## SYNAPSES FROM JANUARY STATE MEETING



Corresponding Secretary, Lu Simmons mentioned that Roger Mahon is healing. Scott & Shirley Marriner hope to be at both Leadership and the 2017 Festival. They asked that the gift to them, as Editors of Footnotes, (\$200) be donated to the Timothy Dale Boggs Memorial Fund.

Margaret Kiser reported that Leadership has Keynote Speaker Craig Abercrombie for 2017 with Bill Reid & Mary Parson will be calling & cueing. In 2018 Steve Noseck will be the Keynote Speaker and in 2019 Gary Shumake. At this point 26 are registered, with 8 RV sites reserved. Registration forms should be at each hall within each Council and at Circle 8. This summer Saturday's lunch will be provided by the 2018 Festival; and NEW: the evening meal will be a POTLUCK at 5:00 in "The Meadow".

**2017 State Festival** - Mike Seastrom and T.J. (Bruce) Chadd will be caller and cuer. RV and lodging information, as well as Registration forms are available on the 2017 Festival website http://www.2017wa-statefestival.com and in Footnotes online. Ways & Means were listed, and encouragement given for Councils to advertise in the Program Book. Idaho's Festival will be held in Wallace June 9-10 with Scot & Erin Byars; Wednesday is Dancing on the Boat at Lake Coeur d'Alene (with Dan Preedy and Adam Christman), Thursday's Trail-In dance (at the Fairgrounds) is Sponsored by Spokane Council, with Steve Noseck and Kevin Thomaier calling.

**2018 State Festival** is on track with caller and cuer; there will be a clogging hall available.

2019 State Festival is scheduled for June 21-22 at Puyallup Fair with Ghost Riders headlining "Rainier Rendezvous" with Charlie Robertson and Don Wood. They have 300 RV sites.

**Finance & Audit** has received the Treasurer's books to audit today. Last year's State Festival, Leadership and Heritage Center will be audited for May's meeting.

**Heritage Center** has revised their donation and memorial forms - they are available on website.

**Historian** - Big thank you to Kruse and Curriers for pictures, fliers and articles. Take a look at the books in the back. Thanks to Brooms for making the scrapbooks.

**Publications** - Kay Mahan reported that Mini-Caller Lab received three grants; one for \$1,400 was refunded (not used). Roger recently had a stroke.

**Publicity** - Lane confirmed a full page ad will appear in NEC online publication January - May.

**BMI/ASCAP** - Bruce read a report about SESAC, which he just learned about. Tom Tomlinson said Rounda-Lab is covered through SESAC but may need to see if it can be favorable.

**NEC** report was given by Don & Cheryl Pruitt on Cincinnati June 21-14, 2017. Purple People Bridge, American Kings Wednesday's special event and The Ark Encounter (NEW).

**Good of the Order:** Cheryl Pruitt announced the pre-registration forms available for upcoming 2017-2020 Conventions.

Don Pruitt mentioned Poulsbo Promenaders are honoring Vietnam Era Vets 50th (1964-75). Jim Raupp and Joyce Sebree will be calling/cueing at KSDC.

## Dear Editor

Although we have been involved with square dancing in Seattle area for many years, we decided to attend our first State Federation meeting in January. We found it very informative. We appreciate all the effort that the Federation officers, committee chairmen, delegates, and members put forth at these meetings and we thank you for your hard work to keep square dancing alive in Washington.

Every year we hear of more clubs folding. The same dancers end up being club officers, and after a while, clubs cannot get new officers. The clubs then look to their callers to keep the clubs going. There are callers willing to take on the clubs, but because of the Federation By-Laws the clubs can no longer be part of the Federation. We are noticing that more caller-run clubs or caller-sponsored events are popping up. If the State Federation has their eyes on the horizon, maybe it should start taking steps to recognize and/or include caller-run clubs in the Federation. Many of these caller-run clubs have independent dancers that have

long been forgotten by the Federation. It may also be a way to grow Federation membership.

Perhaps the "caller-run" clubs defeat the original purpose of including only Non-Profit clubs, as defined in the By-Laws, in the Federation. But times have changed in the past 63 years, and we all are adjusting as best we can to the declining numbers. The electronic Footnotes is a great step forward in providing all square dancers, both Federated and Independents, throughout the state a way to share ideas and club news with each other in this activity we all love.






## WILD WILLY'S FOOD FOR THOUGHT! Bill & Neva Reid

Calling is all about the Dancers enjoying our favorite sport and Dancers will be creative when they get bored. Central Oregon Dancers do their own routine when 'square thru four' is called. They shared with me that a 'National Caller' got upset with them for doing it, but what the heck, they were having a good time, and that's what it's all about.

The New Year provides an opportunity to refocus our energies on our favorite contact sport! We will survive these lean times, so keep on dancing, and keep inspiring those around you to join the greatest activity for having fun and gaining new friendships.

