A Solo Primer

Spring has arrived, bringing to dancers everywhere the anticipation for a long, sunny season of festivals, conventions and special dances.

Locally, Olympia Area Square Dancers, Inc. hold a whiz bang five day event, our Memorial Campout. It's a celebration of hard work, newly graduated dancers, and a wide variety of events and dance levels, bringing everyone an opportunity to dance, dance, dance, while raising muchneeded funds to support our great hall.

As solo dancers, it may be intimidating to attend a large event such as this one, or the upcoming State Festival in June, held in Longview. One natural confidence builder is to arrange with your local solos to share the drive, share motel costs, and have the moral support of your friends. Gender of your group is unimportant. Approach dancers you enjoy, even if you haven't really connected as buddies yet. You'll be amazed how grateful many will be to be included in plans.

When you arrive at your chosen venue and check in, ask what the policy is for solo dancers. In our area, you'll be dancing with many seasoned solo dancers. We invite solos to come into a square, hold up their hand and you will have a partner in no time. If there's a shortage of guys, we've been known to form an all-woman square, which is not only giddy fun, but strengthens your dancing skills. We have several guys who enjoy filling in the girl's position, when needed.

The Washington State Festival, a MUST for new dancers and an OF COURSE for us long timers, is much more flexible than years ago, but being a larger event, it takes a little more energy to match up with other solos. When you send in your registration, be sure to indicate you're a solo and there will be a SOLO ribbon waiting for you at the registration desk.

They may, or may not, have the old Hitching Post, the area where solos hang out, hoping for a partner. My recommendation is to go to the hall you want to dance in, depending on your level of dance. Hopefully, you're exploring this event with a buddy or two, so you will have more fun, be less intimidated and if you haven't run into other solos and asked about partnering for the next tip, you'll be bold and get in a square with each other. The last option should only be done if one, or both, of you has a strong command of both dance positions, boy and girl (Belle and Beau).

know you, square up near the caller stand, and it doesn't hurt to mention to the caller that you're solo and he'll help fill your square. I've mentioned in earlier columns that all dancers are grateful to be

that all dancers are grateful to be invited to dance. I've been solo off and on since the 1970's, and never once has any dancer refused my invitation to dance, regardless of their gender. (Well, OK, there was one woman, many years ago, who chose to sit on the bench over dancing with another woman, but as I danced away with a more fun-loving lady, I'm sure she questioned her decision.) The solo world was much less evolved when this happened and, really, it

was good for me to taste rejection... OUCH!, making me sensitive to how I respond to invitations to dance.

I look forward to dancing with some of you at these two great events. Keep an eye out for a snowy white head and a beaming grin, and if you don't ask me to dance, I'll probably ask you.

Though this sounds as though I'm writing mainly for women, solo men, being more scarce, are even more important to this discussion. Don't hesitate to ask a lady to dance. We're all at these events to have fun and you're an important key to that fun.



- 9. Eat well and exercise regularly to boost feel-good endorphins, which improve your mood, help you sleep, and increase your pain tolerance.
- 10. If you feel down, acknowledge your right to feel down for a while, and then try to move on.

Take new fabric directly to the washing machine to prepare it for sewing. Fabric is stretched in the weaving process and will shrink as the threads return to their original length. Some weaves can shrink three inches per yard. The length of the fabric usually shrinks more than the width. Pre-washing the fabric with hot water and detergent not only shrinks the fabric, it removes the sizing. Sizing is starch like stuff that is needed to get thread through the loom. When it is removed the feel, the hand, of the fabric will often change. Plans for the fabric might change after washing. Sizing can cause skipped stitches, and prevent iron-on interfacing from bonding.

Wash the fabric alone, especially if it is dark colored, and look in the washer during the cycle. Hot water and detergent will remove more dye and sizing than cold water. Almost all dark fabrics bleed during the first wash. Black is very bad because often it is over dyed. Keep re-washing the fabric until the wash water is clear. Do not use fabric softener in the rinse cycle when preparing fabric.

Dry the fabric completely in the dryer. It is the dryer that causes most shrinkage. If the fabric is cotton or poly-cotton run it through the rinse cycle after it has been dried once and **16** | **FOOTNOTES** www.

dry it again. Do not use dryer softener sheets. They can keep the interfacing from bonding, use them after the garment is completed.

Shrink all of the items that are going to be part of the garment. The easy way to shrink trims is to put them in a leg cut from an old pair of panty hose. Tie a knot in the top and send them through the washer and dryer. If there is more than one piece of trim put them in separate legs to reduce tangling. Dark trims can also bleed so take care in combining items. To shrink bias binding or other cotton trims, remove the plastic wrap and wind some thread around the trim and cardboard. Place it, cardboard and all, in a glass dish. Cover with water, put in the microwave and cook until steaming. Then pour the water off, if there is dye in the water, repeat the process. After the excess dye is out, set the trim aside and let it air dry. Gently unwind the trim from the cardboard and press with lots of steam. Do not pull on the trim while pressing. Treat it gently so it is not stretched. Wind the trim on a toilet paper core to keep it from getting tangled. We have all seen trim that has shrunk once it was sewn on a garment and puckered the fabric. Have you ever seen trim that has stretched after it has been washed? This is a lot of extra work.

