

Did You Know...?..."

caravanning" makes you smarter?

Did that statement grab your attention? OK, so I fibbed...caravanning doesn't make you smarter. But it adds to the fulfillment and enjoyment you derive from being a well-rounded square dancer. Not only that, your list of square dance acquaintances and soon-to-be close friends can grow almost exponentially when a conscious effort to caravan with your club is applied.

I remember when caravanning with at least a full square of dancers from one club to another (and having the "other" club reciprocate) was a hugely popular part of belonging to a club...most clubs anyway. How many of you remember "stealing" another club's banner as part of an "official" caravan? Was it kind of silly?...of course it was. But it was also fun, and part of square dance tradition.

I don't for one second mean to suggest that caravanning has gone away completely, but it doesn't seem to have the same level of commitment that it once had...am I wrong? I count myself as being "guilty" in recent years of allowing that tradition to slip a bit in terms of its importance. Recent visitations (caravans) from other clubs to some of "our" dances has rekindled the flame I once enjoyed.

For the past few years in Rainier Council, for example, the relative success of what's been dubbed the monthly "Big Dance" is, I believe, noteworthy. Following the suggestion of one of the council's longtime dancers, the clubs in the council collaborated, with each club hosting a "Big Dance" at some point during the dance season. Everyone agreed that attending a dance with 4, or 5, or 6 (sometimes more) squares was a lot more fun than struggling to put only one or two squares on the floor at a regular club dance. These Big Dances are not "Council Dances" as such, since the host club "manages" the dance just as they would if it were simply a regular club dance. The difference is that the other clubs in the council agreed ahead of time to support each other's "Big Dance". Is the "Big Dance" concept identical to old-fashioned club caravanning? Perhaps not, but the effect is almost the same.

Granted, there's no guarantee that the dance hall will be "filled to capacity" just because the event is promoted as a "Big Dance"...that's not the point! But, by and large, the program has brought the clubs and the dancers closer together as a community. With the decline in the number of square dancers (exacerbated BIG TIME by Covid) we <u>need</u> that sense of "belonging" to a community larger than any single club.

The cross-club cooperation has spilled over into other areas...lessons specifically. We're all the better for it.

Eery council in our state is unique in many respects, so the Big Dance concept may not be practical. I can see where It likely would not "fit" for a large council with lots of clubs...or a small council with only a handful of clubs.





For those clubs giving lessons, do not forget to send us a list of your students' names, addresses, and telephone numbers. Students are covered by our insurance while they are going through lessons. Upon graduation, the student is covered for 10 more days. At that time, the student must join a club to continue to be covered by insurance. If they do not join a club within the 10-day period, they will no longer be covered after lessons. A new graduate joining your club would be handled the same as any person joining the club, send us their name, address, and telephone number. 



CALLER'S CORNER







Tt is hard to believe that Summer is gone, and Fall has Lquickly arrived to replace it. Just like pumpkin spice is a recurring Fall tradition so are square dance lessons. Most clubs have already started lessons while some of your clubs are waiting till after the holidays to start lesson. Regardless of when your club will begin new dance lessons, I think this is a good time to review some of the important things we all need to remember as we begin to guide our new dancers through lessons. Most seasoned square dancers have angeled so many lessons you think you know what needs to be done and how to do it.

After teaching new dancers lessons for many years here are some tips everyone should consider to help improve your angel skills to become a better angel.

- 1. Always remember that our goal is to have fun. If you are not having fun being an angel then why waste your time. Help the new dancers to feel relaxed and make sure that you are having a fun experience.
- 2. Each new dancer has their own way to learn new skills. Some learn by doing, some by listening, some by watching, and some by a combination of all these methods. The best way to help new dancers is to dance your position and execute the moves according to the prescribed definition. Help the instructor by not talking in your square. People do not learn by being pushed or pulled when they are learning a new move. Be gentle and patient so the new dancers will feel comfortable and relaxed.
- 3. If you see that a student or students in your square are having difficulty, bring it to the at-

tention of the instructor. Let the instructor help them learn the move rather than you trying to teach in the square. We don't pay you enough to have you teach, you are there to have fun and make sure the students have a successful experience.

