




Varying categories and provided, ranging from and the award structure is a maximum of recognition level.



HONEST RULES FOR THE OLD GAME

It is hard to believe it is already May. We hope you have had as much fun this year as we have. Classes are full and dances well attended. Square and Round Dancing is the greatest activity we know of. Marie and I firmly believe that it keeps you young at heart and is one of the best mental activities we can do as we get older.

This month I would like to have a discussion with dancers, callers and cuers alike. Recently it dawned on me that I have been calling for 34 years. There are many callers out there that have been calling even longer. Suffice it to say, we are not going to last forever. I, for one, have an agreement with my wife Marie. We are in agreement that when it is time to retire from calling if I don't recognize the signs, she will let me know. I have known callers and cuers who, for one reason or another, have tried to continue even though their skill sets have degraded. This will happen to all of us at one point or another. That begs the question, what do we do to keep the activity we all love alive?

In my opinion, the answer is to support the new callers and cuers in your area. There are roles for callers, cuers and dancers alike. For established callers and cuers, this support goes beyond allowing these new folks to call or cue a tip at your dance. We need to do what we can to help the new callers and cuers understand choreography, floor savvy, music awareness and the list goes on. Take a new caller or cuer under your wing and help them.

For dancers, there are several things you can do to help. First of all, when they are calling or cuing a guest tip, get up and dance to the new callers. They may not be the best or the smoothest you have ever danced to, but with time they can become the teachers callers and cuers of the future. Be honest with them when you speak to them about their performance. It is possible to be honest without being brutal. Secondly, is what I like to call an "adopt a caller or cuer program". A new caller or cuer needs dancers to practice with. As a dancer, get four couples and offer to help these new callers and cuers improve their skills. The most common issue new callers and cuers speak about is that they do not have dancers to practice with. Perhaps you can invite them to your home for a session. Keep in mind, they are our future.

For the new caller or cuer: Yours is a daunting task. I have known many 16 | FOOTNOTES

people in my time that initially thought calling was all about doing a singing call. That is the furthest thing from the truth. It is not necessary to be a fabulous singer to be a great caller. The real effort is learning patter and learning to teach. Understanding choreography, flow, timing and gaining a sense of what your audience can and cannot do is paramount. Mastering these skills will begin to let you know what to call, when to call it and how to call it. The other thing you and your significant other must be aware of is COMMITMENT! If you truly want to become a caller or a cuer, you will make a commitment of time and resources. Many things will be put on the back burner. Vacations and outings will give way to workshops, classes and equipment. If you are only interested in standing on stage holding a mic, calling and/or cueing is most likely not for you. You must also realize this commitment will impact family life. These are all decisions you must make if you truly want to become a caller or cuer. Keep in mind; if four couples adopt you, you need to commit to them. The other thing new callers and cuers need to realize is that often times, dancers will, in an effort to be kind, give you all kinds of positive reinforcement. They will tell you how good you were. This is wonderful; however, most of the time it's higher praise than you have actually earned. Listen to your spouse or significant other. Those are the people that will truly be honest with you. I can tell you after all these years; Marie is still my worst critic and best friend. She tells me the truth. I am not certain I listen as well as I should, but I try.

There's one other thing I would like to mention this month. I know that we have all lost dancers and callers/cuers that have meant a lot to us and the activity recently. Please let your callers/cuers/dancers know they are appreciated. We and the activity need them. We never know how long we'll have to enjoy each other and need to make the most with the time we have. Be sure to give a yellow rock every chance you get. It's not just a hug, it's a way to say "You're important and I'm glad you're here."

That's all for this month, we hope to see many of you at the State Festival in Mt Vernon.

Thread Barf

That is the technical term we used in the sewing machine repair shop when a machine was brought in completely jammed with thread and fabric down into the hole of the needle plate. Most of the time the only way to fix the problem was to remove the needle plate and cut the fabric away. Not only does this ruin the piece of fabric, a jam can damage the machine.