Plea for support!!

May is always a busy month for the teens. Competition is always an exciting time and as always is busy. These teens have been practicing for months and go up on stage or onto the floor in front of thousands of people and put on a show. We want and need people to support the teens in anyway possible. Whether it be coming to competition which I know is hard when it is up in Canada. Support the teens by buying badges even if they/you can't go. Or support them by donating or helping with other fundraisers. Please support these kids as they are the future of square dancing, without these kids there is no future for our hobby. And while it is too late this year please find a teen club to support for this next dance season.

but shrinkage after the garment is completed can completely ruin hours of construction. Don't take short cuts. These special steps add polish to your sewing and prevent damage to the garment. Enjoy the creative process of sewing. Look for the best way to do things not the quickest. It is these techniques that will change your home made sewing into custom couture creations that will give you pleasure for a long time.

The last thing that must be shrunk is the interfacing. This applies to sewin and iron-on interfacing. At one time I thought that I didn't have to shrink interfacing. I was wrong. The yoke on one of my blouses is wrinkly because the interfacing shrank beneath the fabric. To shrink interfacing, lay it in gentle folds in the bath tub. Add just enough hot tap water to cover, and let it relax until the water cools. Roll the interfacing in a towel and gently blot dry. DO NOT twist or squeeze. Then lay the interfacing out on a table and let it dry completely. Gently roll the interfacing around an old wrapping paper core and put it away.

Everything shrinks, but at different rates. The fabric, trims and interfacing are under a lot of stress and pull in the manufacturing process. Don't take a chance on any part of a project. Even if it is not going to be used right away shrink it. When there is time to sew, don't be stopped by untreated fabric or trims. When everything is prepared, place fabric, trims, pattern, buttons and thread together in a clear plastic bag. Then everything will be ready to sew when you are.



In the meantime, surveyors discovered that the fence to the south, which had been assumed to be on the boundary line for many years, is actually 12 feet onto the CCSDC property. That means that 12 feet of the property may be lost to the southern neighbor due to what's called "adverse possession". Because of the same surveying discrepancy, much of the north parking lot which we've been using all these years actually belongs to the neighbor to the north. Therefore, the property which was put up for sale is potentially smaller than it was thought to be. In the meantime, the church has asked for an extra 90 days to realign their finances for the purchase. So, things are up in the air. Negotiations are on-going. It's all very complicated. Come back next month. Maybe I'll have more to tell you.

We will host our regular first and third Saturday dances at the Clark County Square Dance Center with Jim Hattrick calling and cueing. The May 7th dance will be our annual anniversary dance with the theme of "A Hawaiian Beach Party". As part of our on-going effort to accommodate Mainstream dancers, this dance will feature Mainstream calling on every third tip.

Our lessons are "dark" for the summer season, to resume in September. We had a wonderful season since September, welcoming 104 new dancers. Counting students and angels, our attendance averaged 60 per week.





We need help in the following areas:

Badge Making - most badges will be made ahead of time, but there will be some walk-in registrations, plus visitors need name badges.

First Aid – you would help with the record-keeping, no medical background is needed; we will have certified EMTs on staff.

Lost & Found – helping complete forms, placing the labeled item on shelf and return to rightful owner.

Showcase of Ideas - helping set up, take down, walking through to make sure all is in its proper place.

Vendor Loading / Unloading – helping where needed, not necessarily physically lifting or shoving.

Counters in dance halls – every 15 minutes the number of dancers needs to be recorded; every hour or two the numbers need to be turned into the Programming Office for record-keepina.

Counters in education rooms – every 60 minutes the number of attendees needs to be recorded and turned into the Education Office for record-keeping.

Hosts to introduce Education Presenters – read from a brief script introducing the presenters to those gathered. Also make note who is taking the session for LCP credit.

Hosts to support the Exhibition Teams/Groups – 6 teams are coming and will need help storing costumes, checking out costumes and finding their way around the IEC.

Safety/Security throughout the whole facility and Sew & Save – all persons in our area of the IEC will need a name badge. Guests, visitors will need a name badge.

If someone does not have a name badge, they need to be escorted to Registration to get one. Sew & Save will have a variety of items that need to remain where positioned.

Information Booth for Des Moines and for the Convention - The Convention Visitors Bureau has a large booth that will have information on Des Moines/Iowa. We need to have persons there who are able to read maps and can direct others around the convention center. We also want to have a smaller booth on the 3rd floor near the entrance.

Greeters at Shuttle Bus Stops at Iowa Events Center and at the different arrival points, including Hotels, Airport, Megabus terminal, the IEC various entrances, etc. Ushers needed for the Opening Ceremony, Vocal Trash; Bid Session, Fashion Show, Parade of States and Closing Ceremony.