- 4. Make sure that you talk to each new dancer during the first two or three lessons. Introduce yourself, get to know each person better. Find out if you share common interests, vocations, and or hobbies. The more you talk to the new people the more they will feel welcomed and want to come back.
- 5. Make a conscious effort to dance with each of the new dancers sometime during lesson night. Don't shy away from dancers who might not be getting it or constantly make mistakes. Those are the dancers you are there to help, so make sure you do your job.

Being an angel is by no means an easy task. It takes patience, kindness, a good sense of humor and the ability to laugh at yourself when you make a mistake. Always wear a smile even when your square is having difficulty. Give words of encouragement to the new dancers. Be the example of what a good square dancer should be. Always remember your experience with the angels that helped you learn to dance and apply the skills that helped you have a fun and rewarding lesson experience.

I appreciate all the hard work provided by angels. I know as a caller that I could not teach new dancers to square dance without angels. Thanks for each and every one of you who have angeled in the past and continue to volunteer your time to help grow our square dance activity.

1. Pattern paper 16 x 16 inches 2. Fabric to cut two of pattern 3. As much lace as you want

5. 2 short pieces of cord

Materials

Instructions

Pettipants Shoe Tote This is a quick project that can be made from almost any fabric. Make one for every pair of shoes. Make them for gifts or door prizes. Decorate with lace or ribbons.

1. Make the pattern following the diagram and

2. Sew lace across the leg area on the right side, starting two inches above the bottom





- 3. Place the pieces right sides together and sew a half-inch seam down the sides like the stitching line in the diagram.
- 4. Fold the tote in half with the seams on top of each other,
- 5. Press both top seams open. Tuck 2-inch long strips of fuse webbing top edge and press. This keeps the seam allowances flat when the ties are inserted and reinforces the openings.
- 14 inches fold line 16 inches stitching 8 inches old line 16 inches
- 6. Fold the top (waist) of the pettipants over one inch toward the inside, and stitch all the way around 3/4 inch down from the top to make a tunnel for the ties.
- 7. Make bar tacks over the seam line at the top edge and stitching line of the tunnel on both the front and back seams. With your seam ripper, pick open the seam between the bar tacks on the right side (outside) of the tote.
- 8. Insert one of the long ties in the front opening and work it all the way around until it comes out the same opening. Tie the ends together. Repeat with the back seam. When you pull the ties, they will work against each other to shut the tote.
- 9. Make a one-half-inch wide tunnel around the bottom of the legs. Insert some cord and pull it tight. Tie a knot and work the knot inside the tunnel.

Now that you have the basic idea, you can vary the pattern to suit yourself.





Thank you for registering for the 73rd National Square Dance Convention® being held in Milwaukee, WI. June 26-29, 2024.

Our published rates for camping were based on a verbal agreement with the Wisconsin State Fairgrounds RV Park. As we proceeded towards signing a formal contract, the park unexpectedly raised the rates by a significant amount resulting in a cost to our campers of more than \$100 per night. This is about 30 percent higher than the rates already published for those same dates in 2024 on their website, and for which they are actively accepting reservations. They refused to consider any lower nightly pricing for our group.

This was incredibly disappointing to us and was a dramatic change in their position from our earlier discussions. We do not believe our campers should have to pay that marked-up price. We also do not believe you would be satisfied with such a premium over their already-premium nightly rates.

After lengthy discussions with our camping staff, our convention leaders, and the National Executive Committee, we feel it is in everyone's best interest for the 73rd National Square Dance Convention® to *not* offer a group rate for RV camping. Instead, we will provide you with a list of campgrounds in the general vicinity and ask you to select your preferred location and make your own private reservations. We will also be unable to offer bus transportation to and from the original camping site.

We sincerely apologize for any inconvenience this may have caused. Any camping deposit you have already made through our convention registration process will be refunded to you within the next few weeks.

As an alternative to camping, we have two convention hotels which are connected by skywalks to the Baird Center, formerly known as the Wisconsin Center, where the convention will be held. Our host hotel, the Hilton Milwaukee City Center, offers \$5.00 per day parking with in and out privileges included. The hotel rate for both of our hotels, Hilton and Hyatt Regency Milwaukee, is \$169 per night, based on double occupancy, plus applicable taxes and fees.

For a Great Convention, in a Great City, on a Great Lake, we look forward to welcoming you to Milwaukee, WI, on June 26-29, 2024.
