event will open another window with more details, including a flyer if one exists.
- Now go back and reset the search criteria for your zip code (or address), and for any date in the future, etc. Experiment! You'll quickly begin to appreciate making WTD your "go-to" resource for up-to-the-minute info.



Ti again. Let's talk about lesson plans this month. First, back in my college days, I had an education professor that said "at the beginning of each school year you should throw away last year's lesson plans and make fresh new ones!" Now I'm not that ambitious, but I do believe that lesson plans should be reviewed at least every year, and for the best teaching results after every set of lessons. I tweak mine as I am teaching. After I complete the teaching tip, I will write the addition or change on my paper copy, and then later make the change on my master copy in my computer. On the facing page of my lesson plan I have a note page where I keep track of the patter music, the singing call, and line or round dance I used for each set. I also have a note section for comments about the class that night or movements I didn't get to, or that need a lot more practice. These comments are written on the next week's note page, so I can see them while I am progressing through that week's lesson plan. I also give handouts with information about square dancing, so there is a place for me to keep track of what I've distributed.

So, what is a lesson plan? A lesson plan is an outline of what is going to be taught during the teaching cycle of the evening class, and hopefully the whole season of classes. A check-off list is not a lesson plan! I now have three separate lesson plans to accommodate my teaching goals this year. The Mainstream lesson plan lays out the twenty-week teaching cycle for Happy Hoppers Oct. class, Skagit Squares Jan. class, and Whirlybirds Feb. class. This year we have decided to teach the basic program in Skagit Squares and Whirlybirds fall classes, and since I intermix the Mainstream and Basic lists in my Mainstream lesson plan, I needed a new one for the Basic program. As I mentioned last Month, Whirlybirds are doing a blast class Basic one weekend in Nov. so there is the third lesson plan.

By the way, even though I'm not in favor of the SSD program for Washington, the program has a very robust lesson plan. It is similar to the lesson plan Bob Osgood published for the Square Dancing/Sets In Order magazine years ago. I don't need that much detail, so I use a simpler format, with a weekly outline. Attached is an example of Lesson 11 from my mainstream lesson plan, so you can see what it actually looks like while I describe it for you here.... ¹⁵ FOOTNOTES

At the left top of each page is an alphabetical list of the movements to be taught that night. That is followed with four or five numbered paragraphs containing the movements to be taught, retaught, reviewed, featured, or explored, and possibly a singing call figure or choreographic idea I want to use during that teaching segment. I always finish each segment with a singing call, give them a 30 to 60 second breather then teach or play a line dance or easy round before starting the next session. I do the singing call and line dance/round so that my lessons feel more like a dance rather than an intense lesson routine. Everything in my lesson plan is color coded. The movements at the left top of the page are in black, and in the numbered paragraphs the word TEACH is underlined, followed by a colon, and in black, followed by the movements that I want to teach during that segment. In the same way, the movements taught the week before are displayed under RETEACH and highlighted in red. REVIEW is in blue and are the movements from three weeks back. FEATURE is four weeks back, and in green. EXPLORE is multi colored, and is a more in-depth look at a movement. On the right side of the page is an alphabetical color-coded column containing the movements taught up to the previous week. So, the left side of the page reflects what I am currently teaching that night, and the right side is the history of what I've taught. Contact me if you have questions about this method of lesson planning.

Hey, An Idea for State Festival Planning: At the 1987 state festival we had a caller's seminar (the subject was on sound). When I arranged it, I was hoping it would become an annual event that would cover a range of topics. That didn't catch on, but it would be nice to see it revitalized so we could share ideas like lesson plans, and other topics of interest, with each other during a State Festival gathering. A Caller's Think Tank?

CONTEMPLATIONS FROM THE CAVNESS CORNER Shawn & Wendy Cavness shawn@rounddancing.org

We have been taking lessons for about as long as we can remember and have been teaching lessons for the past 7 years. This month we will start a two part series on round dance lessons. We will share some of our thoughts about what we have learned over the years as both students and as teachers, encouraging our students to learn. We hope these tips will help new students be successful and they will help existing dancers to make their own lessons more successful.

