## **Emotions**

This past month has given us the highs and lows of emotions. 1 wedding and 4 loss of dancers are examples of these highs and lows.

This is our circle of love, friendship, and life. Enjoy what we have today. No guarantee for tomorrow. These events plus many other events (I only know of these but there are plenty more).

We can look over our attitudes and habits and try and do something about it. Try and improve.

For example, within our rosters/former rosters are dancers that we do not see anymore.

They may have moved.

They may no longer dance due to health.

They may no longer dance as there were ignored and did not feel welcomed.

What could be done here? Something for sure. My example (this is real too):

A couple I know was former Members of 2 Clubs in our area. A Mainstream Club and a Plus Club. They were Officers, maybe more than once. Health slowed them down and they were only able to show up once every few months to dance at their Clubs.

No one made them feel welcomed.

No one talked to them.

No one knew them.

No one, even, those that remembered them said much.

In your Church, someone new shows up and it's a big deal. Here it was not. Someone shows up that is older/slower/and we don't know, we bypass them, and they get ignored. This couple dances a tip or two at the most. Grabs some of the snacks, puts their coats on and leaves. This happens to them at their own Club or former Club 2-3 times in a year and they are forever forgotten and gone. Quit.

We all lose on this.

What can we do?

## Suggestion.

Someone from the Club, the current President, the oldest member, should Call them.

Probably there needs to be a few calls to more than 1 person or couple, to reach out, connect, and say, "Hi". What's is going on?

Is this too hard? Of course not. How many calls will you have to make? Who cares? Make them, today DO NOT wait

Every club has a "Greeter".

"Welcome." Pay your money. "Thanks."

What about when dancers leave. Leave early. Leave because of (fill in the blank).

Who is there then? NO ONE

Change this about your Club. Have someone there to say "Goodbye and Thanks." "It's fine now", you say, even without someone to say goodbye.. It is not, change now, make it better for next season. Tell them as they leave

"Thanks, hope you had a good time".

"Is everything OK?"

"Sorry, you are leaving early, see you at the next dance".

Will this be of help? I guarantee it will. I, from the stage at every dance, see this, repeatedly. It is a sad sight. **Change it today for your next dance.** 

I know those (older dancers) will remember you when you call and the hope is for them to return, even if it is not to dance but to remember the older days with them in it.

## **ROUNDS FOR YOU**

This month our article will be honoring "RESPECT". We will acknowledge several aspects of the topic. SOME points need to be brought to light and respect needs to be addressed. If someone is offended—SORRY—BUT what is mentioned IS HAPPENING.

DICTIONARY: honor, esteem, consideration, honesty..... feeling for others, think highly of, high regard.

Some characterists of showing respect are:

- 1. Using good manners
- 2. Using good language
- 3. Practicing tolerance
- 4. Consideration of the feelings of others
- 5. Dealing peacefully with anger, insults and disagreements

## WHY IS THIS SO IMPORTANT?

Respect makes us feel safe, helps us accept others for who they are. If you don't agree with their opinion, it's okay. Always remember we are all different and showing respect simply builds feelings of trust, safety and assures wellbeing.

Personally, we have seen and experienced such happenings as:

- 1. Comments from the floor on what they think a caller should have called or should not have called (patter) during a dance. Hey, you <u>scr</u> ed that up!
- 2. Experienced dancers(angels) teaching to new students on the floor while the instructor is demonstrating and teaching.
- 3. Talking, pushing shoving, commenting: you need to be over here, not where you're at.
- 4. Members of a square dance club visiting another club conducting themselves loudly on the side-lines while dancers on the floor struggling to hear the cuer.

## WHAT CAN BE DONE ABOUT THIS?

- 1. One instructor on the floor ONLY! If you are talking to your partner, he or she is missing directions given by the instructor
- 2. Show everyone as much respect as you can. Even if you don't like someone—show the best side and be respectful. *YOU CAN DO IT!*

- 3. If a square breaks down and a further problem arises between dancers, let the caller know so it can be solved immediately.
- 4. Talking quietly and visiting can be done moderately on the sidelines...you know...BE RESPECTFUL!
- 5. Mama always said, "Some comments are better left unsaid".

*Suggestion:* Respect scenarios could be demonstrated during class sessions promoting good manners.

