Did You Know...?

..."a picture is worth a thousand words"? Fred R. Barnard, advertising executive, 1927 [I looked it up!]. My grandkids routinely (& bitterly) complain whenever I want to take a picture of them. But later, they look and sound excited whenever they chance upon a picture of themselves!...go figure.

Square dancers, on the other hand, usually smile or wave when someone with a camera or smartphone snaps a picture (even when they don't know who the person is that took it). Dancers whose pictures were taken at a dance seldom get to see the outcome. Why is that?

See if this not-so-fictional account resonates with you. Suppose you travel to a dance outside your own council area (already, that makes it somewhat "special"). You meet some nice people, maybe dance with a caller you've never danced to before and have a great time. You notice another dancer or two that seem to enjoy taking lots photographs during the dance (even at least one you're sure had "you" in it), but you were so busy dancing and having a good time you never thought to ask the photographer(s) his/her/their name(s) or where you might be able to get a copy or see the pictures online.

You get home and a few days afterwards you go searching for photos taken at the dance. Where do you look? Facebook???...good luck with that one! Maybe there's a Facebook page or group for the sponsoring club...nope (they don't have one). There could be some on the website for the council... nope (no website, either...couldn't find one even after searching for it). Ahhh...how about Instagram???...nope, not there either (besides, you've never used Instagram and don't plan on starting now). Yet you KNOW there were lots of pictures taken at the dance, so you don't give up hoping to find some.

A day or two later one of your "friends" on Facebook "shares" a post containing 3 pictures taken at the dance (now you're getting somewhere, but sadly none of the 3 have "you" in them). A year goes by...you're at a council dance in TimBuckTwo and lo & behold there's a really nice picture of you in one of the Historian books that come out of hiding once in a while (lucky for you, Tom Rohde finally loaded them in the car after the 3rd time Donna reminded him not to forget them!).

Congratulations! Now all you have to do is take a picture

of a picture with your smartphone and store it somewhere so you can show it to your grandkids. Good luck with "that one" too...they really don't care now...maybe later...MUCH later (but, by then, THEY won't be able to find it either)!

I'm sure by now you "get the point". It's nice to see pictures of your square dance friends but trying to find them (even when you KNOW they exist) can be challenging and frustrating.

Back in 2019 I put together a website with the intention of exclusively storing square dance pictures (and even videos) taken anywhere in WA state all in one place. I linked the site to the WA State Federation webpage as a "companion" website. But the Covid fiasco brought everything to a screeching halt. I haven't promoted the site effectively, but still feel it's "the way to go" going forward. I hope you'll take the opportunity to poke around and explore what's on the site already. It's a Work-In-Progress, so don't expect a well-oiled machine, but I think you'll come away with a pretty clear "picture" (pun intended).

Oh yeah...you just might find a picture of "YOU" on the site somewhere!

Start here: WA State Square and Round Dance Clubs Pictures (<u>squaredance-wa-pics.org</u>). Then scroll down to Statewide (Federation) Events, then select State Festivals . There's a link for every council, and below that a link for every club (needs work).

There's a link to the latest Flipbook version of Footnotes, and a link to the State Federation website. You might even try looking at Rainier Council (shameless promotion since that's where I live)...that's where you'll find the most "Content". 

We have lost three clubs in the federation this year. The following clubs have been dropped due to not completing the renewal process: Jacks & Jills and the Mavericks of the Central Puget Sound Council and the Northwest Callers Association of the Rainier Council. That leaves us with 81 clubs, and 1,913 members as of August 31, 2023, a gain of 65 members from last year.



When I was quite young, my father had one of the first telephones in our neighborhood. I remember well the polished old case fastened to the wall.

The shiny receiver

hung on the side of the box. I was too little to reach the telephone, but used to listen with fascination when my mother used to talk to it. Then I discovered that somewhere inside the wonderful device lived an amazing person – her name was Information




Please and there was nothing she did not know. Information Please could supply anybody's number and the correct time.

My first personal experience with this genie-inthe-bottle came one day while my mother was visiting a neighbor. Amusing myself at the tool bench in the basement, I whacked my finger with a hammer. The pain was terrible, but there didn't seem to be any reason in crying because there was no one home to give sympathy. I walked around the house sucking my throbbing finger, finally arriving at the stairway – the telephone!