The first question you want to ask yourself as you contemplate beginning round dance lessons is why do you want to dance? It's important to understand your own motivation to learn as it will help you understand what goals to set and it will also help your teacher understand how to help you meet your goals. One reason to learn to dance is simply to participate in the rounds between tips. There is nothing wrong with simply wanting to learn to dance so that you can join the round dancers between square dance tips. If this is your goal make sure that the rhythm you are learning is either Two Step or Waltz. Bolero and Tango are a lot of fun but they are rarely danced at square dances. Make sure your teacher knows what your goals are. (This goes for everything - you want your teacher to work with you to meet your goals.) If your goal is to simply dance between tips your teacher will work with you on footwork mainly and not focus as much on form and positioning.

You may be contemplating round dance lessons as something to do with your partner. We see many couples come into our lessons after their children have become independent. They finally have time to invest in each other again and dancing is a great couple activity. Others simply want an activity in common that they can do together. Beware that some teachers will split couples up during the course of a lesson. There is a school of thought that beginning dancers should be dancing with multiple partners in order to solidify their own learning. (We personally never do this). It would be very frustrating to plan round dance lessons as a date night only to find that you will be dancing with everyone except your own partner. Make sure your teacher knows that this is a date night for you or that you don't want to be split up. Knowing what your goals are, they will take more of an interest in helping you to be successful dancing with your own partner.

You may want to learn to dance intermediate level or above. As a square dancer you may have wandered into the advanced rounds hall during a festival and been wowed watching the intermediate and advanced round dancers. You may have thought that's what I want to do. If lessons for you are a foundation for eventually dancing at the phase 4 or 5 levels make sure you let your teacher know. They can take extra time with you to ensure the steps are more thoroughly learned and to teach proper positioning. Contra banjo and proper offset, head positioning etc. - which are critical to learn Smooth dances above Phase 3 - can be easily learned at the Beginning level. Your teacher can help you with all of this, so you won't need to relearn these concepts as you gain experience.

Maybe it's not you, but your partner who wants to learn. You are just along to be supportive. Make sure you know what your partner wants out of dancing so you can support him or her. Keep an open mind – we frequently see women who drag their husbands or boyfriends into our lessons. After three or four weeks, it's their husband or boyfriend who falls in love with the activity.

It's important to identify who are you going to dance with. Many couples coming to our lessons are married couples or are sweethearts. We have seen same sex couples join our class, partnerless or parents dancing with their children. We welcome everyone. We have also had women join our classes who already knew how to dance but wanted to learn to dance the Men's part - we give special certificates for that. We invite teachers to be totally open about who they welcome to their class - dancing should be a safe environment. We encourage dancers without partners to join our classes. Two single dancers will often dance together or they may be paired with an Angel or one of the two of us, as their instructor. We have taught many sets of lessons with Shawn hash cueing while dancing with a student. There are teachers who do not welcome singles, so check in advance if you are going to come without a partner.

Blindhem Foot

This is a foot that most people have but never learn to use. Tailors use this stitch. It looks professional, doesn't pucker and does not come out like a hand sewn hem. As with all other techniques, it takes a little practice. Take a couple of scraps and try this foot.

1. Finish the edge of the hem. My favorite finish is the triple zig zag "D" on the widest setting. This stitch does not cause the edge to bunch up like the regular zag zag can. This edge can also be serged or any other stitch of your choice.




2. Fold the hem up the desired amount. Glass headed pins allow the hem to be pressed at this point.

3. Pressing will ease back any stretch that has occurred along the finished edge.

4. Set the machine on the longest straight stitch "B", for basting. Sew all around the hem one half inch from the finished edge of the hem. Use a contrasting thread so that it can be easily pulled out later.

5. Position the garment, hem down and fold the garment back to the straight stitching, making sure the hem edge protrudes one half inch. This will be the inside of the garment.



6. Position the fabric so the red edge guide runs

along the fold. The blind hem foot for your machine may look different, like the white guide one. While sewing keep the fabric fold tight against the guide.



7. Set the machine on the hem stitch"F".


This is where the practice is necessary. The needle will take three straight stitches and then zig over to the left. That zig should just barely catch the fold. Use the stitch length, width control and the position of the guide to adjust the stitch.

Check the front of the garment to see what the stitch looks like. If the stitch punctures are very visible on the front, try moving the edge guide to the

left, with the knurled adjusting knob. Just a little adjustment and try again.

