While trying to find a good picture for the cover of the May Footnotes, I thought about all the things that happen in May. There's Cinco de Mayo on the 5th, and Mother's Day on the 12th, Larry's birthday on the 19th (although I don't think he'll get national recognition for this one),

Memorial Day May 27th. So many from which to choose.

I found some national days of recognition that aren't quite as well known, but worth mentioning." May Day" is May 1st. A traditional day I remember as a first grader, by wrapping the May Pole at school with ribbons, I think they must have removed the flag for that activity. "Mother Goose Day," is also May 1st. 

Hungry Quilters

Quilters must think about food a lot when they quilt. So many of their fabric sets have food names. When you are thinking about your next skirt, look at some of these yummy collections. The colors and patterns were designed to go together so you don't have to worry about matching. There are often larger pieces to match the strip sets and occasionally entire bolts can be found. The strips and pieces are cut very accurately so you can get right to the sewing part. I have made several skirts using precut quilting fabrics. I usually use my serger with a 3 thread over edge stitch for putting these strips together. That makes a ¼" seam or close enough.

I have sewn quilt type skirts with the sewing machine and ¼" inch seams. They have been worn and washed them for years. Many seams results in a lot of thread strings. Occasionally, I trim off the strings but most of the time, just ignore them.

Jelly Rolls = 40 strips that are 2½" x 44". If you sew these together with ¼" seam allowances you get a 80" by 44" piece of fabric, or a fraction over two yards. I usually get 2 jelly rolls for an outfit. The skirt is entirely jelly roll and the top of his shirt are solid bodies with jelly roll decoration. Junior Jelly Rolls or Pops are 20 strips. Fat Quarters - That is not a body part. It is 18" x 22" or a quarter yard. A good way to get an accent trim. Fat Quarters are often bundled into sets of 10. There are also Fat Eights, that are 9" x 22". You can usually find Fat Quarters to match the Jelly Rolls.

Honey Buns = 20 strips - 1½" x 44"

Dessert Rolls or Jolly Bars = 12 strips - 5" x 44"

Charm Packs = 40 pieces - 5"square

Mini Charms = 40 pieces - 2½" squares

Layer Cakes = 40 pieces - 10" square or about 2 yards after it is

sewn together.

Any of these sizes of strips and squares can be combined with other fabrics purchased by the yard. These descriptions are approximate. Different manufactures change the names and amounts. Buyer Beware, check the label and always do the math.

The other problem is fabric stretching on the bias. If the straight of grain is not exactly the same in each piece there will be pulls and puckers. I used Pellon Quilter's Grid for this French Braid project (skirt with the 'V's)so that the fabric could not pucker.



The paper piecing technique of stitching, flipping and ironing, kept everything smooth. By fusing the fabric to the Quilter's Grid the skirt has more body and does not wrinkle as easily.



The Christmas skirt was two Jelly Rolls. The strips were sewn together with a 2" off set at the starting edge, then cut at a 45° angle. After stitching the strips together they must be pressed very throughly flat before the cross cut is made.

A lot of my friends quilt and I keep telling them that if they would just cut a hole in the middle of that quilt top it would make a great square dance skirt. After all, how many people see that quilt on your bed? Everyone sees your new square dance skirt.
