
Holly (Paul) Gonseth (Central Area Council)

By the time you read this, all the club treasurers should have received the INDIVIDUAL membership renewals through email from us for the 2017-2018 dance season. We are doing this process through email instead of snail mail. Returning this information back to us will still have to be done via snail mail because you will be sending us a check. If you are a club treasurer and you have not received this individual membership renewal from us by the time you read this article, please let us know. This email includes your club membership list, invoice, and instructions and is sent to the club treasurers we have on file. If you receive this email and you are not the current club treasurer, please pass it on to the club treasurer. We will email you your club membership list along with the invoice and instructions and we are emphasizing that we want you to print your club membership list as emailed to you, make the necessary corrections on that list, and return it to us with the invoice and check. Remember the deadline for returning this information along with your check is May 31, 2017.

We can only input what you give us. PLEASE make sure your zip codes are correct (we have found as many as three different zip codes for the same person at the same address), your addresses are correct (we have found different numbers for the same person on the same street address along with NE and NW, SE and SW, etc), and the names are spelled correctly (especially name changes caused by marriage and divorce). Errors diminish the effectiveness of our database and make it nearly impossible to verify an individual's membership. Please spend a little more time proofreading (fix the typos)!

Footnotes - February 1952

As some of you know, we moved

from The Dalles, Oregon to Joseph, Oregon not so long ago. We are now finding/making time to go through boxes of 'stuff' that we did not immediately need. Most of the 'stuff' will probably be given to charity, some will go to the 'dump', and there is some that we just can't part with.

In one of the boxes of 'stuff', we found an issue of Footnotes dated February 1952. That was some 65 years ago, and before they had added 'Square' to the name of the Federation. Back then it was 'The Folk Dance Federation of Washington'. What is remarkable is that some of the challenges they were addressing in the articles of that publication are the same issues we face today.

The Editorial, written by Donald Mills, concerned attracting youth to the dance activity. He begins by stating, "Every cause or movement which hopes for a future must make its appeal to youth. However interesting and worthy the enthusiasms of one generation may be, unless they are shared by the young people coming up, they will be interred with the bones of the oldsters." I think we would all agree that without new life there will not be continuance of existence, whether you're talking dancing, or anything else. Let's not go the way of the dinosaurs.

He explained the reasons that youth in 1952 were not attracted to the activity as follows: "The current revival of the American folk dance, along with its international counterparts, has, for certain obvious reasons, left a large proportion of our youth rather cold. For one thing, many have met it first as girls' physical education. Basically, that's not bad. But treated as curricular exercise, along with calisthenics, its appealing social values are often overlooked. Furthermore, its social use requires boys. The male seems hard enough to trap at best, and when totally inept boys are paired with carefully trained girls, the situation becomes psychologically impossible. In addition, the prevalent association of the folk dance with a "hillbilly" locale, often fostered by regrettable radio programs, brands it as pure corn, and definitely not "the thing to do". Interesting!

Until I read this Editorial, I thought that the disconnect with youth was a problem that started occurring during the late 50s and 60s. Many schools at that time had incorporated square dancing as part of the curriculum that all were required to participate in and that many disliked. We drew that conclusion from the many comments we have heard like "oh, I did that in grade school and didn't like it". The additional disconnect may have been that square dancing continued to use what was labeled as 'square dance music', while many

of the youth were enjoying Rock & Roll.

Other articles that were included in this 1952 Footnotes that are still apropos today are "Variety in Your Squares" by Joe Rantz, and "Square Dancing for Your Health" by Charles "Chuck" Schultz.

Youth - Make Them the Priority

The message today, as it was many years ago, is 'attract youth to the activity'. My two cents, for what it's worth, is for the Federation, Councils, Clubs, Callers, Cuers, and Dancers to give renewed efforts and priority to the youth. Let's establish avenues for youth to be involved not only with the present but with the future of square dancing. Get the youth engaged by giving them a voice, and don't just give them lip service, but react positively to changes needed to attract and persuade their friends and classmates to participate and enjoy our wonderful activity.

