



Merry Christmas, I hope your Thanksgiving was wonderful!

For the caller's section for December I will be focusing on not so common "Zero Line Get Ins" from a Static Square. I will also let you know if this is a 1P2P, or a 4P1P line. I hope someone gets good use out of this information! Here we go!!!

- 1) Heads Touch to a Wave; Spin the Top; Turn Thru; Circle to a Line [1P2P].
- 2) Sides Face; All Touch to a Tidal Wave; Center Ladies Trade; All Spin the Top; Men Run; Bend the Line [1P2P].
- Sides Face; All touch to a Tidal Wave;
 Center Ladies Trade; All Spin the Top;
 Slide Thru [1P2P].
- Head Ladies Chain to the Right; Heads Lead Right; Ladies lead Dixie Style; Recycle [4P1P].
- 5) Head Men Lead, Reverse the Flutter; Heads Star Thru; Double Pass Thru;1st Couple Go Left, Next Couple Go Right [4P1P]
- 6) Heads Promenade 1/2; Heads Touch 1/4; Walk and Dodge; Veer Left; Bend the Line [1P2P].
- 7) Heads Promenade 1/2; Lead to the Right; Star Thru; Reverse the Flutter [1P2P].
- 8) Sides Promenade 3/4; Heads Square Thru 3/4; Pass the Ocean; Recycle [4P1P].
- 9) Heads Promenade 3/4; Centers pass Thru; Veer Left; Bend the Line [4P1P].
- 10) Heads Rollaway; Pass Thru; Both Turn Left; Single File Circulate Around 2 to a Line; [4P1P].
- 11) Heads Rollaway; Pass Thru; Both Turn Right; Single File Circulate Around 2 to a Line [1P2P].
- 12) Heads Rollaway; Heads Lead Right; Swing Thru; Ladies U-Turn Back [1P2P].
- 13) Heads Rollaway; Heads Lead Right; Swing Thru; Ladies U-Turn Back; Bend the Line [4P1P].
- 14) All 4 Ladies Chain 3/4; Heads Square Thru; 8 Chain 2; Slide Thru [4P1P].

- 15) All 4 Ladies Chain 3/4; Heads Square Thru 2; Flutter Wheel; Sweep 1/4 [4P1P].
- 16) Heads Touch 1/4; Same Men Run; Swing Thru; Men Trade; Spin Chain Thru; Slide Thru [1P2P].
- 17) Heads Left Touch 1/4; Same 4 Walk and Dodge; Veer Left; Bend the Line [1P2P].
- 18) Heads Lead Right; Touch 1/4; Split Circulate; Men Run [4P1P].
- 19) Heads Lead Right; Pass the Ocean; Recycle [4P1P].
- 20) Heads Lead Right; Veer Left; Wheel and Deal; Sweep 1/4 [4P1P].
- 21) Heads Lead Right; Veer Left; Chain Down the Line; Flutter Wheel [4P1P].
- 22) Heads Lead Right; Veer Left; Chain Down the Line; Touch 1/4; Walk and Dodge; All Face In [4P1P].
- 23) Heads Lead Right; Veer Left; Ladies Trade; Wheel and Deal; Slide Thru [4P1P].
- 24) Heads Lead Right; Veer Left; Tag the Line; Face Left; Bend the Line [4P1P].
- 25) Heads Lead Right; Veer Left; Bend the Line; Pass the Ocean; Slide Thru [4P1P].

NOTES FROM NINA

Alittle background on your Round Dance Coordinator is what I promised for this issue. I have lived in eastern Washington for my entire life: Born in Colfax; Lived in Colfax, Metaline, Newport, Pullman, and Cheney. I was a freshman at WSU in Pullman the fall of 1965 and continued to live there for 35 years. I completed 32 years of full time employment after my undergraduate years, and worked part time for two years after that. When I retired I was the Assistant Director for Human Resource Services. After retirement, Bill and I moved to Cheney. I can't believe I've lived here for 18 years.

I took a couple of ballroom dance classes in college and had a college boyfriend who loved to dance. I probably went to more semi-formal and formal dances than any other girl on campus at the time. What fun that was! My roots in dance, however, were in Square and Round Dancing. I am told that as a preschooler, at regular old-time square dances with my parents, I would crawl in my sleeping bag when I was tired. As I got older I danced with the other kids in the back of the hall. Rounds were memorized, not cued, then. Our favorites were Schottische and Polka dances. I usually dragged several of my friends with me to dances by the time I was in high school. We danced most of the squares but had not learned and practiced the round dances. My Dad had taught me a few so I stole Mom's partner for the few round dances I knew.

I took Modern Western Square Dance Lessons in 1985. The following year I took beginning Round Dance Lessons. Later, I took Round Dance Lessons from both June Bassett and Jack DeChenne.