## **Ladies Dancing Together**

**T**atching the floor last weekend I noticed four women dancing alone to a dance I was cueing. It occurred to me that they would have a lot more fun if they were dancing together. I learned to do the lead years ago when I first started cueing so that I could be a better teacher but I think it could hold benefits for other single ladies willing to try it. I'm not being sexist. Men dance alone too, but generally they are a lot less shy about asking a lady to dance. It is always desirable to have a partner, but for some reason a lot of women are reluctant to have their husbands dancing with someone else. That leads to the silly situation of a bunch of women out on the floor dancing alone. That is better than nothing but it is hard to do certain moves alone. A pivot for example is best done with the momentum of two people. First of all when you dance alone you tend to wander a bit because a great deal of it is done backwards and you can't see where you are going. You also tend to cut corners and get mixed up if you are

facing the wall which direction you are going. This can lead to running over people. Now learning to dance the lead if you are a women, means more than just changing feet. You have to retrain your brain. Women learn to automatically convert the directions she hears such as Left mean Right and Forward means back etc. Now the Cuer is talking to you, so you go the direction cued. Sounds simple but it always takes me a minute or so to regroup my brain and stop double converting things. Once I'm locked into it, I really enjoy it. I like leading but sometimes my husband thinks he's supposed to do it. "MEN" really, where do they get that idea from? If this sounds even slightly interesting I strongly suggest you go through class angeling a new lady student. You will both be learning and it will come naturally later on. That way you'll never dance alone.

# The Meaning of Ease

E ase is the amount of extra fabric in the garment that makes it bigger than the body measurements. Fitting ease allows for normal movement, as in office work. Design ease is the extra amount for style and vigorous activity. There are different amounts of ease in different places.

Sheath dresses such as McCalls 7279, Butterick 5627, and Vogue 1004 are also called slopers and muslins. They are American pattern industry standards for size. They have fitting ease. Designers for pattern companies start with these shapes. They add wide skirts and puffy sleeves but cannot make them smaller than these measurements for the size.

The back of a pattern envelope will describe the amount of ease as:

Closely fitted = 0 - 3 inches - Think of a strapless evening gown and blue jeans. Swimsuits and leggings have minus ease, they are smaller than the body.

Fitted = 3 to 4 inches - A little bigger than the body measurement to allow movement and some design changes. Designed to allow you to reach and move but have a slim silhouette. Sheath dresses are fitted. Wearing a sheath dress you should be able to drive your car.

Semi-fitted = 4 to 5 inches - A blouse or street dress. Designed for daily activity. You should be able to square dance in this blouse.

Loose fitting = 5 to 8 inches - Pajamas and bowling shirts.

Very loose fitting = over 8 inches - Bathrobes and haram pants.

Part of ease is how you like your clothes. Do you work in an office wearing tailored suits? Do you work in an art store and wear painting smocks and prairie skirts? Either way is correct. It depends on your style and your situation.

On some envelopes it will give a range of sizes, such as - Medium 38 - 40. Keep in mind that it is really size 40. If you are closer in measurement to the 38 and the style says loose fitting you may want to get a size Small 34 - 36. If it says fitted stay with the Medium. Seams are always easier to take in than to let out. Changing the type of fabric from those recommended on the pattern envelope will greatly effect the ease and the fit. Most patterns designed for woven fabric can be made in knits if the knit is fairly stable and does not sag. Most patterns designed for knits CANNOT be made with woven fabrics because they do not stretch.

Making a practice garment before cutting the expensive yardage will cost time but save money and frustration. The practice garment must be of fabric that has about the same weight and feel as the good stuff. Purchase

inexpensive yardage and keep it on hand for practice garments. Only buy fabric in colors that you like. Life is too short to sew on ugly fabric.

Use all of the best techniques and make a practice garment just as if you were planning to wear it. It if comes out all right, you have an extra garment. If it comes out all wrong, figure out what the problem is and adjust the pattern. If it can't be fixed, get rid of the evidence and the pattern.

The practice garment is where a new technique or sewing notion can be tried. There is more than one way to



sew most anything. The instructions in the pattern may be confusing or you may like doing things a different way. The practice garment will take care of these problems.

Before you purchase a pattern look it over carefully. Read the back of the envelope. When you get this garment finished, where are you going to wear it? Does it fit your life style? Are you going to spend 20 hours making a dress you are only going to wear once? Maybe it would be more cost effective to buy a dress for this occasion. Place a piece of paper over the models face in the pattern book. She is smiling at you and telling you how happy you would be in this outfit. Remove her face and you can focus on the body. Will this design work with or against your body contours? Look at the line art on the envelope. This is better than the photograph for showing the seam lines.

You are going to spend money, time and creative energy on this project. Careful research and planning will make success more likely and the rewards greater.

The the theme was Under the Sea. Cynda Clark along with her decorating committee out did them selfs this year.