Please, please send me your recommendations for the Almon F. Parker Inspirational Award. The protocol for selection and a listing of past recipients of the award can be found on the website of the Square & Folk Dance Federation of Washington at www.squaredance-wa.org. We've had only a few recommendations thus far, and there are a whole lot of callers out there that have not been recognized for their contribution to our wonderful activity. If perhaps you submitted a recommendation in the past that was not selected, please send me an update. That way your favorite can be considered again, otherwise they cannot be considered.

Washington Round of the Month

Tt seems we are at a crossroads for the Washington Round L of the Month. In the beginning when rounds were memorized we needed it to teach a dance everyone could dance when we all got together at State dances or traveled to other clubs in our area. Now we all dance to cues and with minimal instruction, can dance most any dance tossed at us. When we used records everyone had to buy a record to play it. Now we use computers with MP3 files that can be downloaded making it much easier and cheaper to get the music we need but that also makes it easier to share music. It is illegal to share music so we are obligated to own a copy to play it at a dance. Unfortunately we don't always do that and the music police are after us trying to catch us out and levy large fines. I cannot afford a large fine for sharing music and will not do so. That makes it harder to evaluate a dance if all you have is a cue sheet. The good news is music downloads are easy and the participation in WROM has become very low. Changes come with time and Roundalab has been trying to figure out a solution for over a year. Maybe they

will find an answer at this year's Roundalab convention. Until that happens we may need to hold the WROM program and wait for a full decision to continue it. That is a shame because it is quite an honor to the choreographer to get a Round of the Month Certificate. We get nothing for writing a dance, there are no copyrights, and most of the time we never hear who wrote our favorite dances when they are cued. That being said there are numerous web sites that have cue sheets freely uploaded by choreographers willing to share their talents to make our activity more fun. I think I may have stirred up some of the delegates to participate more. At least the current response is good so I will try again next month and see how it goes.

A Space of Your Own

Many women say they don't have space for a sewing area. Amazingly, they have all managed to find space for a computer desk they didn't have ten years ago. Finding space depends on the value that you place on the object and the activity. Why are computers valued more than sewing machines?

Papers, pens and post-it notes can cover the computer area. Why can't patterns, pins and thread be left in plain site on the sewing table? Sewing is an art form. Some artist paint pictures. Do they hid everything away every time they take a break? Why is sewing devalued as an artistic creation. As if fabric projects and accomplishments are not as worthy as those of other artists. Stitchers are their own worst critics.

Keeping the sewing machine in the closet is the worst obstacle to sewing. Hauling that heavy thing out to the dining room to set up on a table that is the wrong height is hard on your back and shoulders. The chandelier lighting causes eyestrain and headaches. The improper chair is bad for your knees and hips. Then you have to put it all away for the next meal. You need to have a space to pursue your hobby in comfort.

The book *Dream Sewing Spaces* by Lynette Ranney Black is the perfect guide for anyone who is looking to make a sewing area in their home. It has design ideas for every size space from a closet to a garage. Included in the instructions are suggestions for light and electrical outlets. Once there is a space to sew, you can take advantage of every spare minute.

The book *10-20-30 Minutes to Sew* by Nancy Zieman is an organizational guide that will help you find sewing time. Even if you just do one seam it will give you a spark of creative satisfaction. That is one seam closer to your new dance dress. It is very hard to find all day to sew but it is easy to chop the project into manageable pieces and sew a few minutes at a time.

If your sewing machine is over 15 years old consider getting a new one. Just like cars, the gears and motors can wear out. Many women are reluctant to give up their old machine because it has been a fun toy that they are familiar with. I sold a machine to a friend and she left it at the shop after a class because she had another class in a couple of days. She thought she could use her old machine at home. She called me late that night and said the old machine was like driving a truck, with standard transmission, and flat tires, on a dirt road, in the rain.