I danced as a single in the Palouse until Bill took square dance lessons and swept me off my feet. We enjoyed square dancing and social dancing. I started learning to cue in 1991, just a few months after Bill and I were married. Frolickers, in Pullman, put up with me as I continued to learn. I was their cuer from 1992 until their club folded after 63 years. I began cueing for the Hi Flyers in 1996, the Krazy 8's in 1999, and the easy-level Wag Arounds' dances in about 2004. I continue to cue for all three clubs. I've been lucky enough to cue for several



small festivals in the greater Spokane area, and a few dances in other areas of Washington, Idaho, and Oregon.

I taught my first Round Dance class with Bill in about 1993 in Pullman. I continued teaching there for about 15 years. When Krazy 8's hired me in 1999 it included the request to teach square dance-level rounds. So I started teaching in Spokane at that time. In about 2006 I started teaching Phase III lessons in Spokane and have continued to teach both of those classes. When Bill's health declined to the point he could no longer help me teach I borrowed dance friends to be my teaching partner for a few years. About 12 years ago Dan Bailly became my teaching partner. A couple years ago some dancers were asking for a Phase IV class. I was simply not able to prepare one more lesson each week. So Dan took on the Phase IV class with my help as a teaching partner. That arrangement continues to work for us. He's a far better dancer than I am and has helped me to be a better dancer, dance teacher, and cuer. Now I think you know more about me than I did when I started this article.

Bling! Bling!

Glitter - Sparkle - Shine - Flash Dance halls are the right place to wear the brightest costume jewelry. A delicate necklace is perfect for dinner at a fine restaurant, but on the dance floor it would never be seen. This is where to have fun with the wildest colors and boldest styles. Chunky plastic bead necklaces and bold ear rings show off your crazy side.

The first thing that should be considered when choosing jewelry to wear to a dance is safety. Those vintage beads might be the perfect color but if that vintage string breaks it will be the center of attention. If beads go rolling across the floor they could cause a fall. The dance would have to stop while they were swept up. Earrings and pins can also come loose and get stepped on. Make sure that every thing is well attached. All clasps and clips need to be in good order and strong enough for the piece. Replace any loose pins or other worn findings.

Jewelry findings are available in many hobby shops and fabric stores along with 'how to' books. To get the perfect accent for your ensemble just make it your self. This is not very expensive or time consuming. There are many different styles of necklace clasps, earring backs, and pins that can be used to make or re-do jewelry. Magnets can be purchased from your badge dealer. They work as well on large broaches as they do on badges. Look at reworking some of the costume items already in your jewel box.

Another place to look for great costume jewelry is in second hand shops. If the necklace is the right color, and the right price, but not the right length get it any way. Consider a bargain necklace as a source of beads that can be remade into a perfect accent for your ensemble. The proper length necklace is one that fits the neckline of the dress. Usually, for this activity, shorter necklaces are better. Long necklaces could get caught on your partner's badge during a swing or bounce up into your face during a Dive Thru. By restringing a long necklace there may be enough beads left over to make matching earrings.

The size of earrings is the choice of the wearer, but don't make them so heavy that they are uncomfortable. New earring backs can be purchased for pierced earrings and pads that can be added to clip ons for a better fit. Clip ons can easily be turned into pierced style with jewelry findings and a bit of glue.

Hair clips and head bands can also add sparkle to your outfit. Don't settle for plain clips to keep your hair back, at a dance you can wear the flashy stuff. Do you have a tiara from high school? Dust it off and wear it with your head held high. There is no reason not to show off and it will improve your posture. You can't slouch with a crown on your head.

Wrist bracelets can become tangled in someone's shirt cuff during a Turn Thru. Consider an ankle bracelet instead. Ankle bracelets are just larger versions of the wrist bracelet and there is less that they can get caught on. Why should the upper half get all the jewelry?

Shoe clips are another fun accent to sparkle the lower part of the outfit. These special clips can be positioned on the toe, the side or the strap for a variety of looks. Just make sure that they are firmly attached.

Belt buckles can be a very interesting accent. A plain one can be made fancy with glue on beads and sparkles. If there is enough bling on the front of the dress turn the belt around and put the buckle in the back. When we are in a square many people are looking at the back of the outfit.

Rings can be a problem when Angeling with new dancers. They have a tendency to hold hands too tight and to not let go. They are just unsure and nervous. After a while they will learn to touch and not grab hands. For the first few lessons leave your extra rings at home.

For a real bling go to Sue's Sparklers (www.suessparklers.com). She has iron on crystals, metals and beads. I have used several of her designs and they go right through the wash. Just follow the instructions carefully and they will add shine to any garment.

The amount of bling on your outfit is up to you. This activity is a great place to let the wild side out. Those pieces that you would never wear to the office are perfect for the square dance hall.

WOW, have things changed!

I was stuck on a topic to talk about this month, so decided to read through some back issues of Footnotes for inspiration. As I wandered through the years, I was struck by the high number of solo dancers who have found life partners through square dancing; how many successful clubs have been formed for "singles" in order to satisfy the hunger for dancing, partner or not; and how the perception of solo dancers has changed in just a few years.