Quickly I ran for the footstool in the parlor and dragged it to the landing. Climbing up I unhooked the

receiver and held it to my ear. Information Please I said into the mouthpiece just above my head. A



"Isn't your mother home?" came the question. "Nobody's home but me" I blubbered. "Are you bleeding?" "No," I replied. "I hit my finger with the hammer and it hurts." "Can you open your icebox?" she asked. I said I could. "Then chip off a little piece of ice and hold it to your finger." After that I called Information Please for everything. I asked her for help

with my geography and she told me where Philadelphia was. She helped me with my math, and she told me my pet chipmunk I had caught in the park just the day before would eat fruits and nuts. And there was the time that Petey, our pet canary died. I called Information Please and told her the sad story. She listened, then said



the usual things grown-ups say to soothe a child. But I was unconsoled. Why is it that birds should sing so beautifully and bring joy to all families, only to end up as a heap of feathers, feet up, on the bottom of a cage? She must have sensed my deep concern, for she said quietly, "Paul, always remember that there are other worlds to sign in." Somehow, I felt better. Another day I was on the telephone. "Information Please." "Information," said the now familiar voice. "How do you spell fix?" I asked. All this took place in a small town in the pacific Northwest.

Then when I was 9 years old, we moved across the country to Boston. I missed my friend very much. Information Please belonged in that old wooden box back home, and I somehow never thought of trying the tall, shiny new phone that sat on the hall table. Yet as I


.A few years later, on my way west to college, my plane put down in Seattle. I had about half an hour or

so between planes, and I spent 15 minutes or so on the phone with my sister, who lived there now. Then without thinking what I was doing, I dialed my hometown operator and said, "Information Please". Miraculously, I heard again the small, clear voice I knew so well, "Information." I



hadn't planned this but I heard myself saying, "Could you tell me please how to spell fix?" There was a long pause. Then came the soft-spoken answer, "I guess that your finger must have healed by now." I laughed, "So, it's really still you," I said. "I wonder if you have any idea how much you meant to me during that time." "I wonder," she said, "if you know how much your calls meant to me. I never had any children, and I used to look forward to your calls." I told her how often I had thought of her over the years and I asked if I could call her again when I came back to visit my sister. "Please do, just ask for Sally." Just three months later I was back in Seattle. . . A different voice answered Information and I asked for Sally. "Are you a friend?" "Yes, a very old friend." "Then I'm sorry to have to tell you. Sally has been working part-time the past few years because she was sick. She died five weeks ago." But before I could hang up she said, "Wait a minute. Did you say your name was Paul?" "Yes." "Well, Sally left a message for you. She wrote it down. Here it is. I'll read it. 'Tell him I still say there are other worlds to sing in. He'll know what I mean." I thanked her and hung up. I did know what Sally meant.

CIRCULATING THOUGHTS

I am going to start this month by asking everyone a question.

"As a dancer what part of your body is the most important for you to be a successful dancer and why?? Here is a list of what I think will be the most common responses:

My brain that helps me to help me remember the movements.

My ears that allow me to hear the music and the caller's commands.

My legs that help me get to the right place when I am dancing.

My feet that help me dance one step to every beat of the music.

My arms to help me execute moves like California Twirl etc.

My hands are used on almost every move in square dancing.

Of those six possible answers I believe your hands are the most important. Let me explain why I think that. From the very beginning of our dance experience, we are told to "take hands" with your partner. We are also told that anytime we are standing beside someone, regardless of gender, we should take their hand. Why is this important? Because our hands always tell our brain the location of the rest of our body. Some would contend that our eyes tell us body location. They do, but the sense of touch is much faster in determining location.

When I teach new dancers, I constantly remind them to touch hands with the person beside them – even if it is only for a split second, which will tell your brain where you are. That is very important in our activity because of the quick amount of time dancers need to determine where they are and where they need to go next.

As a dancer, either experienced or brand new, the next time you dance make a conscious effort to touch hands with the person who is next to you. If they don't offer their hand, touch it anyway to help them understand how important that is to your dancing.

Notice that I use the term "take hands" but it's really "touch hands." Take hands indicate hold the person's hand – when all that is needed is a light touching of the hands. That brings me to the discussion about hand use in turning movements, especially ocean waves. Because of multiple turns in opposite directions your hands must be able to change positions quickly. I teach my dancers to have their palms touch without gripping the hand. I also tell them to do "hand touches," not "hand holds that place your thumb over the back of the person's hand.