Over and over I have heard women say, "I don't sew enough to justify getting a new machine." Have you ever heard men say "I don't hunt/fish/camp enough to justify getting a new rifle/boat/tent."? To tell the truth it is not the fault of the guys. Several times I have seen husbands buy a new sewing machine for their wife because they can see that she would like one with the new features.


Buying a machine is a costly investment. When looking for a new sewing machine or serger there are a few basic things to check.

Number One - Service after the sale. It may be a great machine but something could go wrong. Where is the service done and what is the usual turn around time? What is the warrantee? Get the service contract in writing.

Number Two - Instructions/ Classes. With the new computerized machines it takes more than a couple of classes to learn all of the things that it can do. If you are not using all of the features of the new machine you are not getting our money's worth.. Once you learn that the fancy stuff is as easy as pushing a couple of buttons you will use it.

Number Three - Test Drive. Once you find a machine that has the features and is in the price rang you are interested in sew on it. Don't just watch the sales clerk sew. Bring some fabric of different weights and types. Are the buttons in a place you find convenient? They will be different than your old machine but that might be better. Feel the vibration and listen to the motor. Test drive several brands of machines until you find the one that suits your style.

Sewing is a creative activity. If you get enjoyment out of playing with fabric - then sew. The possibilities are endless and the rewards are artistic satisfaction and personal accomplishment.



66TH NATIONAL SOUARE DANCE CONVENTION® June 21-24, 2017



The **Ghost Riders** will be appearing at the 66th National Square Dance Convention[®]. They are a live band from California. They have been playing at square dances and conventions since 1972 and have been featured in sixteen National Conventions. The band is mad us almost entirely of square dancers turned musicians.

A little History on the Ghost Riders

Back in the old days, musicians didn't quite understand

the band perform at a local hoedown and found himself hanging around the stage. Hal soon asked if Dan was a musician and then asked him if he would be interested in coming to a rehearsal. Dan did, and soon joined the band. Kay dropped out but Hal's wife, Nancy, returned home from college and became the drummer. Soon after that Jim had to guit because of a work transfer and the band was back to 4 members. In 1972, Hal was moving to Mack,

the sixteen measure concepts (and many still don't) and how to change a regular country western tune to something a caller could work with. In 1969 Mr. Hal Langer, a square dancer, was interested in square dancing to live bands, but he knew that every time he had a chance to, it was a disaster. Well after a lot of soul searching, Hal came up with the perfect idea of starting his own band!



He understood that he couldn't use regular musicians

so he thought, what about square dancers? Hey, that's the ticket, they know the calls, they understand square dancing and all he had to do was teach them how to play an instrument. No problem! All he had to do was teach some people that knew all about square dancing and nothing about playing music--- RIGHT! Sure, that's all.

Well, that's just what he did. They formed a four-piece band and called it the "Ghost Town Echo." Hal played banjo and took the leadership role on for the band. Dorrie, Hal's sister played bass guitar, Jim Starr played guitar, and Kay played fiddle. There was no drummer but the banjo kept a pretty good rhythm. It worked real well and mostly had a bluegrass sound. A few months later, Dan Bright saw Colorado, to pursue his career in science. Hal called Dan and asked if he would like to keep the band going. After pondering it for awhile Dan asked how would that be possible? Hal said, same way I did, get square dancers, teach them to play, and have fun. Well, Dan did just that. The Ghost Riders Square-dance band was formed. The logo (Ghost on the horse holding a guitar) was designed by Bert Swerer, a square dance caller. Before Hal

Left, He impressed on Dan Bright, number one-- A Live Square Dance Band was the future, and number two-- The ghost logo had to be the focus instead of the band or any one person. Dan, like an Olympian runner picked up the torch and ran, and man did he! He found four square dancers. One was a drummer named John Moore. The next two dancers were a father and son team, which Dan taught to play guitar. Aron Schneider learned to keep a strong rhythm on his guitar while his son Rudy laid a strong foundation on bass. to round it all off, Dan found a dancer out of Martinez, Calif., Named Gary Spence whom he taught how to play piano. A Band was formed! And keeping with Hal's wishes, Dan called the Band --- The Ghost Riders---.