The wad of thread and fabric can force the timing and the alignment out of order. It often breaks the needle sending flying needle parts in your direction. Breaking a needle is a sign that something is very wrong. Every stitcher has had this problem at some time. There are several reason this occurs.

The needle is dull and/or bent. Instead of piercing the fabric it pokes it down into the hole. Needles are only good for 8 to 10 hours of sewing. They pass through the fabric about 5,000 times in an hour. Just because they aren't broken doesn't mean they are sharp. Only use Schmetz brand needles. They are more expensive than the others because they are better and they are worth the investment.

The wrong type of needle was being used. A universal needle will not sew well on microfiber or lycra. If the needle does not have the correct point and groove, the thread will not

be pulled back by the take up lever. It will leave loops of thread on the back and jam. There are many more types of needles on the market, because there are many more types of fabric. The size and type of the needle are important.

The wrong type of thread was being used. I worked on one machine that was jammed because she was trying to use a thread labeled for quilting. That thread was for hand quilting not for machine piecing fabric together. It was glazed and too thick and stiff for machine sewing. The thread must be designed for machine sewing and must be the right size for the eye of the needle.

Old and/or cheap thread. After all the money you spent on fabric and all of the time cutting it out this is not the place to get stingy. Poor quality thread has slubs which catch in the needle eye and the tension disks. It has weak spots that break and it leaves a lot of fuzz in the machine.

The needle hole is too wide. My new machine is great, because it has a 9mm wide stitch. I can make wonderful designs. My new machine is horrid, because that 9mm wide hole likes to eat fabric. Especially the softer, finer stuff. The answer is to use a straight stitch needle plate. As the name implies you can only sew straight seams with this plate in

position. It has a small round hole so fabric can not be jammed into it. Read the instruction manual carefully when using a straight stitch needle plate If the machine does not have a safety lock option, put a large piece of blue tape over the controls so that the stitch can not be accidentally changed. Most quilters use this plate to keep their small pieces from being eaten by the machine.

The take up lever was not in the top position when starting and/or the thread ends got pulled down into the bobbin area because they were not held securely. See last month's article on back stitching.

If the machine starts to jam, stop sewing, unplug the machine and and start cutting threads. A hobby knife or a scalpel works well in this tight space. Use a pair of needle nose pliers or hemostats to pull out all of the bits. While you have the needle plate off vacuum the machine and brush the toe jam out of the feed dogs. Give it a drop of oil according to the instruction manual, to put it in a better mood. Insert a brand new needle. The jam bent and dulled the needle. I know, it looks OK to you. Just don't come crying to me when it jams again in a couple of minutes.

remove the needle plate. If the plate

won't pop up, open the bobbin door

Go get a cup of tea and a cookie, then your sewing will go much better. This is suppose to be fun. If you are frustrated it is time to take a break and sew again tomorrow.



Also in March, we donated our time helping F.I.S.H. (http://fishvancouver. org/), by sorting 26,000 pounds of food donated by the annual "Walk & Knock" campaign (http://walkandknock.org/). When F.I.S.H. receives that food, it is randomly packed in cardboard cartons. The donated food needs to be sorted into 20+ classifications and then re-packed into cartons for use by the distribution center. More than 20 Happy Hoppers showed up to help on each of 2 days. It's a bit of a madhouse with folks carrying food from the table where the unsorted boxes are opened to the various classification stations. That's where our experience as square dancers was most helpful. There were plenty of opportunities for collisions, but our well-developed "radar" came into play. I'm proud to report that no one was injured, at least not seriously.

Our weekly square dance lessons are now on summer vacation. Lessons will pick up again on Monday, September 7th.

As usual, we will hold two club dances in May, on the first and third Saturday evening, at the Clark County Square Dance Center. The May 16th dance will feature an Ice Cream Social at the break. You don't want to miss that one!