Let me finish by saying that all the parts I listed in the beginning are important because without any one of them learning to square dance would be a challenge. The hands are what brings them all together.

CUER'S THOUGHTS FROM DAN BAILLY

Hello everyone sorry we didn't get anything in last month. This time I would like to talk about basic round dance figures in general we have an organization (Round A Lab) that has worked at the standardization of them so that each figure is hopefully taught the same--where ever you take lessons.

Over the years, there have been modifications made to some of the steps to keep them up to date with the times or easier to dance. Having said that, some modifications have been learned or incorporated to deal with limitations dancers need due to ailing issues. For example, I learned three different ways to do a whip turn in West coast swing, first one was due to my skill level, then another way because that different way improved the movement for me and my dance partner, and the third way was due

to health issues I developed recently.

It's nice to get instruction from several different people as we don't all explain the figures the same way even though it is the same figure; one teacher may say something that clicks for you or maybe just having someone else say it makes you more comfortable with the figure. The more comfortable dancers are with a figure, it helps blend to or make it easier to move from one figure to another. Be sure to ask any cuer teacher if you don't know or understand a move or sequence. I'm certain that many would gladly help anyone learn our activity. Till next time, and we hope you are enjoying the holidays.

Planes, Trains, Automobiles, Bus and Boat

Here are the many ways to travel to Milwaukee, WI so you can enjoy the 73rd National Square Dance Convention[®]:







By plane, you can fly into the Milwaukee Mitchell International Airport (MKE), only 12 minutes (7.8 miles) from our convention site. At the airport there are several options to travel to the convention site, public transportation, Uber, and taxi services. Check your local airlines that travel to Milwaukee, WI.



You can fly into Chicago and take the Amtrak or a bus to Milwaukee as an option. We had several committee members travel this way for our pre-convention. There is bus service from Chicago O'Hare and Midway airports to the train & bus terminals in Chicago.

By train and bus, Milwaukee has the Milwaukee Intermodal Station. The station is 0.3 miles from the Hilton Milwaukee City Center Hotel. You can schedule your train ride by visiting; www.amtrak.com. If traveling by bus, look up your local area bus service providers, and let others do the driving.



By Boat, you can cut across Lake Michigan by using the Lake Express High-Speed Ferry. There are 3 departures daily for a 2.5-hour "short cut" across Lake Michigan from Muskegon, MI, to Milwaukee, WI. This is a great way to avoid the Chicago area traffic and get some relaxing time before arriving in Milwaukee. There are one- way and round-trip options for the ferry and the cost is moderate. The trip is 80 miles long from the Muskegon Terminal at 1918 Lakeshore Drive to the Milwaukee terminal at 2330 S. Lincoln Memorial Drive. This option is extremely popular and sells out quickly, so get your tickets soon if you are interested! Go to: www.lake-express.com, for further information, pricing, and reservations.

GETTING AROUND: Both of our hotels are connected to the Baird Center by enclosed, climate- controlled skywalks.


Our facilities are within easy walking distance of many restaurants and attractions. Public transit can take you almost anywhere around the Milwaukee area for a low fee.







The 4 weeks allow us to easily make room to have a "tweener" dance. Tweener is a new word to invite the square dancers to an extra dance between Christmas and New Years. It was December 19 and boy we had fun!

December put me in mind of past Square Dancing after WWII. The number of dancers increased dramatically as huge numbers of Americans got housing, marriages, children, and jobs. This group, about 1955 and onward, needed to find social groups for adults and teens. Square dancing was the answer for many families. Note: the Skagit Squares was formed 73 years ago and built 3 dance floors at the Skagit Fairgrounds to accommodate dances. How many dancers were normal? 30 squares!

The caravan chairperson had to limit the number of caravan dancers going to the other target dance halls.

The normal social event is dancing and then serving a hot dinner to the members and visitors. In about 1980, the "finger food" was invented to accommodate the increased number of working men and women dancers. It is my belief that food be returned as it can add more social activity for the club and its visitors. More social activity means more members.

I would have the Square Dance board of directors add more social events to their club activities. An example from me follows. At 6:00 PM dancers and visitors meet at a place away from the dance floor when possible. I would have arranged to have a cookie or ice cream tasting event. The winner is the person that finds the cookie that has a black berry inside of their cookie or ice cream. Coffee, tea, and water are served as well. 6:30 PM round dancing, 7:00pm to 10 PM. Rounds between the tips.