In past issues, credit has been given to Don Wood and Glen Raiha for preparing dancers for being able to dance the other gender when the numbers on the floor have become uneven. I want to also mention that Tom Tomlinson, Kevin Thomaier, and Steve Noseck all teach "all position dancing" in the Puget Sound Area. I encourage all dancers to look for opportunities to join workshops for "alternative dancing," "DBD dancing," and "all position dancing." Not only will you pick up some skills, but when you become proficient, you will dramatically increase the number of mainstream and plus calls that your caller can confidently call, doubling the amount of fun on the floor.


This is the season for new lessons, and it is a temptation to choose this opportunity to learn how to dance the "other side" while classes are slow, and the differences between "left side dancing" and "right side dancing" are carefully explained. However, be cautious, that unless you are highly proficient, you will end up causing confusion on the floor, and new dancers are already pretty confused. As angels, we don't want to increase their level of frustration, as too often newbies will decide it is just too difficult for them to grasp. If you find there are more angels than the floor needs, ask those dancers sitting out to help you learn the other side. Your home club dancers will be delighted to help you at your regular club dances, and you might even influence the rest of the club to join you in this new skill.

Other places to sharpen your skills are at the workshops. In my area, Steve has Thursday Night Plus at Mountlake Terrace, Kevin has KT's on Thursday night at the Maple Valley Grange, and Tom will start his workshops when his new dancers have graduated Mainstream, around the middle of January. Workshops are generally ongoing, and you can show up at any time during the year. There are many more callers

willing to coach all position, so watch for flyers. Anytime you see "workshop," it will be a good venue to try "the other side" in a safe, supportive environment.

Have a safe and joyous holiday season, and look forward to supporting the upcoming dances. In our area, Rainier Council is hosting a Pre-New Years Eve dance on the fifth Saturday (December 29) with the Hatch Brothers calling and Kyle Quande cueing. These young men bring a lot of talent to the stage, so come on out and be delighted at how much fun their calling brings. There are many New Year's Eve dances all over the state, so check out the flyers in this magazine and have a great time!



Scholarships are awarded at the Washington State Square & Folk Dance Festival held in June each year. Monies are paid directly to the winner's college or trade school.



My wife and I decided we wanted to add a little fun to our life so we decided to try square dance lessons.

We enrolled in lessons with the Sky Valley Whirlwinds, a club that dances in Mill Creek, Washington. It only took a few lessons and we were hooked. I loved everything about square dancing- the music, the callers, the comradery of the dancers and the pure joy of dancing. We received our graduation certificate in May of 2006, joined the Whirlwinds and attended every dance we could fit into our schedule.

The joy of dancing, however, was offset by other things I had on my mind. My brother, Marty Bahr, had been diagnosed with Early Onset Alzheimer's Disease at age 50. Marty was an executive with a major insurance company and was forced to leave his position as the Alzheimer's symptoms began to manifest. Marty and his wife moved to Chicago to seek treatment from Rush University Alzheimer's Disease Center (RADC). He spent his final 6 years there receiving excellent treatment.

I felt helpless. I knew I couldn't save my brother, but maybe there was something I could do to help others who faced the deadly Alzheimer's diagnosis. Knowing the generous hearts of my fellow dance club members, I approached the Sky Valley Whirlwinds and asked if they would be willing to put on a benefit dance with all proceeds going toward Alzheimer's research. The club unanimously passed on the motion to have the dance and plans were set in motion. Callers volunteered to call for free and club members covered all the dance duties. The first Alzheimer's dance was held in 2008 and much to the

club's delight, raised \$4002, all sent directly for research. The following year's dance did not disappoint, bringing in \$7414. The momentum for finding a cure continues.

In the last 10 years we have raised almost \$60,000 that has been sent to the research departments of Rush University and The University of Washington. A website has been set up (www.remembertodance.org) so that dancers may donate to the cause online and keep up with recent news from the research department at the University of Washington.

In 2018, we were able to branch out and as a result dances were held in Kirkland, Olympia and Spokane. My passion for this cause is so great, I asked myself, Why stop here? I have contacted clubs in Oregon, Canada and Australia seeking their help to make these benefit dances go global. When I retire in a few years I plan to travel the country visiting square dance clubs and encouraging them to follow our example and take one day out of their busy schedule to raise money for a cure.

I can't bring my brother back, but I hope to see this disease eradicated so that others won't lose their brother. My vision is to see square dancers worldwide working to wipe out Alzheimer's and having fun at the same time. I beseech you as callers to let it begin with you. One dance a year can make such a difference.

Abercrombie was the caller and cuer. Thanks to all who came to help us celebrate Davis' years of teaching and service to the dance community. Hope to share pictures next month.




WDA has a mystery we would like help
