





## Happy Lazy Dayz of Summer!!!


Yes, indeed! I've been told that it is time to resume work on the Rounds of the Month! Here's the plan for the September ROM.

Fluttering Fabric

As a sewing machine needle moves up and down, the fabric to moves with it, this is called flutter. Excess movement causes poor quality stitching. There are ways to reduce this movement and improve the appearance of the seam.

This cannot be said too often, dull needles cause poor quality stitching. They force their way down dragging fabric into the stitch plate. The bobbin hook may not catch the thread because movement of the fabric does not allow the loop to form on the back of the needle. Needle points are ground to microscopic sharpness. You cannot see if a tip

is dull or damaged. Sharp new needles pierce fabric cleanly and slide through without pulling and stretching. Only use Schmetz brand needles, they are the best quality.

New machines with 9mm wide needle holes are wonderful, they make beautiful wide stitches. New machines with 9mm wide holes are terrible, they allow more

fabric downward flutter. Old Singer Featherweights are great machines because they have a very small hole in the stitch



plate. They can only sew straight and they do this very well. A small needle hole means the fabric is supported all around the needle. Newer machines have straight stitch plates available with small needle holes. Quilters use them to keep the quarter inch seam allowances from being pulled into the machine.

Wide openings in zig zag feet allow fabric upward flutter, especially 9mm feet. A straight stitch foot with only a small hole will reduce the movement and when paired with a straight stitch plate will improve straight stitch quality. If you do not have a straight stitch plate and foot, try moving the needle to the far right position while straight stitching. This supports the fabric on three sides, instead of just front and back. The right position is better than the left because of the way the hook works underneath.

Keep the fabric in contact with the feed dogs on both sides so that the fabric is being moved forward evenly. If only the left feed dog is holding the fabric, the edge can be pulled into the machine and it is more difficult to sew straight. If you want to sew closer to the edge of the fabric move the needle as far as possible to the right. When making French seams in fine fabric it is always better to sew a wider seam with the fabric well supported between the presser foot and the feed dogs. Then trim the seam allowance to one-eighth inch, fold and stitch at one quarter inch. The layers of fabric and the first seam will add support to the second stitching.

Controlling flutter in stretchy fabric starts with using the correct needle. Sometimes it is just trial and error to find it. The reason there are so many types of needles is that we have so many types of fabric available to the home stitcher. Your great grandmother only had one type of needle and she only had woven fabric. We have lycra, spandex and a lot of other words she never heard. Sometimes the slightly rounded tip of the universal needle is fine for a knit fabric. Other knits require more rounded tips of the stretch or jersey needles. A rounded tip is deflected by the yarns of the fabric and slips between them. A sharply tipped needle will snag the yarn and pull it down, causing runs and skipped stitches. Very fine, very stretchy fabrics (think skaters costumes) may require the microtex tip to get through the tightly packed yarns.

For some fabrics stabilizer is required to keep the stitching even. There are many products on the market for the many different things you can do with fabric and thread. I have used adding machine roll paper or tissue wrapping paper for some projects. Just sew the seam with a strip of paper on the bottom, then rip the paper away. This is great for doing decorative stitches. Little bits of paper often remain stuck in the stitching. Just ignore them. They are on the inside of the project and will dissolve in the wash.

Understanding how a stitch is formed and looking at the factors involved will allow you to trouble shoot many sewing problems. Always experiment on scraps before beginning the project. Don't just sew a couple of inches, sew at least a foot. Take it out of the machine, look at both sides, separate the layers and look at the seam line. Try different stitch lengths and pull on the seam to see if it will hold.



## **SOLO CORNER**

State festivals, national festivals, square dance campouts, roundups, US West... there has been no shortage of opportunities to dance during the summer months.

When I first graduated from Mainstream, I was excited to register for our state festival, held in Enumclaw that year. I was surprised to learn that my angels did not plan on going. Unfortunately, I found that there was a legitimate basis for their hesitations.

The good news about large square dance venues is that dancers are exposed to a number of callers and cuers, many of whom are nationally and internationally known. Because travel and registration can be somewhat expensive, dancers want to be sure they get in a lot of floor time, and will usually assure themselves of a dance partner in advance.

Some festivals offer badges to solo dancers so they can be readily identified by other dancers. Other festivals offer a special seating section for solo dancers with the expectation that dancers who need a partner for the next tip will hang out there. At the 2018 National Festival, there were big banners in each hall stating "Find your next dance partner here," along with a picture of two dancers. The signs were very well done and they were large enough to be noticed. At USA West there were no programs to identify dancers needing a partner. At both the state and national festivals, there were activities for solo dancers to help them meet other dancers who would be available to dance. At one dinner, 11 ladies signed up; at another social, four ladies and two guys showed.

So the question... do these badges and signs work? Will solo dancers be assured of dancing to their favorite callers? I had injured my knee on the way to the National Festival and had the opportunity to just sit and "people watch" to gauge the success of the solo section. I concluded solo dancers in the seating section matched up approximately 30% of the time. I noticed that partnered dancers used the seats in front of the banner more than the solo dancers did. I assume the partnered dancers just wanted a seat, and did not notice the banner. The second day of the festival, the banner in the Plus hall was moved off to the side and not used. It was a small hall, so it may have been so the chairs could be moved against the wall to make more room for the dancers.

Is there a stigma attached to being a solo dancer at the festivals? Seasoned dancers will tell solos to take the bull

by the horn and just get on the floor with the expectation that someone will magically arrive. There are pros and cons to this, which I will address in a future article. I was taken aback when I was discussing the "solo section" with another dancer. She said when she was a solo dancer, her friends teased her about sitting in the solo section. Another dancer suggested that dancers should be charged extra for a ribbon that designates them as a solo. Fortunately, this attitude is not shared by the majority, but there is still the question of what to do when it seems that everyone else in the room is partnered.

I conducted interviews with other dancers and with callers to get their opinions. The short answer is to learn to dance as a belle and as a beau so that your chances of matching with another solo dancer are doubled. This seemed to be the one solution that everyone could agree on. But what if you are a new dancer, and you are struggling with your normal position, not ready to take on the task of learning the opposite part? Is there a way of getting more active participation within the solo community? If you have ideas, or have seen a program that works well, please drop me an email.

Scholarships are awarded at the Washington State Square & Folk Dance Festival held in June each year. Monies are paid directly to the winner's college or trade school.