Lastly, we would like to comment about respect for the caller and the cuer. Showing respect to both of these professionals is so important to our dance activity. They have had many expenses in their learning years of education, along with many hours of practice, callers /and or cuers schools, spending countless trips and time with mentors not to mention the purchase of sound equipment. There is value in acceptance to one's personal feelings and when you applaud these professionals you are showing respect and appreciation of their talent. They have studied and practiced many hours to perfect their profession. We work hard to perfect our programs and deserve to be rewarded both in pay and receiving your acceptance with your applause.

We feel the cuer deserves the same pay as the caller. We cannot speak for the callers however we can give an account of what we do as cuers. There is at least 4-5 hours spent on every dance Bob cues. Linda prepares the program after reading the contract and Bob adds or deletes what he wants to cue. We are a good team and respect each others views. Sometimes we don't agree but mostly Linda wins. Often times the cuer must arrive early to set up and supply the equipment for the dance in preparation for pre-rounds.

Quality entertainment is expected by the dancer and hopefully brought about by the hired duo. Remember to show your entertainers that your enjoying their efforts by your respectful applause.

## **Rickrack Returns**

You're thinking, 'Rickrack, how old fashioned and boring." Actually, it is 'Retro-cool' right now. Everything old is new again and rickrack is trendy with the younger set.

Rickrack is available in various widths, 1/4, 1/2, 5/8 and 1 1/2 inches are the most common. There are several internet sites that sell rickrack that is less expensive in bulk. The cotton rickrack in that old sewing box won't match new stuff. New rickrack is polyester and doesn't shrink. Manufacturers change the colors every couple of years to keep up with the fashions.

One reason to consider rickrack, is exactly the same reason as the ladies who wore flour sack dresses durability. We want to look pretty and fancy when we walk into the hall, but the fast paced dancing usually leaves our blouses in need of washing. Our skirts are subject to seatbelt crushing and potluck spills. Rickrack can handle this with ease and not get snagged and bedraggled like laces can.

The major problem with sewing on rickrack is that it has a tendency to pucker and curl up at the tips. The reasons for this are - Stitchers see anything long and skinny and they have to pull on it, to get it nice and tight. This causes the points to fold up. The other reason is rickrack is thicker and stiffer than the fabric it is being attached to, so the feed dogs pull the fabric faster than the rickrack. This causes the fabric to gather under the trim. Always, keep the rickrack longer than fabric. Hold back a little on the fabric and push forward on the rickrack. Another method is to use kids school glue on the back of the rickrack, position it gently, loosely on the fabric and iron it in place. No, the glue won't hurt your machine. The glue stick trick makes curves and loops easy.

The best way to sew on rickrack is to use invisible thread. Wind your bobbin only half full of invisible thread. If you try to wind it all the way full it will break the bobbin. (Voice of Experience) This thread is so fine you will have plenty on a half full bobbin. Decrease the upper thread tension. Yes, that sounds backwards. This thread stretches and it creates its own tension. I set my tension on '1'. If you get loops on the back of the stitching, first rethread the machine making sure the thread is in the tension disks. It is very easy to mis-thread with this difficult to see stuff. If loops are still forming, increase the tension, just a little bit.


Sew down the middle of the rickrack using a 5 mm stitch length. Then sew across the points, this will keep everything nailed down. The stitching won't show unless someone has their nose on the fabric. The solution for that, is to dance faster. For the 1/4 inch baby rick rack sew it on with a 5 mm wide by 5 mm long zig zag. It doesn't have to be exactly on the points, this will keep everything flat.

Consider layering rickrack. A row of baby down the center of the jumbo will make a unique combination. Rickrack can be twisted together for a new look. There are many ideas on the internet. Pintrest has dozens of flowers and embroidery combined with rickrack tutorials. The following site has a fast and easy way to make a rickrack insertion using your sewing machine. - https://weallsew.com/how-to-sew-decorative-floating-rickrack-trim-and-insertion/.

Plain or dressed up rickrack has a lot going for it. This traditional trim will look good for the life of the garment. It adds a depth to the garment surface. Consider adding rickrack to an old skirt to completely change the look of the piece. Don't turn your nose up at this flexible, easy to work with trim that can add a pop of color to your creation.












