

Lee and Catherine were very active in the square and round dance community. Among their contributions:

- He was the Editor of this very magazine soon after it first stared.
- State President 1984-85
- Held offices in several square and round dance clubs, most recently President of the Grand Squares Club.

- One of the early members of the Olympia Area Square Dancers, including President.
- Helped build the first Lac-A-Do Hall in 1963 and the second hall in 1995-6.
- Chairman of the 1989 Washington State Square Dance Festival.
- One of the organizers of the Olympia Callers and Cuers Association.

In recognition of their efforts, Lee and Catherine received the President's Award in 1983 and the MacGregor Award in 1986 from the State Square and Folk Dance Federation.

Lee was a great man; always willing to step in and help out where he could. He will be missed by many.

We basically say the same thing every December; it's just that we shortened it up this year, because by now we figure you should have it memorized! As always, call us with your questions.



What To Ask Santa To Bring You For Christmas

We all need the correct shoes to Round Dance. If you are trying to dance in sticky shoes, i.e. rubber soled or grooved, you will have trouble. To dance you need soles that slide smoothly over the floor so you don't injure knees, ankles or hips. They need to give you good support to carry you around turns and its nice if they look good too. One pair of shoes is never enough. Flats are best for general dancing and lessons. Ladies like heels for special dancing but remember what works well for a Waltz may not work at all for Jive. Men sometimes think they don't need special shoes but I highly recommend at least taking a nice pair to the shoe repair store and have a dance sole put on so they slide well. Those of you who live near a dance clothing store should be able to find just the right shoes for you or if you know your size it's easy to get them mail order

Why are so many experienced stitchers afraid of the ruffler? Is it the funny shape? The little knobs? Or the funny noise it makes? Be brave, be bold and give rufflers a try!

Rufflers don't actually make ruffles, they make a series of little pleats. They are much better than the pulled thread system of gathering. Consistent neat pleats that sew to the next piece of fabric with a nice flat seam. Years ago rufflers were a standard attachment on all sewing machines.

<u>**Presser Bar Attachment</u>** -Wraps around the presser foot bar. For snap on presser feet, unscrew the ankle from the presser foot shaft.</u>

<u>Arm Fork</u> - This fits over the needle clamp bar. The movement of the needle clamp bar causes the ruffler to work.

Give the needle clamp screw an extra quarter turn to tighten. The vibration of the arm fork tends to loosen the needle. Thread the needle before attaching the ruffler.

<u>Finger</u> - Fits through the slots on the Ruffler Rack - Lift and slide the rack from side to side to adjust the number of pleats. With the finger in 1 a pleat will be formed every stitch. In 6 it will be every sixth stitch. In 12 it will be every twelfth stitch and in the star position it will not ruffle at all.

<u>**Pleat Size Adjustment</u>** - Determines the depth of the little pleats. There are several different models. Just look for a small screw that adjusts in and out.</u>

Fabric Guides - These guide the fabric for making a narrow, approx. ¹/₄ inch seam allowance. I do not use these

guides. Line up the cut edge of the fabric with the right side Pivot Point. this will result in a ½ inch seam allowance

<u>**Upper and Lower Blades**</u> - The fabric goes between these blue spring steel blades. They have very sharp points.

Always pull the fabric away from you and to the left when removing it from the ruffler.To make a wider ruffle the lower blade can be removed. Tighten the little screw, after removing the lower plate, so it won't vibrate out.

The trick to the ruffler is to play with it and learn what it can do for you. Just give it a try. There are lots of places



on the internet that have more information about the ruffler, or go to your sewing machine dealer for a demonstration. Rufflers are easy to use and make sewing faster.

Place the fabric to be ruffled between the blades.

Hold the fabric very loosely. Let the ruffler have all the fabric it wants. Rufflers will work with very sheer fabric. Be very careful of the teeth on the blades when working with sheer fabric. Never pull backwards. It will also work well with poplins and trigger cloth. For heavier fabrics adjust for the deepest pleats for the best results.

Don't try to make the ruffle and sew it to the garment in one step. It can be done but it is much harder to keep track of two layers that are moving at different speeds. It is less stressful to make the ruffle and then attach it.

Three adjustments determine the amount of fabric in the ruffle. It is a combination of these factors along with the type of fabric that will determine the amount of fabric in the ruffle.


#1 the Rack, every stitch, each 6th stitch or each 12th stitch.

#2 the Pleat Size Adjustment, little bitty pleats that look more like gathers or deeper pleats that take up more fabric.

#3 the Stitch Length Adjustment on the sewing machine. Changing the stitch length will change the distance between tucks. The amount of fabric in the ruffle is determined by the stitcher. Softer lighter fabrics can be ruffled more closely than stiffer thicker ones. A wider ruffle looks better if it is a bit fuller than a narrower one. Fabric cut across the grain ruffles softer than fabric that is cut the length of the grain. Bias cut ruffles are even softer. The type of hem treatment of the ruffle will make a difference. Rolled hem, serger edge or bias binding will change the look. The key is experiment. The formulas to determine how much fabric is needed to make a ruffle are on *- www.squaredancesewing.com*.

My personal preference for square dance dresses is to leave the ruffler rack set on six, the pleat size adjustment as deep as it will go and just adjust the stitch length to change the amount of ruffle. Once you use a ruffler you will never go back to pulling threads.

December already? Where has 2016 gone? The New Year will be here before we know it. Now I know I talk about competition in almost every article so I'm going to take a small step back and talk about youth in general, and our relationship with adult clubs.

Youth have always had a hard time at adult club dances (when they show up that is) and I want to clean up a few blurred lines. Youth have a lot of changes going on in their lives (some physical, some emotional, and some environmental) which can make things easily uncomfortable to them. For instance asking an adult they don't know to dance or fill a square. Now don't get me wrong this isn't always easy for adults too but it's much harder on kids. For them it's easier if they are asked to dance or fill a square (rarely will they say no, but if they do bring them to me!) And it's easier for them to dance with the people they know (I'm not saying this is a good or bad thing, it just is)

Another problem between youth and adults at dances is very few youth are serious through a whole singing call... let alone a whole tip, and for some people this can be frustrating as it can at times cause squares to break down. And when squares break down this makes people not want to dance (understandably)

Now, there are a few things that both parties can do to fix these problems. 1)

Both sides need to get better at asking the other to dance or fill a square. Bridge the gap people! 2) While it is OK to horse around and have fun we need to make sure it's in the capacity that people can still hear and dance to the calls while still having fun (this goes for everyone) 3) Maybe ask the other people in your square if it's ok for you to politely horse around before the tip starts 4) Mix up your squares and if you want to have a fun and crazy square then say every other or every 3rd tip will be a youth square or a crazy square. And while this doesn't need to be done in the back it needs to be done so the other squares can still hear and dance the calls.

I know it was long and I'm sorry but I hope it helps bridge the divide a little bit. If you need help finding a youth or adult club in your area to visit please contact me.