Thinner fabrics need a very tiny bite. Thicker

fabrics need bigger bite. When the hem is complete, pull out the basting stitching and press again.



The advantages of using the blind hem foot on the machine verses hand hemming are;

1. Faster - Once the stitch is set correctly, you can speed down the hem.

8. Reduce puckering - Hand stitches tend to pucker because most stitchers draw the thread too tight. If there is puckering with the blind hem foot, reduce the upper thread tension a little and increase the stitch length.

9. Stronger hem - If one part of the hem stitching is broken, the hem won't completely pull out like it can with hand stitching.

10. More flexible - The little zigs add stretch to the stitching so it is less likely to pop than hand stitching. The other blind hem stitch "E" is designed to be used on very stretchy fabrics.

While working at a sewing machine shop, my job was to teach all of the different feet and accessories for the machines. It really opened my eyes to the idea of the right tool for the job. Making my stitching more accurate, faster and more creative was the result.



This past month I have been privileged to dance with Mount Baker, CPSC, Rainier, and So'Western Councils. As I write, I am excited about the first SSD classes offered by Swingnuts, beginning on Thursday.

Although I had become complacent about not dancing for the past year, to be back in home clubs with so many positive attitudes reminded me of why we all love square dancing so much.

With fewer dancers turning out, it seems that solos are skittish about showing up without a partner. As new lessons are beginning, this is a good time to remind seasoned dancers that callers will welcome you signing in as a new dancer so you can learn the opposite part. It is a courtesy to the club and caller to pay for your spot, and not expect to get in as an angel if you are there to learn a new skill. Once you have this new skill, you will be able to go to any dance with confidence that someone else will have shown up without a partner, and you can both dance your feet sore for the entire evening. All of the clubs are facing new challenges with higher rents, even though callers may be keeping their stipends stable; or in some cases, even reducing their fees. While we can expect to pay a little more at the door, just keep in mind that this is still one of the least expensive sports there is, and in order to survive, clubs need to be financially responsible. Having an evening of great music, dancing, and being with friendly people costs about half of a night out at the movies (with popcorn), and less than half of an evening at the bowling alley (with pizza).

A final thought... in the past, clubs I learned with told their newly graduated students to come back for the next new-dancer sessions and sign in as an angel, in order to reinforce their skills. No one expected the angels to pay. However, things have changed. Angels should know the definitions of the calls and be able to follow the caller without hesitation. Many of us who considered ourselves experienced dancers find we are now struggling simply because we haven't danced in a while. If this describes you, please sign in (and pay) as a student. Your club needs you!



Ghost Riders band to perform at 71st NSDC

EVANSVILLE — 71st National Square Dance Convention® General Chairmen John and Carolyn Cook recently announced the Ghost Riders Square Dance Band will be performing at the convention, June 22-25, 2022 in Evansville, Indiana.

This will be the 11th national convention the band has performed at in its 50 years of existence. The band was started in August, 1972 in Concord, California by Hal Langer. Hal wanted to square dance to live bands but it never worked out, so Hal decided to start his own band of square dancers. After some rehearsals, the Ghost Riders were born.

The band consists of five members, three who play guitar, a keyboard player, and a percussionist. If you have never danced to them, you are missing out on an experience you won't forget.

With the addition of the Ghost Riders, registration numbers for the convention keep rising. More than 1,000 dancers have committed to attend. As of late September, Indiana had the most registrants with 145, followed by Ohio with 101 and Texas with 64. Alabama, California, and Florida all had around 50 registrants or more.



 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups (6 oz.) shredded cheddar cheese

1 can (2.8 ounces) french-fried onions

2 Tbsp. chopped fresh parsley

Salt to taste

Filling:

1¹/₂ cup shredded or cubed cooked chicken or turkey 1 pkg. (10 oz.) frozen mixed vegetables, thawed and drained

1 can (10³/₄ oz.) condensed cream of chicken soup, undiluted

¹/₄ cup milk

- ¹/₂ tsp. ground mustard
- ¹/₄ tsp. garlic powder


1/4 tsp. pepper


- 1. Combine all of the potato shell ingredients and spread them over the bottom and up the side of a greased 2-quart shallow baking dish. In a large bowl, combine the filling ingredients and pour gently into shell.






